SVITOLINA:

- Making tournament debut, where she is top seed. Has been top seed on 13 previous occasions at a WTA event in her career, going on to win the title at three of these (2017 Taipei City, 2017 Istanbul and 2018 Dubai)
- Snapped three-match losing streak with 1r win over Kovinic. Beat qualifier Govortsova in 2r to reach first QF since R-Up finish at 2019 WTA Finals in Shenzhen
- Won all 11 service games to see off in-form teenager Fernandez in QF then eased past first-time WTA semifinalist Rus in the last four, winning 63% of her return points
- Faces Bouzkova in today's final; owns 13-3 win-loss record in WTA finals
- Neither finalist has conceded a set this week; no player in the 11 previous editions of the tournament lifted the title without dropping at least one set en route
- Best results this season were QF run at Hua Hin (l. Hibino) and 3r showing at Australian Open (l. Muguruza). Fell 1r at Brisbane (l. Collins), Dubai (l. Brady) and Doha (l. Anisimova)
- Finished 2019 at No.6, her third consecutive Top 10 finish
- Season highlight was reaching the title match as defending champion at the Shiseido WTA Finals (l. Barty)
- Loss to Barty ended her nine-match unbeaten run at the year-end championship having gone undefeated in the RR stage from 2018-19
- In 2018, won 13th – and most prestigious – career title at 2018 WTA Finals (d. Stephens in F), after going 3-0 during round robin stage. Ended year ranked No.4. Also won titles at Rome (as defending champion, d. No.1 Halep in F), Dubai (as defending champion, d. Kasatkina in F) and Brisbane (d. Sasnovich in F); career record in finals now stands at 13-2, including a current nine match win streak
- Enjoyed stand-out 2017, finishing year at No.6, winning a tour-leading five titles and posting second-most wins (53, behind Wozniacki with 60)
- Season culminated by qualifying for WTA Finals in Singapore, becoming first Ukrainian woman to qualify for the season-ending tournament in singles (fell at round robin stage with 1-2 record)
- In 2017, became first player to win three Premier 5 titles in a single season (Dubai, Rome, Toronto), since such tournaments were introduced in 2009
- One of five players to make Top 10 debut in 2017, after winning Dubai in February (also Ostapenko, Garcia, Mladenovic and Vandeweghe). Peaked in rankings at No.3 on September 11, 2017
- On four occasions could have reached World No.1 spot – at 2017 US Open, then needed to win 2017 Beijing (fell in QF), then needed to triumph at 2017 WTA Finals (fell in group stage), or reach final at 2018 Australian Open (fell in QF)
- End to 2016 season also saw her reach first SF at Premier Mandatory level at Beijing (l. A.Radwanska) Qualified for 2016 WTA Elite Trophy Zhuhai for the second time (l. Kvitova in F)

- Reached three finals in 2016, at Kuala Lumpur (d. Bouchard in F) and advancing to finals at New Haven (l. A.Radwanska) and Zhuhai (l. Kvitova)
- Other 2016 season highlights included SFs at Dubai, Tokyo [PPO] and Moscow, and QF at Rio Olympics
- Owns two career doubles titles: 2014 Istanbul (w/Doi) and 2015 Istanbul (w/Gavrilova)
- Made WTA main draw debut at 2012 Baku (lost in 1r but went on to win title there in both 2013 and 2014)
- Played first ITF Circuit events of career in 2008
- Ukrainian Fed Cup Team, 2012-15, 2017, 2020
- Coached by Andrew Bettles

BOUZKOVA:

- Making second main draw appearance at Monterrey (third overall). This week is the latest memorable showing of her career in Mexico, where she made her tour-level main draw debut at Acapulco in 2015, lifted a couple of ITF \$25k titles at Cuernavaca in 2016 and Irapuato in 2018, while reached her previous biggest final at the WTA 125K Series event at Guadalajara last year (l. Kudermetova)
- Defeated lucky loser Kucova and qualifier Schmiedlova for loss of just 11 games in opening two rounds to record first WTA main draw wins of the year
- Overcame No.84 Y.Wang in QF to record second Top 100 win of the season – also defeated No.42 Kudermetova in qualifying at Brisbane
- Upset No.16 Konta in SF to record fourth Top 20 win of her career (also No.8 Stephens and No.4 Halep at 2019 Toronto, and No.3 Svitolina at 2019 Guangzhou) and reach her first WTA final
- Faces No.7 Svitolina in today's final; prevailed in their previous meeting at 2019 Guangzhou when the Ukrainian retired w/right knee injury
- Regardless of the result in the final, is projected to break into the Top 50 for the first time; by contrast, 12 months ago was ranked No.130 and fell in the first round of qualifying here (l. No.252 Kuwata)
- Also this week reached doubles SF w/Voracova (l. Bondarenko/Fichman)
- Lost in 1r in first four WTA tournaments of 2020. Reached QF at ITF \$100k Nashville (l. Abanda) in February
- Ended 2019 ranked No.57 for career-best year-end finish and first inside the Top 100
- Posted career-high ranking of No.53 on August 12, 2019
- Standout performance of 2019 season was a SF run in her first Premier 5 appearance at Toronto (as qualifier, l. S.Williams in 3s)
- Also in 2019, made QF at Guangzhou and was R-Up at WTA 125K Series event at Guadalajara. Lifted 12th and biggest title of career on ITF Circuit, at \$80K Nur-Sultan-KAZ (d. Kostic in F); broke into the Top 100 for the first time at No.92 following the tournament (on July 22)
- Scored first three career Top 10 wins in 2019, against No.8 Stephens and No.4 Halep (both Toronto), and No.3 Svitolina (Guangzhou)
- Won first Slam main draw match during 2r showing at Wimbledon (as qualifier, d. Barthel, l. Sakkari)
- Highlights of 2018 season were 2r showing at Québec City (as qualifier, l. Lepchenko) and qualifying for first Grand Slam at US Open (l. Bogdan in 1r)
- Also in 2018, fell 1r at Monterrey, in qualifying at Australian Open, Roland Garros, Wimbledon, Acapulco, Lugano, Stuttgart and Prague, while on ITF Circuit, won one title at \$25k Irapuato-MEX and reached four further SF
- Has won 12 titles in singles and one in doubles on ITF Circuit
- Made WTA main draw debut at 2015 Acapulco (as wildcard, l. Karatantcheva)

- Professional debut was opening round loss in qualifying at 2013 Katowice
- Won US Open girls' singles title in 2014 (d. Kalinina in F)
- Coached by Cristian Requeni

2014 Junior US Open champion Marie Bouzkova made a name for herself on the WTA Tour in 2019. The 21-year-old Czech soared 60 spots in the rankings, peaking at a career-high World No.53, in a year that showed promise from the first week, qualifying for the Brisbane International and upsetting 2011 US Open champion Samantha Stosur.

Her results only got stronger after the Australian summer, with a runner-up finish at a WTA 125K tournament in Guadalajara and a maiden main draw appearances at Roland Garros and Wimbledon, where she reached the second round as a lucky loser.

She then qualified for the Premier 5 tournament in Toronto and scored wins over Sloane Stephens (her first over a Top 10 player), Jelena Ostapenko and Simona Halep to reach the semifinals, where she nearly upset 23-time Grand Slam champion Serena Williams with a stunning 6-1 first set.

When she's not on court, Bouzkova is usually found studying for her Business Administration degree at Indiana University East.

With an incredible nine titles between the 2017-18 seasons, Elina Svitolina is a force on the WTA Tour, and has cemented her place among the elite of women's tennis by lifting the biggest title of her career in the form of the Billie Jean King trophy at the WTA Finals in 2018.

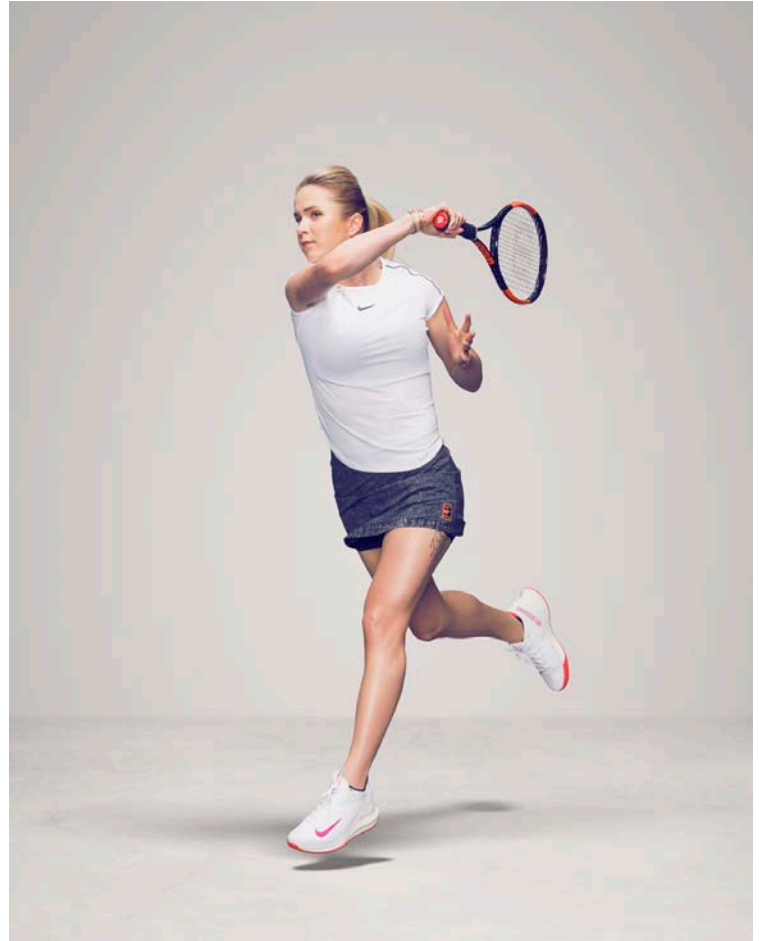
The Ukrainian lifted a tour-leading five WTA titles in 2017 and also that year became the first player in WTA history to win three Premier 5 titles in a single season, peaking at No.3 in the rankings. Her rise continued in 2018 with titles at Brisbane, Dubai and Rome, before her stunning undefeated run to WTA Finals crown during the final year of the season-ending event in Singapore.

Elina doesn't believe in "intimidation." When her older brother started playing tennis, Elina did not shy away, but became determined to become better than he was. The Ukrainian let that competitive nature fuel her early in her career - winning Junior Roland Garros at 15 years old, and her first WTA title at 18 years old.

The fire and passion she is known for has even caught the attention of one of her childhood idols - Serena Williams, who she defeated at the 2016 Rio Olympics. "She had this fire in her eyes and she had this desire," said 23-time Major Champion of Svitolina, who is sure to continue to fight to get to the top of the game.

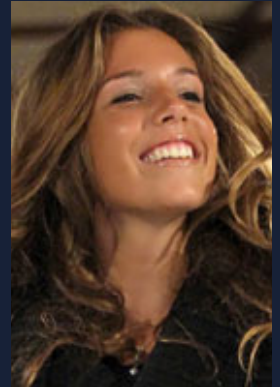

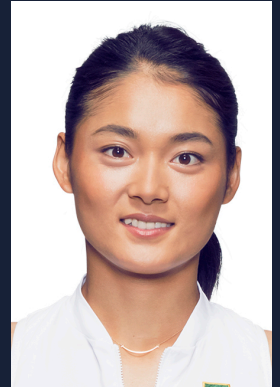
