- · Making fourth appearance at Wimbledon, where her best result was 2r showing on debut in 2017 (as qualifier, l. Witthoeft)
- Also made QF in doubles here in 2019 (w/Mertens)
- Seeded No.2 this fortnight her highest position at a major. Has now been seeded at 11 consecutive Slams
- At 2019 Wimbledon, No.2 seed Osaka fell in 1r (l. Putintseva)
- Is the only Top 20 seed this year yet to reach a Grand Slam QF
- Faces No.191 Monica Niculescu in 1r today; last loss to a player ranked outside Top 100 came at hands of No.139 Rybarikova in 1r at 2019 Wimbledon
- In terms of ranking, a defeat today would be worst on Tour since falling to No.214 Aiava in 1r at 2019 's-Hertogenbosch
- Owns 5-4 career record against players from Romania in main draw matches, while is 1-0 this season (d. Halep at Stuttgart)
- Has 5-1 record against qualifiers this season, with sole defeat coming to Giorgi last week at
- Record in Grand Slam 1r matches stands at 9-5
- Best career result on grass is R-Up finish at 2018 Eastbourne
- One of four players from Belarus in the draw (also Azarenka, Govortsova and Sasnovich)
- Best result by a woman representing Belarus at Wimbledon were SF runs by Victoria Azarenka (2011-12) and Natasha Zvereva (1998)
- Is currently ranked at a career-high No.4 (first achieved May 10, 2021)
- Has won a Tour-leading 29 matches this season (level with Jabeur)

- Best career result on grass is R-Up finish at 2015 Nottingham

SEASON 2021 HISTORY

- Suffered 2r exit at Berlin (after 1r bye, l. Keys) before QF run at Eastbourne (l. Giorgi). Also won doubles title w/Azarenka at Berlin
- Reached 3r at Rome (l. Gauff) and Roland Garros (l. Pavlyuchenkova)
- At Madrid, captured first WTA title on clay (d. Barty in F); rose to career-high No.4 in the rankings following the tournament (May 10, 2021)
- Finished R-Up at Stuttgart (l. Barty); defeated No.3 Halep in SF
- Suffered back-to-back losses to Muguruza in the Middle East swing, falling at QF stage at Dubai and in 2r at Doha (as defending champion). Followed this with QF at Miami (l. eventual champion Barty in 3s)
- Made R16 at Australian Open (l. S.Williams in 3s) - matching her best result at the majors (also 2018 US Open); bounced back to lift doubles title w/Mertens (d. Krejcikova/Siniakova in F), subsequently rising to No.1 in WTA doubles rankings afterwards
- Opened 2021 season by winning Abu Dhabi (d. Kudermetova in F) - her third consecutive title - and extending her career-best winning streak to 15 matches. Run was ended in 2r at Gippsland Trophy (after 1r bye, l. No.94 Kanepi)

- Reached 2r at \$100k ITF/Nottingham-GBR
- · Fell at final hurdle of qualifying for Roland Garros
- In doubles was R-Up at Doha w/Ostapenko (l. Melichar/Schuurs)
- Contested qualifying at Doha, Dubai, St. Petersburg and Miami
- Made exits in 1r at Gippsland Trophy (l. Siegemund) and 2r at Philip Island Trophy (as LL, after 1r bye, l. Teichman)
- Opened season by falling at the first hurdle of Australian Open qualifying event in Dubai

CAREER MILESTONES

- · Won final nine matches of 2020 to end the year with back-to-back titles - at Ostrava (d. Azarenka in F) and Linz (d. Mertens in F) - and ranked at No.10
- Having also taken home the silverware at Doha (d. Kvitova in F), was one of two players (also Halep) to lift three singles titles during disrupted 2020 season
- At Ostrava completed the sweep of titles by teaming up with Mertens to win the doubles
- Ended as World No.11 for the second straight year in 2019 after capturing three WTA singles titles at Shenzhen (d. Riske in F), Wuhan (d. Riske in F) and Zhuhai (d. Bertens in F)
- Having also won Wuhan in 2018 (d. Kontaveit in F), became first player to successfully defend Wuhan title
- Made Top 10 debut on January 28, 2019 following 3r run at 2019 Australian Open
- Ended 2019 at No.2 in WTA doubles rankings after capturing first Grand Slam doubles trophy at US Open (w/Mertens, d. Azarenka/Barty in F). Earlier in the season, the pair claimed the 'Sunshine Double' by winning back-to-back titles at Indian Wells (d. Krejcikova/Siniakova in F) and Miami (d. Stosur/ Zhang in F)
- Qualified for WTA Finals Shenzhen in doubles (w/Mertens), going 1-2 in the round robin stage
- Enjoyed breakthrough season in 2018, lifting two titles, at New Haven (d. Suárez Navarro in F) and Wuhan (d. Kontaveit in F), winning 46 matches and finishing at No.11 in the rankings
- Also in 2018, was R-Up at Lugano (l. Mertens) and Eastbourne (l. Wozniacki), made SF at Cincinnati, reached five QFs and produced a career-best Grand Slam run to R16 at US Open
- Entered Top 50 on April 16, 2018, after Lugano run, and Top 20 on August 27 of the same year, following New Haven title
- Broke into Top 100 at No.76 on October 16, 2017 after reaching first tour-level final at Tianjin (l. Sharapova). Also in 2017 made SF run at Tashkent (l. Babos) and lifting WTA 125k Series title at Mumbai (d. Jakupovic)
- Made Grand Slam main draw debut 2017 Wimbledon, falling in 2r (as qualifier, d. Khromacheva, l. Witthoeft)
- Fell 1r on main draw debut at 2017 Dubai (as qualifier, l. Ka.Bondarenko)
- Member of Belarus Fed Cup team that lost to USA in 2017 final - scored first Top 20 win of career with defeat of No.13 Stephens during 2017 Fed Cup final in Minsk

- Only Tour-level appearances in singles last season were 1r exits at Australian Open and Roland Garros. Was also R-Up in doubles at Prague w/Olaru
- Best singles results in 2019 were QF run at Shenzhen and 3r showing at Miami; also won doubles title at Hua Hin (w/Begu)
- Injury interrupted 2018 season was highlighted by QF runs at Hobart (as qualifier, l. eventual champion Mertens) and Taipei City (l. Lisicki)
- Also reached 3r at 2018 Miami (d. No.17 seed Rybarikova in 2r, l. eventual champion Stephens)
- Missed entire 2018 clay season due to a left calf injury, returning at the ITF grass event at Southsea, Great Britain
- In doubles, advanced to semifinals of 2018 Australian Open (w/Begu), lost to Makarova/Vesnina
- Highlight of 2017 was finishing runner-up at Hobart (l. Mertens); has reached at least one singles final seven years running (2011-17). Also reached QF at Washington DC (l. Goerges), 3r at US Open (l. Brady) and won WTA 125K title at Limoges (d. Lottner in F)
- In doubles appeared in first Grand Slam final at Wimbledon 2017 (w/H.Chan, l. Makarova/Vesnina) and won Biel (w/Hsieh)
- During 2017 Asian swing, passed US\$5 million in career prize money
- Won third WTA singles title of career at 2016 Luxembourg, defeating Kvitova in final. Career record in singles finals stands at 3-5
- Posted three wins against Top 20 ranked players in 2016 - defeated No.20 Jankovic at Doha, No.9 Kvitova in Fed Cup play-offs vs. Czech Republic and No.11 Kvitova at Luxembourg. Ended 2016 at No.39 in rankings
- Made Top 100 debut on May 19, 2008 and entered Top 50 on November 10, 2008. Achieved career-high ranking of No.28 on February 27,
- Best win by ranking came over No.6 Li at 2011
- On ITF Circuit, winner of 18 singles titles and 22 doubles titles
- Made WTA main draw debut at 2007 Dubai

- · WTA qualifying debut came at 2016 Rabat
- Lifted first three ITF Circuit titles in 2015, including a 13-match win streak towards the year's end, bringing back-to-back trophies in Antalya, Turkey
- Made debut on ITF Circuit in Minsk in 2012

CAREER MILESTONES

- · Reached four QFs across 2019, including Auckland (l. eventual R-Up Andreescu), Indian Wells (l. eventual R-Up Kerber), Birmingham (l. eventual champion Barty) and Cincinnati (l. eventual champion Keys)
- Scored her best win of the 2019 season at Indian Wells, ousting No.3 Kvitova in 3s. Also defeated defending champion and then-ranked No.5 Bertens in Cincinnati

Doi). Is sixth-oldest player to win a WTA singles title, after Billie Jean King (39) at 1983 Birmingham, Kimiko Date (38) at 2009 Seoul, Serena Williams (38) at 2020 Auckland, Martina Navratilova (37) at 1994 Paris [Indoor] and Francesca Schiavone (36) at 2017
- · With 49 titles, currently 11th on list of Open Era titleholders, chasing Monica Seles (53 titles)
