TOURNAMENT TALKING POINTS

- Two-time champion **Elise Mertens** returns as the top seed. The Belgian is undefeated in Hobart and holds a 10-match winning streak set to face a qualifier in the first round
- No.4 seed Veronika Kudermetova is making her main draw debut against long-time Australian No.1 and former US Open champion Samantha Stosur. The pair have only faced each other on one occasion

 at 2014 Fed Cup with Stosur winning the match in straight sets
- Also in the draw is former champion Alizé Cornet (2016) who will open her tournament against Alison Van Uytvanck. Cornet is one of three Frenchwomen in the main draw (also Fiona Ferro and Caroline Garcia)
- One to Watch Elena Rybakina. The 20-year-old just reached her third career final in Shenzhen and having started 2019 ranked No.186 is now set to break into the Top 30. Rybakina is making her tournament debut in Hobart as the No.2 seed and faces Tamara Zidansek in the first round



WATSON:


- Making sixth appearance at Hobart International, where she was one of four former champions in the draw (also Muguruza, Cornet and Mertens)
- Has scored four Top 100 wins during her run through qualifying this week; last scored this many at a single tournament since reaching SF at 2017 Eastbourne
- Owns 4-4 record in WTA SF matches
- Ended 2019 back in the Top 100 (No.92); finished R-Up at Tianjin and won two ITF Circuit titles
- Finished 2018 just outside the Top 100 (No.101). Best year-end finish came in 2012 (No.49)
- Highlights of 2018 were SF runs at Hobart (as qualifier, l. eventual champion Mertens) and Quebec City (l. eventual champion Parmentier). Also picked up fourth career WTA doubles title at Acapulco (w/Maria) and reached doubles final at Nottingham (w/Buzarnescu)
- Won third WTA singles title of career at 2016 Monterrey (d. Flipkens in F), adding to wins at 2012 Osaka and 2015 Hobart (3-0 record in finals)
- Hit career-high singles ranking of No.38 on January 19, 2015 after title run at Hobart
- Lifetime record against Top 10 players stands at 2-17, with wins coming against No.8 A.Radwanska (2015 Indian Wells) and No.9 Cibulkova (2017 Eastbourne)
- In doubles owns four WTA titles, most recently at 2018 Acapulco (w/Maria)
- Represented Great Britain at 2016 Rio Olympics, reaching 2r in singles (I. Svitolina), 2r in doubles (w/Konta, I. H.Chan/Y.Chan) and QF in mixed doubles (w/A.Murray, I. Bopanna/Mirza)
- Struggled throughout 2014 season with a right rib injury and missed two months in 2013 due to glandular fever (Miami to Roland Garros)
- Enjoyed a breakthrough 2012 season, winning Osaka to become first British woman to win a WTA singles title since Sara Gomer in 1988. Finished year as British No.1
- With 2012 Osaka singles title, became first British woman to win a WTA singles title since Sara Gomer in 1988
- Broke into Top 100 on June 6, 2011 and made Top 50 debut on October 15, 2012
- On ITF Circuit, winner of six singles and three doubles titles
- Made WTA main draw debut as a wildcard at 2010 Miami and recorded first main draw match win at 2010 Eastbourne
- Played first professional event on ITF Circuit at 2009 ITF/Jersey-GBR
- Member of Great Britain Fed Cup Team, 2011-18 and Great Britain Olympic Team, 2012, 2016
- Born on Channel Island of Guernsey. Mother is Michelle and father is Ian; siblings are Adam, Stephanie and Julie
- Started playing at age 7; moved to Bollettieri Academy in Florida at age 12 (still trains there)
- Endorsement portfolio includes New Balance, Dunlop, Jaguar and Always



RYBAKINA:

- Making debut at Hobart International. This time last year, was ranked No.171, having recently finished R-Up at \$25K ITF Circuit event at Playford-AUS
- Following exciting QF win over Cabrera, has now won 28 of past 37 matches on tour, a sequence which began with her maiden title run at Bucharest last July
- Will be seeded for the first time at next week's Australian Open (No.29); will face Pera in 1r
- Finished 2019 season at No.37 to record first Top 50 finish of her career, up from 2018's final ranking of No.191
- During a breakout 2019 season, lifted maiden WTA singles title at Bucharest (d. Tig in F). Also advanced to second career final at Nanchang (l. Peterson) and made SF appearances at Luxembourg (l. Goerges) and 's-Hertogenbosch (l. Bertens)
- Additionally, made QF runs at Istanbul (I. Strycova), Wuhan (I. Sabalenka) and Linz (I. Osatapenko)
- Made Grand Slam main draw debut at 2019 Roland Garros, falling 1r (as qualifier, l. Siniakova). Also fell 1r at 2019 US Open (as qualifier, l. Muchova)
- On the ITF Circuit in 2019, lifted silverware on three occasions; back-to-back at \$25K Moscow-RUS and \$25K Kazan-RUS and at \$60K ITF/Launceston-AUS. Now holds four singles and four doubles titles on ITF Circuit
- Highlights of 2018 included reaching maiden WTA QF at St. Petersburg (I. Goerges) and clinching the title at \$15k ITF/Kazan-RUS
- First Top 10 win came over No.7 Garcia at 2018 St. Petersburg. Has since added the defeat of No.6 Halep (2019 Wuhan) to list of Top 10 triumphs
- Ended 2017 ranked No.425, improving 191 spots from 2016 (finished at No.616)
- Made WTA qualifying and main draw debut at 2017 Moscow (as qualifier, l. Begu in 1r)
- Coached by Stefano Vukov

ZHANG:

- Owns 2-9 career record in WTA SF matches, most recently falling at this stage at Prague, Hiroshima and Hong Kong in 2018
- Looking to become the first Chinese player to reach the singles final here at Hobart since Zheng Jie went all the way to the title in 2005
- Playing doubles this week with countrywoman Peng Shuai they advanced to SF when Watson withdrew due to injury (Watson was partnered w/Rus)
- Former doubles R-Up in Hobart in 2014 (w/Raymond)
- Has drawn No.24 seed Stephens in 1r at next week's Australian Open, and could potentially face her friend and regular doubles partner Stosur in 2r
- In singles, posted fourth successive Top 50 season finish in 2019, at No.46; also registered first Top 10 doubles
- season (at No.10)
- Singles highlight in 2019 was reaching second Grand Slam singles QF of career at Wimbledon (l. eventual champion Halep); also in singles, reached final at WTA 125K Series event in Anning, China (l. S.Zheng) and
- closed out season by winning \$100k ITF/Tokyo-JPN (d. Paolini in F)
- Won first Grand Slam title in doubles at 2019 Australian Open (w/Stosur; d. Babos/Mladenovic in F); Stosur/
- Zhang also reached final at Miami (I. Mertens/Sabalenka). Team duly qualified for WTA Finals in Shenzhen (Zhang's debut at the season finale) where they advanced to SF (I. eventual champions Babos/
- Mladenovic)
- Enjoyed Grand Slam singles breakthrough at 2016 Australian Open, where she advanced to QF first time she had progressed beyond 1r at a major in what was her 15th main draw appearance. Run also marked first time winning back-to-back main draw matches since SF showing at 2014 Birmingham
- As a qualifier during 2016 Melbourne run, defeated No.2 Halep and No.17 Keys (l. Konta). Ranked No.133, became lowest-ranked player to advance to last eight in Melbourne since unranked Henin reached final in 2010, and first qualifier to do so since Gavaldon in 1990
- Contemplated retirement after ending 2015 ranked No.186, her lowest year-end finish since 2008 (No.212) and down from No.62 in 2014
- Winner of two WTA singles titles, at 2013 Guangzhou (d. King in F) and 2017 Guangzhou (d. Krunic in F); also won WTA 125K Series events at Nanjing in 2013 and Honolulu in 2017
- In mixed doubles, reached SF at 2018 US Open (w/Peers)



- Member of Chinese Fed Cup team in 2007, 2009-10, 2012, 2014-15 and 2019; Chinese Olympic Team, 2012, 2016
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2006 Beijing; the following week, made WTA main draw debut at Guangzhou
- Winner of 21 singles titles and eight doubles titles on ITF Circuit
- Hails from a sporting family. Father, Zhang Zhi Qiang, was a professional soccer player, and mother, Wang Feng Quin was a basketball player

KUDERMETOVA:

- Defeated Australian WC Stosur in 1r this week followed by CiCi Bellis, making her comeback from wrist surgery on a Special Ranking of No.43, in 2r
- Advanced to today's SF when her intended opponent, No.2 seed Muguruza, withdrew on Thursday due to viral illness


