- Only player from Egypt to reach QF
- Reaching the QF is her best result of 2022
- First time a player from Egypt reached QF at Parma
- Is currently ranked No.74

- After skipping grass season due to injury, lost in 1r of Washington DC, Cincinnati, Cleveland, and US Open
- Reached the 2r of the French Open and had to withdraw due to injury (I. Zidansek)
- Made 2r at Rabat (I. Liu)
- Lifted WTA 125K Series title at Karlsruhe without dropping a set
- Contested qualifying at Madrid and made 2r at WTA 125K Series tournament in Saint-Malo
- Won all three singles rubbers as Egypt gained promotion from Europe/Africa Group II of the Billie Jean King Cup
- Began clay-court season with title at WTA 125K Series event at Marbella
- Made 2r at Monterrey (I. Q.Wang) and fell 1r at both Indian Wells (I. Frech) and Miami (I. Li)
- Suffered 1r exits at Dubai (as WC, I. Svitolina) and Doha (I. Cirstea)
- Fell 1r at Melbourne Summer Set 2 (I. Li), Adelaide [250] (I. Samsonova) and Australian Open (I. Watson)

- Broke into Top 100 for first time on August 9, 2021 highest-ranked Egyptian woman ever
- At 2021 Cluj-Napoca, finished R-Up in singles (I. Petkovic) and doubles (w/Piter)
- Last season also reached 2r on three occasions (including at Australian Open) and finished R-Up at WTA
 125K Series event at Karlsruhe
- Made debuts in WTA main draw at 2020 Prague and Grand Slam main draw at 2020 Roland Garros, falling 1r
 as qualifier on both occasions; is the first woman representing Egypt to contest the main draw of a major
- Also contested WTA 125K Series event in Prague in August, reaching 3r; best results on ITF Circuit were
 picking up eighth and ninth title at this level, at \$25k ITF/Antalya-TUR in March and \$100k ITF/Charleston-SC,
 USA in November
- Fell in qualifying at 2020 Australian Open (I. Li in 1r), her first time contesting qualifying at Tour level
- During 2019 season, broke into Top 200 for the first time (at No.189 on November 11, 2019), having only appeared on the rankings on July 1 (at No.500)

- Won first ITF Circuit title in 2013 at \$10k Sharm El-Sheik
- Made ITF Circuit debut in 2010, at a \$10k event in Ain Alsoukhna-Suiz in Egypt

- Has won 13 matches so far in 2022
- Has been involved in 9 three-set matches in 2022

- Tied career best Grand Slam result by reaching 3r at 2019 Wimbledon (as lucky loser, I. Suarez Navarro); in 2r upset Kerber to become the first LL to beat the defending women's champion at Wimbledon and the first LL to win two matches at the tournament
- Win over No.5 Kerber was first Top 10 win since 2017 Eastbourne (d. No.10 A.Radwanska)
- Won 2019 USTA Pro Circuit ITF World Tennis Tour W100 event in Bonita Springs, FL-USA. which helped her win 2019 USTA Roland Garros Wild Card Challenge
- Ended 2018 ranked No.252 her first year-end finish outside Top 100 since 2011
- Only tour-level victories in 2018 came during 3r run at Australian Open (I. Halep)
- Reached career high ranking of No.26 on May 2017 after reaching QF at Morocco (I. Pavlyuchenkova), Doha (as qualifier, I. Wozniacki) and Dubai (I. eventual champion Svitolina) as well as advancing to R16 at Indian Wells (I. Mladenovic)
- Broke into the Top 50 at No.46 for the first time on Jan. 9, 2017 after first career WTA title at Auckland (d. Konjuh in F)
- Appeared in first singles finals of career in 2016, at Washington DC (I. Wickmayer) and Québec City (as qualifier,
 I. Dodin)
- Earned first Top 20 win en route to R16 at 2014 Indian Wells over No.4 Azarenka (I. Dellacqua by walkover)
- Reached 3r at 2014 Australian Open for career best Slam result (I. Bouchard) has since reached 3r at a major four more times
- Notched first WTA main draw win over No.55 Martic at 2012 Indian Wells (I. Petrova in 2r)



- Record in WTA QF matches stands at 5-10
- Has reached two career finals on clay at 2016 Istanbul and 2021 Charleston
- Only player from Montenegro in the draw
- Is currently ranked No.78; this time last year was ranked No.85

- On grass, fell 1r at Eastbourne (I. Linette). Withdrew from Wimbledon w/back injury
- Advanced to 3r at Roland Garros (I. eventual champion Swiatek). Other clay-court highlights included SF run at WTA 125K Series tournament in Marbella and lifting title at W100 ITF Circuit event at Wiesbaden
- Reached 3r at Indian Wells (I. Samsonova) and fell 1r at Miami (I. Fruhvirtova)
- Defeated in 1r at Lyon (I. Rus)
- At Australian Open, became first Montenegrin to reach 3r at a Grand Slam (I. Halep)
- Fell in qualifying at Melbourne Summer Set 1 and in 1r at Adelaide [250] (I. Inglis)

- Enjoyed a productive fortnight in Charleston last season, finishing R-Up at Volvo Car Open (I. Kudermetova) in her first WTA final for five years, then progressed to SF at the following week's MUSC Health Women's Open
- Season highlights in 2020 include reaching QF at Istanbul (I. Bouchard) before advancing to R16 at Rome (as qualifier, I. Mertens)
- Defeated No.10 Bencic at Rome for her second career Top 10 victory (also upset No.8 Vinci at 2016 Madrid)
- At 2020 Australian Open made her first main draw appearance at a major since 2017 Wimbledon Highlights from 2019 were R-Up appearance at 125K event in Bastad, Sweden (I. Doi in F) and QF run at Tashkent Open (I. Cirstea)
- Additionally in 2019, lifted titles at \$100K ITF/Szekesfehervar-HUN, \$25K ITF/Campinas-BRA and \$25K ITF/Ystad-SWE. Now owns 11 singles and four doubles titles on the ITF Circuit
- Spent majority of 2018 competing on the ITF Circuit, though advanced through qualifying at WTA International tournaments Lugano and Istanbul to record back-to-back R16 runs
- In 2016, advanced to second career singles final at Istanbul (I. Buyukakcay)
- Set career-high ranking of No.46 on February 22, 2016, following QF run at Rio de Janeiro
- Made Top 100 debut on May 4, 2015 at No.95
- First WTA final appearance came in shape of R-Up finish at 2015 Tianjin (I. A.Radwanska)
- At 2015 Roland Garros became first player man or woman from Montenegro to advance to 2r of a Grand
 Slam (already set the national record for first player to appear in 1r at major at 2014 Roland Garros)
- Montenegrin Fed Cup Team, 2011-13, 2016, 2018; Montenegrin Olympic Team, 2016
- Reached QF at 2013 Budapest, which was her WTA main draw debut
- Played first events of her career on the ITF Circuit in 2009

- SF performances at Palermo and Warsaw this year are best career results on clay

- Looking for her 30th match win of 2022 today
- Has played 18 three set matches this year

- Advanced to QF at Nottingham (I. eventual champion Haddad Maia) and SF at Berlin (I. Bencic). Also upset in 2r at Eastbourne (after 1r bye, I. Kalinina) and 3r at Wimbledon (I. Maria)
- On clay, advanced to QF at Rome (I. Jabeur) and suffered 2r exits at Stuttgart (after 1r bye, I. Siegemund via ret. w/GI illness), Madrid (I. Kasatkina) and Roland Garros (I. Muchova)
- Finished R-Up at Indian Wells (I. Swiatek) and fell 2r at Miami (after 1r bye, I. Haddad Maia)
- Advanced to SF at Doha (I. eventual champion Swiatek)
- Finished R-Up at St. Petersburg (I. Kontaveit)
- Reached R16 at Australian Open (I. Pegula)
- Fell 2r at Adelaide 500 (I. Rogers)

- Historic 2021 season was highlighted by her becoming first Greek woman to break into the Top 10 (at No.10, September 27) as well as the first from her country to qualify for the WTA Finals (made SF)
- Reached her third WTA singles final at Ostrava (I. Kontaveit) and made the SF at Roland-Garros and US Open, defeating three Top 20 ranked opposed at both event
- Posted most Top 10 wins in 2021 (nine), including two wins over the World No.2 (Osaka at Miami and No.2 Sabalenka at WTA Finals)
- Secured best year-end ranking of No.22 in 2020; broke into Top 20 on February 24 for first time, at No.20
- Scored third and fourth Top 5 wins of her career last season, over No.5 Svitolina at Ostrava and No.5 Bencic (2020 St. Petersburg). Previous wins came over No.5 Ka.Pliskova (2018 Rome) and No.5 Kvitova (2019 Rome, via ret.)
- Upset No.10 seed Keys to reach the R16 for the first time at one of the four Slams, at 2020 Australian Open (I. Kvitova)
- Qualified for WTA Elite Trophy Zhuhai in 2019 for first time in career (fell in RR stage). That season won maiden
 WTA title at Rabat, recovering from a set and break down to defeat Konta in final

- At 2016 Australian Open, by reaching 2r (d. Y.Wang, I. Suárez Navarro) became the first woman from Greece to win a main draw match at a Slam since Daniilidou d. Ka.Pliskova at 2013 Australian Open
- Reached first career WTA QF at 2016 Istanbul (as qualifier, I. Kovinic)
- Fell 1r on WTA main draw debut at 2015 US Open (as qualifier, I. Q.Wang)
- WTA qualifying debut came at 2012 Palermo


