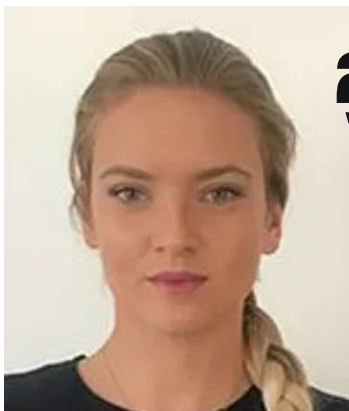

- Making first main draw appearance at Prague
- Fell in qualifying here in 2016-20
- Has beaten Samantha Murray Sharan, Asia Muhammad, Viktoria Kuzmova and Greet Minnen so far this week to reach her career first WTA Final
- Record in WTA SF matches improves to 1-3, losing at this stage to Davis at 2016 Quebec City, Kontaveit at 2017 Gstaad and Tig at 2020 Istanbul
- Faces No.13 Barbora Krejcikova in F today; owns 2 wins in career over Top 20 players, most recently No.11 Kiki Bertens at 2021 Dubai
- Owns 2-3 career record against players from Czech Republic, with record in 2021 standing at 1-0 (d. Kr.Pliskova at Dubai)
- Aiming to become fourth Czech to lift the Prague title, following Petra Kvitova in 2018, Lucie Safarova in 2016, Karolina Pliskova in 2015
- Last time 2 players from Czech Republic reached F at PRAGUE was 2015 (Ka.Pliskova d. Hradecka)
- Six Czech women have reached the final here: Ka.Pliskova (2015 WON), Hradecka (2015 R-Up), Safarova (2016 WON), Kr.Pliskova (2017 R-Up), Kvitova (2018 WON) and Muchova (2019 R-Up)
- Is currently ranked at career-high No.78, following Wimbledon 3r run
- Has won 17 main-draw matches so far in 2021; the most she had previously amassed in a singles season was five (in both 2017 and 2020)

- Has beaten Isabella Shinikova, Ysaline Bonaventure, Katerina Siniakova and Xinyu Wang so far this week to reach her first final since lifting the 2021 Roland Garros trophy
- Record in WTA SF matches improves to 5-1
- Faces No.78 Tereza Martincova in F today; record in WTA final stands at 2-2
- Owns 4-3 career record against players from Czech Republic, with record in 2021 standing at 2-0 (d. Kr.Pliskova at Roland Garros and Siniakova this week at Prague)
- Has reached one final on hard courts, at 2021 Dubai (l. Muguruza in F)
- Last time 2 players from Czech Republic reached F at Prague was 2015 (Ka. Pliskova d. Hradecka)
- Six Czech women have reached the final here: Ka.Pliskova (2015 WON), Hradecka (2015 R-Up), Safarova (2016 WON), Kr.Pliskova (2017 R-Up), Kvitova (2018 WON) and Muchova (2019 R-Up)
- Is currently ranked at a career-high No.13, following Wimbledon R16 run
- Has now won 32 matches in 2021; only Barty (35), Sabalenka (34) and Jabeur (33) have more wins to their names
- Seeded

SEASON 2021 HISTORY

- Produced impressive grass court campaign, advancing to QFs at Nottingham (l. Stojanovic) and Birmingham (l. Kasatkina), then 3r showing at Wimbledon (l. Ka.Pliskova)
- Scored first Grand Slam main draw win during 2r showing at Roland Garros (d. Jorovic, l. Pegula)
- Made 2r at first clay tournament of the year at Bogota (l. eventual champion Osorio Serrano) before 1r exits at MUSC Health Women's Open (ret. w/right lower leg injury vs. Navarro), WTA 125K Series event at Saint-Malo and Belgrade (l. Jani). Also contested qualifying at Rome
- Also advanced to 3r at Dubai (as qualifier, l. Gauff) and 2r at Lyon (as qualifier, l. Ferro via ret. w/back injury), St. Petersburg (l. Alexandrova) and Miami (as qualifier, l. eventual R-Up Andreescu)
- Opened 2021 by falling at Australian Open qualifying event in Dubai before dropping down to ITF Circuit to play a couple of indoor hard events in France
- Advanced to R16 on Wimbledon main draw singles debut (l. eventual champion Barty)
- Enjoyed a glorious fortnight at Roland Garros, where she became the first woman since 2000 to sweep titles in singles (d. Pavlyuchenkova in F) and doubles (w/Siniakova); upset five seeds in her seven singles matches, including saving 1MP to beat Sakkari in SF, becoming the third woman in the Open Era to save a match point en route to the title in Paris
- At Strasbourg, lifted maiden WTA singles title (d. Cirstea in F)
- Began the clay court season with 2r showing at Istanbul (l. Bogdan) and then 1r exit at Madrid (l. Badosa); also lifted doubles title in Madrid w/Siniakova
- Made 2r at Miami (l. Swiatek) At Dubai, reached second career final (l.Muguruza); broke into Top 50 following the tournament at No.38 (March 15)
- Has enjoyed a successful season in doubles, lifting title at Gippsland Trophy and finishing R-Up at Australian Open (both w/Siniakova). Also defended mixed doubles title at Melbourne Park (w/Ram)
- Opened season with 2r showing at Abu Dhabi (l.Putintseva), before advancing to QF at Grampians Trophy (l. Brady) and then 2r at Australian Open (l. Alexandrova)

CAREER MILESTONES

- Broke into Top 100 at No.98 on April 5, 2021, following 2r showing at Miami
- Highlight of last season was SF run at 2020 Istanbul (l. eventual champion Tig)
- In 2019, season highlight was fourth ITF Circuit title of career at \$25K Essen-GER
- Won third ITF Circuit singles title of career in 2018, at \$25k ITF/Obidos and made QF run at WTA 125K Series event at Taipei
- Advanced to first tour-level SF at 2017 Gstaad, earning career first Top 20 win over then-No.20 Garcia
- Earned a then career-high singles ranking of No.114 following 2r run at 2017 Nanchang (l. eventual champion Peng)
- Win-loss record at tour-level in 2017 was 5-7, including three wins at Gstaad and 2r runs at Monterrey (d. McHale, l. Boserup) and Nanchang (d. Kudryavtseva, l. Peng)
- Advanced to maiden WTA SF at Québec City in 2016 (l. Davis)
- In 2015, reached first WTA QF at Florianopolis (l. Mattek-Sands)
- Made WTA qualifying and main draw debut at 2013 Nurnberg (l. Cabeza Candela in 1r)
- Owns four singles titles on the ITF Circuit at 2014 \$10k ITF/Heraklion-GRE, 2015 \$25k ITF/Lenzerheide-SUI, 2018 \$25k ITF/Obidos and 2019 \$25k Essen-GER
- Professional debut came on ITF Circuit in Germany in 2010 (as qualifier, l. 1r)
- Lifted maiden WTA title at 2021 Strasbourg, followed by sweep of singles and doubles titles at Roland Garros. Roland Garros was just her fifth Slam main draw in singles; only two women have won a major with fewer main draw appearances to their name
- Enjoyed breakout year in singles in 2020, posting career-high ranking of No.65 (November 16) and making R16 at Roland Garros and reaching second WTA SF at Linz
- Also reached two doubles finals last year, finishing R-Up at Dubai (w/Zheng) and winning Shenzhen (w/Siniakova)
- In Mixed Doubles, defended Australian Open title (w/Pavic), having triumphed in Melbourne a year earlier with w/Ram
- In 2019, advanced to QF at Bucharest in addition to winning four ITF Circuit singles titles on clay in North America and Europe, winning 20 of her 21 matches during this stretch
- Also in 2019, posted second Top 20 doubles season highlighted by titles at Toronto and Linz, and R-Up finish at Indian Wells (all w/Siniakova). Won Australian Open mixed doubles title w/Ram
- In 2018, won first two Grand Slam trophies at Roland Garros (d. Hozumi/ Ninomiya in F) and Wimbledon (d. Melichar/Peschke in F) both w/Siniakova, the first pairing to complete the Roland Garros-Wimbledon double since Kim Clijsters and Ai Sugiyama in 2003; also became the first team ever to win the girls' (2013) and ladies' doubles title at SW19
- Rose to WTA doubles World No.1 on October 22, 2018
- Highlight of 2017 was R-Up finish in first WTA singles final at Nürnberg (l. Bertens in F). Also made QF as qualifier at Bastad (l. Garcia). Only other tour-level appearances were 1r exits at Bucharest and Québec City
- Contested five WTA main draws in 2016, progressing to 2r at two events: Kuala Lumpur and Prague
- Lifted maiden WTA doubles title at 2015 Québec City (w/Mestach)
- Advanced to first WTA doubles final at 2014 Luxembourg (w/Hradecka, l. Bacsinszky/Barrois)
- Reached 2r on WTA debut as qualifier at 2014 Québec City (l. Hradecka)
- On ITF Circuit, owns 14 singles and 19 doubles titles
- Made professional debut at \$10K ITF/Piestany-SVK in 2010
