CAREER MILESTONES

- · Enjoyed a productive start to 2021 season in Melbourne, triumphing at the Gippsland Trophy (d. Kanepi in F) to lift sixth WTA singles title, then teamed up w/Sabalenka at Australian Open to claim second Grand Slam doubles title (d. Krejcikova/Siniakova in F); reached R16 in singles at Australian Open (l. Muchova)
- Other first half of the year highlights included finishing R-Up final at Istanbul (l. Cirstea in F, also won doubles title w/Kudermetova), SF at Dubai (l. Muguruza), QF at Madrid (l. Sabalenka) and 3r at both Roland Garros (l. Sakkari) and Wimbledon (l. Keys)
 - In doubles at the All England Club, won third career Grand Slam doubles title w/Hsieh
- In singles, competed in Olympics in Tokyo falling in 1r to Alexandrova then reached SF at San Jose (l. Kasatkina) and R16 at US Open (l. Sabalenka)
- · In doubles w/Hsieh, won title at Indian Wells and qualified for the year-end AKRON WTA Finals in Guadalajara where they reached the final (l/ Krejcikova/Siniakova)
- Won the most matches on Tour in 2020, going 34-13 across the season
- Reached two finals last year, finishing as R-Up at both Prague (l. Halep) and Linz (l. Sabalenka)
- Earned her milestone 200th career main draw win with victory over Kalinina in 1r at Linz
- Won 10th career doubles title at Ostrava (w/Sabalenka)
- Loss to Watson at 2020 Hobart, at 3h 33m, was the longest match of the year
- Singles highlights in 2019 were winning biggest title of career at Doha (d. No.3 Halep in final) and advancing to QF at US Open for the first time (l. eventual champion Andreescu in 3s)
- Enjoyed standout season in doubles in 2019 won maiden major doubles title at US Open w/Sabalenka (d. Azarenka/Barty in F). Also Completed 'Sunshine Double' in doubles (w/Sabalenka), lifting the back-to-back titles at Indian Wells (d. Krejcikova/Siniakova) and Miami (d. Stosur/Zhang), and qualified for Shiseido WTA Finals Shenzhen (went 1-2 in RR)
- Won three singles titles in 2018 (Hobart, Rabat and Lugano), one of six players on tour with three or more titles to their name that year also Kvitova (5), Svitolina (4), Bertens (3), Halep (3) and Wozniacki (3)

- Posted career-high ranking of No.78 on April 4,
- Reached maiden WTA SF at 2021 Portoroz (l. Riske)
- Performed well at the majors in 2021, reaching 3r at Australian Open (as qualifier, l. Brady) and Wimbledon (l. Gauff)
- Began 2021 season brightly in Melbourne, reached 2r at Gippsland Trophy (l. Swiatek) and 3r at Australian Open (l. Brady)
- · Broke into the Top 100 and posted current career-high singles ranking on October 26, 2020 at No.100
- Claimed maiden Top 20 win over No.18 Vondrousova at 2020 Palermo
- Also in 2020 advanced to 2r at US Open (l. Kontaveit) and at Roland Garros (d. No.22 Kerber, l. Burel)
- In 2019, made Grand Slam and tour-level debut as a lucky loser at Roland Garros, falling 1r (l. Cirstea) and won first Grand Slam match as qualifier at Wimbledon (d. Kr.Pliskova) before losing to S. Williams on Centre Court in 2r
- Rose nearly 400 places in the rankings to finish 2018 at a career-best No.174
- Ended 2018 campaign with 42-10 record and four titles on ITF Circuit. Also fell at the first hurdle on WTA qualifying debut at Budapest (l. Schnyder)
- Has 4-7 record for Slovenia in Fed Cup, making debut in 2017 and representing her nation in 2018 and 2019 as well
- Owns seven singles and one doubles title on ITF Circuit
- Made professional debut on ITF Circuit in Slovenia in 2015, losing in the 2r at \$25K Velenje
- On the junior tour, achieved a career-high ranking of No. 5 in January 2017 and won the Wimbledon doubles title in 2017 (with Olga Danilovic). Also won double gold, singles and doubles (with Iga Swiatek), at the Youth Olympics in Buenos Aires in 2018

- · Also in 2018, advanced to first Grand Slam SF of career at 2018 Australian Open (l. eventual champion Wozniacki)
- Finished 2018 with 46 main draw match wins across the campaign - only Ka.Pliskova (49) and Kvitova (47) registered more. By contrast, prior to 2018 season owned only 36 wins at this level across entire career
- In doubles in 2018, won four titles and reached QF at WTA Finals (w/Schuurs)



CAREER MILESTONES

- Produced impressive campaign in 2021, culminating in first Top-50 year-end finish and a career-high ranking of No.43 on November 8
- On clay, won WTA 125K Series title at Saint-Malo and then performed impressively on grass with back-to-back QF runs at Eastbourne and Wimbledon
- After a strong start to last season on ITF Circuit, continued her resurgence by coming through qualifying to reach the final at Lyon (l. Tauson) and Monterrey (l. Fernandez)
- Ended 2020 outside Top 100 (at No.137) for first time since 2017 - after a campaign in which she fell 1r three times (including Australian Open and US Open) and in qualifying on four occasions
