IRINA-CAMELIA BEGU

Swiatek arrived at the All England Club having only previously won one match on grass... Begu is through to the third round here for a second time... Swiatek is one of two Polish women left in the draw... Begu bidding for first Top-10 win since 2018



KAROLINA PLISKOVA



TEREZA MARTINCOVA

Pliskova won in two tie-break sets when they met at 2019 US Open... Martincova has advanced beyond the second round at a major for the first time... This is the only third-round match-up between players from the same country





GARBIÑE MUGURUZA



Muguruza saved a match point to beat Jabeur at Hobart last year... Jabeur bidding to win 32nd match of the season, although only one of those was against a Top-20 opponent... Muguruza has dropped just six games in opening rounds... Jabeur is appearing in third round here for the first time

Keys beat Mertens in the first round during her run to 2017 US Open final... Mertens won 10 unanswered games to close victory in her second-round match... Keys has scored two Top-20 wins this season... Mertens is seeded No.3 in doubles this fortnight alongside Hsieh

- Making fourth appearance at Wimbledon, where her best previous result was 2r showing on debut in 2017 (as qualifier, l. Witthoeft)
- Also made QF in doubles here in 2019 (w/Mertens, l. eventual champions Hsieh/Strycova)
- Seeded No.2 this fortnight her highest position at a major. Has now been among the seeds at 11 consecutive Slams
- Last No.2 seed to reach Wimbledon final was S.Williams in 2009
- Is the only woman from the Top 20 seeds this year yet to reach a Grand Slam QF in her career
- Has beaten qualifier Monica Niculescu and WC Katie Boulter so far in the opening week, striking 75 winners (including 16 aces)
- Faces No.94 Maria Camila Osorio Serrano in 3r today; has lost to two players ranked outside Top 50 this season, No.94 Kanepi at Gippsland Trophy and No.75 Giorgi at Eastbourne
- · Has never faced a Colombian opponent as a professional (at any level)
- Record against qualifiers this season stands at 6-1, with loss coming to Giorgi at Eastbourne
- Across career, is 2-3 in Grand Slam 3r matches
- Best career results on grass is R-Up finish at 2018 Eastbourne (l. Wozniacki); upset three Top 20 players en route to final, including No.7 and defending champion Ka.Pliskova
- One of four players from Belarus in the draw (also Azarenka, Govortsova and Sasnovich)
- Best result by a woman representing Belarus at Wimbledon were SF runs by Victoria Azarenka (2011-12) and Natasha Zvereva (1998)
- Is currently ranked at a career-high No.4 (first achieved May 10, 2021)
- Has won a Tour-leading 31 matches this season (level with Jabeur) Her 16 aces here have taken her 2021 total to 205 - the second-most on Tour behind Barty

- · Making debut appearance at Wimbledon one of 23 debutantes in the draw
- Competed in the girls' singles here on three occasions but never made it beyond 3r
- In last week's qualifying draw, beat Liang, Udvardy and Parrizas-Diaz, with all matches going to three sets
- Continued this trend in main draw, overcoming a slow start to see off fellow qualifier Kalinskaya
- In 2r on Wednesday, upset No.36 Alexandrova the highest-ranked opponent faced in her young career; previous best win was over No.43 Zhang at 2021 Belgrade
- Faces No.4 Aryna Sabalenka in 3r today; bidding to win three consecutive Tour-level matches fo the fourth time this season
- · Only match of her career against a Belarusian opponent was QF win over Sasnovich at Belgrade earlier this season
- Record against seeded players this season is 5-0 (including win over Alexandrova here)
- Before 2021 Wimbledon, only match of her career on grass was 1r exit to Boulter last month at Nottingham
- Only player from Colombia ranked inside Top 400 (next-highest is No.437 Emiliana Arango)
- Is the first Colombian to reach 3r at Wimbledon since Fernandez in 1974. Bidding to become the third Colombian woman to reach R16 at a major, following Fabiola Zuluaga (2004 Roland Garros and 2004 Australian Open) and Isabel Fernandez-DeSoto (1973 Wimbledon, 1973 US Open and 1976 Roland Garros)
- Best result by a qualifier here was Alexandra Stevenson's run to SF in 1999. Five other qualifiers have made QF, most recently Kanepi in 2010
- Is currently ranked at a career-high No.94; broke into Top 100 on May 24, 2021, after SF run at Belgrade
- One of nine teenagers in the draw

SEASON 2021 HISTORY

- Suffered 2r exit at Berlin (after 1r bye, l. Keys) before QF run at Eastbourne (l. Giorgi). Also won doubles title w/Azarenka at Berlin
- Reached 3r at Rome (l. Gauff) and Roland Garros (l. Pavlyuchenkova)
- At Madrid, captured first WTA title on clay (d. Barty in F); rose to career-high No.4 in the rankings following the tournament (May 10, 2021)
- Finished R-Up at Stuttgart (l. Barty); defeated No.3 Halep in SF
- Suffered back-to-back losses to Muguruza in the Middle East swing, falling at QF stage at Dubai and in 2r at Doha (as defending champion). Followed this with QF at Miami (l. eventual champion Barty in 3s)
- Made R16 at Australian Open (l. S.Williams in 3s) - matching her best result at the majors (also 2018 US Open); bounced back to lift doubles title w/Mertens (d. Krejcikova/Siniakova in F), subsequently rising to No.1 in WTA doubles rankings afterwards
- Opened 2021 season by winning Abu Dhabi (d. Kudermetova in F) - her third consecutive title - and extending her career-best winning streak to 15 matches. Run was ended in 2r at Gippsland Trophy (after 1r bye, l. No.94 Kanepi)

- Suffered 1r defeat at Nottingham (l. Boulter)
- At Belgrade, reached another SF (as qualifier, l.Konjuh), then fell 1r at Roland Garros (as qualifier, l. Brengle)
- Advanced to SF at MUSC Health Women's Open (l. eventual champion Sharma); comeback win over No.51 Linette in 1r was best of career, in terms of ranking
- Won maiden career title on home soil, at Bogotá (d. No.98 Martincova in 2r for first Top 100 win and Zidansek in F); became the fourth teenager to lift a WTA singles trophy this season, joining Swiatek (Adelaide), Tauson (Lyon) and Fernandez (Monterrey) and at No.180, was also the lowestranked WTA title winner since World No.299 Margarita Gasparyan won 2018 Tashkent
- Best results of the season on ITF Circuit were QFs at \$25k Orlando and \$25k Boca Raton. Also reached final round of qualifying for Australian Open (l. Burel)

CAREER MILESTONES

- · Won final nine matches of 2020 to end the year with back-to-back titles - at Ostrava (d. Azarenka in F) and Linz (d. Mertens in F) - and ranked at No.10
- Having also taken home the silverware at Doha (d. Kvitova in F), was one of two players (also Halep) to lift three singles titles during disrupted 2020 season
- At Ostrava completed the sweep of titles by teaming up with Mertens to win the doubles
- Ended as World No.11 for the second straight year in 2019 after capturing three WTA singles titles at Shenzhen (d. Riske in F), Wuhan (d. Riske in F) and Zhuhai (d. Bertens in F)
- Having also won Wuhan in 2018 (d. Kontaveit in F), became first player to successfully defend Wuhan title
- Made Top 10 debut on January 28, 2019 following 3r run at 2019 Australian Open
- Ended 2019 at No.2 in WTA doubles rankings after capturing first Grand Slam doubles trophy at US Open (w/Mertens, d. Azarenka/Barty in F). Earlier in the season, the pair claimed the 'Sunshine Double' by winning back-to-back titles at Indian Wells (d. Krejcikova/Siniakova in F) and Miami (d. Stosur/ Zhang in F)
- Qualified for WTA Finals Shenzhen in doubles (w/Mertens), going 1-2 in the round robin stage
- Enjoyed breakthrough season in 2018, lifting two titles, at New Haven (d. Suárez Navarro in F) and Wuhan (d. Kontaveit in F), winning 46 matches and finishing at No.11 in the rankings
- Also in 2018, was R-Up at Lugano (l. Mertens) and Eastbourne (l. Wozniacki), made SF at Cincinnati, reached five QFs and produced a career-best Grand Slam run to R16 at US Open
- Entered Top 50 on April 16, 2018, after Lugano run, and Top 20 on August 27 of the same year, following New Haven title
- Broke into Top 100 at No.76 on October 16, 2017 after reaching first tour-level final at Tianjin (l. Sharapova). Also in 2017 made SF run at Tashkent (l. Babos) and lifting WTA 125k Series title at Mumbai (d. Jakupovic)
- Made Grand Slam main draw debut 2017 Wimbledon, falling in 2r (as qualifier, d. Khromacheva, l. Witthoeft)
- Fell 1r on main draw debut at 2017 Dubai (as qualifier, l. Ka.Bondarenko)
- Member of Belarus Fed Cup team that lost to USA in 2017 final - scored first Top 20 win of career with defeat of No.13 Stephens during 2017 Fed Cup final in Minsk

- Finished 2020 ranked at No.186 the same position she ended 2019 campaign, too. Best results were SF at \$25k ITF/Saint-Malo- FRA., while contested qualifying at Australian Open and Roland Garros
- In 2019 won second and third career ITF Circuit titles, both at \$25k Guayaquil-ECU
- Won first ITF Circuit singles title at \$15k Cucuta-COL
- Colombian Billie Jean King Cup Team 2016-17,
- Fell 1r on WTA main draw debut at 2017 Bogotá (as WC, l. Blinkova)
- Made professional debut in qualifying at 2016 Bogotá (l. Perrin in 3s)
- On the ITF Junior Circuit rose to No.1 in September 2019, shortly after winning US Open girls' singles title (d. Yepifanova in F)

- · WTA qualifying debut came at 2016 Rabat
- Lifted first three ITF Circuit titles in 2015, including a 13-match win streak towards the year's end, bringing back-to-back trophies in Antalya, Turkey
- Made debut on ITF Circuit in Minsk in 2012

- Currently working with former hitting partner Anton Dubrov; previously coached by Dmitry Tursunov and Didi Kindlmann
- Started playing tennis when she was 6 by an accident when her father Sergey drove by the tennis courts and decided to give it a try
- Loves her family and her young sister. Loves to laugh, has a sweet tooth and considers something sweet as a perfect present. Dreams of having a dog. Loves her grandmother's cooking, and looks forward to her pancakes when she is away from home

- Won girls' singles title here in 2018. One of seven junior champions in this year's draw (also Kr.Pliskova, Barty, Bencic, Ostapenko, Potapova and Liu)
- In 1r on Monday, defeated Hsieh, whom she beat en route to 2020 Roland Garros title. In 2r saw off 2010 R-Up Zvonareva
- Faces No.79 Irina-Camelia Begu in 3r today; only Grand Slam loss to a player ranked outside Top 50 came at hands of No.81 Golubic at 2019 Wimbledon
- Owns 2-2 career record against players from Romania in main draw matches, while is 0-1 this season (l. Halep at Australian Open)
- Is 5-1 in Grand Slam 3r matches, with sole defeat coming to Azarenka at 2020 US Open
- Has now recorded her second and third main draw wins on grass, having claimed her first during last week's 2r showing at Eastbourne (d. Watson, having trailed 4-1 in the deciding set)



- Ended 2020 outside Top 100 (at No.137) for first time since 2017 - after a campaign in which she fell 1r three times (including Australian Open and US Open) and in qualifying on four occasions
- Other than run to SF at Guangzhou, highlights of 2019 season include QF runs at Hua Hin and last week in Nanchang, and 3r showing at Wimbledon - the deepest run of her career at a major

- · Last season highlighted by reaching 3r at US Open and matching career best result in New York (d. No.25 Yastremska in 2r, l. Rogers) and winning first WTA 125K Series title at Newport Beach (d. Voegele in F)
- Defeated top seed and World No.2 S.Williams in 2r to reach QF at 2017 Auckland for best byranking win of career to date
