

- Previous three appearances at tournament were all courtesy of a wildcard
- In 1r, upset No.25 Beatriz Haddad Maia to score fifth Top-50 win of her career; in terms of ranking, best previous win of her career was over No.41 Zhang Shuai at 2022 Charleston
- Faces No.19 Veronika Kudermetova in 2r today; has lost all previous meetings with Top-20 players, including two this year against Gauff (Indian Wells) and Badosa (Charleston)
- Owns 3-12 career record against seeds, while this year is 3-4
- Bidding to win back-to-back matches at a Tourlevel hard-court event for the first time
- One of eight players from United States to reach 2r (from 11 in original draw), the most since 2001
- This title has been won by an American on 25 occasions, including eight times since 2000
- Is currently ranked No.79, having been down at No.118 as recently as this May
- During last summer's hard-court swing, reached 2r at San Jose, fell 1r at US Open and advanced to SF at WTA 125K Series event in Chicago
- Has won nine matches so far in 2022; by contrast, won only three matches at this level between 2019-21

- Faces No.79 Claire Liu in 2r today owns 14-2 record against opponents outside Top 50 this season, losing to No.66 Rus (Doha) and No.122 Potapova (Istanbul)
- Owns 15-8 career record against players from United States, winning 10 of the past 11 (4-0 this season)
- Best career results at WTA hard-court tournaments are R-Up finishes at 2021 Abu Dhabi and 2022 Melbourne Summer Set 1
- Is currently ranked No.19, having broken into the Top 20 earlier this summer
- During last year's US hard-court swing made 2r at Montréal and Cincinnati, before being upset in 1r at US Open
- Has won 26 matches so far in 2022 the 10thmost on Tour (level with Gauff and Rybakina)

- Last season reached 2r at Charleston (as qualifier, l. Rogers), Wimbledon (as qualifier, l. Rybakina) and San Jose (l. Rybakina); upset of No.46 Yastremska in 1r at San Jose was first career win over a Top-50 player
- At WTA-level in 2020, fell 1r at US Open (as WC, l. Sorribes Tormo) and in qualifying at Lexington.
 On ITF Circuit, was R-Up twice, including at \$100k ITF/Nicholasville, KY-USA (l. Govortsova)
- Slipped down the rankings in 2019, ending at No.333 after posting 23-23 record (at all levels)
- Fell in WTA qualifying seven times (including Australian Open, Roland Garros and Wimbledon), while on ITF Circuit won third, and most recent, title at \$25k ITF/Florence-SC, USA
- Reached 2r five times in 2018, at Wimbledon (as qualifier, l. eventual champion Kerber in 3s), US
 Open (as WC, l. Sevastova), Miami (as WC, d.
 Osuigwe for first main draw win, l. Barty),
 Charleston (as qualifier, l. Begu) and Bucharest (as qualifier, l. eventual R-Up Martic)
- Win over No.69 Linette in 1r at 2018 Charleston was first over a Top 100 player
- Made Grand Slam main draw debut at 2017 US Open (as qualifier, l. Duan)
- Also in 2017 fell 1r at Stanford (l. Gibbs) and in qualifying at Indian Wells and Québec City.
 Lifted second and third ITF Circuit titles, at \$25k ITF/Naples, FL-USA (as qualifier, d. Collins in F) and \$25k ITF/Caserta-ITA (d. Badosa Gibert in F)
- Fell in qualifying at 2015 US Open and 2016 Miami
- Won first of her six ITF Circuit titles at \$10k ITF/Orlando, FL-USA in 2015
- Played first matches on ITF Circuit in 2014, qualifying at \$25k ITF/Florence (lost 1r)
- In juniors, won the Wimbledon girls' singles in 2017, becoming the first American to win the event since Chanda Rubin in 1992. With this success, rose to No.1 in the ITF girls' junior rankings
- Also won Wimbledon girls' doubles in 2016 w/Arconada. At 2017 Roland Garros lost to Osuigwe in singles final

- Last season in singles, reached debut final at Abu Dhabi in opening event (l. Sabalenka) before securing first title at Charleston (d. Kovinic)
- In doubles made two biggest finals of career, at Wimbledon (w/Vesnina, l. Hsieh/Mertens) and Indian Wells (w/Rybakina, l. Hsieh/Mertens)
- Scored first win over a Top-3 ranked opponent by upsetting No.3 Ka.Pliskova at 2020 Western & Southern Open. Other highlights in 2020 included SF run at Hobart and closing out season with back-to-back QFs at Ostrava and Linz
- Won 27 main-draw matches during 2019 had previously won six across entire career - to rise over sixty places in the WTA rankings, making Top 100 debut on February 4 and Top 50 debut on September 9
- Singles highlights in 2019 included reaching maiden WTA SF at 's-Hertogenbosch (l. eventual champion Riske), 3r at Roland Garros (d. No.13 Wozniacki in 1r - her maiden Grand Slam main draw win and also first over a Top 20 opponent - l. Kanepi) and winning WTA 125K Series title at Guadalajara (d. Bouzkova in F)
- Posted first two Top 10 wins of career in final weeks of 2019, over No.10 Bencic at Wuhan and No.4 Svitolina at Moscow
- Fell 1r on Grand Slam main draw debut at 2019 Australian Open (as qualifier, l. Kenin)
- Won career first WTA doubles title at 2019
 Wuhan with Duan (d. Mertens/Sabalenka in F);
 also in 2019 was R-Up at Charleston
 (w/Khromacheva) and Lugano (w/Voskoboeva)
- Posted maiden career WTA QF runs in 2018, first at 's-Hertogenbosch (l. eventual champion Krunic) and then Gstaad (l. Bouchard)
- Reached 2r on WTA main draw debut at 2018 Stuttgart (d. No.25 Suárez Navarro, l. eventual champion Ka.Pliskova)
- WTA qualifying debut came at 2014 Moscow
- Made Billie Jean King Cup debut in 2014 vs. Australia (l. Stosur - her first Tour-level match)
- On ITF Circuit, owns four singles most recently at 2018 \$25K Keito-JPN - and 16 doubles titles
- Made professional debut at \$50K ITF/Kazan-RUS in 2014






