TOURNAMENT TALKING POINTS

- World No.4 and top seed **Kiki Bertens** looks to lift her third trophy of the year and first in her home country
- Defending champion, **Aleksandra Krunic**, returns to defend her title alongside last year's runner-up, **Kirsten Flipkens**
- Three Dutch players will compete on home soil including **Bertens, Arantxa Rus** and **Bibiane Schoofs**. The last and only time 's-Hertogenbosch saw a Dutch champion was Michaëlla Krajicek in 2006.
- **Bertens** will team up with compatriot **Demi Schuurs** as a Dutch powerhouse and No.1 seed in the doubles draw
- **One To Watch – Amanda Anisimova**. The teen sensation is coming off of her first ever Grand Slam semifinal appearance at Roland Garros earning her first Top 5 win over defending champion Simona Halep before losing to eventual champion Ashleigh Barty. She was the first person, male or female, born in the 2000s to make a Grand Slam semifinal.
