- An American has won the title here eight times, most recently S.Williams in 2001
- Playing doubles here with fellow teenager Fernandez, into the 2r where they face the No.5 seeded team of Melichar/Schuurs later today

- Fell 2r at Cleveland (l. eventual champion Kontaveit) and US Open (l. Rybakina)
- Came through qualifying at both Montreal (l. Pavlyuchenkova in 1r) and Cincinnati (l. Muguruza in 2r)
- Knocked out in 1r at Olympics (l. Vekic) and 2r at San Jose (l. Kasatkina)
- Suffered 1r defeat at Hamburg (l. Niemeier) and advanced to SF at Lausanne (l. Burel)
- On grass, made 2r at Birmingham (l. Bouzkova) before falling in qualifying at Eastbourne and in 1r at Wimbledon (l. Pegula)
- Fell 2r at Rome (as WC, l. Kudermetova), Strasbourg (l. Krejcikova) and Roland Garros (l. Hercog)
- Reached 3r at Dubai (l. Mertens) and 2r at Miami (l. Halep)
- Fell 2r on home soil at Lyon (l. Golubic)
- Made 2r at Australian Open (l. eventual champion Osaka) and posted 3r showing at Gippsland (l. eventual champion Mertens). Followed this with 1r exits at Phillip Island Trophy (l. Doi) and Adelaide (l. Sevastova)

- Reached QF of Montreal (l. eventual champion Giorgi) before falling in 2r of Cincinnati (l. Osaka) and US Open (l. Stephens)
- Made 2r at Eastbourne (l. Sevastova) and R16 at Wimbledon (l. Kerber)
- At Roland Garros, advanced to maiden Slam QF (l. eventual champion Krejcikova)
- Completed sweep of singles (d. Q.Wang in F) and doubles (w/McNally) titles at Parma; the youngest player to win both titles at the same event since Sharapova at 2004 Birmingham
- Advanced to first SF on clay, at Rome (l. eventual champion Swiatek); beat four Top 50 players en route, including No.4 Sabalenka in 3r and No.1 Barty in QF (via ret.)
- Reached QF at Charleston (l. Jabeur) and fell1r at Madrid (l. Ka.Pliskova)
- Advanced to QF at Dubai (l. Teichmann), then suffered 2r exit at Miami (after 1r bye, l. Sevastova)
- Reached her maiden WTA 500 SF at Adelaide (l. Bencic) - first time she had won back-to-back main draw matches since SF run at 2020 Lexington

CAREER MILESTONES

- · Best results in 2020 came at Slams, reaching R16 at Roland Garros (l. Svitolina) and 3r at US Open (l. Brady)
- Defeated No.3 Ka. Pliskova in 2r at Flushing Meadows to record her first Top 10 win since 2018 Tianjin title (d. No.6 Ka.Pliskova in F)
- Highlights of 2019 campaign include capturing her seventh career WTA singles title at Nottingham and reaching the finals at Strasbourg
- Member of French Fed Cup team that won the 2019 competition final vs. Australia, teaming up with Mladenovic to win the decisive doubles runner against Barty/Stosur. Also took part in the team that advanced to 2016 Fed Cup final vs. Czech Republic
- Fell out of the Top 20 on March 18, 2019 after holding her position there since August 14, 2017
- In 2018, won sixth career title at Tianjin; also made semifinals at Stuttgart and Madrid
- Broke into the Top 5 on August 13, 2018 and reached a career-high of No.4 on September 10,
- Became first player to win Wuhan and Beijing back-to-back in 2017. As a result, qualified for WTA Finals. Was ranked No.30 on the Race to Singapore leaderboard in May 2017
- Best win of her career came over No.2 Halep in 2017 Beijing final
- In 2017, lifted first Premier-5 level title at Wuhan and first Premier-Mandatory crown at Beijing; subsequently made Top 10 debut
- Won a career-best 48 main draw matches in 2017 (48-22 record, two titles), Advanced to QF at 2017 Roland Garros (l. Ka.Pliskova) for best Grand Slam singles result to date
- Advanced to QF at 2017 Roland Garros (l. Ka.Pliskova) for best Grand Slam singles result to date
- Qualifying for WTA Finals in 2017, became the first Frenchwoman to compete at WTA Finals in singles since Mauresmo in 2006 (l. Henin in F)
- At 2016 Roland Garros w/Mladenovic, won first major doubles title. They were the first French pair to win in Paris since 1971, when Gail Chanfreau and Francoise Durr triumphed
- Represented France at 2016 Rio Olympics in singles (2r) and doubles (1r, w/Mladenovic)
- Member of French Fed Cup team that advanced to 2016 competition final vs. Czech Republic
- Played 2015 WTA Finals Rising Stars Invitational in Singapore (l. Osaka in F)
- Made professional debut at 13 on ITF Circuit in France in 2007

- Ended 2020 season at No.48, just one shy of her career high which she reached on October 26, 2020
- First cracked the Top 50 earlier in the season on Feb. 24, 2020 at No.49 following a R16 appearance at Australian Open to tie her career best Grand Slam result - during performance, defeated V.Williams in 1r and her first Top 5 opponent in No.4 Osaka in 3r (l. eventual champion Kenin in 3s)
- Enjoyed breakout season in 2019, highlighted by maiden WTA singles title at Linz (as lucky loser, d. Ostapenko in F) - earned her first Top 10 win en route to title over No.8 Bertens in QF
- At 15y214d, her title run in Linz made her youngest to win a WTA tour-level title since Vaidisova (15y177d) won Tashkent in 2004
- · Also claimed maiden WTA doubles titles at Washington, DC (w/McNally, d. Sanchez/Stollar in F) and Luxembourg (w/McNally, d. Christian/Guarachi in F)
- By winning the doubles title at Washington, DC at 15 yrs, 144 days, became the youngest player to win a doubles title since May 1995 (Martina Hingis won Hamburg at 14 yrs, 219 days)
- Reached R16 at 2019 Wimbledon on Grand Slam main draw debut defeating V.Williams in 1r (l. eventual champion Halep) - followed with 3r showing at US Open (as WC, l. Osaka)
- Made WTA main draw debut as a wildcard at 2019 Miami where she earned her first WTA main draw win over good friend McNally (l. Kasatkina in 2r)
- Made professional debut in May 2018 as a qualifier into the \$25K ITF/Osprey, FL-USA
- Member of US Billie Jean King Cup team in 2020
- Former Junior World No.1 (July 2018). Won 2018 Roland Garros girls' title (d. McNally in F) and 2018 US Open doubles title (w/McNally), while finished R-Up at 2017 US Open girls' event (l. Anisimova) becoming the youngest girls' singles finalist in US Open history at 13-years-old

• In juniors, singles runner-up at 2011 US Open (l. Min) and was a semifinalist at the other three Slams

- Coached by father, Corey, who played basketball at Georgia State; mother, Candi, excelled in gymnastics before competing in a track and field at Florida State University
- · Started playing tennis at six
- Favorite surface is hard, describes her playing style as aggressive as possible with a big serve; depends on her quickness and athleticism to keep her in any point - describes herself as a "fighter"
- Tennis idols growing up were the Williams sisters whose tenacity and fearlessness made her want to become a professional tennis player

- After 1r bye, opens her campaign against No.51 Riske in 2r today; has lost four times this season to players ranked outside Top 50, falling to No.71 Hsieh (Australian Open), No.85 Zidansek (Roland Garros), No.63 Cornet (Berlin) and No.58 Cornet (Wimbledon)
- Owns 16-3 career record against players from United States in main draw matches, while is 4-1 this season; loss to Rogers last week in Chicago ended an 11-match winning streak vs. **Americans**
- One of two Canadian women in the draw (also Fernandez)
- This Monday, slipped out of Top 20 for the first time since August 2019
- In addition to title here, two other career titles both came on hard courts in 2019, at Toronto and US Open

- Coming off 1r loss at Chicago 500 (l. Anisimova)
- Reached 2r at Chicago 250 (l. Peterson) and
- made 1r exit at US Open (l. Andreescu) Fell 1r at Montreal (l. Badosa) and in qualifying at Cincinnati (l. Ferro)
- Defeated in 2r in singles at Olympics (l. Osaka); won doubles silver medal w/Bencic
- Made Grand Slam breakthrough at Wimbledon, advancing to QF (l. Ka.Pliskova). Also on grass, reached 3r at Nottingham (l. Van Uytvanck) and fell 1r at Birmingham (l. Watson)
- Made SF at \$60k ITF/Saint-Gaudens-FRA, before suffering 1r exits at Parma (l. Friedsam) and Roland Garros (l. Kontaveit)
- Kicked off clay court season with 2r showing at Istanbul (l. Mertens), then won title at WTA 125K Series event at Saint-Malo
- Finished R-Up at Lyon (as qualifier, l. Tauson) and Monterrey (as qualifier, l.Fernandez)
- Continued to play on ITF Circuit in February, highlighted by her 10th career title at this level, at \$25k Grenoble-FRA
- Opened season with R-Up finish at \$25k ITF/Fujairah-UAE (l. Tauson), then fell in qualifying for Australian Open

- · Coming off run to final at Ostrava for third WTA final appearance (l. Kontaveit); broke into Top 10 for the first time on Sept. 27
- Reached second Grand Slam SF of the year by advancing to final four at US Open (l. eventual champion Raducanu)
- Made 3r at Montreal (l. Azarenka) before making 1r exit at Cincinnati (l. Kerber)
- Reached 2r at Wimbledon (l. Rogers) and 3r at Olympics (l. Svitolina)
- At Roland Garros, became first Greek woman to reach a Grand Slam SF run at Roland-Garros (l. to eventual champion Krejcikova, having held 1MP in third set)
- Started clay court campaign by reaching 2r at Stuttgart (l. Kvitova) and then 3r at Madrid (l. Muchova)
- Advanced to SF at Miami (l. Andreescu) first Greek woman to reach this stage since former World No.14 Daniilidou in 2004
- Victory over No.2 Osaka in Miami was one of six Top-5 wins in her career – also No.5 Ka.Pliskova (2018 Rome), No.5 Kvitova (2019 Rome), No.5 Bencic (2020 St. Petersburg), No.5 Svitolina (2020 Ostrava) and No.4 Kenin (2021 Abu Dhabi)
- Advanced to QF at Doha (l. Muguruza) and then made 1r exit at Dubai (l. eventual R-Up Krejcikova)
- Upset in 1r at Australian Open (l. Mladenovic)
- Opened season with back-to-back SF runs at Abu Dhabi (d. No.4 Kenin in QF, l. eventual champion Sabalenka) and Grampians Trophy (l. Kontaveit)

CAREER MILESTONES

- Ended 2020 outside Top 100 (at No.137) for first time since 2017 - after a campaign in which she fell 1r three times (including Australian Open and US Open) and in qualifying on four occasions
- Other than run to SF at Guangzhou, highlights of 2019 season include QF runs at Hua Hin and last week in Nanchang, and 3r showing at Wimbledon - the deepest run of her career at a
- Finished 2018 ranked No.92 for second-best career-end finish (after No.57 in 2016)
- Made 2r at three events in 2018, at Gstaad, Hiroshima and Wuhan, and fell 1r on seven occasions
 - Also won ninth career title on ITF Circuit at \$80k Poitiers-FRA
- The 2017 campaign saw her play all four Grand Slam main draws for first time in her career and post career-high ranking of No.51 on April 3,
- · Ended 2016 at No.57 for best year-end finish of career (up from No.178 in 2015)
- Season highlights were winning maiden WTA singles title at Gstaad (d. Bertens in F) and R-Up finish at Linz (l. Cibulkova in F)
- Made Slam debut at 2016 Australian Open (as qualifier, l. Suárez Navarro in 1r) and qualified for Roland Garros, reaching 2r (l. Safarova). Prior to 2016 Australian Open, had fallen six times in Grand Slam qualifying
- Other 2016 highlights included QFs at 's-Hertogenbosch (l. Bencic), Tokyo [Japan Open] (l. eventual champion McHale) and Guangzhou (l. Kontaveit). Reached 2r at Katowice (l. Babos) and Bastad (l. Errani), and fell 1r at Cincinnati (l. Nara) and Luxembourg (l. Lisicki)
- Posted first and second Top 50 wins (vs. No.18 Ka. Pliskova and No.33 Strycova) during 2016 Fed Cup World Group SF against Czech Republic
- Entering 2016, had posted just two tour-level main draw wins in career. By comparison, registered 20 main draw wins in 2016
- Prior to 2016 had contested two tour-level events, having come through qualifying on both occasions: 2013 Bad Gastein (d. Bertens, l. Hlavackova), 2014 Shenzhen (d. Wozniack, l. Beck)
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2010 Budapest, and main draw debut at 2013 Bad Gastein
- Debut on ITF Circuit came at \$10k ITF/Budapest-HUN in 2008

- Secured best year-end ranking of No.22 in 2020; broke into Top 20 on February 24 for first time,
- Scored third and fourth Top 5 wins of her career last season, over No.5 Svitolina at Ostrava and No.5 Bencic (2020 St. Petersburg). Previous wins came over No.5 Ka.Pliskova (2018 Rome) and No.5 Kvitova (2019 Rome, via ret.)
- Upset No.10 seed Keys to reach the R16 for the first time at one of the four Slams, at 2020 Australian Open (l. Kvitova)
- Qualified for WTA Elite Trophy Zhuhai in 2019 for first time in career (fell in RR stage). That season won maiden WTA title at Rabat, recovering from a set and break down to defeat Konta in final
- Highlights of 2018 were reaching her first tourlevel final at San Jose (l. Buzarnescu) and scoring maiden Top 5 win over No.5 Ka.Pliskova in 2r at Rome
- Notched first Top 10 victory of career over No.6 Wozniacki en route to first WTA SF of career at 2017 Wuhan Open
- Broke into Top 50 for first time at No.49 on October 9, 2017
- At 2016 Australian Open, by reaching 2r (d. Y.Wang, l. Suárez Navarro) became the first woman from Greece to win a main draw match at a Slam since Daniilidou d. Ka.Pliskova at 2013 Australian Open
- · Reached first career WTA QF at 2016 Istanbul (as qualifier, l. Kovinic)
- Fell 1r on WTA main draw debut at 2015 US Open (as qualifier, l. O.Wang)
- WTA qualifying debut came at 2012 Palermo
- Made debut on ITF Circuit in 2010; owns seven ITF Circuit singles titles and five in doubles
