KASATKINA

- Playing inaugural edition of Open 6ème Sens Métropole de Lyon
- This week, scored back-to-back main draw wins for the first time this season by defeating Parmentier in 1r and Bara in 2r
- In her first QF since 2019 Beijing, faces No.94 Giorgi today in their career first meeting.
- Enters Lyon following a qualifying exit at Dubai (I. Mladenovic) and 1r exit at Doha (as qualifier, I. Muguruza in 3s)
- Finished 2019 season at No.69, down from No.10 in 2018, having gone 12-21 across the season
- Ended 2018 season by catering her second WTA singles title at Moscow [Kremlin Cup]. Recovered from a set and 6-2 4-1 down to defeat Jabeur in final; is now 2-3 in WTA singles finals, all coming at Premier-level or above
- Reached biggest final of career at 2018 Indian Wells (I. Osaka)
- Captured the joint-most wins over Top 5 players (five) in 2018, along with Bertens and Stephens
- Was one of eight players to reach QF or better at two or more Grand Slams in 2018 (Wimbledon and Roland Garros)
- One of five players in WTA history to have multiple wins over World No.1s before their 21st birthday, others being: V.Williams (9), S. Williams (8), Sharapova (4) and Kuznetsova (2)
- 2017 season was highlighted by capturing first WTA singles title in debut final at Charleston, defeating fellow teenager Ostapenko in F – the first all-teenage final on tour since 2009 Linz (Wickmayer d. Kvitova)
- Reached second tour-level final at Moscow in 2017 (I. Goerges in F). Also finished R-Up in two WTA doubles finals at 2017 – at Tokyo [PPO] and Moscow (both w/Gavrilova)
- Scored first win over a reigning No.1 by defeating Kerber at 2017 Sydney
- Ended 2016 as the highest-ranked teenager
- 2016 highlights included reaching second WTA SF at St Petersburg (I. eventual R-Up Bencic) and QF stage at Indian Wells (I. Ka.Pliskova), Charleston (I. eventual champion Stephens having held match points), Montreal (I. Kerber), Rio Olympics (I. Keys) and Moscow (I. Goerges)
- Reached first WTA SF at 2015 Moscow (I. Pavlyuchenkova, having recorded first Top 20 win over No.14 Suárez Navarro in QF)
- Nominated for WTA Newcomer of the Year in 2015
- QF run at 2015 Bad Gastein (as qualifier) was first time reaching last eight at a WTA-level tournament
- Won maiden WTA doubles title at 2015 Moscow (w/Vesnina)
- Won five singles titles on ITF Circuit in 2015, taking total to seven
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2013 Moscow; made main draw debut as WC also at Moscow in 2014 (I. Riske 1r)

GIORGI

- Playing inaugural edition of Open 6ème Sens Métropole de Lyon
- In 1r this week, defeated Lapko before ousting home favorite Cornet in 3s to reach her first QF since 2019 Osaka (I. Mertens in QF)
- Win over No.58 Cornet marked her second-best win-by-ranking of 2020 following a victory over No.53 Kuznetsova en route to 3r at Australian Open (I. Kerber)
- Faces No.73 Kasatkina today for a spot in her first SF since 2019 Bronx in August (I. Linette in F)
- Coming off back-to-back qualifying exits a Dubai (I. Goerges) and Doha (I. Pera)
- Finished 2019 ranked No.98 – her eighth consecutive Top 100 year-end finish
- Highlights were R-Up finishes at Washington DC (I. Pegula) and the Bronx (I. Linette); career record in WTA finals is 2-6
- Missed entire clay court season w/wrist and ankle injuries
- Lost both her matches (I. Golubic, Bencic) as Italy fell to a 3-1 defeat to Switzerland in last week's Fed Cup World Group II encounter. Her previous appearance in the team competition came in 2016
- Ended 2018 season perched at a career-best ranking of No.26, winning second career title in final event at Linz (d. Alexandrova in F). Won 29 tour-level matches in 2018 – the most wins she had previously posted in a single season was 28, in 2014
- Advanced to first Grand Slam QF at 2018 Wimbledon (I. eventual R-Up S.Williams) on her 26th appearance at this level; became the first Italian woman to reach the QF of Wimbledon since 2009 (Schiafone, I. Dementieva)
- Other highlights last season included SF runs at Sydney (I. eventual champion Kerber), Prague (I. Buzarnescu after serving for match in third set) and Tokyo (I. Osaka)
- Posted sixth consecutive Top 100 season, finishing 2017 ranked No.79 (up from No.83 in 2017)
- In 2016 reached final at Katowice for the third year in a row (I. Cibulkova). Appeared in four additional quarterfinals in 2016, at Hobart (I. Bouchard), Prague (I. Ka.Pliskova), Washington, DC (I. Davis) and Seoul (I. Zhang)
- Won first career title at 2015 's-Hertogenbosch (d. Bencic in F).

- Finished 2015 season with then best year-end ranking (No.34), up one place from No.35 in 2014. Season highlighted by winning her first WTA singles title at 's-Hertogenbosch (d. Bencic in F)
- Had never reached WTA QF prior to 2014; reached QF or better at seven events during that season
- Made Top 100 debut on July 9, 2012 and broke into Top 50 on May 26, 2014
- Tour-level main draw debut came as a qualifier at 2011 Wimbledon
- On ITF Circuit, winner of five singles titles
- Played first career professional tournament at 2006 ITF/Baku-AZE
- Coached by father, Sergio Giorgi

KUZMOVA

- Playing inaugural edition of Open 6ème Sens Métropole de Lyon
- Battled through back-to-back three-setters to advance to first WTA QF of 2020 campaign, and first since 2019 Linz in October
- Attempting to win three matches in a row at the WTA level since Auckland last January
- Faces off against No.136 Friedsam for the first time since winning their first meeting at 2017 Linz
- Has also advanced to SF stage of doubles w/partner Marta Kostyuk
- Coming into Lyon off 1r exit in St. Petersburg (l. Dodin)
- Fell in 1r of Australian Open to No.39 Goerges
- Reached R16 at Hobart International (l. Mertens)
- Began season with 1r loss to Gauff in Auckland
- Highlight of 2019 season was QF appearance at Dubai where she defeated the likes of No.8 Bertens and Kenin en route (l. Kvitova)
- Advanced to an additional four QFs, including a SF visit at Auckland (l. eventual champion Goerges)
- Finished 2018 ranked No.54 - the highest year-end • Ended 2018 season ranked No.56 to register her first Top 100 year-end finish of career
- Posted best career result at 2018 Budapest, simultaneously making tour-level QF and SF debut. As qualifier, defeated No.36 Cirstea, Grand Slam R-Up Lisicki and Martic to reach SF without dropping a set (l. eventual champion Van Uytvanck)
- Other 2018 highlights included reaching SF at 's-Hertogenbosch (l. Flipkens)
- On ITF Circuit in 2018, won titles at \$100K ITF/Budapest-HUN, \$60k ITF/Shenzhen-CHN (d. Kalinskya in F) and ITF \$100k/Trnava 2-SVK (d. Cepede Royg in F) to break into Top 100 for first time
- Was instrumental for Slovakia on Fed Cup debut vs. Russia in February 2018, going 2-0 in singles (d. Potapova, Vikhlyantseva) as they ran out 3-1 winners
- Finished 2017 season ranked No.132 to record her first Top 200 year-end finish
- Highlight of 2017 season was earning first tour-level win at Linz over Friedsam (l. Maria in 2r)
- Fell in WTA qualifying on four occasions in 2017
- Made tour-level main draw debut at 2017 US Open (as qualifier, l. V.Williams)
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2016 Prague
- Trains at Slovakian National Tennis Centre in Bratislava
- Introduced to tennis aged four by father, Radovan, who used to run a tennis club; mother is Ingrid and sister is Katarina
- Studying International Relations and Diplomacy at a Czech University
- Tennis idols are Rafael Nadal and Ana Ivanovic

FRIEDSAM

- Playing inaugural edition of Open 6ème Sens Métropole de Lyon
- Aside from Dodin, is the only other quarterfinalist to have not dropped a set thus far
- Defeated Komardina in 1r action prior to R16 upset of No.2 seed Mladenovic
- Aiming to win three consecutive matches in a row for the first time since 2016 Australian Open when she reached the R16 (l. A.Radwanska)
- Seeking her first SF appearance at a WTA tour-level event since Shenzhen Open in January 2016 (l. A. Radwanska again)
- Takes on No.85 Kuzmova for the second time in her career today
- Coming in off back-to-back ITF appearances in Europe
- Fell in 1r qualifying of Australian Open to Naito
- Began 2020 campaign winning through two rounds of qualifying at Shenzhen Open but falling in 1r to Sasnovich
- 2019 season was first full season on tour in several years after struggling with injuries – highlighted by back-to-back successful ITF weeks in same location, Roehampton, winning title at 25K and runner-up finish at ITF 25K the week prior
- 2018 season was cut short due to a continuing shoulder injury - only competed in tour level events at Hobart (l. 2r) and Australian Open (l. 1r)
- Finished the 2017 season ranked outside the Top 1000 due to her recovery from shoulder surgery
- Competed in two WTA events in 2017 (Luxembourg and Linz) and capped off the year with by winning \$25k ITF/Shrewsbury-GBR title
- Attained year-end career-highs in both singles (No.68) and doubles (No.121) in 2016
- Season highlights in 2016 included runner-up in doubles at Mallorca (w/Siegemund), the first WTA doubles final of her career. Also advanced to QF stage at Nürnberg (l. countrywoman Beck), finished runner-up at new WTA 125K Series event at San Antonio (l. Doi in F) and reached second tour-level SF of career to date at Shenzhen (l. eventual champion A.Radwanska) before R16 effort at Australian Open
- Finished 2015 at No.99 for second consecutive Top 100 finish (also No.86 in 2014)
- Season highlight in 2015 was runner-up finish at Linz (l. Pavlyuchenkova) – best result of career so far
- Won WTA 125K Series event in Suzhou, China in 2014
- Made Top 100 debut on August 11, 2014 (went from No.101 to No.100)
- On ITF Circuit, winner of 12 singles titles and three doubles titles

- Favorite shot is serve, favorite surface is hardcourt
- Has been a member of the Porsche Talent Team for rising German stars
- Introduced to tennis at six years of age by parents
- Mother Barbora works at a kindergarten; father Ludwig is a mechanical engineer; brother, Sebastian, is studying to be a sports teacher; and sister, Emmanuela, works at a kindergarten

KENIN

- Playing inaugural edition of Open 6ème Sens Métropole de Lyon
- Battled from a set and break down to defeat qualifier Cristian and advance to her first QF since lifting silverware at the Australian Open (d. Muguruza in F)
- Faces No.130 Oceane Dodin in today's match – hasn't fallen to a player outside of the Top 100 since 2019 Eastbourne (l. Stosur)
- As top seed, is playing at a career-high ranking of No.5 (as of Feb. 24, 2020)
- Also holds the top position on the Porsche Race to Shenzhen Leaderboard
- Produced incredible 2019 campaign, tallying three singles titles, a career-best Grand Slam performance, qualification into both WTA Elite Trophy Zhuhai and WTA Finals (as alternate, played one match), and a career-high singles ranking of No.12
- Finished the year as US No.2 (behind No.9 S.Williams) and leader in hard court wins (38-tied w/Barty)
- Registered back-to-back SF runs at Cincinnati and Toronto, subsequently leading to Top 20 debut
- During this run, defeated No.1 Barty (Toronto) and No.1 Osaka (Cincinnati), to become first player since October 2001 to defeat reigning World No.1s in consecutive weeks (Davenport); also became youngest American to defeat reigning No.1 in eight years (McHale)
- Advanced to R16 for first time at a Slam at Roland Garros (d. S.Williams), becoming first American to defeat Serena at the majors since Stephens at 2013 Australian Open QF
- Broke into the Top 100 on March 19, 2018 and Top 50 on October 8, 2018
- Advanced to first WTA level SF in 2018 at Mallorca as a qualifier, also reaching this stage later in the season at Québec City
- Represented the USA in the Fed Cup final vs. the Czech Republic in November 2018
- In 2017, won the US Open Wild Card Challenge, reaching the third round (l. Sharapova) and posting career first Top 50 win over No.34 Davis
- Made WTA main draw debut at 2015 US Open as a wildcard (l. Duque-Mariño in 1r)
- Owns four ITF singles titles and two doubles titles
- Played first matches of career on ITF Circuit in 2013, climbing to No.2 in ITF World Junior Rankings
- Represented the USA at the 2014 Youth Olympic Games and competed at the 2016 ITF Junior Masters, both held in China

DODIN

- Playing inaugural edition of Open 6ème Sens Métropole de Lyon
- Struck 15 aces to defeat Minella in 1r action, advancing to a second Tour-level QF this season, having also reached final eight at St. Petersburg (d. No.14 Konta, l. eventual R-Up Rybakina)
- Squares off against No.5 Kenin for their first career meeting. Looking to notch second Top 5 scalp of her career today, her first coming three years ago at 2017 Madrid (d. No.5 Cibulkova)
- Coming off victory at \$25k ITF/Macon-FRA (d. Ponchet in F)
- Entered Lyon ranked No.130, up from last year's ranking of No.339 during this same week
- In 2019, recorded 1-3 record in ITF finals - advanced to final at \$25k ITF/Corroios-PRT (l. Ozgen in F), \$25k ITF/Koksijde-BEL (l. Hogenkam in F) and \$25k ITF/St. Etienne-FRA (l. Bogdan via walkover) while lifting a trophy on home soil at \$25k ITF/Cherboug-FRA (d. Tan in F) to record her ninth ITF Circuit singles title
- Advanced through qualifying at the 2018 Miami Open to defeat Cepede Roys in 1r, her sole tour-level main draw win of 2018 (l. Halep)
- Posted second Top 100 season finish in 2017, reaching career high WTA singles ranking No.46 on June 12
- Highlights included SF at Washington DC (l. Makarova) and first Premier Mandatory R16 at 2017 Madrid (l. Mladenovic)
- Captured maiden career title at 2016 Québec City (d. Davis in F) on ranking of No.132. Following this result, made Top 100 debut (September 19, 2016)
- Québec City run formed centerpiece of 16-match win streak that began with title at \$25k ITF/Barcelona-ESP and concluded with SF effort at \$25k ITF/Clermont-Ferrand-FRA
- Also appeared in QF at 2016 Linz (as qualifier, l. Keys)
- Ended 2016 season by defeating Davis in final of \$100k ITF/Poitiers-FRA – her eighth ITF Circuit singles title
- Made tour-level debut in 2015 at Australian Open (as a wildcard), then reached Strasbourg main draw as a lucky loser, received another WC into Roland Garros, bowed out of the 1r at 's-Hertogenbosch, made 2r at US Open (defeating 2008 runner-up Jankovic) and fell 1r at Luxembourg (as qualifier)
