**Muguruza** prevailed in straight sets when they last met at 2021 Australian Open... **Samsonova** has won 15 of her past 16 matches on Tour... **Muguruza** bidding to reach first SF of the season... **Samsonova** owns nine Top 20 wins in her career, including three this year... **Samsonova** has won the title at two of her last three tournaments... With a win today in QF, **Muguruza** would return to the Top 10 – at No.10 with SF, No.8 with R-Up and No.7 with title

After posting a 3-15 record vs. Top 20 opponents in 2021, **Kudermetova** is 7-7 this year... **Kudermetova** has reached 12 semifinals in her career, including four times at a WTA 500 tournaments... **Kudermetova** is making her 9th QF appearance of the year; only Jabeur (11) and Swiatek (10) have reached more QFs this year... **Haddad Maia** advanced to the QF via walkover after Osaka withdrew... **Haddad Maia** owns a 7-3 record vs. Top 20 ranked opponents this year... Five of **Haddad Maia**'s seven semifinals have come in 2022... **Haddad Maia** is the first Brazilian to compete at the tournament since 1987

**Kudermetova** and **Haddad Maia** are both battling for a qualifying spot in the WTA Finals... For **Kudermetova**, by reaching the QF this week, she moves to No.9 on the Leaderboard (important to note, current No.8 on the Leaderboard Halep is done for the season)...**Haddad Maia**, who with a QF finish moves to No.14, can climb as high as No.10 by winning the title this week

Martic dropped just three games when they last met at 2019 Miami... Zhang upset No.10 Garcia in previous round to register second Top-10 win of the season... Martic has won 15 of her past 20 matches and risen nearly 40 places in the rankings over the past few months... Zhang has compiled 31 main-draw wins this season, more than double her 2021 total... Zhang saved match point in her win over Garcia and overcame 27 aces from Garcia in the win... Martic saved 9 of 10 break points to defeat No.6 seed (and 2018 champion) Pliskova in the second round

**Zheng** upset top seed Badosa in the second round, her first completed Top 10 win... **Liu** contesting her first WTA QF on hard courts... - · Looking to reach fourth SF this year also advancing to final four at Stuttgart (l. Swiatek in SF), Washington DC (WON) and Cleveland (WON); has gone on to win the title in each hard-court tournament where she has reached SF in 2022
- Owns 3-3 career record against players from Spain, with record in 2022 standing at 1-0 beating Parrizas Diaz at Adelaide 250
- Owns 13-19 career record against seeded players, with a record in 2022 standing at 7-3
- Record in WTA QF matches stands at 7-1 (3-1 in 2022); only loss at this stage came to Madison Keys at Adelaide 250 this year
- Owns two titles on hardcourts, both coming this year at Washington DC and Cleveland
- Has won 15 of her last 16 matches winning two titles in August and reaching R16 at US Open (l. Tomljanovic)
- Leads the Tour in Service Games Won (81.6%), Service Points Won (64.2%) and Second Serves

- Looking to reach first SF of the year; by contrast, reached five SFs in 2021
- Record in WTA QF matches stands at 32-26 however is 0-2 this year falling at Sydney (l. Kasatkina) and Doha (l. Ostapenko)
- Has won eight hard court tournaments in career: WTA Finals, Chicago 500, and Dubai in 2021; Monterrey in 2019 and 2018; Cincinnati in 2017; Beijing in 2015; Hobart in 2014
- Only player from Spain to reach QF

- · Lifted second and third WTA singles titles at Washington DC (d. Kanepi in F) and Cleveland (d. Sasnovich in F). Advanced to R16 at US Open for best result to-date in New York and ties best Grand Slam performance (l. Tomljanovic)
- During grass-court season, made 2r in Berlin title defense (l. Kudermetova) and suffered 1r exits at 's-Hertogenbosch (l. Li) and Bad Homburg (l. Rakhimova)
- Advanced to SF at Stuttgart (l. eventual champion Swiatek in 3s), then fell 1r at Madrid (l. Martic), Rome (l. Pegula) and Roland Garros (l. Kovinic)
- Reached R16 at Indian Wells (l. Martic) and fell 2r at Miami (l. Brengle)
- Fell in qualifying at Dubai and 1r at Doha (l.
- Made 2r at Australian Open (l. Vondrousova)
- Fell 1r at Melbourne Summer Set 1 (l. Petkovic) and reached QF at Adelaide [250] (l. eventual champion Keys)

- Reached 3r at US Open (l. Kvitova, held 2 MPs) and Toronto (l. Bencic), while upset in 2r at Cincinnati (after 1r bye, l. Rybakina)
- During grass-court season, made 3r at Eastbourne (l. Giorgi) and defeated in 1r at Berlin (l. Petkovic) and Wimbledon (l. Minnen)
- On clay, fell 2r at Madrid (l. Kalinina), Rabat (l. Trevisan) and Roland Garros (l. Kanepi), and in 1r at Rome (l. Putintseva)
- Upset in 2r at Indian Wells (after 1r bye, l. Riske) and withdrew from Miami w/left shoulder injury
- Fell in 2r during defense of Dubai title (l. Kudermetova) and QF at Doha (l. Ostapenko)

### CAREER MILESTONES

- · Highlight of last season was coming through qualifying to lift maiden WTA title on grass at Berlin (d. Bencic in F)
- · Also reached two SFs in 2021, at Luxembourg and Courmayeur, and helped Russia win Billie Jean King Cup Finals
- Ended 2020 with R-Up finish at \$25k ITF/Reims-
- · Last season also reached 2r at Brisbane (as qualifier, d. No.24 Stephens, l. No.7 Kvitova) and Palermo (as qualifier, l. Martic), and fell 1r four times (including Australian Open, US Open and Roland Garros); posted career-high ranking of No.114 after Australian Open (February 3, 2020)
- Finished 2019 at No.139 her best seasonending finish after ending the year with a 32-28
- · Appeared in the first six WTA main draws of her career in 2019, highlighted by SF run at Palermo (l. eventual champion Teichmann), 2r showing at Lausanne (l. Han) and falling 1r on Grand Slam main draw debut at Roland Garros (as qualifier, l. Vekic)
- Contested qualifying at a WTA event for the first time at 2019 St. Petersburg, while fell 1r on her main draw bow at Roland Garros that year
- Owns four singles titles on the ITF Circuit, most recently at \$60K Saint-Malo-FRA in 2018
- Made professional debut at \$10K ITF/Gonesse-FRA in 2013

- Last season brought third Top-5 finish of career (and first since 2017) following victory at the WTA Finals in Guadalajara (d. Kontaveit in F to become first Spaniard to win the season finale)
- In addition to capturing 10th career title at Guadalajara, reached a further four finals in 2021, winning titles at Dubai (d. Krejcikova in F) and Chicago 500 (d. Jabeur in F), and finishing R-Up at the Yarra Valley Classic in Melbourne (l. Barty) and Doha (l. Kvitova)
- Reached fourth Grand Slam singles final of career at 2020 Australian Open (l. Kenin in 3s). Was first Spaniard to reach the final at Melbourne Park since Conchita Martinez in 1998
- In 2019, successfully defended her title in Monterrey for seventh career WTA trophy (d. Azarenka in F)
- Is a two-time Grand-Slam champion winning titles at 2016 Roland Garros (d. S.Williams in F) and 2017 Wimbledon (d. V.Williams in F). Dropped only one set in Roland Garros title run
- Is only player to ever beat both Williams sisters in a Grand Slam final and one of 29 women in the Open Era to win multiple Grand Slam titles. One of just eight players all-time to defeat Serena in a Grand Slam final
- Also finished R-Up at 2015 Wimbledon (l. S.Williams) to make Top 10 debut. Is one of two players to meet both Williams sisters in the final of the same Grand Slam - also Hingis at US Open (1997, d. V.Williams; 1999, l. S.Williams)
- First Spaniard to reach Wimbledon final since Sánchez Vicario in 1996 and first to reach any Slam final since Conchita Martínez at 2000 **Roland Garros**
- Rose to World No.1 on September 11, 2017 to become the 24th woman in history to hold the top spot and second from Spain (after Sánchez Vicario in 1995). Also named ITF World Champion for 2017
- Reached R16 at Rio Olympics in 2016
- In 2015, became first Spanish player to compete at the WTA Finals in singles since 2001 (Sánchez Vicario) and reached doubles final (w/Suárez Navarro, l. Hingis/Mirza). Overall, has qualified three times for the season-ending championships (2015-17)
- Owns five WTA doubles titles, most recently at 2015 Tokyo [PPO] (w/Suarez Navarro), and reached SF at 2014 Roland Garros (w/Suarez Navarro); rose to No.10 in WTA doubles rankings on February 23, 2015

Advanced to R16 on WTA main draw debut at 2012 Miami (l. evantual champion A.Radwanska), defeating No.9 Zvonareva en route for first Top

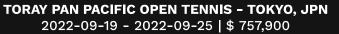
