

BEATRIZ HADDAD MAIA (BRA #24)

Head-to-Head

[15] SIMONA HALEP (ROU #16)

Haddad Maia is the first Brazilian to reach the final of a WTA 1000... Haddad Maia is the 4th Brazilian woman to reach 3+ WTA-level finals in a season, joining Suzana Gesteira (1969), Maria Bueno (1968) and Vera Lucia Giugni (1968)... Haddad Maia became the first Brazilian woman to defeat the current WTA World No.1 last round by defeating Swiatek... Haddad Maia is the first lefty to reach the final here was Kvitova (2012)... Haddad Maia has won 17 matches since June, second most on Tour, behind only Garcia (20)... Haddad Maia has played a Tour-leading 19 3-set matches, winning won 15 (also most on Tour)... By reaching SF, Haddad Maia will make her Top 20 debut at No.16 (as runner-up) or No.14 with the title.

Halep has the most wins at WTA 1000s tournaments (184), ahead of Azarenka (177) and Wozniacki (176)... This is Halep's 18th WTA 1000 final, tied with S.Williams for most since the level was introduced in 2009... Only Monica Seles (6), Chris Evert (6), S.Williams (5) and Aranxta Sanchez-Vicario (5) have reached more finals at this tournament than Halep (Capriati also with 4)... Two-time tournament champion (2016, 2018), this is 1 of 5 tournaments Halep has won twice — along with Shenzhen, Madrid, Bucharest and Dubai... Halep has won 37 matches this season, behind only Swiatek (48) and tied with Jabeur (37)... Halep will return to the Top 10 next week either at No.9 as runner-up or No.6 with the title; Halep was most recently in Top 10 the week of Aug. 2, 2021



If Gauff / Pegula win the title, Gauff will move to No.1 in the WTA Doubles Rankings on Monday as the second youngest player to make her debut at No1.; Pegula will also be making her Top 10 debut in doubles next week at No.8... Gauff / Pegula are seeking their second WTA 1000 doubles title of the year (also won Doha)... Pegula has also won doubles titles this year at Melbourne 250 #2 (w/Muhammad) and Washington DC (w/Routliffe); this is her third consecutive doubles final having finished as runner-up at Roland Garros and winning Washington DC... Melichar-Martinez won her 11th doubles title earlier this year at Strasbourg (w/Saville)... Perez won her 4th doubles title earlier this year at 's-Hertogenbosch (w/Zidansek)







SEASON 2022 HISTORY

- Fell 1r at San Jose (l. Liu)
- At Nottingham, lifted titles in singles (d. Riske in F) and doubles (w/S.Zhang). Followed by another title run at Birmingham (d. Zhang in F), a QF at Eastbourne (l. eventual champion Kvitova) and 1r exit at Wimbledon (l. Juvan)
- Highlights of clay-court season came at WTA 125K Series events in Saint-Malo and Paris, where she won title and finished R-Up, respectively. Also made 2r at Roland Garros (l. Kanepi) and Bogota (l. Rakhimova)
- Won all five rubbers as Brazil secured a spot in the Billie Jean King Cup play-offs
- Reached 2r at Indian Wells (l. Tauson) and 3r at Miami (l. Kalinina)
- At Monterrey, advanced to first SF in three years (l. eventual champion Fernandez)
- Fell 1r at Doha (as qualifier, l. Anisimova)
- Fell 1r at Melbourne Summer Set (l. Sorribes Tormo) and at Sydney (as qualifier, l. Bencic).
 Made 2r at Australian Open (l. Halep), where she also finished R-Up in doubles (w/Danilina)

- Fell in 2r at Washington (l. Kalinskaya via ret. w/illness)
- Advanced to SF at Birmingham (l. eventual champion Haddad Maia), Bad Homburg (withdrew w/neck injury prior to match against Andreescu) and Wimbledon (l. eventual champion Rybakina)
- Reached QF at Madrid (l. Jabeur) and fell 2r at Rome (l. Collins) and Roland Garros (l. Q.Zheng)
- Progressed to SF at Indian Wells (l. eventual champion Swiatek). Withdrew from Miami w/left thigh injury
- Advanced to SF at Dubai (l. eventual champion Ostapenko) and fell 1r at Doha (l. Garcia)
- Opened season by lifting 23rd WTA title of her career, at Melbourne Summer Set 1 (d. Kudermetova in F). Made R16 at Australian Open (l. Cornet)





CAREER MILESTONES

- Peaked in rankings at No.80 last season, her highest position since May 2018
- Posted best win-by-ranking of career in 2021, defeating No.3 Ka.Pliskova during run to R16 as LL at Indian Wells. Was second Top-10 win of career, after No.4 Stephens at 2019 Acapulco
- Also won five ITF Circuit titles last season, including two W60 in Switzerland towards the end of the year
- Highlights of 2019 were SF at Bogota and QF at Acapulco
- Ended 2018 at No.184, with season highlight reaching 3r at a Premier Mandatory tournament for first time at Miami (l. Ostapenko). Also made 2r at Hobart, Australian Open and Acapulco, and reached final at \$80k ITF/Tyler, TX-USA
- Posted first Top 100 season in 2017, finishing at No.65; only Brazilian to finish in Top 300
- Hit career-high ranking of No.58 on September 25, 2017
- Broke into Top 100 for first time following 2017 Roland Garros at No.94
- Reached first WTA singles final at 2017 Seoul (l. Ostapenko); previous best results were quarterfinals at 2015 Rio de Janeiro and 2017 Prague
- Won first WTA doubles title at 2015 Bogotá (w/Goncalves, d. Falconi/Rogers). Owns 2-0 record in doubles finals (also won 2017 Bogotá)
- In July 2015, suffered a shoulder injury at the Pan American Games in Toronto, was forced to have surgery and miss remainder of season
- Won first WTA match at 2013 Florianopolis (d. Hsu, l. Czink)
- Owns 17 ITF Circuit singles titles
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2012 Québec City (l. El Tabakh)

- Finished 2021 season at No.20 and briefly dropped out of the Top 20 for the first time since 2013 on Nov.1, 2021
- Ended year on a high note, reaching QF at Moscow (l. Sakkari) and SF at Linz as well as reaching first and only final of the year at Cluj-Napoca (l. Kontaveit)
- Retired in opening match of Rome against Kerber after tearing a calf muscle that kept her out of Roland Garros and Wimbledon where she was the defending champion; made return to play at Montreal and reached R16 at US Open (l. Svitolina)
- Reached SF at Stuttgart (l. Sabalenka) and 3r at Madrid (l. Mertens)
- Posted a 17-match winning streak in 2020, featuring titles at Dubai, Prague and Rome - the longest streak (at any level) of her career
- Victory at 2020 Dubai saw her become the sixth active player to reach 20 career titles
- Lifted second Grand Slam title of her career at Wimbledon in 2019 (d. S.Williams in F)
- Ended 2018 season as World No.1 for the second time in her career, with season highlighted by maiden major title at Roland Garros (d. Stephens in F) - was the second Romanian woman to win a Grand Slam singles title, following in the footsteps of 1978 Roland Garros champion Virginia Ruzici
- Opened 2018 season by sweeping singles and doubles titles at Shenzhen - doubles titles w/Begu was the first of her career
- Finished 2017 as the year-end World No.1, having ascended to the No.1 spot for first time in career on October 9, 2017 - became the 25th woman to reach the top spot, and the 13th to hold yearend No.1
- Has spent 64 weeks as World No.1
- Made Top 10 debut on January 27, 2014 and has remained there ever since
- Breakthrough at Slam level came in 2014, when she made QF at Australian Open (l. Cibulkova), SF at Wimbledon (l. Bouchard) and finished R-Up at Roland Garros (l. Sharapova)
- Owns one win over a reigning World No.1: vs.
 S.Williams in RR at 2014 WTA Finals Singapore

- She won her first six WTA titles in the same calendar year in 2013, and was the first to do so since Stefanie Graf in 1986. This led to her being named the WTA Most Improved Player at the end of the year
- Between May 2013 and August 2014, improved ranking from No.64 to No.2, winning seven titles
- Scored first Top 10 win over then No.6 Li Na in 1r at 2011 US Open
- Broke into Top 100 on October 4, 2010, Top 50 on September 12, 2011 and Top 20 on August 26, 2013
- Has qualified six times for WTA Finals in Singapore (2014-19, although withdrew injured in 2018), reaching final in 2014 (l. S.Williams)
- Made WTA main draw debut at 2010 Marbella as a qualifier, reaching quarterfinals
- Romanian Fed Cup Team, 2010, 2012, 2014-19;
 Romanian Olympic Team, 2012
- Made professional debut on ITF Circuit in Romania in 2006

- Born in Sao Paulo, to Ayrton Elias Maia Filho and Lais Scaff Haddad
- Both her mother and grandmother Arlette Scaff Haddad were successful tennis players in Brazil
- Started playing tennis at the age of five

- Currently working with Patrick Mouratoglou. Previously coached by Darren Cahill
- Enjoys music, movies and football
- Favorite food is pasta; favorite drink is orange juice; favorite city is Paris; favorite tournament is Roland Garros
- Tennis idols are Justine Henin and Roger Federer

- Having made their first appearance together at Madrid 2022, the duo is making their 7th appearance on tour
- On their way to the Toronto final this week, the pair have overcome seeds No.2 Dabrowski/Olmos, No.4 Sanders/Zhang and No.7 Haddad Maia/Krejckova
- On their 5th appearance together, at Wimbledon, they reached the QF's, where they fell against the eventual champions, Krejcikova/Siniakova, in a three-set battle. Today's finalists were the only team to have won a set against the Wimbledon Champions
- Melichar-Martinez has one previous WTA1000 final appearance, reaching the final at Cincinnati 2020 (w/ Y.Xu I. Peschke/Schuurs); this is her 42nd appearance in doubles at a WTA 1000
- For Perez, this is the first final of this level in her 12th WTA 1000 appearance
- Melichar-Martinez has reached two previous Grand Slam finals Wimbledon 2018 (I. Krejcikova/Siniakova) and US Open 2020 (I. Siegemund/Zvonoreva), while she also holds 11 doubles titles on the tour, most recent coming in at Strasbourg 2022
- Perez holds four doubles titles 2022 's-Hertogenbosch (w/ Zidansek), 2021 Guadalajara (w/ Sharma), 2021
 Tenerife (w/ Eikeri) and 2019 Strasbourg (w/ Gavrilova), while her best Grand Slam result has been this year's
 Wimbledon QF run
- Perez also entered the singles qualifying rounds at Toronto this year, however fell in Q2 against C.Liu
