TOURNAMENT TALKING POINTS

- Preparation for Roland Garros continues this week on the Bosporus, with eight of the Top 50 in the field for the second edition of the TEB BNP Paribas Tennis Championship Istanbul
- Istanbul has been a regular stop-off on both WTA and ATP calendars for many years, with a stellar cast
 visiting the city. Indeed, the WTA event held at the Garanti Koza WOS between 2005 and 2019 had an honor
 roll that included Venus Williams, Elena Dementieva, Agnieszka Radwanska, Caroline Wozniacki, Elina
 Svitolina and Petra Martic
- Last year, this tournament held in early September saw a move to the Turkish Tennis Federation's centre, where Patricia Maria Tig lifted her maiden WTA title
- Top seed this time is **Elise Mertens**, who has reached four clay court finals in her career, including in Istanbul back in 2017, when she lost out to Elina Svitolina. The Belgian has been drawn to face qualifier **Lara Arruabarrena** in the first round
- Also in the top half of the draw is the in-form Veronika Kudermetova, who lifted her maiden WTA title on the green clay of Charleston two weeks ago. Her challenge gets underway against Bernarda Pera
- Meanwhile, in the bottom half No.2 seed Martic leads the way, opening up with a tricky encounter against
 Fiona Ferro on Monday evening
- The standout first-round match-up this year is arguably between former teenage star Ana Konjuh and Sara Errani, the 2012 losing finalist at Roland Garros
- In addition to this run in Paris, Errani's clay court resumé includes seven titles. In total, the Italian has won 183 career main draw matches at clay-court tournaments, the most of any active player:

 Kateryna Kozlova, Barbora Krejcikova, Tereza Mrdeza, Nuria Párrizas Díaz, Bernarda Pera, Anastasia
 Potapova and Kamilla Rakhimova are seeking their first career titles
- One to Watch Anastasia Gasanova. In the opening week of the season, 21-year-old Gasanova announced herself to the tennis world by upsetting Karolina Pliskova as a qualifier at Abu Dhabi. She proved this was no flash in the pan a few months later, when she battled through qualifying once more, this time on home soil in St. Petersburg, before winning a couple a marathon main draw matches en route to a maiden WTA quarterfinal. This weekend in qualifying here, she beat Irina Fetecau and then survived a two-hour, 42-minute tussle with Nikola Bartukova to secure a first-round date with No.8 seed Wang Qiang
