OSORIO SERRANO:

- Making third main draw appearance at Bogotá (fifth overall), where she reached QF in 2019 (l. eventual champion Anisimova in 3s)
- Also fell 1r in 2018 (l. Blinkova) and in qualifying in 2016 and 2017
- Opened this year's campaign by breaking seven times to beat Vickery
- Upset No.98 Martincova in 2r to score maiden Top 100 win; in terms of ranking, best previous career win came over No.134 Wang Xiyu in qualifying at 2021 Monterrey
- Broke serve six times to beat former Top 50 player Voegelé in QF
- Won seven of her eight service games to beat fellow SF debutante Tan on Saturday – is yet to drop a set this week
- Has conceded 22 games en route to the final; her opponent in the final, Zidansek, has also not conceded a set, surrendering 25 games
- Is the third Colombian to reach the championship match here, following in the footsteps of four-time champion Zuluaga (1999, 2002-04) and Duque-Mariño (2010 champion)
- Ranked No.180, is the lowest-ranked finalist on Tour this year (previously No.144 Bouchard – Guadalajara R-Up)
- Owns three clay court singles titles on ITF Circuit
- Contesting tournament ranked at a career-high No.180 (April 5, 2021)
- Best results of the season on ITF Circuit were QFs at \$25k Orlando and \$25k Boca Raton. Also reached final round of qualifying for Australian Open (l. Burel)
- Ended 2020 ranked at No.186 – the same position she ended 2019 campaign, too
- Best results were SF at \$25k ITF/Saint-Malo-FRA. Also contested qualifying at Australian Open and Roland Garros
- In 2019 won second and third career ITF Circuit titles, both at \$25k Guayaquil-ECU
- Won first ITF Circuit singles title at \$15k Cucuta-COL
- Colombian Billie Jean King Cup Team 2016-17, 2019
- Fell 1r on WTA main draw debut at 2017 Bogotá (as WC, l. Blinkova)
- Made professional debut in qualifying at 2016 Bogotá (l. Perrin in 3s)
- On the ITF Junior Circuit rose to No.1 in September 2019, shortly after winning US Open girls' singles title (d. Yepifanova in F)

ZIDANSEK:

- Playing Bogotá for the second time, having made QF in 2019 (l. Arruabarrena)
- Made a flying start to this year's tournament, winning 12 of the first 13 points en route to straight sets victory over Kalinskaya, then beat qualifier Gatto-Monticone in 2r
- Hit 28 winners in QF win over former Roland Garros R-Up Errani, reeling off the final six games of the match to close out victory
- Recovered from 4-1 down in the second set to close out a straight sets win over Tomova in SF
- Faces No.180 Osorio Serrano in today's final – two of past three losses have been to players ranked outside Top 100, against No.120 McNally at Guadalajara and No.120 Dodin at Miami qualifying
- In only previous WTA final, lost out to Putintseva in three sets on clay at 2019 Nürnberg
- In addition to run at 2019 Nürnberg and SF at 2018 Moscow [River Cup], career highlights on clay include WTA 125K Series titles at Bol in 2018 and 2019
- Fell 2r at Guadalajara and Monterrey before contesting qualifying at Miami
- Opened season with 3r showing at Abu Dhabi (l. Kostyuk) before 1r exits at Gippsland Trophy (l. Kovinic) and Australian Open (l. Diyas)
- Best singles result in 2020 was reaching QF at Acapulco (l. Zarazua)
- Earned a career high doubles ranking of No.57 on November 16, 2020 after winning third career Tour-level doubles title at Ostrava (w/Rus). Also lifted the doubles title at Palermo (w/Rus)
- Highlights of 2019 were reaching first WTA singles final, at Nurnberg (l. Putintseva in F), as well as defending WTA 125 Series title at Bol (d. Sorribes Tormo in F) and reaching SF at Hua Hin (l. Tomljanovic)
- Contested all the Slam main draws in 2019 for the first time – reached 2r twice, at 2019 Australian Open (l. Osaka) and 2019 Wimbledon (l. Wang Qiang)
- Highlights in 2018 included SF run at Moscow [River Cup] and title run at Bol WTA 125K Series event
- Broke into Top 100 (at No.95) following Bol title on June 11, 2018 - became the ninth Slovenian player in history to crack the Top 100
- In 2018, posted seven tour-level main draw wins and 40 on ITF Circuit; reached SF in just third WTA main draw, at Moscow [River Cup] (d. No.13 Kasatkina in 2r, l. Potapova)
- Made 2r on WTA main draw debut at Rabat in 2018 (as qualifier, d. Linette, l. Hsieh)
- WTA qualifying debut came at 2018 Brisbane
- Spent three months off tour with left knee injury in 2018
- Slovene Fed Cup Team, 2017-18, 2020
- Won first ITF Circuit title of career aged 16 at \$10k Velenje in 2014 - has won 16 more singles titles at this level
