## 2020 ROLAND GARROS

The first national French Championships for women were held in 1897, with foreign competitors eligible to take part from 1925. As such, this year’s Roland Garros represents the 113th staging of the event overall, and the 90th edition since international players were admitted (the tournament was not held during WWI and WWII). 2020 Roland Garros also marks the 53rd staging of the Open Era (which began in 1968). Of the 128 players in the singles main draw, 108 gain direct entry based on WTA Singles Rankings (for week of August 17, 2020). In addition, there are 12 qualifiers who play three rounds of qualifying matches, as well as eight wildcards.

### WORLD NO.1 ON THE LINE

The fortnight of 2020 Roland Garros will be **Ashleigh Barty’s** 33rd and 34th consecutive weeks at World No.1. With Simona Halep winning the title in Rome, she now has a chance to return to No.1 at Roland Garros and overtake Barty atop the WTA Rankings.

Halep, a quarterfinalist last year at Roland Garros and the champion in 2018, would need to win the title in order to do so. By winning the title in Rome, Halep’s ranking points increase to 7255. A title run at Roland Garros would allow Halep to add +1570 ranking points (2000 points for the title, replacing 430 points for 2019 QF run), pushing her total to 8825.

Under the revised ranking system, as Barty is not playing at Roland Garros, her ranking point total will stay at 8717.

## ACTIVE GRAND SLAM CHAMPIONS

The 2020 season has already welcomed one new Grand Slam champion: **Sofia Kenin** won her maiden Grand Slam singles title at Melbourne Park in January; and seen another champion add to her total: **Naomi Osaka** won her third Grand Slam title just a few weeks ago at the US Open. There are 16 active Grand Slam champions, six of whom have lifted the trophy previously at Roland Garros: Ashleigh Barty (2019), Simona Halep (2018), Svetlana Kuznetsova (2009), Garbiñe Muguruza (2016), Jelena Ostapenko (2017) and Serena Williams (2002, 2013, 2015).

**STRONG OFF THE BLOCKS – FIRST-ROUND SUCCESS**

Of those players with 10 or more Grand Slam appearances in this year’s Roland Garros draw, here are the players with the best strike rate in the opening round at a Grand Slam:

- **Serena Williams (74-1 in 1r):** Serena’s lone opening round loss at a Grand Slam came at 2012 Roland Garros (I. Razzano) making it 28 straight Grand Slam appearances without a 1r exit.
- **Madison Keys (28-3 in 1r):** Keys has not fallen in the first round on her past 21 major appearances. All three of her losses at this stage came in her teenage years, at 2012 Australian Open (I. J.Zheng), 2013 US Open (I. Jankovic) and 2014 Roland Garros (I. Errani)
- **Venus Williams (72-14 in 1r):** Venus has fallen in the opening round of a Grand Slam 14 times in her career most recently at the 2020 US Open (I. Muchova). Other incidents include: 1997 Wimbledon (I. Grzybowska), 2001 Roland Garros (I. Schett), 2006 Australian Open (I. Pironkova), 2012 Wimbledon (I. Vesnina), 2013 Roland Garros (I. U.Radwanska), 2014 Australian Open (I. Makarova), 2015 Roland Garros (I. Stephens), 2016 Australian Open (I. Konta), 2018 Australian Open (I. Bencic), 2018 Roland Garros (I. Q.Wang), 2019 Roland Garros (I. Svitolina), 2019 Wimbledon (I. Gauff), 2020 Australian Open (I. Gauff).
- **Garbiñe Muguruza (25-5 in 1r):** Muguruza fell 1r most recently at 2019 US Open (I. Riske) and Wimbledon (I. Haddad Maia). Prior to this, the Spaniard had not been upset in the first round in her previous 18 major appearances. Her three other defeats at this stage came on her Grand Slam debut at 2012 US Open (I. J. Errani), 2014 Wimbledon (I. Vandeweghe) and 2014 US Open (I. Lucic-Baroni)
- **Victoria Azarenka (41-9 in 1r):** Azarenka enjoyed 22 straight Grand Slam appearances without falling in the 1r during the years 2010-2016. Three of her 1r losses came at her first three career Grand Slam main draws at 2006 Australian Open (as qualifier, I. Mirza), 2006 Roland Garros (as qualifier, I. Medina Garrigues) and 2006 Wimbledon (I. Radwanska). However, five of her 1r losses have come at Roland Garros. and she has seen three 1r losses since returning to the tour from maternity leave at 2018 Roland Garros (I. Siniakova), 2019 Australian Open (I. Siegemund) and 2019 US Open (I. Sabalenka). Her other 1r exits came at 2007 Roland Garros (I. Knapp), 2010 Roland Garros (I. Dulko), 2016 Roland Garros (I. Knapp).

The oldest women’s singles champion at Roland Garros all-time is Zsuzsi Kormoczy of Hungary, who was 33 years, 279 days of age when she won in 1958. The oldest champion in the Open Era is Serena Williams of USA, who won her second Roland Garros title at the age of 33 years, 254 days in 2015.

## MUM’S THE WORD

There are four mothers this year’s Roland Garros field:

**Victoria Azarenka, Tsvetana Pironkova, Patricia Maria Tig and Serena Williams.**

At this year’s US Open, Azarenka and Williams made history by becoming the first pair of mothers to reach the semifinals of the same Grand Slam.



## ROLAND GARROS MISCELLANY

- The 113th staging of the women’s singles at French Championships (having first been played in 1897)
- Only three times, in 1933 (**Margaret Scriven**), 2010 (**Francesca Schiavone**) and 2017 (**Jelena Ostapenko**) has the women’s singles title at Roland Garros not been won by a Top 10 seed
- The players who have won the most Roland Garros singles titles (in the tournament’s entire history) are **Chris Evert** (7); **Stefanie Graf** (6); **Margaret Smith Court** (5); **Justine Henin** and **Helen Wills-Moody** (4); and **Hilde Sperling**, **Monica Seles**, **Arantxa Sánchez-Vicario** and **Serena Williams** (3)
- USA has won the most titles at Roland Garros (29) ahead of Germany (10), then Australia (9) and Great Britain (8)
- The players who own the most doubles titles are **Martina Navratilova** (7), **Simone Mathieu**, **Natasha Zvereva** and **Gigi Fernandez** (6 apiece)
- **Mary Pierce** was the last player to win both the singles and doubles titles in the same year (2000). **Lucie Safarova** contested both the singles and doubles finals in 2015 (finished runner-up in singles, champion in doubles)
- There are seven former or current No.1s in the 2020 main draw: **Victoria Azarenka**, **Simona Halep**, **Angelique Kerber**, **Garbiñe Muguruza**, **Karolina Pliskova**, **Serena Williams** and **Venus Williams**
- Longest match (time): 4 hours, 7 minutes – V.Buisson (FRA) d. N. Van Lottum (FRA) 67 75 62, 1r, 1995
- Longest match (games): 56 games – K Melville (AUS) d. P.Teeguarden (USA) 97 46 1614, 1r, 1972. Since the introduction of the tiebreak in 1973, the record is 46 games, which has happened twice
- A left-handed player has won the singles title 10 times (most recently, **Monica Seles** in 1992)
- The singles title has been won without dropping a set 20 times (most recently, **Justine Henin** in 2007)
- Four players have won the title after saving match point: **Osborne DuPont** (1946); **Smith-Court** (1962); **Myskina** (2004); and **Henin** (2005)
- Only six players have won the Roland Garros women’s singles title after winning the Roland Garros girls’ singles title (**Halep**, **Durr**, **Jausovec**, **Mandlikova**, **Capriati** and **Henin**)
- Previous girls’ singles winners in this year’s main draw are: **Kanepi** (2001), **Cornet** (2007), **Halep** (2008), **Mladenovic** (2009), **Svitolina** (2010), **Jabeur** (2011), **Kasatkina** (2014), **Badosa** (2015), **Gauff** (2018), **Fernandez** (2019)

- Last year, **Ashleigh Barty** won her first Grand Slam and became the first Australian to win Roland Garros since 1973.
- Two years ago, **Simona Halep** also won her first Grand Slam and became only the second Romanian to win Roland Garros after Virginia Ruzici did in 1978. It was the 19th time a No.1 seed has won the Roland Garros title.
- Three years ago, **Jelena Ostapenko** became the first unseeded player in the Open Era to win Roland Garros
- In 2011, **Li Na** won the title at Roland Garros as the No.6 seed, the first Asian to win a Grand Slam singles title
- In the Open Era, the Top 2 seeds have played in the final 12 times, with the No.2 seed winning seven times (most recently 1995)
- Thirty-one of the Roland Garros women’s titles have been won by one of the Top 2 seeds; the top seed has won the title 19 times, and the No.2 seed has won the title 12 times
- The Roland Garros final has been decided in three sets on 21 occasions, including three of the past five years
