## **TOURNAMENT TALKING POINTS**

- This season's Asian swing kicks off with the inaugural ICBC Credit Card Zhengzhou Open, which features three of the Top 10, as well as two Grand Slam champions
- Top seed is **Karolina Pliskova**, who touches down in Asia fresh from a fourth-round run at the US Open, taking her win-loss record for the season to 45-13 the most wins on tour (level with Ashleigh Barty)
- After a first-round bye, Pliskova will meet either Polona Hercog or a qualifier, while in the bottom half, No.2 seed and recent US Open semifinalist Elina Svitolina is set to take on the winner of Yulia Putintseva versus Tamara Zidansek
- The pick of the opening round matches is arguably between Alison Riske and two-time major champion Angelique Kerber – one of three wildcards in the main draw, along with Yang Zhaoxuan and Duan Yingying
- One To Watch At 22, Fiona Ferro is one of the younger players in the draw and arrives in China
  after a summer to remember, during which she won her maiden WTA title at Lausanne before
  heading stateside where she advanced to the third round on her US Open debut. Twelve months
  ago, Ferro then ranked No.124 advanced to the quarterfinals at a tour-level event for the first
  time, in Guangzhou, which proved to be the springboard for her current charge towards the Top 50
