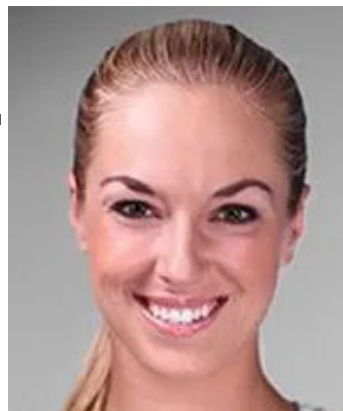

- Beat Aliaksandra Sasnovich in 1r and Kamilla Rakhimova so far this week to reach her third QF of the season (also Sydney and Lyon)
- Faces No.804 Sabine Lisicki in QF today; only career loss to a player outside Top 800 came against No.853 Ana Belzunce Crompin at W10 ITF Circuit event in 2009
- Owns 19-14 career record against players from Germany, most recently losing to Niemeier at 2021 Hamburg
- Record in WTA QF matches stands at 22-21
- Owns two grass-court titles, at 2019 Nottingham and 2016 Mallorca
- One of two players from France to reach QF (also Cornet)
- Last year on grass made 2r at Birmingham and fell 1r at Wimbledon

- Making 1st appearance at Bad Homburg - first WTA main draw since 1r exit at 2019 Nurnberg
- Overcame Tamara Korpatsch in 1r to register first Tour-level win since 2r showing at Guangzhou in 2018 (d. Zvonareva, l. Putintseva)
- Victory over Minnen saw her win back-to-back Tour-level matches for the first time since SF showing at 2018 Taipei
- Faces No.75 Caroline Garcia in QF today; in terms of ranking, a win today would be her best since QF run at 2017 Mallorca (d. No.25 Bertens and No.70 Rogers)
- Owns 14-10 career record against players from France in main-draw matches
- Record in WTA QF matches stands at 17-17
- Best career result on grass was title run at 2011 Birmingham. Has also reached SF or better on eight further occasions on the surface
- One of six Germans in the draw (Kerber also reached QF)
- Best result by wildcard at Bad Homburg last year was Azarenka's QF run
- Playing only fourth tournament since returning from serious knee injury

- Made 2r at Roland Garros (l. Keys)
- Withdrew from Madrid w/right foot injury
- Suffered exits in 2r at Indian Wells (l. Raducanu) and 1r at Miami (l. Bondar)
- Advanced to SF at Lyon (l. eventual champion Zhang)
- Defeated in 1r at Dubai (as WC, l. Krejčíková) and 2r at Doha (l. Gauff)
- Upset in 1r at Australian Open (l. Baptiste, having led 6-4 5-3)
- Fell 1r at Melbourne Summer Set 2 (l. Sevastova) and made QF at Sydney (l. Krejčíková)

- Fell in qualifying at Berlin. Also reached SF in doubles w/Andreescu
- Defeated in 1r at W100 ITF Circuit event in Surbiton
- In May, reached Qf at W25 ITF Circuit tournament in Sarasota, Florida - her first tournament since end of 2020

CAREER MILESTONES

- Highlights last season came on clay, with SF at Lausanne and QF at Parma
- Best results in 2020 came at Slams, reaching R16 at Roland Garros (l. Svitolina) and 3r at US Open (l. Brady)
- Defeated No.3 Ka.Pliskova in 2r at Flushing Meadows to record her first Top 10 win since 2018 Tianjin title (d. No.6 Ka.Pliskova in F)
- Highlights of 2019 campaign include capturing her seventh career WTA singles title at Nottingham and reaching the finals at Strasbourg
- Member of French Fed Cup team that won the 2019 competition final vs. Australia, teaming up with Mladenovic to win the decisive doubles runner against Barty/Stosur. Also took part in the team that advanced to 2016 Fed Cup final vs. Czech Republic
- Fell out of the Top 20 on March 18, 2019 after holding her position there since August 14, 2017
- In 2018, won sixth career title at Tianjin; also made semifinals at Stuttgart and Madrid
- Broke into the Top 5 on August 13, 2018 and reached a career-high of No.4 on September 10, 2018
- Became first player to win Wuhan and Beijing back-to-back in 2017. As a result, qualified for WTA Finals. Was ranked No.30 on the Race to Singapore leaderboard in May 2017
- Best win of her career came over No.2 Halep in 2017 Beijing final
- In 2017, lifted first Premier-5 level title at Wuhan and first Premier-Mandatory crown at Beijing; subsequently made Top 10 debut
- Won a career-best 48 main draw matches in 2017 (48-22 record, two titles). Advanced to QF at 2017 Roland Garros (l. Ka.Pliskova) for best Grand Slam singles result to date
- Advanced to QF at 2017 Roland Garros (l. Ka.Pliskova) for best Grand Slam singles result to date
- Qualifying for WTA Finals in 2017, became the first Frenchwoman to compete at WTA Finals in singles since Mauresmo in 2006 (l. Henin in F)
- At 2016 Roland Garros w/Mladenovic, won first major doubles title. They were the first French pair to win in Paris since 1971, when Gail Chanfreau and Francoise Durr triumphed
- Represented France at 2016 Rio Olympics in singles (2r) and doubles (1r, w/Mladenovic)
- Fell awkwardly and tore her anterior cruciate ligament during doubles match at 2020 Linz - missed entire 2021 campaign
- Highlight of 2018 campaign was SF run at Taipei City (l. Kozlova). Also made 2r at Budapest and Guangzhou
- Shoulder injury delayed start of 2017 season in which she only played only six tournaments, with best results QFs at Mallorca and Washington DC
- In 2015 made SF at Indian Wells (l. Jankovic), where she had never previously won a match in five prior visits – marked first time she had won three consecutive matches since title run at Hong Kong in September 2014
- Followed up with QF run at 2015 Miami (d. No.6 Ivanovic en route, l. eventual champion S.Williams)
- Also made R16 at US Open in 2015 (l. Halep)
- During 2r match at 2015 Birmingham served a then-WTA record 27 aces vs. Bencic; since bettered by Kr.Pliskova's 31 aces at 2016 Australian Open during loss to Puig
- Holds record for fastest-recorded serve in WTA history (131mph) in 1r at 2014 Stanford (l. Ivanovic)
- Won fourth career WTA singles title at 2014 Hong Kong (d. Ka.Pliskova in F). Won first title at Premier-level Charleston in 2009 and is 4-5 in singles finals overall
- Best Grand Slam result is reaching 2013 Wimbledon final (l. Bartoli). Was first German to advance to a Grand Slam final since Graf at 1999 Wimbledon. Defeated World No.1 S.Williams en route (R16), ending the American's 34-match winning streak, and defeated No.4 A.Radwanska in SF
- Broke Top 20 after winning title at 2011 Dallas and Top 15 after 2011 Bali, having been outside Top 200 earlier in year
- In doubles has reached one Grand Slam final, at 2011 Wimbledon (w/Stosur). Owns four doubles titles, most recently 2015 Brisbane (w/Hingis)
- Retired vs. Craybas w/left ankle injury at 2010 Indian Wells and was subsequently off tour for five months, ending season at No.179 on the rankings and falling as low as No.218 in March 2011
- Made WTA main draw debut at 2006 Berlin as WC (1r)

- Member of French Fed Cup team that advanced to 2016 competition final vs. Czech Republic
- Played 2015 WTA Finals Rising Stars Invitational in Singapore (l. Osaka in F)
- Made professional debut at 13 on ITF Circuit in France in 2007
- In juniors, singles runner-up at 2011 US Open (l. Min) and was a semifinalist at the other three Slams

- Coached by Bertrand Perret; formerly worked with father, Louis Paul Garcia
- Mother is Marylene
- Played many sports when she was younger and chose tennis because it was the one she enjoyed the most
- Enjoys reading and spending time with family, and a big sports fan
- Best tennis memories are winning Limoges, Strasbourg, and the 2016 Roland Garros doubles title

- Coached by Chip Brooks
- Father is Dr. Richard Lisicki; mother is Elisabeth (an artist - painting, ceramics); has a Yorkshire Terrier named Happy
- Introduced to tennis at age 7 by father
- Favorite shot is serve; likes all surfaces
- Owns fastest serve in WTA history (131mph at Stanford in 2014)
- Speaks German, English and Polish
- Enjoys pop and R&B music, reading and athletics
- Self-described as happy, hardworking and someone who laughs a lot.
