- After 1r bye, faces No.127 Katie Boulter in 2r today; last loss to a player ranked outside Top 100 on grass came against No.112 Kr.Pliskova at 2019 Birmingham
- Owns 6-2 career record against players from Great Britain, losing the most recent of these matches against Konta at 2019 US Open
- Owns 28-13 career record against wildcards, while is 1-1 this season (d. Andrianjafitrimo, L. Jeanjean - both at Roland Garros)
- One of five women from Czech Republic in the draw
- Is one of three Czech women to triumph at Eastbourne - also Jana Novotna (1998) and Helena Sukova (1987)
- Last year on grass, finished R-Up at Wimbledon and fell 2r at Berlin and 1r at Eastbourne
- Has won eight matches so far in 2022; by contrast, entering Eastbourne last year had 15 to her name
- In addition to titles here, career grass-court highlights include title at 2016 Nottingham and R-Up finish at 2021 Wimbledon. Is one of five active players to win three or more grass-court titles (also S.Williams, V.Williams, Kvitova and Kerber)

- Faces No.7 Karolina Pliskova in 2r today; has lost all four career matches against Top-10 players, most recently in three sets to No.4 Sabalenka at 2021 Wimbledon
- In terms of ranking, best career win came over No.35 Riske last week in Birmingham
- Has won past three matches against Czechs, including victory over today's opponent's twin sister Kr.Pliskova at 2021 Miami. Overall (including qualifying and ITF Circuit results) is 6-12 against women from the Czech Republic
- Owns 7-14 career record against seeds, while is 2-2 this season
- One of four British women in the draw (Burrage and Dart also reached 2r - the most since 2013)
- Best result by a British woman at Eastbourne was Wade's title run in 1975
- Best result by a wildcard at Eastbourne were title runs from Jelena Ostapenko in 2021, Julie Halard-Decugis in 2000 and Monica Seles in 1996
- Is currently ranked No.127; this time last year was outside Top 200
- Last year on grass made QF at Nottingham and 2r at Wimbledon

CAREER MILESTONES

- Reached three finals across 2021, at Rome (l. Swiatek), her second Slam final at Wimbledon (l. Barty, having never previously gone beyond R16 at the All England Club) and Montreal (l. Giorgi). Has now reached at least one singles final Tour every year since 2013 (nine straight seasons)
- Ended 2021 season by qualifying for WTA Finals for the fifth consecutive year - only four active players have qualified more than her
- Made Olympic debut, reaching R16 at Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games (l. Giorgi)
- Reached two finals across 2020, at Brisbane (d. Keys) and Rome (l. Halep via ret.)
- Lifted a WTA-leading four titles across the 2019 season (tied with Barty) - triumphed at Brisbane, Rome, Eastbourne and Zhengzhou. Dropped 19 games across five matches during Eastbourne title win (d. Kerber in F) - most economic title run in 2019
- Also reached first Premier Mandatory final at Miami, losing to Barty in straight sets, and produced best Australian Open performance of career, reaching SF (l. eventual champion Osaka in 3s); saved four match points to beat S.Williams in QF
- Lost to twin sister Kr.Pliskova in 2r at Birmingham, in what was their first career main draw encounter
- Made fourth straight appearance at the WTA Finals in 2019, reaching SF for the third year in a row
- Won two titles in 2018 from three finals contested, triumphing at Stuttgart (d. Vandeweghe in F) and Tokyo [PPO] (d. Osaka in F). Posted R-Up finish in Tianjin (l. Garcia in F)
- Won Billie Jean King Cup for Czech Republic in 2015-16 and 2018
- Claimed No.1 ranking on July 17, 2017 despite making 2r exit at Wimbledon (l. Rybarikova). Was the first Czech woman to achieve the No.1 ranking since the computer rankings were introduced in 1975 (Martina Navratilova became No.1 on July 10, 1978 while representing USA)
- Won three titles in 2017, at Brisbane (d. Cornet in F), Doha (d. Wozniacki in F) and Eastbourne (d. Wozniacki in F)
- Is a Grand Slam finalist, reaching the title match at 2016 US Open (l. Kerber)
- Captured fifth WTA doubles title of career at 2016 Birmingham (w/Strycova). At 2013 Linz,
- During last year's grass court season, advanced to QF at Nottingham (ret. vs. Davis w/right elbow injury) and 2r at Wimbledon (l. Sabalenka)
- Opened 2021 season by reaching 3r at the Gippsland Trophy in Melbourne (l. Osaka); upset No.14 seed Gauff in 2r
- Ended 2020 by finishing R-Up at \$15k ITF/Sharm El-Sheikh-EGY. Earlier in the year, made 2r at Acapulco (l. Zhu) and fell 1r at Australian Open (l. Svitolina) in only Tour-level outings
- Suffered a stress fracture in her back which forced her out for much of 2019. Best results prior to injury were 2r showing at Australian Open and SF run at \$25K ITF/Solapur-IND (l. Raina)
- Won the WTA's first-ever 10-point match tie-break at a Slam to see off Makarova in 1r at 2019 Australian Open
- Reached career-high No.82 on February 18, 2019
- Broke into the Top 100 the week of October 15, 2018
- Made significant strides in 2018, reaching first WTA QF of career at Nottingham (l. eventual champion Barty) - defeated Stosur en route for her first win over a Grand Slam winner. Also enjoyed QF run at Tianjin (d. No.432 Sakkari, l. Ka.Pliskova) and R-Up finish at \$100K ITF/Southsea-GBR (l. Flipkens)
- Also in 2018, reached 2r for the first time at a major, at Wimbledon (d. Cepede Royg, l. Osaka)
- Part of Great Britain Fed Cup Team, 2018-19
- Fell 1r on tour level main draw singles debut at 2017 Wimbledon (as WC, l. McHale)
- On ITF Circuit, winner of six singles titles and four doubles titles
- Played first professional events of career on ITF Circuit in Britain in 2011
- Appeared in girls' singles at all four Slams, reaching 3r at Australian Open, Wimbledon and US Open, and was R-Up in doubles at 2014 Australian Open (w/Jorovic, l. Kalinina/Kulichkova). Other junior highlights include winning Lemon Bowl in Rome at age of 11, and reaching final at Junior Orange Bowl in Florida at age 14

with sister Kristyna, became first set of twins to ever win a tour-level doubles title

- Made Top 10 debut after 2015 Stanford R-Up finish; was first time in WTA history that three Czech women ranked inside Top 10 at the same time (also Kvitova and Safarova)
- Scored first Top 20 win of her career over No.16 Petrova in 1r at 2013 Wimbledon
- Won first career WTA title at 2013 Kuala Lumpur (d. Mattek-Sands) and followed it up with two more in 2014 Seoul (d. Lepchenko) and 2014 Linz (d. Giorgi)
- Reached first WTA QF as WC at 2008 Prague (l. Azarenka)
- Made professional debut on ITF Circuit in 2006

- Currently coached by Sascha Bajin; fitness coach is Martin Nosko and Ivan Trebatická; trains at and plays for Sparta Praha tennis club
- Married Michal Hrdlicka after 2018 Wimbledon
- Away from the court, enjoys fresh-water fishing, as well as contributing to her foundation which benefits various causes, including pediatric oncology and children battling cancer in her native Czech Republic
- Enjoys listening to Czech pop music and watching movies (favorites is Public Enemies). Favorite author is Paulo Coelho

- Works with LTA Senior National women's coach Jeremy Bates and receives support from the LTA via their Pro Scholarship Programme, offered to the highest potential British male and female players aged 16-24; trains at National Tennis Centre in London
- Mother is Sue (ex-tennis coach), Father is David
- Began playing tennis aged 5; tennis idol is Serena Williams
- Hobbies include hockey, cycling, shopping and cooking; supports Leicester City football club
