Osaka recovered from 5-3 down in the final set to win their most recent encounter at 2018 Beijing... Zhang is only Chinese woman in the draw... Osaka leads the Tour this season for percentage of both service games (79.8%) and service points won (62.9%)... Zhang won doubles title here last year and is currently ranked No.2 in the latest WTA Doubles Rankings, just 290 behind new No.1 Gauff

Williams advanced to SF here 10 years ago, while Pliskova was champion in 2016... Pliskova came from match point down to win only previous meeting with Williams on American soil, at 2016 US Open... Williams is bidding for her first Top-20 win since overcoming Bertens here in Cincinnati three years ago... Pliskova has struck 144 aces at this event, only two women have hit more since 2008:

Since lifting the US Open last year, Raducanu has played 30 matches, posting a 13-17 record... Williams is the only woman to win back-to-back titles at this tournament in the Open Era, triumphing in 2014 and 2015... Raducanu is making her tournament debut... Winner faces Azarenka in second round



- Making 5th appearance at Western & Southern Open; finished R-Up in 2020 when the tournament was staged in New York (withdrew prior to final against Azarenka w/hamstring injury)
- Also made QF in 2019 (l. Kenin via ret. w/left knee injury)
- Faces No.44 Shuai Zhang in 1r today; has won three of their previous five meetings, including the most recent at 2018 Beijing (recovered for 4-1 and 5-3 down in the third set)
- Owns 89 wins in career over Top-50 players, although has lost the past five
- Has 7-2 career record against players from China, while is 1-0 this season (d. Zheng Qinwen in 1r at San Jose)
- She has won seven singles titles in her career, all on hard courts, including three on American soil: Indian Wells (2018), US Open (2018 and 2020)
- · Only player from Japan in main draw
- Is one of two Japanese women to reach Western & Southern Open final, along with Akiko Morigami, who was R-Up in 2005 and 2007
- The former World No.1 is currently ranked No.39, having slipped as low as No.85 this February
- During last year's North American summer hardcourt swing, reached 3r at US Open and Cincinnati
- Is making her 34th appearance at a WTA 1000 tournament, reaching the final four times and lifting titles at 2018 Indian Wells and 2019 Beijing
- Leads the Tour for percentage of service games (79.8%) and points won (62.9%)

- Faces No.39 Naomi Osaka in 1r today; owns 52 wins in career over Top-50 players, including five this season (posted only one across entire 2021 campaign)
- Owns 10-6 career record against players from Japan, while is 1-0 this season (d. Doi at Wimbledon)
- She has won three singles titles in her career, all come on hard court: Lyon in 2022; Guangzhou in 2017 and 2013
- Only player from China in main draw. Best reuslt by a Chinese woman here was Li Na's title run in 2012
- In addition to 1r exit here, last summer also made QF at San Jose and Cleveland, 2r at US Open and fell 1r at Montreal
- Is currently ranked No.44; career high ranking was No. 23 (November 2016)
- Currently ranked No.2 in WTA doubles ranking, 290 points behind No.1 Gauff
- Is competing in her 68th main draw at a WTA 1000 tournament; best results were QF runs at Rome in 2014 and Beijing in 2016 and 2018







### **CAREER MILESTONES**

- Won 2021 Australian Open (d. Brady in F) to become first woman since Seles in the early 1990s to win each of her first four Grand Slam finals - is the 16th woman to win four or more majors in the Open Era
- At 2020 US Open, came from a set and a break down to Azarenka and win third Grand Slam title of career
- Also last season was R-Up at Western & Southern Open - withdrew w/left hamstring injury before final against Azarenka
- Won second Grand Slam at Australian Open (d. Kvitova in F); became first Japanese player to reach World No.1 ranking following the tournament
- In addition, won back-to-back titles for first time in her career at Osaka (d. Pavlyuchenkova in F) and Beijing (d. Barty in F); defeated No.1 Barty in Beijing final for second career victory over world No.1 (also beat Halep at 2018 Indian Wells)
- Enjoyed break-out season in 2018, posting a 40-20 record resulting in a No.5 (first Top 10 season), up from No.68 in 2017
- Won the first two titles of her career in 2018, at Indian Wells (d. Kasatkina in F) and debut Grand Slam crown at US Open (d. S.Williams in F)
- En route to the Indian Wells title, defeated fivetime major champion Sharapova, and A.Radwanska, Ka.Pliskova and Halep. Only set dropped all fortnight was against Sakkari in R16
- Reached one further final in 2018, at Tokyo [PPO] (l. Ka.Pliskova)
- In reaching R16 at 2018 Australian Open, became youngest Japanese player to reach R16 at a Slam since Sugiyama at 1995 Roland Garros (19y, 342d) and the youngest player from Japan to reach R16 in Melbourne since Date in 1990 (197, 122d)
- Book-ended 2017 season with QF showings at Auckland and Hong Kong; other highlights included 3r runs at Wimbledon and US Open
- Scored first Top 5 win of career when she defeated No.5 V.Williams at 2017 Hong Kong. Upset win over defending champion and No.6ranked Kerber at 2017 US Open marked first career Top 10 win
- Voted 2016 WTA Newcomer of the Year; highlight was career-first WTA final at Tokyo [PPO] (l. Wozniacki). Also reached OF on three occasions

- Reached fourth singles final of career in 2021, finishing R-Up at Nottingham (l. Konta). Also advanced to SF at Palermo and QF at San Jose
- Enjoyed strong campaign in doubles last season winning three tiles, at Cincinnati and US Open (w/Stosur) and Ostrava (w/Mirza). Qualified for WTA Finals for first time (w/Stosur) however failed to progress from group stage
- Season highlight in 2020 was reaching third career WTA singles final (l. Rybakina in F) and finished R-Up in doubles at Hobart (w/Peng), which marks the first time she made it through to the championship match in both singles and doubles at the same tour-level event
- Also in 2020, made R16 at Roland Garros for the first time; now has advanced to second week in three Grand Slams across hard, grass and clay
- Standout results of 2019 season were reaching second Grand Slam singles QF of career at Wimbledon (l. eventual champion Halep), finishing R-Up at WTA125K Series event in Anning, China (l. S.Zheng) and closing out season by winning \$100k ITF/Tokyo-JPN (d.Paolini in F)
- Registered first Top 10 doubles season in 2019finished at No.10 while posted career-high ranking at No.9 on May 20
- Won first Grand Slam title in doubles at 2019
   Australian Open (w/Stosur; d. Babos/Mladenovic
   in F); also reached final at Miami w/Stosur (l.
   Mertens/Sabalenka). Team qualified for WTA
   Finals in Shenzhen (Zhang's debut at the season
   finale) where they advanced to SF (l. eventual
   champions Babos/Mladenovic)
- First Top 30 season in 2016, posted career-high ranking of No.23 on November 14
- Enjoyed Grand Slam breakthrough at 2016
   Australian Open, where she advanced to QF as
   qualifier (d. No.2 Halep and No.17 Key en route, l.
   Konta). Run also marked first time winning
   back-to-back main draw matches since
   semifinal run at 2014 Birmingham
- As a qualifier during 2016 Melbourne run, defeated No.2 Halep and No.17 Keys (l. Konta). Ranked No.133, became lowest-ranked player to advance to last eight in Melbourne since unranked Henin reached final in 2010, and first qualifier to do so since Gavaldon in 1990
- Contemplated retirement after ending 2015 ranked No.186, her lowest year-end finish since 2008 (No.212) and down from No.62 in 2014

- and 3r at Australian Open, Roland Garros and US Open
- Ranked No.406, made WTA main draw debut at 2014 Stanford. As an alternate, won through qualifying (achieving first WTA qualifying wins), and came from match point down to shock No.19 Stosur in 1r of main draw, before losing to No.18 Petkovic in 2r
- Made WTA qualifying debut at Québec City in 2013 (l. Dabrowski)
- Winner of two WTA singles titles, at 2013
  Guangzhou (d. King in F) and 2017 Guangzhou (d.
  Krunic in F); also won WTA 125K Series events at
  Nanjing in 2013 and Honolulu in 2017
- Scored first Top 10 win over then top ranked Safina in 1r at 2009 Beijing; at No.226, was the lowest-ranked player ever to beat a World No.1
- First broke into Top 100 on August 9, 2010 and Top 50 on February 3, 2014
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2006 Beijing; made WTA main draw debut at 2006 Guangzhou
- Winner of 21 singles titles and eight doubles titles on ITF Circuit
- Member of Chinese Fed Cup team in 2007, 2009-10, 2012, 2014-15, 2019-20. Chinese Olympic Team, 2012, 2016
- In mixed doubles, reached SF at 2018 US Open (w/Peers)



- Opened grass-court season with 2r showings at Nottingham (l. Riske) and Birmingham (l. Boulter) before triumphing at Bad Homburg (d. Andreescu in F) to end three-year wait for a title and reaching R16 at Wimbledon (l. Bouzkova)
- Made 2r at Roland Garros (l. Keys)
- · Withdrew from Madrid w/right foot injury
- Suffered exits in 2r at Indian Wells (I. Raducanu) and 1r at Miami (I. Bondar)
- Advanced to SF at Lyon (l. eventual champion Zhang)
- Defeated in 1r at Dubai (as WC, l. Krejcikova) and 2r at Doha (l. Gauff)
- Upset in 1r at Australian Open (l. Baptiste, having led 6-4 5-3)

### **CAREER MILESTONES**

- Highlights last season came on clay, with SF at Lausanne and QF at Parma
- Best results in 2020 came at Slams, reaching R16 at Roland Garros (l. Svitolina) and 3r at US Open (l. Brady)
- Defeated No.3 Ka.Pliskova in 2r at Flushing Meadows to record her first Top 10 win since 2018 Tianjin title (d. No.6 Ka.Pliskova in F)
- Highlights of 2019 campaign include capturing her seventh career WTA singles title at Nottingham and reaching the finals at Strasbourg
- Member of French Fed Cup team that won the 2019 competition final vs. Australia, teaming up with Mladenovic to win the decisive doubles runner against Barty/Stosur. Also took part in the team that advanced to 2016 Fed Cup final vs. Czech Republic
- Fell out of the Top 20 on March 18, 2019 after holding her position there since August 14, 2017
- In 2018, won sixth career title at Tianjin; also made semifinals at Stuttgart and Madrid
- Broke into the Top 5 on August 13, 2018 and reached a career-high of No.4 on September 10, 2018
- Became first player to win Wuhan and Beijing back-to-back in 2017. As a result, qualified for WTA Finals. Was ranked No.30 on the Race to Singapore leaderboard in May 2017
- Best win of her career came over No.2 Halep in 2017 Beijing final
- In 2017, lifted first Premier-5 level title at Wuhan and first Premier-Mandatory crown at Beijing; subsequently made Top 10 debut
- Won a career-best 48 main draw matches in 2017 (48-22 record, two titles), Advanced to QF at 2017 Roland Garros (l. Ka.Pliskova) for best Grand Slam singles result to date
- Advanced to QF at 2017 Roland Garros (l. Ka.Pliskova) for best Grand Slam singles result to date
- Qualifying for WTA Finals in 2017, became the first Frenchwoman to compete at WTA Finals in singles since Mauresmo in 2006 (l. Henin in F)
- At 2016 Roland Garros w/Mladenovic, won first major doubles title. They were the first French pair to win in Paris since 1971, when Gail Chanfreau and Francoise Durr triumphed
- Represented France at 2016 Rio Olympics in singles (2r) and doubles (1r, w/Mladenovic)

- Historic 2021 season was highlighted by her becoming first Greek woman to break into the Top 10 (at No.10, September 27) as well as the first from her country to qualify for the WTA Finals (made SF)
- Reached her third WTA singles final at Ostrava (l. Kontaveit) and made the SF at Roland-Garros and US Open, defeating three Top 20 ranked opposed at both event
- Posted most Top 10 wins in 2021 (nine), including two wins over the World No.2 (Osaka at Miami and No.2 Sabalenka at WTA Finals)
- Secured best year-end ranking of No.22 in 2020; broke into Top 20 on February 24 for first time, at No.20
- Scored third and fourth Top 5 wins of her career last season, over No.5 Svitolina at Ostrava and No.5 Bencic (2020 St. Petersburg). Previous wins came over No.5 Ka.Pliskova (2018 Rome) and No.5 Kvitova (2019 Rome, via ret.)
- Upset No.10 seed Keys to reach the R16 for the first time at one of the four Slams, at 2020 Australian Open (l. Kvitova)
- Qualified for WTA Elite Trophy Zhuhai in 2019 for first time in career (fell in RR stage). That season won maiden WTA title at Rabat, recovering from a set and break down to defeat Konta in final
- Highlights of 2018 were reaching her first tourlevel final at San Jose (l. Buzarnescu) and scoring maiden Top 5 win over No.5 Ka.Pliskova in 2r at Rome
- Notched first Top 10 victory of career over No.6 Wozniacki en route to first WTA SF of career at 2017 Wuhan Open
- Broke into Top 50 for first time at No.49 on October 9, 2017
- At 2016 Australian Open, by reaching 2r (d. Y.Wang, l. Suárez Navarro) became the first woman from Greece to win a main draw match at a Slam since Daniilidou d. Ka.Pliskova at 2013 Australian Open
- Reached first career WTA QF at 2016 Istanbul (as qualifier, l. Kovinic)
- Fell 1r on WTA main draw debut at 2015 US Open (as qualifier, l. Q.Wang)
- WTA qualifying debut came at 2012 Palermo
- Made debut on ITF Circuit in 2010; owns seven ITF Circuit singles titles and five in doubles

- Member of French Fed Cup team that advanced to 2016 competition final vs. Czech Republic
- Played 2015 WTA Finals Rising Stars Invitational in Singapore (l. Osaka in F)
- Made professional debut at 13 on ITF Circuit in France in 2007
- In juniors, singles runner-up at 2011 US Open (l. Min) and was a semifinalist at the other three Slams

- Parents are Konstantinos and Angeliki; brother is Yannis (studies at Boston University) and sister is Amanda. Introduced to tennis by parents at age 6; mother played on WTA; achieved a Top 50 singles ranking
- Born and raised in Athens; moved to Barcelona at age 18 to train
- Favorite surfaces are hard and clay; favorite shot is serve
- Tennis idols are Serena Williams, Rafael Nadal and Roger Federer
- During free time enjoys going back to Greece and seeing friends.
