#### [1] SIMONA HALEP (ROU #2) vs. SARA SORRIBES TORMO (ESP #70)

#### First meeting

**Halep** is bidding to register her 15th consecutive victory... **Sorribes Tormo** owns one career Top 10 win... **Halep** was seeded No.1 during 2018 title run here in Paris

#### [9] JOHANNA KONTA (GBR #13) vs. COCO GAUFF (USA #51)

#### First meeting

**Konta** lost to 19-year-old Vondrousova in last year's SF... **Gauff** won girls' title at Roland Garros in 2018... **Konta** posted a tour-leading 15 wins on clay last season

#### [10] VICTORIA AZARENKA (BLR #14) vs. DANKA KOVINIC (MNE #74)

#### Azarenka leads 1-0

**Azarenka** won when the pair met at 2016 Australian Open... **Kovinic** coming off run through qualifying to third round at Rome... **Azarenka** seeded at a Slam for the first time since becoming a mother

#### MARGARITA GASPARYAN (RUS #122) vs. [16] ELISE MERTENS (BEL #20)

#### Mertens leads 1-0

**Mertens** triumphed when the two met at 2019 Australian Open... **Gasparyan** looking for first main draw win in Paris... **Mertens** has won the second-most tour-level matches in 2020

#### [17] ANETT KONTAVEIT (EST #21) vs. CAROLINE GARCIA (FRA #45)

#### Kontaveit leads 2-1

**Kontaveit** won when they faced each other 12 days ago in Rome... **Garcia** made QF of her home Slam back in 2017... **Kontaveit** seeded for the 12th major in a row

#### AJLA TOMLJANOVIC (AUS #64) vs. [20] MARIA SAKKARI (GRE #24)

#### Sakkari leads 1-0

**Sakkari** came out on top over three sets in their previous encounter at Bol in 2017... **Tomljanovic** reached last 16 in Paris six years ago... **Sakkari's** sole career title came on clay in Rabat last season

#### ANNA KAROLINA SCHMIEDLOVA (SVK #161) vs. VENUS WILLIAMS (USA #76)

#### Schmiedlova leads 2-1

**Schmiedlova** came from a set down to upset **Williams** here in 2014... **Williams** owns nine clay court titles... **Schmiedlova** contesting tournament under a special ranking, after recovering from knee surgery

# **ROLAND GARROS**

- Making her 11th main draw appearance at Roland Garros (12th overall)
- Lost title matches here in 2014 (I. Sharapova) and 2017 (I. Ostapenko) before triumphing in 2018 (d. Stephens in F)
- In 2017 final, led Ostapenko 6-4 3-0 with game point before losing, however turned the tables in 2018, having been a set and a break down to Stephens
- Triumph here in 2018 made her the 49th woman in the Open Era to win a Grand Slam title, and just second woman from Romania to win a major (Ruzici, also here in Paris in 1978)
- Is one of three Romanian women to reach final in Paris, following in footsteps of Mihai (1977 - R-Up) and Ruzici (1978 - Champion, 1980 - R-Up). Has be joined by six of her compatriots in this year's draw (Bara, Begu, Bogdan, Cirstea, Niculescu and Tig)
- Made Grand Slam main draw debut in Paris as qualifier in 2010 (I. eventual R-Up Stosur in 1r)
- 2008 Roland Garros girls' singles champion, and is one of six players to go on to win the women's title in Paris, after Francoise Durr, Mima Jausovec, Hana Mandlikova, Jennifer Capritati and Justine Henin
- Sixth time contesting a Grand Slam as No.1 seed and second time at Roland Garros (also during title run in 2018)
- Faces No.70 Sorribes Tormo in 1r today; last loss to a player ranked outside Top 50 came at hands of No.116 Townsend in 2r at 2019 US Open
- Owns 27-12 record in Grand Slam 1r matches, with most recent defeat at this stage coming at 2018 US Open (as No.1 seed I. No.44 Kanepi)
- Overall Grand Slam win-loss record stands at 93-37 only seven active players have registered more wins
- Her 28-9 win-loss record gives here the fifth best win percentage in Paris (.757) among active players
- Has made QF or better in all five tournaments played this year, posting 20-2 record - only Rybakina (28-7), Mertens (26-10) and Muguruza (21-6) have posted more victories
- Has won 14 matches in a row, during title runs at Dubai (four wins), Prague (five wins) and Rome (five wins) - the joint longest streak (at any level) of her career, matching 2015's run when she lifted trophies at Dubai and Indian Wells, then made SF at Miami
- Owns nine clay court titles the second-most among active players: V.Williams (9) and S.Williams (13)
- Since 2013, when Halep won her first of 22 titles, only S.Williams (27) has won more silverware
- Fortnight of Roland Garros will see her move to 325 consecutive weeks in the Top 10 – the longest active streak (ahead of Ka.Pliskova). Can return to No.1 by winning the title in Paris
- Since the start of 2016 season has scored 70 wins on clay, the second most on tour after Bertens (77)

# **ROLAND GARROS**

- Making fourth main draw appearance at Roland Garros (sixth overall)
- Made 2r here in 2019 (d. Van Uytvanck, I. Stephens)
- Previously fell 1r in 2016 (as qualifier, I. Pavlyuchenkova) and 2017 (I. Bacsinszky) and in qualifying in 2015 and 2018
- Faces No.2 Halep in 1r today; in terms of ranking, best career wins were against No.14 Keys at 2018 Madrid and No.10 Osaka in 2020 Fed Cup
- Has faced two Top 5-ranked players previously, losing to No.5 Ka.Pliskova in 1r at 2017 Australian Open and No.1 Osaka in 2r at 2019 Madrid
- Owns 4-13 record in Grand Slam matches, and 4-9 in 1r matches
- Enters Paris ranked No.70 places off career-high ranking (set on June 10, 2019)
- One of four Spaniards in main draw this year (also Badosa, Bolsova and Muguruza
- Has enjoyed the best results of her career on clay, reaching her only WTA SF, at Bogota and Gstaad in 2017. Has also finished R-Up on clay at WTA 125K Series event at Bol in 2019 and won nine of her 10 ITF Circuit singles titles on the surface - including at the \$80K event in Cagnes-sur-Mer in France earlier this month



# **GRAND SLAM HISTORY**

- Contesting landmark 40th Grand Slam main draw of her career at 2020 Roland Garros
- Winner of two Grand Slam titles, lifting first at 2018 Roland Garros (d. Stephens in F) followed by an historic 2019 Wimbledon run (d. S.Williams in F)
- Became first Romanian to lift the singles title at the All England Club, defeating S.Williams in 56 minutes
- Posted three runner-up finishes in Paris in 2014 (I. Sharapova in 3s), 2017 (I. Ostapenko in 3s) and at Australian Open in 2018 (I. Wozniacki in 3s)
- Was the first Romanian woman to advance to final at Australian Open in 2018 (I. Wozniacki)
- Best result at US Open is SF run in 2015 (I. eventual champion Pennetta)

### SEASON

- Last Monday, captured her 22nd career title at Rome (d. No.4 Ka.Pliskova in F) - now owns the fifth-most titles among active players, behind Serena (73), Venus (49), Clijsters (41) and Kvitova (27)
- On her return, won title at Prague (d. Mertens in F)
- Prior to tour's five-month hiatus, clinched her 20th career title at Dubai (d. Rybakina in F)
- Reached eighth career Grand Slam SF at Australian Open (I. Muguruza)
- Opened 2020 season with QF appearance at Adelaide (I. Sabalenka)

# **CAREER MILESTONES**

- Ended 2019 ranked No.4 for sixth consecutive year in the Top 5. Season highlighted by winning second career Grand Slam title at Wimbledon (d. S.Williams)
- Also in 2019 finished R-Up at Madrid (I. Bertens) and QF at Roland Garros (as defending champion, I. Anisimova) and Toronto (ret. vs. Bouzova w/Achilles pain)
- Ended 2018 season as World No.1 for the second time in her career, with season highlighted by maiden Grand Slam title at Roland Garros (d. Stephens in F)
- Also won titles in 2018 at Shenzhen (d. Siniakova in F) and Montréal (d. Stephens in F) and was R-Up at Australian Open (I. Wozniacki), Rome (I. Svitolina) and Cincinnati (I. Bertens)
- Won first career WTA doubles title at 2018 Shenzhen (w/Begu). Now 1-1 in career doubles finals
- Finished 2017 as the year-end World No.1, having ascended to the No.1 spot for first time in career on October 9, 2017 – became the 25th woman to reach the top spot, and the 13th to hold year-end No.1

# **GRAND SLAM HISTORY**

- Made major debut at 2016 Roland Garros (as qualifier, I. Pavlyuchenkova in 1r)
- Best showings are 2r runs at 2018 Wimbledon (as qualifier, d. Kanepi, I. Suarez Navarro) and 2019 Roland Garros (I. Stephens), 2020 Australian Open (I. Kontaveit) and 2020 US Open (I. Mertens)
- Also fallen 1r on nine other Grand Slam appearances: Australian Open in 2017 and 2019, Roland Garros in 2016 and 2017, Wimbledon in 2017 and 2019, and US Open in 2017, 2018 and 2019
- R-Up in 2013 US Open girls' doubles (w/Bencic, I. Krejcikova/Siniakova)

# SEASON

- Coming off lifting the 10th ITF Circuit title of her career, at \$80K Cagnes-sur-Mer-FRA (d. Bara in F)
- Made 2r at US Open (I. Mertens) and Istanbul (I. Badosa)
- Advanced to 10th career WTA QF at Prague (I. Begu)
- Fell 1r at Palermo (I. Yastremska)
- Made 1r exits at Acapulco (I. Errani) and Monterrey (I. Bondarenko)
- Upset No.10 Osaka to register career-best win during Spain's 3-1 Fed Cup qualifying win over Japan
- Opened season with 1r exits at Shenzhen (I. Y.Wang) and Hobart (as qualifier, I. Kozova) before reaching 2r at Australian Open (d. Kudermetova, I. Kontaveit)

# **CAREER MILESTONES**

- Posted third consecutive Top 100 finish in 2019 (at No.82). Season highlights were making QF at Auckland (I. to Hsieh), Bogota (I. Haddad Maia) and Hiroshima (I. to Doi); reached 2r six times (including Roland Garros)
- Rose to career-high No.64 in the rankings on June 10, 2019
- Won second career doubles title in 2019, at Rabat (w/Martinez Sanchez); now 2-1 in WTA doubles finals
- Ended 2018 ranked No.87 to register second Top 100 finish (also No.99 in 2017)
- Season highlight in 2018 was reaching QF at Gstaad (I. Minella). Also made 2r for the first time at a major, as a qualifier at Wimbledon (I. Suarez Navarro)
- Won maiden WTA doubles title at 2018 Monterrey (w/ Broady)

# **ROLAND GARROS**

- Making sixth main draw appearance at Roland Garros (eighth overall)
- Won her first main draw matches here during last year's run to SF (I. Vondrousova). Fell in 1r from 2015-18 and in qualifying in 2013-14
- Was the first British woman to reach SF in Paris since Jo Durie in 1983 (SF)
- Overall Slam record is 39-26; is 14-12 in 1r matches at the majors (1-4 in Paris)
- Faces No.51 Gauff today. Is 7-5 vs. players ranked outside the Top 50 in 2020, with wins coming over unranked Clijsters, No.91 Maria and No.89 Potapova (all at Monterrey), No.79 Flipkens and No.270 Zvonareva (both at Western & Southern Open), No.54 Watson (US Open) and No.77 Begu (Rome)
- Has not faced an American opponent since her QF showing at last year's Wimbledon (d. Stephens in 3r)
- Owns 4-1 record against teenagers at Grand Slam level, beating Babos (2012 US Open), Chirico (2015 US Open), Bencic (2016 US Open) and Osaka (2017 Australian Open), and losing to Vondrousova (2019 Roland Garros)
- Owned joint-second most wins on clay in 2019 with 15 (tied with Martic and Vondrousova) and behind Bertens (17). Posted 15-4 record - Rabat (R-Up), Madrid (2r), Rome (R-Up) and Roland Garros (SF)
- · One of two British women in draw also Watson

# **GRAND SLAM HISTORY**

- Is a three-time Grand Slam semifinalist. Made Slam breakthrough with historic run to SF at 2016 Australian Open (I. eventual champion Kerber); became first British woman to reach the last four at Melbourne Park since Sue Barker in December 1977, and at any Slam since Jo Durie at 1983 US Open
- Has since reached SF at 2017 Wimbledon (I. R-Up V.Williams), becoming the first British woman to reach the last four since Wade in 1978 (I. Evert), and at 2019 Roland Garros (I. Vondrousova)
- One of nine active players to reach a major SF on hard, grass and clay: also Azarenka, Bouchard, Clijsters, Halep, Kvitova, Muguruza, S.Williams and V.Williams
- Also advanced to QF at 2017 Australian Open, 2019 Wimbledon and 2019 US Open

# **ROLAND GARROS**

- Making main draw debut at Roland Garros this year, having fallen in qualifying in 2019 (I. Juvan)
- Won the girls' singles title here in 2018, defeating her good friend and doubles partner McNally in the final.
   Was youngest to win the title since Hingis in 1993
- Is among 10 former junior champions in 2020 draw
- Playing fifth Grand Slam main draw this fortnight; win-loss record is 8-4
- Youngest of 11 teenagers in draw (also Jacquemot, Tauson, Fernandez, Parry, Kostyuk, Anisimova, Rakhimova, Burel, Juvan and Swiatek
- A teenager has won a Grand Slam singles title 34 times (13 different players), most recently Andreescu at 2019 US Open
- Faces No.13 Konta in 1r today. Owns three Top 20 wins: No.8 Bertens (2019 Linz), No.4 Osaka (2020 Australian Open), No.11 Sabalenka (2020 Lexington)
- Holds 3-1 record in 1r at the majors, with sole loss at this stage coming at 2020 US Open (I. Sevastova)
- Bidding to advance beyond 1r on her main draw debut at all four majors, having previously defeated V.Williams (2019 Wimbledon), Potapova (2019 US Open) and V.Williams again (2020 Australian Open)
- Won her career first clay court match at Tour level this year at Rome (d. Jabeur, I. Muquruza in 2r)
- One of a tournament-leading 19 American women competing this fortnight

# **GRAND SLAM HISTORY**

- On Grand Slam main draw debut, became first 15-year-old to reach R16 at Wimbledon - and also appear on Centre Court - since Hingis in 1996 (I. eventual champion Halep)
- In 1r, defeated No.44 Venus Williams to become the youngest player (15y123d at end of tournament) to win a main draw match at Wimbledon since Capriati (15y100d) reached SF in 1991; and youngest at all Slams since Kournikova (15y93d) advanced to R16 at 1996 US Open (I. Graf)
- Also competed at 2019 US Open (as WC, I. then-No.1 Osaka in 3r)
- At 2020 Australian Open, Defeated No.4 Osaka in 3r, becoming the youngest woman to beat a Top 5 opponent at WTA level since Capriati (15y163d) defeated No.3 Sabatini in QF of 1991 US Open
- Is only the third player in last 30 years to win seven or more Grand Slam matches before her 16th birthday - also Capriati (28) and Hingis (20)
- Is the first American woman in 30 years to reach the 3r in her first three majors
- As a junior, won singles title at Roland Garros in 2018 (d. McNally) and was R-Up at US Open in 2017 (I. Anisimova), aged 13 – youngest finalist in history
  - Won US Open girls' doubles title in 2018 (w/McNally)



# SEASON

- Coming off 3r showing at Rome (I. Muguruza)
- At US Open, fell 2r (I. Cirstea in 3s) after a SF appearance at the Western & Southern Open (I. eventual champion Azarenka)
- Suffered 1r defeat at Lexington (I. Bouzkova)
- Before tour's hiatus, ended losing streak by advancing to SF at Monterrey (I. Bouzkova)
- Returned to Europe in February to make 2r exit at St. Petersburg (after 1r bye, I. qualifier Dodin)

#### **CAREER MILESTONES**

- At 2017 Wimbledon became first British player since Virginia Wade in 1978 to reach Wimbledon SF (I. eventual R-Up V.Williams)
- Reached third final of 2017 season at Nottingham (I. Vekic). Also in 2017, reached SF for second year in a row at home event of Eastbourne QF defeat of World No.1 Kerber was first by a British woman over a reigning No.1 since Barker d. Evert at 1979 Boston
- Reached first Premier Mandatory final of career at 2016 Beijing (I. A.Radwanska)
- Was the non-playing alternate for WTA Finals in Singapore in 2016, narrowly missing qualification in the Top 8
- By virtue of reaching 2016 Beijing final, made WTA
  Top 10 debut becoming the first British woman to
  feature in the elite group since Durie in 1984, and the
  fourth British woman overall to do so (also Wade and
  Barker)

# SEASON

- Coming off 2r showing at Rome (d. Jabeur, I. Muguruza in 3s). Marked her first WTA main draw on clay
- Made 1r exit at US Open (I. Sevastova) her first 1r loss at a major
- Returned to tennis at Lexington, reaching the SF (I. eventual champion Brady), before 1r exit at Western & Southern Open (I. Sakkari)
- At 2h 50m, upset of No.11 Sabalenka in 2r at Lexington was the longest of her career five minutes longer than her win over Hercog at 2019 Wimbledon
- Opened 2020 season by reaching 2r at Auckland (I. Siegemund) and R16 at Australian Open (d. No.4 Osaka, I. eventual champion Kenin in 3s)

#### CAREER MILESTONES

- Enjoyed breakout season in 2019, highlighted by maiden WTA singles title at Linz (as lucky loser, d. Ostapenko in F) - earned her first Top 10 win en route to title over No.8 Bertens in QF
- At 15y214d, her title run in Linz made her youngest to win a WTA tour-level title since Vaidisova (15y177d) won Tashkent in 2004
- Also claimed maiden WTA doubles titles at Washington, DC (w/McNally, d. Sanchez/Stollar in F) and Luxembourg (w/McNally, d. Christian/Guarachi in F)
- By winning the doubles title at Washington, DC at 15 yrs, 144 days, became the youngest player to win a doubles title since May 1995 (Martina Hingis won Hamburg at 14 yrs, 219 days)
- Reached R16 at 2019 Wimbledon on Grand Slam main draw debut (I. eventual champion Halep) - followed with 3r showing at US Open (as WC, I. Osaka)
- Finished 2019 season ranked No.69, having started the year ranked No.685
- Made WTA main draw debut at 2019 Miami (as WC, I. Kasatkina in 2r)
- Made ITF debut in May 2018 as a qualifier into the \$25K ITF/Osprey, FL—USA, where she won her first professional match (as qualifier, I. Stewart in R16)
- Finished 2018 season with a WTA ranking of No.875
- Former junior World No.1 (July 2018)

- Won career-first singles title at 2016 Stanford in maiden final (d. V.Williams in F). First British woman to reach final of a Premier event since WTA Roadmap was introduced in 2009
- Broke into Top 20 on June 6, 2016 (at No.18) first British woman in Top 20 for nearly 30 years (the week of October 13, 1986, with Durie at No.20)
- Was voted WTA Most Improved Player in 2016 by international media and fans
- Made tour-level main draw debut at 2011 Copenhagen

# **ROLAND GARROS**

- Making her 13th appearance at Roland Garros
- Best result in Paris came with SF run in 2013 (I. eventual R-Up Sharapova)
- Made QF stage in 2009 (d. defending champion Ivanovic in R16, I. Safina) and 2011 (I. Li)
- Doubles R-Up in 2009 (w/Vesnina, I. Median Garrigues/Ruano Pascual) and mixed doubles champion in 2008 (w/B.Bryan d. Srebotnik/Zimonjic)
- Last year in Paris, led 6-4 4-2 before eventually losing to top seed Osaka in 2r
- Contesting 51st major this fortnight one of 10 active players to reach the half century of appearances
- Owns 133-47 win-loss record across the Slams fourth-most wins (after S.Williams - 356, V.Williams - 269 and Kuznetsova - 153)
- Faces Kovinic in 1r today; last loss to a player outside Top 50 at a major was against No.110 Siegemund at 2019 Australian Open
- Record in Grand Slam 1r matches stands at 41-9
- One of seven players who have held the WTA World No.1 singles ranking and one of 11 Grand Slam winners in this year's starting field
- Is one of four mothers in this year's Roland Garros field – also Pironkova, Tig and S.Williams. At this year's US Open she made history alongside S.Williams by becoming the first pair of mothers to reach the semifinals of the same Grand Slam
- Won sole clay court title at Marbella in 2011
- Currently ranked No.14 her highest ranking since returning to the tour from maternity leave in 2017 – and seeded for the first time at a major since returning from maternity leave in 2017
- · Is one of 26 thirtysomethings in this year's draw

# **GRAND SLAM HISTORY**

- Contested landmark 50th major at 2020 US Open one of nine active players to reach this milestone
- Two-time major champion, winning Australian Open in 2012 (d. Sharapova in F) and 2013 (d. Li in F)

- Made 2r here in 2015 (d. Koukalova, I. Mladenovic)
- Also fell 1r here on Grand Slam main draw debut in 2014 (as qualifier, I. Flipkens), 2016 (I. Kvitova) and 2017 (I. Konjuh) and in qualifying 2018 and 2019
- Faces No.14 Azarenka in 1r today; owns two Top 20 wins in her career, over No.8 Vinci at 2016 Madrid and No.10 Bencic at 2020 Rome
- In terms of ranking, best win at a major was over No.65 Krunic at 2015 US Open
- Owns 5-13 record in Grand Slam matches, and 5-8 in 1r matches
- Is the sole player from Montenegro within the WTA Top 500. Reached a career high of No.46 on February 22, 2016
- In 2019, captured three ITF singles titles on clay at \$25K ITF/Campinas-BRA, \$25K ITF/Ystad-SWE and \$100K ITF/Szekesfehervar 3-HUN. Also reached the final at WTA 125K event at Bastad (I. Doi in F)

# **GRAND SLAM HISTORY**

- Made 13th Grand Slam main draw appearance at 2020 US Open, reaching the 2r of a Slam for the fifth time in her career
- Has also reached 2r at 2015 Roland Garros (I. Mladenovic), 2015 US Open (I. Schmiedlova), 2016 Australian Open (I. Azarenka) and 2017 Australian Open (I. Bacsinszky)
- Starting at 2017 US Open, fell in qualifying on nine successive occasions before breaking the streak at 2020 Australian Open

- Made 2r at US Open (I. Linette) following a qualifying exit at Western & Southern Open

- Opened 2020 campaign with 1r exit at Australian

- Making her fourth appearance at Roland Garros in what is her 13th career Grand Slam main draw
- Fell 1r on her Grand Slam main draw debut in 2015 (as qualifier, I. Konjuh)
- Also made 1r exits in 2016 (I. Stephens) and 2019 (I. Blinkova)
- Was leading 4-0 in final set against Blinkova here in 2019 before eventually falling to her compatriot 8-6
- Advanced to doubles SF here in 2016 (w/Kuznetsova, I. eventual champions Garcia/Mladenovic)
- Owns 7-12 win-loss record at the Grand Slams and 5-7 in 1r matches at the majors
- Faces No.20 Mertens today in their second career meeting. Sole Top 50 win at a major came over then-No.19 Errani in 1r at 2016 Australian Open
- Owns three other wins over Top 20 players in her career: No.19 Ka.Pliskova (2016 Doha), No.10 Bertens (2018 Linz) and No.7 Svitolina (2019 Birmingham)
- Went 3-5 on clay in 2019 only wins came during SF run at Istanbul (I. Martic via ret.)
- One of 12 Russians in this year's main draw. Only other country with more players represented in the draw is the United States (19)

- Best result here is reaching R16 in 2018 (d. No.8 Kvitova in 3r, I. eventual R-Up Stephens)
- Also made 2r in 2017 (I. Muguruza)
- Owns 4-4 record at Roland Garros and 26-20 record across the Slams
- Faces No.45 Garcia today in their fourth career meeting, most recently defeating the Frenchwoman just 12 days ago in 1r at Rome; prior to Rome, had also defeated Garcia on clay en route to the 2019 Stuttgart final (I. Kvitova)

- At 2016 Roland Garros, teamed up with Mladenovic to win first Grand Slam doubles title. They were the first French pair to win the doubles title at Roland Garros since 1971, when Gail Chanfreau and Francoise Durr triumphed

- Faces Kontaveit in 1r today; in terms of ranking, a win today would be the best of her career at Roland Garros (previously No.40 Begu during 2018 R16 run)
- Today marks her third meeting against a Top 30 ranked opponent in 2020, having defeated No.3 Ka.Pliskova at US Open and lost to No.21 Kontaveit at Rome
- Owns 21-12 record in Grand Slam 1r matches, with most recent defeat at this stage coming at 2019 US Open (I. Jabeur)
- One of 11 French players in main draw third best represented after USA (19) and Russia (12)

- Making seventh main draw appearance at Roland Garros, with best result coming on first two outings here, reaching 2r on her Grand Slam debut in 2013 (as qualifier, I. Hampton) and posting a tie for career-best showing at a major by reaching 3r in 2014 (I. Muguruza) - also reached 3r at 2015 US Open (I. Kvitova)
- Has fallen 1r on last four appearances, in 2015 (I. Van Uytvanck), 2016 (I. Muguruza), 2018 (I. Begu) and 2019 (I. Osaka - led 6-0 6-5 and was two points from victory)
- Has suffered opening match losses at her last 12 majors, stretching back to 2016 Australian Open (did not play a Slam in 2017 nor 2019 US Open)
- Record in Grand Slam 1r matches stands at 6-17.
   Since making main draw debut at 2013 Roland
   Garros, has compiled 8-23 record across the Grand
   Slams
- Her last victory at a Slam came 3r at 2015 US Open (d. Goerges, Kovinic)
- Highest seeding at a Slam came in Melbourne Park in 2016 (No.27)
- Faces V.Williams in 1r match owns 2-1 record against the seven-time Grand Slam champion, with wins coming at 2014 Roland Garros and 2020 Monterrey. Sole loss came at 2014 Miami
- Returned to action at Prague 125K event, where she advanced to first QF of the season before falling to eventual R-Up Cocciaretto in three sets

- Faces No.161 Schmiedlova in opening round today. Holds 72-14 record in Grand Slam 1r matches, with defeats coming at 1997 Wimbledon (I. Grzybowska), 2001 Roland Garros (I. Schett), 2006 Australian Open (I. Pironkova), 2012 Wimbledon (I. Vesnina), 2013 Roland Garros (I. U.Radwanska), 2014 Australian Open (I. Makarova), 2015 Roland Garros (I. Stephens), 2016 Australian Open (I. Konta), 2018 Australian Open (I. Bencic), 2018 Roland Garros (I. Wang), 2019 Roland Garros (I. Svitolina), 2019 Wimbledon (I. Gauff), 2020 Australian Open (I. - Currently ranked No.75 her lowest position since being No.87 on April 2, 2012
- Joint second place with Halep among active players for clay court titles, with nine, behind S.Williams (13); most recent title on the surface came at 2010 Acapulco

### **GRAND SLAM HISTORY**

- Playing 87th Grand Slam main draw appearance, the most in the Open Era
- Is a seven-time Grand Slam singles champion, winning Wimbledon five times: 2000-01 2005 and 2007-08. Also won US Open in 2000 (d. Davenport in F) and 2001 (d. S.Williams in F)
- In addition, a nine-time Grand Slam R-Up across all four majors: Wimbledon (2002-03, 2009 and 2017), US Open (1997, 2002), Roland Garros (2002) and Australian Open (2003, 2017)

- In mixed doubles, won Australian Open (w/Gimelstob) and Roland Garros (w/Gimelstob, d. S.Willams/Lobo in F) in 1998

- Coming off 2r exit at Istanbul (I. Sasnovich)
- Returned to action at Prague 125K event, where she advanced to first QF of the season before falling to eventual R-Up Cocciaretto in three sets
- Prior to hiatus, suffered 1r exit at Acapulco (I. Potapova) and fell 2r at Monterrey (as qualifier, d. V.Williams, I. Bouzkova)
- Posted first wins of the season by triumphing in both Fed Cup matches against Great Britain, defeating Dart and Watson
- Suffered 1r exit at Australian Open (I. Bencic)
- Opened season with qualifying exits at Brisbane and Hobart

### SEASON

- Coming off 1r losses at Western and Southern Open (I. Yastremska), US Open (I. Muchova) and Rome (I. Azarenka); loss at Flushing Meadows was first at the opening hurdle in her home major in 22 appearances
- Posted 2r showing at Lexington; snapped five-match losing streak with victory over fellow former No.1 Azarenka in 1r, before falling to sister Serena in 2r in what was the 31st career meeting between the sisters
- The win over Azarenka marked her first main draw win of 2020, having fallen in the opening round this year at the Australian Open (I. Gauff), Acapulco (I. Juvan) and Monterrey (I. Schmiedlova)

#### **CAREER MILESTONES**

- Ended 2019 ranked No.53, down from No.40 in 2018
- Reached four QFs across 2019, including Auckland (I. eventual R-Up Andreescu), Indian Wells (I. eventual R-Up Kerber), Birmingham (I. eventual champion Barty) and Cincinnati (I. eventual champion Keys)
- Scored her best win of the season at Indian Wells, ousting No.3 Kvitova in 3s. Also defeated defending champion and then-ranked No.5 in Cincinnati

- At Grand Slam level in 2016, advanced to SF at Wimbledon (I. Kerber) which was first time reaching that stage at a major since 2010 US Open
- At 2016 Rio Olympics won silver medal in the mixed doubles (w/Ram, I. Mattek-Sands/Sock)
- Returned to Top 10 for first time since March 2011 following victory in final of the 2015 WTA Elite Trophy
- Was diagnosed with Sjögrens Syndrome in 2011, missing the end of that season and start of 2012
- Won singles gold medal at 2000 Sydney Olympics (d. Dementieva in F); won doubles gold three times with sister Serena, at Sydney, Beijing and London
- Spent 11 weeks at World No.1 in singles (first ascended to top spot week of February 25, 2002) and topped the doubles rankings for eight weeks in 2010
- Made WTA main draw debut at Oakland in 1994; as unranked WC, defeated Stafford in 1r before falling to then-world No.2 Sánchez Vicario in three sets
