This is the 134th Wimbledon Championships. The event was first held in 1877, with the first women’s singles championship being staged in 1884. This is the 127th staging of the Wimbledon women’s singles championship and the 53rd of the Open Era, which began in 1968 and saw the introduction of prize money. Due to the pandemic, the tournament was not held in 2020.

QUALIFIERS AT GRAND SLAMS & WIMBLEDON

In 2010, Estonian **Kaia Kanepi** became the sixth qualifier in the Open Era to reach Wimbledon QF. The best result by a qualifier at Wimbledon came in 1999 when **Alexandra Stevenson** advanced to SF. **Christine Dorey** (now Mathison) also reached SF at 1978 Australian Open as a qualifier, while Nadia Podoroska repeated the feat at 2020 Roland Garros.

ACTIVE GRAND SLAM CHAMPIONS

The 2021 season has already welcomed one new Grand Slam champion: **Barbora Krejčíková** won her maiden Grand Slam singles title at Roland Garros in June, defeating Anastasia Pavlyuchenkova in the final. There are 18 active Grand Slam champions, six of whom have lifted the trophy previously at Wimbledon: **Simona Halep** (2019), **Angelique Kerber** (2018), **Garbiñe Muguruza** (2017), **Petra Kvitová** (2011, 2014), **Serena Williams** (2002-03, 2009-10, 2012, 2015-16) and **Venus Williams** (2000-01, 2005, 2007-08).

WORLD NO.1 – TOP SPOT ON THE LINE AT WIMBLEDON

During the Wimbledon fortnight, **Ashleigh Barty** will spend her 82nd and 83rd weeks at the top of the WTA rankings. Barty, who claimed the No.1 spot on June 24, 2019, is only the second Australian to achieve the historic milestone, following in the footsteps of Evonne Goolagong Cawley.

Aryna Sabalenka can potentially challenge for the top spot at Wimbledon, although to do so she would need to win the title with Barty falling before the semifinals.

STRONG OFF THE BLOCKS – FIRST-ROUND SUCCESS

Of those players with 10 or more Grand Slam appearances in this year’s Wimbledon draw, here are the players with the best strike rate in the opening round at a Grand Slam:

- **Serena Williams (77-1 in 1r):** Serena’s lone opening round loss at a Grand Slam came at 2012 Roland Garros (l. Razzano). Since then, she has made 31 Grand Slam appearances without another 1r exit
- **Madison Keys (29-4 in 1r):** Keys had gone 21 majors in a row without suffering a first-round exit before her run was ended at last year’s Roland Garros (l. S.Zhang). Her other three losses at this stage came in her teenage years, at 2012 Australian Open (l. J.Zheng), 2013 US Open (l. Jankovic) and 2014 Roland Garros (l. Errani)
- **Venus Williams (73-16 in 1r):** Venus has lost in the opening round of a Grand Slam 16 times in her career, including three times at Wimbledon, in 1997 (l. Grzybowska), 2012 Wimbledon (l. Vesnina), and 2019 Wimbledon (l. Gauff)
- **Garbiñe Muguruza (27-6 in 1r):** Muguruza fell 1r most recently at this year’s Roland Garros (l. Kostyuk). Her other five defeats at this stage came on her Grand Slam debut at 2012 US Open (l. J. Errani), 2014 Wimbledon (l. Vandeweghe), 2014 US Open (l. Lucic-Baroni), 2019 Wimbledon (l. Haddad Maia) and 2019 US Open (l. Riske)

DEFENDING A MAJOR IS A DIFFICULT TASK

There have been **24 title defenses at Wimbledon**, 22 at the US Open, 21 at the Australian Open, and 11 at Roland Garros (post-1945):

- 22 different women have successfully defended a Grand Slam singles title at least once in their careers
- 10 different women have successfully defended two or more different Grand Slams
- Only five women – Maureen Connolly, Margaret Court, Stefanie Graf, Monica Seles and Serena Williams – have defended three or more different majors
- Stefanie Graf is the only woman to have defended at all four of the majors more than once; in fact she achieved the amazing feat at least twice at each Grand Slam
- Five players in the Open Era have defended their title at Wimbledon: King, Navratilova, Graf, V.Williams and most recently S.Williams (2015-16)
- Six defending champions have lost in the opening round of their title defense: Graf (1994 Wimbledon), Capriati (2003 Australian Open), Myskina (2005 Roland Garros), Kuznetsova (2005 US Open), Kerber (2017 US Open) and Ostapenko (2018 Roland Garros)

MUM’S THE WORD

There are seven mothers this year’s Wimbledon singles draw:

Victoria Azarenka, Olga Govortsova, Samantha Stosur, Patricia Maria Tig, Elena Vesnina, Serena Williams and Vera Zvonareva

At last year’s US Open, Azarenka and Williams made history by becoming the first pair of mothers to reach the semifinals of the same Grand Slam.

WIMBLEDON MISCELLANY

- Five players have won the singles title after **saving match point**: Blanche Hillyard (1889), Suzanne Lenglen (1919), Helen Wills-Moody (1935), Venus Williams (2005) and Serena Williams (2009)
- Only 11 **nations** are represented on the Wimbledon women’s singles roll of honor. British and American women have won 91 of the 122 championships to date. The other nations are Australia, Brazil, Czech Republic, France, Germany, Russia, Spain, Switzerland and Romania
- In 2013, France’s Marion Bartoli became the 29th woman to win the singles title **without dropping a set** (10th in Open Era)
- In 2004, Maria Sharapova became the **first woman not seeded in the Top 8** to win the Wimbledon singles title since seeding began in 1927. She has since been joined by Venus Williams (2005—No.14 and 2007—No.23), Marion Bartoli (2013—No.15), Garbiñe Muguruza (2017—No.14) and Angelique Kerber (2018 – No.11)
- Just four players have won the Wimbledon women’s singles title **after winning the Wimbledon girls’ singles title** (Haydon-Jones, Susman, Hingis and Mauresmo). Former girls’ singles winners in the 2021 Wimbledon field are: Kristyna Pliskova (2010), Ashleigh Barty (2011), Belinda Bencic (2013), Jelena Ostapenko (2014), Anastasia Potapova (2016), Claire Liu (2017) and Iga Swiatek (2018)
- The player with the **most women’s doubles titles** is Elizabeth Ryan, who won 12 between 1914 and 1934
- Serena Williams was the last player to **win both the singles and doubles titles** in the same year, in 2016
- Ann Jones (1969), Martina Navratilova (nine times), Petra Kvitova (twice) and Angelique Kerber (2018) are the only four **left-handers** to win the Wimbledon women’s singles title in the Open Era
