QINWEN ZHENG (CHN #51)

Marino is making her third tournament appearance; she made her tournament debut in 2011... In 12 matches this year, *Marino* has hit 75 aces and is averaging 6.25 aces per match; only Ka.Pliskova (7.09) and Osaka (6.32) average more aces per match... *Marino* is 1 of 5 Canadians in the main draw, the most at this tournament since 1996... *Zheng* is making her tournament debut an third WTA 1000 appearance.

Giorgi won the title at the tournament played last year in Montreal... For **Giorgi** 7 of her 15 Top 10 wins have been on hardcourts and 2 of 3 titles have come on hardcourts... **Raducanu** made her Top 10 debut on July 11; she is the fifth British woman to break into the Top 10 since the WTA Rankings system was introduced, joining Virginia Wade, Sue Barker, Jo Durie and Johanna Konta.

In their first meeting at 2017 US Open, **Kanepi** defeated **Osaka** 6-3, 2-6, 7-5, in R32... **Kanepi** enters the week ranked No.31, her best ranking in more than seven years (since the week of May 19, 2014, when she was ranked No.26)... **Osaka** is making her 33rd appearance at a WTA 1000 tournament; she has reached the championship match four times, winning the title at a WTA 1000 twice – 2018 Indian Wells and 2019 Beijing

Kasatkina returned to the Top 10 on Monday (at a career-high No.9) after capturing her fifth career singles title at San Jose... **Andreescu** won the title the last time the tournament was staged in Toronto... **Andreescu** is 1 of 5 Canadians in the main draw, the most at the tournament since 1996... Since 2009, only S.Williams (85.1%) and Swiatek (79.2%) have a higher match win percentage at WTA 1000s than **Andreescu** (77.5%)

Sakkari is making her 32nd appearance in a WTA 1000 tournament, with her best result coming as runner-up at Indian Wells earlier this year... This is **Sakkari's** 10th time being a Top 3 seed at a tournament (first time at a WTA 1000 event); among the nine previous events as a Top 3 seed, **Sakkari** reached the SF four times, with her best result coming at 2022 St. Petersburg (R-Up)... **Stephens** snapped a four-match losing streak with her opening round win over fellow American Sofia Kenin... **Stephens** closed the match on her sixth match point... **Stephens** owns 9 career Top 5 wins and is bidding for her first Top 5 win since the 2018 WTA Finals; since then she has only faced one other Top 5 opponent – lost to No.3 Sabalenka at 2021 Montreal in 3-sets

- On grass, made 2r at Nottingham (l. Sakkari) and Eastbourne (as qualifier, l. Giorgi) and fell 1r at Birmingham (as qualifier, l. Ostapenko) and Wimbledon (l. Kawa)
- Reached 2r at WTA 125K Series events in Saint-Malo and Karlsruhe and fell 1r at Roland Garros (as qualifier, l .Gauff)
- Won singles rubber (d. Vismane) as Canada beat Latvia 4-0 in Billie Jean King Cup play-off
- Suffered 1r exit at Miami (as qualifier, l. Siniakova)
- Posted a strong sequence of results on her return to North American ITF Circuit, highlighted by a title at W60 tournament in Arcadia, California and two R-Up finishes in Mexico
- Fell in qualifying at Adelaide [500] and in 1r at Australian Open (as qualifier, l. Bouzkova)

- Fell 1r at San Jose (l. Osaka)
- On grass, made 3r at Wimbledon (l. Rybakina) and suffered 1r defeats at Berlin (l. Parks) and Eastbourne (l. Frech)

CAREER MILESTONES

 In 2021, recorded best year-end ranking in 10 years (finished at No.144); at Australian Open, won first main draw match at a Slam since 2011 Wimbledon by defeating Kimberly Birrell (in R64, l. Vondrousova); in total, made five main draw appearances with best result coming at Montreal where she won back-to-back messages (3r, l. Sabalenka).

In 2019 contested Grand Slam qualifying at Australian Open and Roland Garros; comeback was hampered by a severe foot injury forcing her to miss second half of 2019 and all of 2020

- Reached QF at Quebec City (l. Watson) and won two more ITF Circuit titles to end 2018 with 49-12 record and back inside Top 200
- Returned to tennis in January 2018, winning her first 18 matches to lift a hat-trick of titles on ITF Circuit
- Decided in late February 2013 to take an indefinite break from tennis. During her break, she studied English literature at the University of British Columbia and was part of the rowing team
- Appeared in career-first WTA singles final at 2011 Memphis (ret. vs. Rybarikova w/left abdominal injury)
- Best Grand Slam result was 3r run at 2011 Roland Garros (l. Kuznetsova); broke into Top 50 following the tournament at No.45
- Made Top 100 debut on January 31, 2011
- Reached maiden WTA QF at 2010 Quebec City; recorded first Top 20 victory over No.14 Bartoli en route
- Played first WTA qualifying at 2006 Montreal and first main draw at 2008 Quebec City
- Owns 11 singles titles on ITF Circuit; won three titles in four weeks on ITF Circuit in September/October 2010; 18-match winning streak (fell SF next week)
- Made Top 50 debut on July 11, 2011; risen 300 places since end 2008

- Broke into Top 100 on January 31, 2022, following run through qualifying to 2r at Australian Open
- Ended 2021 at No.143, her first Top 150 finish
- Reached 2r on WTA main draw debut in 2021 at Palermo (as qualifier, l. Cristian)
- Made further main draw appearances at Moscow (as qualifier, l. Tsurenko in 1r) and Courmayeur (as qualifier, l. Vekic in 1r) last season
- Also last season contested qualifying in Strasbourg
- Made WTA qualifying debut in 2019, appearing at Miami then also at Tianjin and Wuhan that year
- Made ITF debut in Australia, at a \$25k event in Playford in 2018
- Has gone on to amass seven ITF singles titles, including three in 2021

OTHER INFORMATION

- Born in Toronto and moved to Vancouver at age 2 and grew up there (loves west coast). Parents own construction company in Vancouver, 'Marino General Contracting'
- Started playing at age 10 with father and brother (says that made it lots of fun). Brother was on rowing team at Cal Berkeley (on rowing team), while uncle was gold medalist for Canada in rowing at 1964 Tokyo Olympics
- Best shots are serve and forehand; favorite surface is hard; favorite tournaments are all Canadian ones and US Open
- Best tennis memories are first Top 100 win in Québec City and qualifying for main draw at 2010 US Open
- Likes watching movies and hockey (supports Vancouver Canucks)

- Coached by Pere Riba Madrid and trains in Barcelona
- Parents encouraged her to play multiple sports in her childhood, including table tennis
- Short-term goal is to break into Top 30 by end of 2022
- Tennis idol is Roger Federer

CAREER MILESTONES

- Defeated three Top-20 players to lift most prestigious title of her career at 2021 Montreal (d. No.6 Ka.Pliskova in F)
- In 2021 also advanced to SF at Eastbourne (d. No.4 Sabalenka and No.10 Ka.Pliskova, l. Kontaveit via ret. w/left thigh injury) and Tenerife (l. Osorio). Reached QFs at Olympics and Lyon
- During a disrupted 2020, reached SF at Palermo and QF at Lyon, finishing the year at No.76
- In 2019, reached seventh and eighth singles finals of her career, posting R-Up finishes at Washington DC (l. Pegula) and the Bronx (l. Linette)
- Missed entire 2019 clay court season w/wrist and ankle injuries
- Played Fed Cup in 2019 for first time since 2016 - lost both her matches (l. Golubic, Bencic) as Italy fell to a 3-1 defeat to Switzerland

CAREER MILESTONES

- Historic 2021 season was highlighted by her becoming first Greek woman to break into the Top 10 (at No.10, September 27) as well as the first from her country to qualify for the WTA Finals (made SF)
- Reached her third WTA singles final at Ostrava (l. Kontaveit) and made the SF at Roland-Garros and US Open, defeating three Top 20 ranked opposed at both event
- Posted most Top 10 wins in 2021 (nine), including two wins over the World No.2 (Osaka at Miami and No.2 Sabalenka at WTA Finals)
- Secured best year-end ranking of No.22 in 2020; broke into Top 20 on February 24 for first time, at No.20
- Scored third and fourth Top 5 wins of her career last season, over No.5 Svitolina at Ostrava and No.5 Bencic (2020 St. Petersburg). Previous wins came over No.5 Ka.Pliskova (2018 Rome) and No.5 Kvitova (2019 Rome, via ret.)
- Upset No.10 seed Keys to reach the R16 for the first time at one of the four Slams, at 2020 Australian Open (l. Kvitova)
- Qualified for WTA Elite Trophy Zhuhai in 2019 for first time in career (fell in RR stage). That season won maiden WTA title at Rabat, recovering from a set and break down to defeat Konta in final
- Highlights of 2018 were reaching her first tourlevel final at San Jose (l. Buzarnescu) and scoring maiden Top 5 win over No.5 Ka.Pliskova in 2r at Rome
- Notched first Top 10 victory of career over No.6 Wozniacki en route to first WTA SF of career at 2017 Wuhan Open
- Broke into Top 50 for first time at No.49 on October 9, 2017
- At 2016 Australian Open, by reaching 2r (d. Y.Wang, l. Suárez Navarro) became the first woman from Greece to win a main draw match at a Slam since Daniilidou d. Ka.Pliskova at 2013 Australian Open
- Reached first career WTA QF at 2016 Istanbul (as qualifier, l. Kovinic)
- Fell 1r on WTA main draw debut at 2015 US Open (as qualifier, l. Q.Wang)

- Produced SF showing at Parma (l. Q.Wang) her deepest run since 2019 Madrid - then reached R16 at Roland Garros (l. eventual champion Krejcikova)
- Also last year made QF at Charleston and 3r at Wimbledon and US Open
- Best result of disrupted 2020 campaign was 3r appearance at US Open (l. S.Williams in 3s)
- Finished 2019 season ranked No.25; season was highlighted by SF at Madrid (l. eventual champion Bertens) and QF at Roland Garros (l. Konta)
- In 2018 posted best year-end finish of career to date, at No.6; reached career-high No.3 ranking on July 16, 2018
- Season highlights in 2018 included capturing first Premier Mandatory title at Miami subsequently made Top 10 debut at No.9. Also reached her second Grand Slam final, at Roland Garros and posted R-Up finishes at Montréal and WTA Finals
- Won her maiden Grand Slam title at 2017 US Open, d. Keys 6-3 6-0 to become the fifth unseeded player to win a major in the Open Era
- Voted 2017 WTA Comeback Player of the Year. Returned to action ranked No.957 at Wimbledon after 11 months on sidelines w/foot injury (had surgery in the January) and rose to No.12 following her US Open triumph two months later
- After 1r loss at 2017 Washington DC, went 15-2 through US Open title run, including back-toback SF at Toronto and Cincinnati
- Won three titles in 2016, at Auckland, Acapulco and Premier-level Charleston. Won maiden singles title in first final contested at 2015 Washington, DC
- Made Top 20 debut on January 29, 2013
- At No.97 was youngest player in year-end Top 100 in 2011; and after a phenomenal sophomore season, reached No.38 and was the youngest player, and the only teenager, in the year-end Top 50 in 2012

- WTA qualifying debut came at 2012 Palermo
- Made debut on ITF Circuit in 2010; owns seven ITF Circuit singles titles and five in doubles
