ROLAND GARROS - ROUND OF 16 (BOTTOM HALF)

FIONA FERRO (FRA #49) vs. [4] SOFIA KENIN (USA #6)

Kenin leads 1-0

Ferro is in the midst of an 18-match winning streak - 8 at tour level (all on clay)...Kenin is one of two players (also Kvitova) to reach R16 at the three Slams this year

[7] PETRA KVITOVA (CZE #11) vs. ZHANG SHUAI (CHN #39)

Kvitova leads 3-2

Kvitova is one win away from returning to the Top 10 - she needs to reach QFs which would push her to No.9...A win today would make Zhang just the second Chinese player to post at least three QF runs at majors (also Li Na)

[30] ONS JABEUR (TUN #35) vs. DANIELLE COLLINS (USA #57)

First meeting

With Jabeur's advancement to the R16, ensures players from five different continents are competing in the fourth round...This is the ninth consecutive year at least one American has reached R16 in Paris

LAURA SIEGEMUND (GER #66) vs. PAULA BADOSA (ESP #87)

Series tied 1-1 (played in ITFs)

Today's match ensures an unseeded quarterfinalist in Paris for the ninth year in a row...At 32 years old, Siegemund is the fourth oldest player to make her R16 debut in the Open Era

IN GOOD COMPANY

Iga Swiatek is the **youngest player** remaining in the draw and only teenager at 19 years, 132 days old. The next youngest player remaining is Sofia Kenin (21 years, 330 days) followed by Paula Badosa (22 years, 329 days)

This is **Swiatek's** third time advancing to the R16 at a Slam (and first career QF appearance). Other players recently to **reach the R16 three times before their 20th birthday** includes: Belinda Bencic, Caroline Wozniacki, Victoria Azarenka, Agnieszka Radwanska, Nicole Pietrangeli, Ana Ivanovic and Maria Sharapova.

¡VAMOS ARGENTINA!

Nadia Podoroska is enjoying a year to remember. Having started the campaign ranked No.255, the 23-year-old is now **guaranteed to break into the Top 100 for the first time** after her run through qualifying to the quarter-finals.

Victory over Anna Karolina Schmiedlova in the third round was the **41st win of a remarkable 2020 campaign** (including Fed Cup, ITF Circuit and qualifying matches).

With her victory over fellow surprise package **Barbora Krejčíková** she has become the **first Argentinian woman to reach the last eight in Paris** since Paola Suárez's semifinal showing in 2004.

QUALIFIED SUCCESS

Nadia Podoroska and **Martina Trevisan** did not have a Grand Slam main draw win between them heading into the Roland Garros fortnight.

However, the duo have successfully cleared the opening four hurdles to reach the quarterfinal stage, becoming **the first qualifiers to go all the way to the quarterfinals** since Yaroslava Shvedova in 2012:

AGE JUST A NUMBER

There are 3 players who are 30+ years old who have advanced to the fourth round: **Laura Siegemund** (32 years, 220 days), **Zhang Shuai** (31 years, 262 days) and **Petra Kvitová** (30 years, 216 days).

The average age of the R16 players is **25.75 years**.

NO TALL ORDER

At 5' 3" **Martina Trevisan** is certainly not the tallest player on tour. However, she is not the only player in this height bracket enjoying themselves in Paris this fortnight. In fact, six of the players remaining in the draw stand 5' 7" or under - Fiona Ferro, Ons Jabeur, Sofia Kenin, Nadia Podoroska, Laura Siegemund and Trevisan.

ROLAND GARROS

- Making sixth main draw appearance (seventh overall) at Roland Garros, where she is through to R16 at a Slam for the first time
- Previous best result here was 2r showing in 2018 (as WC, l. Muguruza); 1r win over Witthoef that year marked not only first main draw win in Paris, but across the Grand Slams
- Last year - on first direct entry into the tournament - fell 1r (l. Mladenovic)
- Defeated No.56 Watson in 1r on Tuesday in straight sets, having not won a set in their previous two meetings this year at Brisbane and Hobart
- Reeled off the final five games of the match to upset No.18 Rybakina in 2r
- Now owns three Top 20 wins in her career, having previously seen off No.16 Q.Wang at 2019 Strasbourg and No.20 Kontaveit at 2020 Palermo
- In a battle between two clay court champions this year, survived an 85-minute first set then took the third 6-0 to beat No.59 Tig in 2 hours 48 and minutes; one of six players to reach the second week of a Grand Slam for the first time in their careers this fortnight
- Overall Grand Slam win-loss record improves to 7-9
- Is in the midst of an 18-match winning streak – 8 at tour level (all on clay), 10 from exhibition events before the tour's resumption
- One of 11 Frenchwomen in this year's main draw. Through to the R16 along with Garcia (l. Svitolina on Sunday) - this is the second time in the last 11 editions at Roland Garros that two or more Frenchwomen have advanced to the fourth round, also in 2017: Mladenovic QF, Garcia QF and Cornet R16
- Faces No.6 Kenin for maiden Grand Slam QF; only previous meetings with Top 10 players both came at this home major – lost to No.10 A.Radwanska in 2017 and No.3 Muguruza in 2018
- With Garcia's loss yesterday, is now the only Frenchwoman left in the draw. Bidding to become the first Frenchwoman to reach QF in a major since 2017 Roland Garros, where Garcia and Mladenovic were through to the last eight
- Best results from a home representative last year were 2r showings by Garcia, Mladenovic and Parry. The last Frenchwoman to win the title here was Mary Pierce in 2000 (d. Martinez in F)
- Contesting this fortnight ranked No.49, five spots off career-high ranking of No.44 (achieved on August 10, 2020), still highest at majors
- Both of her WTA titles have come on clay, at 2020 Palermo and 2019 Lausanne
- Including title run at Lausanne, posted a 12-5 record on clay last year, also reaching SF at Lugano (l. Hercog)

ROLAND GARROS

- Making third main draw appearance at Roland Garros (fourth overall)
- Last year in Paris, advanced to R16 for the first time at a major (l. eventual champion Barty)
- In 3r during 2019 run became first American to defeat S.Williams at the majors since Stephens at 2013 Australian Open QF
- One of two Grand Slam champions left in the draw (also Kvitova) out of eleven to begin fortnight, though the only 2020 Grand Slam champion to contest
- Pushed to three sets in the opening round, fired 26 winners and broke Samsonova's serve six times to defeat the Russian
- Completed comeback victory over No.93 Bogdan in 3r. Is now 8-3 in three-set matches in 2020
- From 0-2 down, won 12 games in a row to dispatch No.142 Bara in 3r; with this victory, 9th consecutive year at least one American has reached R16 at Roland Garros
- Now is 4-3 in 3r matches at Grand Slams, with all three 3r exits at the majors taking place at US Open in 2017 (l. Sharapova), 2018 (l. Ka.Pliskova) and 2019 (l. Keys)
- Owns a 24-12 mark across all four majors with a 13-1 record in 2020; no one has won more main draw matches at this level this year
- One of two players (along with Kvitova) to reach R16 at the three Slams this year (WON Australian Open, R16 US Open);
- Faces No.49 Ferro for second appearance in Grand Slam QF; record in R16 matches at majors stands at 1-2
- Outside US Open, only the second time facing an opponent playing on home soil at a Slam, having beaten No.1 Barty at Australian Open this year en route to the title
- One of a tournament-leading 19 Americans in main draw; by contrast there were 17 last year
- Has won two titles this season (Australian Open and Lyon) – only other woman to win more than one is Halep (Dubai, Prague and Rome)
- Has never reached a WTA QF on clay, with her best result on the surface last year's R16 run here
- No.9 seed in doubles w/Mattek-Sands. The pair face No.8 seeds Kudrmetova/S.Zhang in 3r on Sunday

GRAND SLAM HISTORY

- Contesting 10th Grand Slam main draw at 2020 Roland Garros
- Contested main draw at all four Slams in 2019 for the first time in career
- Best result was 2019 3r showing at US Open (l. Wang)
- Also reached 2r at 2018 Roland Garros (l. Muguruza) and 2020 Australian Open (l. Wang)
- Fell 1r at 2019 Wimbledon in London debut (l. Mertens)

SEASON

- Won second career title in first and only tournament since the restart at Palermo (d. Kontaveit in F)
- Result shot her to a career high ranking of No.44 and first time in the Top 50
- Leading up to the tour's resumption, performed well at a series of exhibitions in the south of France, posting a 10-0 record including wins over Mladenovic and Cornet
- Only wins of 2020 season before tennis' hiatus were during 2r showings at Hobart (l. Watson), Australian Open (l. Q.Wang) and St. Petersburg (as LL, l. Rybakina)
- Began 2020 season with 1r exit at Brisbane (l. Watson)

CAREER MILESTONES

- Enjoyed career-best season in 2019, lifting maiden WTA title in her career first tour-level final at Lausanne (d. Cornet in F); posted first Top 100 year-end finish (No.63)
- Reached one additional SF in 2019 at Lugano and the QF on two other occasions at Strasbourg and Palermo
- Contested the main draw at all four Grand Slams for the first time in 2019, achieving her best result at the majors by reaching the 3r at the US Open (l. No.18 seed Q.Wang)
- Member of the French Fed Cup squad that were crowned 2019 Fed Cup champions, beating Australia away from home in November
- Finished 2018 ranked No.102 highlighted by maiden WTA QF at Guangzhou (l. eventual champion Q.Wang). Also made 2r at Roland Garros, Tashkent and Luxembourg and won first four titles on ITF Circuit
- Prior to 2018 Roland Garros had lost 1r on eight previous tour-level main draw appearances
- Ended 2017 ranked No.325 (down from No.235 in 2016)

GRAND SLAM HISTORY

- Won maiden Grand Slam in Melbourne, defeating two-time major champion Muguruza to become the youngest champion (21y, 80d) at Australian Open since Sharapova (20y, 283d) in 2008
- Before 2020 Australian Open, best Slam result was R16 run at 2019 Roland Garros (l. eventual champion Barty); in 3r became first American to beat S.Williams at a majors since Stephens at 2013 AO QF
- Made Slam main draw debut at 2015 US Open as a wildcard – received for being crowned USTA Girls' 18s National Champion. Fell 1r to Duque Mariño
- Reached 3r at 2017 US Open as a wildcard (l. Sharapova), in what was only fourth tour-level main draw outing. Has since posted best US Open result with R16 run in 2020
- Made 2r at Wimbledon in 2018-19

SEASON

- Fell 2r at Rome (after 1r bye, l. Azarenka 6-0 6-0 - the only time she has lost by that scoreline in her career)
- Advanced to R16 at 2020 US Open (l. Mertens)
- Suffered 2r exit at Western and Southern Open (after 1r bye, l. Cornet)
- Before hiatus, lifted fifth WTA singles title at Lyon (d. Friedsam in F); now 5-1 in WTA singles finals
- Suffered 1r exit at Dubai (l. Rybakina) before falling 2r at Doha (l. Yastremska)
- Won deciding doubles rubber w/Mattek-Sands to help USA beat Latvia 3-2 and qualify for next year's Fed Cup finals in Budapest; also went 1-1 in singles
- Made her Top 10 debut at No.7 and US No.1 on February 3
- Won maiden major at Australian Open (d. Muguruza in F) to become the youngest champion (21y, 80d) in Melbourne since Sharapova (20y, 283d) in 2008
- Kicked off season with 2r showings at Brisbane (l. Osaka) and Adelaide (l. Collins)

CAREER MILESTONES

- Produced incredible 2019 campaign, winning three singles titles, a career-best Grand Slam performance, qualification into both WTA Elite Trophy Zhuhai and WTA Finals (as alternate, played one match), and a career-high singles ranking of No.12
- Finished the year as US No.2 (behind No.9 S.Williams) and leader in hard court wins (38-tied w/Barty)
- Registered back-to-back SF runs at Cincinnati and Toronto, subsequently leading to Top 20 debut
- During this run, defeated No.1 Barty (Toronto) and

ROLAND GARROS

- Making 11th main draw appearance in Paris
- Missed 2019 edition due to an arm injury
- Best result here was SF finish in 2012 (l. eventual champion Sharapova)
- Other notable results were a handful of R16 visits (2008, 2011, 2015, 2020)
- Did not compete in any lead-up clay events following this year's US Open
- Is 112-44 at Slams, including 26-10 here in Paris; sits at No.6 on active players list of most career Grand Slam victories
- Defeated No.118 Dodin in 1r on Monday for her 10th 1r victory in Paris (10-1 record). Sole 1r loss here came 10 years ago in 2010 (l. Ferguson)
- Dispatched No.94 Paolini in straight sets in 2r to notch her milestone 25th victory at Roland Garros; now holds an impressive 31-7 career record in 2r at the majors
- From 1-5 down, won nine consecutive games while saving two set points in the process to see off Canadian teenager Leylah Fernandez in 3r, which marks her 90th career win on clay; now owns a 21-10 strike rate in 3r of majors
- One of two players (along with Kenin) to reach R16 at the three Slams this year (QF at Australian Open, R16 US Open)
- Faces No.39 Zhang Shuai for a spot in QF; leads the head-to-head 3-2, while the pair split two previous meetings on clay – defeated the Chinese player in their most recent encounter at 2018 Prague en route to the title
- Record in Grand Slam R16 matches is 12-8, includes 1-3 here in Paris
- Is one win away from returning to the Top 10. She needs to reach the QF which would push her to No.9
- Entering this week, has won 62% of her service points - the third best on Tour this season behind Brady (62.6%) and Rybakina (62.2%)
- One of three 30-somethings remaining in this year's draw, of 26 to begin the tournament (also, Siegemund and Zhang)
- Sole Czech woman left in the draw out of 9 to begin fortnight
- Has been a Top 16 seed here in Paris the last five seasons
- Owns five clay titles in her career, winning Madrid (2011, 2015 and 2018), Prague (2018) and Stuttgart (2019) - level with Svitolina as the sixth most successful active player on the surface
- Holds 27 titles overall, sitting No.4 on active players list for most titles won

ROLAND GARROS

- Making 10th main draw appearance at Roland Garros (11th overall), where she is through to R16 for the first time
- Previously made it to 3r in 2017 (l. No.9 Kuznetsova)
- Also made 2r in 2016, 2018 and 2019
- Advanced to doubles QF here in 2019 w/Stosur (l. eventual champions Babos/Mladenovic); seeded No.8 in this year's draw w/Kudermetova (face No.9 seeds Kenin/Mattek-Sands in R16)
- In 1r upset No.16 Keys to register her sixth career Top 20 win at a major and second Top 20 win on clay
- Broke serve six times to defeat French No.4 Cornet in 2r
- Saved three consecutive set points in first set to edge past French wildcard Burel in 3r – also defeated the hometown favorite two weeks ago in Strasbourg after saving two set points in second set
- One of four players who advanced to second week without dropping a set – also Kvitova, Halep and Swiatek; now has won a tiebreak set in each of her first three matches this fortnight (four out of five recent matches)
- Became the first Chinese player to make R16 in Paris since Li Na in 2012, and the third overall (also J.Zheng in 2004);
- Overall Grand Slam singles win-loss record now stands at 28-32; has reached second week in three Grand Slams across hardcourt, grass and clay
- Faces No.11 Kvitova for third appearance in Grand Slam QF; won both previous R16 matches at majors, beating No.17 Keys at 2016 Australian Open and No.35 Yastremska at 2019 Wimbledon
- Owns six Top 20 wins at Grand Slams (18 wins overall), most recently defeating No.16 Keys in 1r this fortnight; Prior to this year's Roland Garros, sole victory over such opponent on clay came at 2014 Rome, where she upset No.6 Kvitova in 3 sets
- Is only Chinese player in the women's singles draw this year. Aiming to become just the second Chinese player to make QF in Paris – Li Na went all the way to win the tournament in 2011
- A win today will also make her the second Chinese player to post at least three QF runs at majors (also Li Na)
- Best career results on clay were SF run at 2018 Prague and QF showings at 2020 Strasbourg and 2014 Rome

GRAND SLAM HISTORY

- Winner of two major singles titles: 2011 Wimbledon (d. Sharapova) and 2014 Wimbledon (d. Bouchard)
- Was first player born in 1990s to win a Grand Slam title (since joined by Muguruza, Ostapenko, Stephens, Wozniacki, Halep, Osaka, Barty and Kenin)
- Best result at Australian Open came with runner-up finish in 2019 (l. Osaka) – becoming first Czech woman to reach the final there since Novotna in 1991 (l. Seles); last Czech to win the Australian Open title was Mandlikova in 1987 (d. Navratilova)

SEASON

- Advanced to R16 at US Open, falling to Rogers in 3 sets after holding match points
- Posted 2r exit at Western & Southern Open (after 1r bye, l. Bouzkova) - main draw record vs. fellow Czechs now 36-5
- Before the hiatus, last tournament contested was Doha, finishing as R-Up (l. Sabalenka); now 27-10 in WTA singles finals
- Defeat of Barty in Doha SF was sixth career win over a reigning World No.1
- Advanced to QF at St Petersburg (withdrew prior to match vs. Alexandrova w/illness)
- Made 12th major QF at Australian Open (l. Barty)
- Opened season at Brisbane, reaching SF (l. R-Up Keys) before withdrawing from Adelaide w/fatigue

CAREER MILESTONES

- Ended 2019 ranked No.7 for second consecutive year ending in Top 10 and seventh time in her career
- Captured 26th and 27th career titles in 2019 at Sydney (d. Barty) and Stuttgart (d. Kontaveit). With 27 titles, is currently tied with Mandlikova and Sabatini in 20th place (Open Era)
- Reached title match at 2019 Australian Open for third career Grand Slam final appearance – result moved her to World No.2, matching her career high ranking
- Also in 2019, qualified for WTA Finals in Shenzhen for seventh time (went 0-3 in group play)
- Won a WTA-leading five titles in 2018, at St Petersburg (d. Mladenovic in F), Doha (d. Muguruza in F), Prague (d. Buzarnescu in F), Madrid (d. Bertens in F) and Birmingham (d. Rybarikova in F). Ended the year ranked No.7 – sixth career Top 10 finish, and first since 2015 (up fro No.29 in 2017)
- Titles in 2018 came on all three surfaces – first player to win a title on three difference surfaces in a season since S.Williams in 2015
- Including 2019, has won at least one title every year dating back to 2011

GRAND SLAM HISTORY

- Made Slam singles breakthrough at 2016 Australian Open, where she came through qualifying to reach QF – first time she had progressed beyond 1r in what was her 15th main draw. Upset No.2 Halep and No.17 Keys en route (l. Konta). Ranked No.133, became lowest-ranked player to advance to last eight in Melbourne since unranked Henin reached final in 2010, and first qualifier since Gavaldon in 1990
- Also reached QF at 2019 Wimbledon (d. No.14 Wozniacki in 3r, l. eventual champion Halep). Had previously not gone beyond 1r at Wimbledon
- Has reached 3r at US Open at 2016, 2017 and 2019
- At Roland Garros, best result is R16 in 2020
- Won first Grand Slam doubles title at 2019 Australian Open (w/Stosur)

SEASON

- Made QF last week at Strasbourg (as qualifier, l. Rybakina)
- On tour's return, suffered 1r exits at Western & Southern Open, US Open and Rome (l. Putintseva, Bonaventure and Pavlyuchenkova respectively)
- Fell 1r at Doha (l. Navarro) and also contested qualifying at Dubai (l. Bogdan, after holding 1MP)
- Made 3r at Australian Open (d. Stephens in 1r, l. eventual champion Kenin)
- Opened the 2020 season with 2r exit at Shenzhen (l. K.Bondarenko) and finished R-Up at Hobart (l. Rybakina); also R-Up in doubles at Hobart w/Peng

CAREER MILESTONES

- In singles, posted fourth successive Top 50 season finishing 2019, at No.46; also registered first Top 10 doubles season (at No.10)
- Singles highlight in 2019 was reaching second Grand Slam singles QF of career at Wimbledon (l. eventual champion Halep)
- Also in singles, reached final at WTA125K Series event in Anning, China (l. S.Zheng) and closed out season by winning \$100k ITF/Tokyo-JPN (d.Paolini in F)
