



- Did not win back-to-back main-draw matches at any tournament until QF run at ITF Circuit W100 event in Bonita Springs, FL in early May
- · Competed exclusively on ITF Circuit this season
- Made early exits at ITF Circuit tournaments in Charleston and Evansville
- On grass, fell in qualifying at Nottingham and in 1r at ITF Circuit event in Ilkley. Also finished R-Up in doubles at Nottingham (w/Niculescu)
- During clay-court season, contested qualifying at Roland Garros and Charleston, while fell early on all four outings on ITF Circuit
- Made 2r at Guadalajara (as qualifier, l. Saville) and in qualifying at Miami. Also reached SF at W60 ITF Circuit event in Arcadia, CA and one other QF at this level
- Fell 1r at Australian Open (as qualifier, l. Collins)

- Also in 2017 reached 2r at Stanford (as qualifier, l. Keys) and won second and third ITF Circuit titles of career, at \$60k ITF/Winnipeg-CAN and \$25k ITF/Surprise, AZ-USA
- Fell in qualifying at US Open and WTA events in Indian Wells, Nottingham, Cincinnati, Linz and Luxembourg
- Highlight of 2016 season was coming through qualifying to win maiden ITF Circuit title at \$10k ITF/Buffalo, NY-USA on clay (d. Herring in F).
 Also won doubles at same tournament w/Neel
- Owns six singles and nine doubles titles on ITF Circuit
- Made professional debut at \$10k ITF/Hilton Head Island 2, SC-USA (lost in qualifying)


- Making tournament debut

- Only Italian woman in the draw
- Has enjoyed success in the summer hard-court swing in recent years. Last year at Montréal won biggest career title, while three years ago was R-Up at Washington (I. Pegula) and the Bronx (I. Linette)

<u>Season</u>

- On grass, made SF at Eastbourne (I. Ostapenko), QF at Birmingham (I. eventual champion Haddad Maia) and 2r at Nottingham (I. Dart), while upset in 1r at Wimbledon (I. Frech)
- Highlight of clay-court season was reaching R16 for the first time at Roland Garros (I. Kasatkina). Also fell 1r at Stuttgart (I. Korpatsch), Madrid (I. Pegula - held 1MP) and Rome (I. Tomljanovic via ret. w/left leg injury)
- Won both rubbers (d. Dodin and Tan) to help Italy to qualify for Billie Jean King Cup Finals with a 3-1 triumph over France in Alghero
- Withdrew from Indian Wells (w/illness) and Miami (w/right wrist injury)
- Made 1r exits at St. Petersburg (I. Alexandrova), Dubai (I. Kvitova) and Lyon (I. Garcia)
- In first tournament of 2022, reached 3r at Australian Open (I. eventual champion Barty)

Career Milestones

- Defeated three Top-20 players to lift most prestigious title of her career at 2021 Montréal (d. No.6 Ka.Pliskova in F)
- In 2021 also advanced to SF at Eastbourne (d.No.4 Sabalenka and No.10 Ka.Pliskova, I. Kontaveit via ret. w/left thigh injury) and Tenerife (I. Osorio). Reached QFs at Olympics and Lyon
- During a disrupted 2020, reached SF at Palermo and QF at Lyon, finishing the year at No.76
- In 2019, reached seventh and eighth singles finals of her career, posting R-Up finishes at Washington DC (I. Pegula) and the Bronx (I. Linette)
- Missed entire 2019 clay court season w/wrist and ankle injuries
- Played Fed Cup in 2019 for first time since 2016 lost both her matches (I. Golubic, Bencic) as Italy fell to a 3-1 defeat to Switzerland
- Ended 2018 season perched at a career-best ranking of No.26, winning second career title in final event at Linz (d. Alexandrova in F). Won 29 Tour-level matches in 2018 the most wins she had previously posted in a single season was 28 in 2014
- Advanced to first Grand Slam QF at 2018Wimbledon (I. eventual R-Up S.Williams) on her 26th appearance at this
 level; became the first Italian woman to reach the QF of Wimbledon since 2009 (Schiavone, I. Dementieva)
- Other highlights in 2018 included SF runs at Sydney (I. eventual champion Kerber), Prague (I. Buzarnescu after serving for match in third set) and Tokyo (I. Osaka)
- In 2016 reached final at Katowice for the third year in a row (I. Cibulkova). Appeared in four additional quarterfinals in 2016, at Hobart (I. Bouchard), Prague (I. Ka.Pliskova), Washington DC (I. Davis) and Seoul (I. Zhang)
- Won first career title at 2015 's-Hertogenbosch (d. Bencic in F)
- Had never reached WTA QF prior to 2014; reached QF or better at seven events during that season
- Made Top 100 debut on July 9, 2012 and broke into Top 50 on May 26, 2014
- Tour-level main draw debut came as a qualifier at 2011 Wimbledon
- On ITF Circuit, winner of five singles titles
- Played first career professional tournament at 2006 ITF/Baku-AZE

- Posted best win-by-ranking of career in 2021, defeating No.3 Ka.Pliskova during run to R16 as LL at Indian Wells. Was second Top-10 win of career, after No.4 Stephens at 2019 Acapulco
- Also won five ITF Circuit titles last season, including two W60 in Switzerland towards the end of the year
- Highlights of 2019 were SF at Bogota and QF at Acapulco
- Ended 2018 at No.184, with season highlight reaching 3r at a Premier Mandatory tournament for first time at Miami (l. Ostapenko). Also made 2r at Hobart, Australian Open and Acapulco, and reached final at \$80k ITF/Tyler, TX-USA
- Posted first Top 100 season in 2017, finishing at No.65; only Brazilian to finish in Top 300

- Owns 17 ITF Circuit singles titles
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2012 Québec City (l. El Tabakh)

- Last season reached 2r at Charleston (as qualifier, l. Rogers), Wimbledon (as qualifier, l. Rybakina) and San Jose (l. Rybakina); upset of No.46 Yastremska in 1r at San Jose was first career win over a Top-50 player
- At WTA-level in 2020, fell 1r at US Open (as WC, l. Sorribes Tormo) and in qualifying at Lexington.
 On ITF Circuit, was R-Up twice, including at \$100k ITF/Nicholasville, KY-USA (l. Govortsova)
- Slipped down the rankings in 2019, ending at No.333 after posting 23-23 record (at all levels)
- Fell in WTA qualifying seven times (including Australian Open, Roland Garros and Wimbledon), while on ITF Circuit won third, and most recent, title at \$25k ITF/Florence-SC, USA
- Reached 2r five times in 2018, at Wimbledon (as qualifier, l. eventual champion Kerber in 3s), US
 Open (as WC, l. Sevastova), Miami (as WC, d.
 Osuigwe for first main draw win, l. Barty),
 Charleston (as qualifier, l. Begu) and Bucharest (as qualifier, l. eventual R-Up Martic)
- Win over No.69 Linette in 1r at 2018 Charleston was first over a Top 100 player
- Made Grand Slam main draw debut at 2017 US Open (as qualifier, l. Duan)
- Also in 2017 fell 1r at Stanford (l. Gibbs) and in qualifying at Indian Wells and Québec City.
 Lifted second and third ITF Circuit titles, at \$25k ITF/Naples, FL-USA (as qualifier, d. Collins in F) and \$25k ITF/Caserta-ITA (d. Badosa Gibert in F)
- Fell in qualifying at 2015 US Open and 2016 Miami
- Won first of her six ITF Circuit titles at \$10k ITF/Orlando, FL-USA in 2015
- Played first matches on ITF Circuit in 2014, qualifying at \$25k ITF/Florence (lost 1r)
- In juniors, won the Wimbledon girls' singles in 2017, becoming the first American to win the event since Chanda Rubin in 1992. With this success, rose to No.1 in the ITF girls' junior rankings
- Also won Wimbledon girls' doubles in 2016 w/Arconada. At 2017 Roland Garros lost to Osuigwe in singles final
