



- Making 1st main-draw appearance at San Jose; fell at second hurdle of qualifying here in 2021
- Faces No.22 Amanda Anisimova in 1r today; only previous meeting with a Top-50 player ended in 6-3 6-2 defeat to No.47 Putintseva in 1r at 2022 Indian Wells
- Only Top-100 win of her career came over No.82 Udvardy in qualifying at 2022 Indian Wells
- Across all levels owns 27-19 record against Americans
- · Has fallen 1r on four previous Tour-level appearances, at 2021 US Open (l. Schmiedlova), 2021 Indian Wells (l. Martincova), 2022 Indian Wells (l. Putintseva) and 2022 Miami (l. Q.Wang)
- One of 11 players from United States in the draw (there were 10 in the field last year)
- This title has been won by an American on 25 occasions, including eight times since 2000
- Best result by a wildcard at San Jose last year was Liu's 2r showing. Last WC to lift this title was Azarenka in 2010
- Is currently ranked at career-high No.242, having been outside Top 500 as recently as this March

- One of three all-American 1r matches (also Day vs. Dolehide and Mandlik vs. Riske-Armitraj)
- Owns 14-8 career record against players from United States in main-draw matches, while is 7-1 this season
- Owns 10-0 career record against wildcards (2-0 in 2022)
- Has lifted one hard-court title, at 2022 Melbourne Summer Set 2
- Is currently ranked No.22; by contrast, was No.84 in the same week last year
- Has won 29 matches so far in 2022; only Swiatek, Jabeur and Halep have won more
- Has been involved in 19 three-set matches in 2022, winning a Tour-leading 13 of them

CAREER MILESTONES

- · Last year, also received WC to Indian Wells, where she was defeated in 1r (l. Martincova)
- Fell 1r on Tour-level debut at 2021 US Open (as WC, l. Schmiedlova in 3s)
- · Also made 2r as WC in doubles at 2021 US Open (w/Montgomery, l. Fernandez/Routliffe) WTA qualifying debut came at 2021 San Jose
- Earned wild cards into the singles and doubles draws at 2021 US Open after sweeping the USTA National Championships
- · Best career result on ITF Circuit was coming through qualifying to reach SF on professional debut in 2019 at W15 event in Carson, CA, USA
- As a junior won 2020 Orange Bowl tournament as a wildcard. Also lifted girls' doubles title at 2021 US Open (w/Montgomery)

- Ended 2021 season with 3r run at Indian Wells to secure her fourth consecutive Top-100 finish
- Best results of 2021 were QF runs at Parma and **Bad Homburg**
- Opened 2020 with SF showing at Auckland, going on to reach 3r at US Open, Roland Garros and Doha
- During Doha run, earned third career Top 10 win over No.7 Svitolina (l. Kuznetsova in 3r due to walkover)
- Finished 2019 ranked No.24 the youngest of three teenagers in the Top 50 (also Andreescu and Yastremska)
- Posted career best Grand Slam result with SF run at 2019 Roland Garros - first player (man or woman) born in 2000s to advance to this stage of a major. Scored maiden win over a Top 5 player during 2019 Roland Garros, upsetting No.3 and defending champion Halep in QF
- Result boosted her into Top 50 for first time at No.26 on June 10, 2019
- Won maiden title at 2019 Bogotá (d. Sharma in F); at 17y 222d was the youngest American to win a title since S.Williams at 1999 Indian Wells (17y 169d)
- Made Top 100 debut at No.95 on September 17, 2018, after reaching first WTA final at Hiroshima (as qualifier, l. Hsieh)
- Also in 2018, upset No.9 Kvitova to become the joint-youngest player to reach R16 at Indian Wells, along with Majoli, who made SF in 1994 (both aged 16 years, 199 days)
- Played only two ITF tournaments before making WTA main draw debut at 2017 Miami (l. Townsend in 3s), with Grand Slam bow coming at 2017 Roland Garros (l. Nara in 1r)
- Owns six Top 20 wins: No.9 Kvitova (2018 Indian Wells), No.11 Sabalenka (2019 Australian Open), No.11 Sabalenka (2019 Roland Garros), No.3 Halep (2019 Roland Garros), No.7 Svitolina (2020 Doha) and No.19 Riske (2020 Western & Southern Open)
- In juniors, won US Open girls' singles in 2017 (d. Gauff in F) and was R-Up at 2016 Roland Garros; reached No.2 in junior world rankings
- Owns one singles title on ITF Circuit
- Made professional debut at 2016 US Open qualifying (l. Hozumi in 2r)

- Is currently ranked No.15, her lowest position since August 2016
- Has won only nine matches so far this season the fewest she has posted entering the US summer swing since 2013

- · Missed entire clay-court season
- Made 2r at Lyon (as qualifier, l. Bondar) and fell 1r at Indian Wells (as qualifier, l. Paolini)
- · On ITF Circuit this February, fell 1r at W60 Andrézieux-Bouthéon and then won first title at this level in nearly four years, at W60 Grenoble
- Opened 2022 season with qualifying exits at Adelaide and Australian Open

- Posted QF showing at Berlin (l. Gauff), then fell 2r at Eastbourne (after 1r bye, l. Boulter) and Wimbledon (l. today's opponent Boulter)
- · On clay, best results were SF at Strasbourg (l. Juvan) and 3r at Charleston (l. Alexandrova). Also fell 2r at Roland Garros (l. Jeanjean), Rome (after 1r bye, l. Teichmann) and Stuttgart (l. Samsonova), and in 1r at Madrid (l. Bouzkova)
- On return to action, suffered 2r defeats at Indian Wells (after 1r bye, l. Kovinic) and Miami (l. Kalinskaya)


