[10] COCO GAUFF (USA #11)

[15] SIMONA HALEP (ROU #16)

**Gauff** is playing this week on a career-high ranking of No.11 and has a chance to move into the Top 10 this week... **Gauff** is the youngest player to reach back-to-back quarterfinals here in Canada at the tournament since Jennifer Capriati did so in 1990, 1991... With a win today, **Gauff** would become the youngest semifinalist at the tournament since 1998 (Hingis)

**Halep** has the most wins at WTA 1000s tournaments (182), ahead of Azarenka (177) and Wozniacki (176)... Two-time tournament champion (2016, 2018), this is 1 of 5 tournaments **Halep** has won twice – along with Shenzhen, Madrid, Bucharest and Dubai... **Halep** has won 35 matches this season, behind only Swiatek (48) and Jabeur (37)... **Halep** has reached 38 QFs at WTA 1000s, only Agnieszka Radwanska (42) has reached more... **Halep** has reached more SF at the WTA 1000 level than any player (28); next in line: S.Williams (26), A.Radwanska (23), Azarenka (22) and Sharapova (22)

[7] JESSICA PEGULA (USA #7)

YULIA PUTINTSEVA (KAZ #46)

**Pegula** is the highest ranked player remaining in the draw... **Pegula** saved match point in her 3r win over Giorgi... Only Swiatek (22) has more hardcourt win at WTA 1000s than **Pegula** (21) in the last two years... This is **Pegula's** 18th career QF appearance and 5th of the 2022 season... This is **Pegula's** 8th QF appearance at a WTA 1000; she has reached the SF at a WTA 1000 3 times

**Putintseva** is through to the quarterfinals at a WTA 1000 for the second time in her career (also 2020 Rome)... Across all levels, **Putintseva** has reached the QF 32 times and has reached the SF 11 times, including twice in 2022 – Budapest and Istanbul, both WTA 250s... **Putintseva** has won 2 of her last 3 Top 10 match-ups – defeating Muguruza (2022 Rome) and Badosa (2022 Toronto) after having lost the previous 12... **Putintseva's** win over Badosa in the second round (via retirement) snapped a 14-match losing streak on hardcourts vs. Top 10 opponents

**[12] BELINDA BENCIC (SUI #12)**

**Haddad Maia** became the first Brazilian woman to defeat the current WTA World No.1 last round by defeating Swiatek... **Haddad Maia** has won 15 matches since June, second most on Tour, behind only Garcia (20)... **Haddad Maia** is the first Brazilian to reach the QF at a WTA 1000 tournament

**Bencic** has 4 Top 10 wins in 2022, including her third round win over Muguruza; she is 5-1 vs. Top 10 opponents at this tournament in her career... Since the start of 2019, only Barty (21) and Sakkari (18) have recorded more Top 10 wins than **Bencic** (18); Sakkari also has 18, followed by Muguruza (13) and Kontaveit (13)... At WTA 1000s, this the 9th QF appearance for **Bencic**... **Bencic** is 11-1 at the tournament with her only loss coming to Svitolina in 2019... **Bencic** has a chance to return to the Top 10 this week

**[14] KAROLINA PLISKOVA (CZE #14)**

**QINWEN ZHENG (CHN #51)**

**Pliskova**, who led the WTA in aces in five of the last seven seasons, has hit a tournament-leading 24 aces this week; **Zheng** has hit 21, the second most this week... With her win over Sakkari last round, **Pliskova** has won 5-straight on hardcourts vs. Top 5 ranked opponents... This is **Pliskova's** 25th QF appearance at the WTA 1000s; she has reached the SF at WTA 1000s 13 times... This is **Pliskova's** 4th QF appearance at the tournament (also 2017, 2019, 2021)

**Zheng** is the first Chinese player to reach the QF at a WTA 1000 since 2020 Doha (Zheng Saisai) and is trying to become the first Chinese woman to reach the SF at a WTA 1000 since 2018 Beijing (Wang Qiang)... **Zheng** is the first Chinese quarterfinalist at the tournament since 2013 (Li Na)

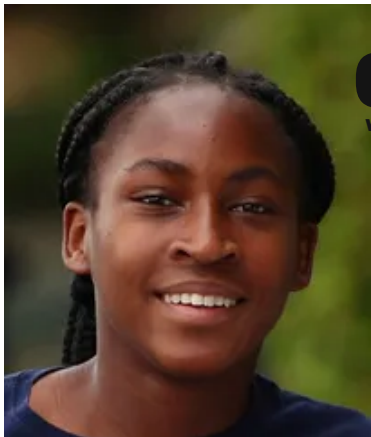

- Record in WTA QF matches stands at 8-6
- Best career result on hard court is Champion which she has reached at Linz in 2019
- One of two players from United States of America to reach QF (w/ Pegula)
- Is currently ranked at her career-high of No.11; has a chance to move into Top 10 this week, depending on results
- During last year's North American swing reached 3r at Indian Wells, 2r at US Open, 2r at Cincinnati, QF at Montreal, QF at Charleston, 2r at Miami
- Has also entered the doubles main draw (w/Pegula) and has reached the QF; Gauff/Pegula are 4th on this year's doubles team leaderboard
- Is currently on a three-match winning streak; longest winning streak of her career was 10 matches in 2021
- Has won 30 matches so far in 2022

- Advanced to QF at San Jose (l. Badosa)
  - Reached SF at Berlin (l. eventual champion Jabeur) and 3r at Wimbledon (l. Anisimova)
  - Highlight of clay-court season came at Roland Garros, where she progressed to maiden major final (l. Swiatek). Also reached 3r at Madrid (l. Halep) and Rome (l. Sakkari), while fell 1r at Stuttgart (l. Kasatinka)
  - Made 3r at Indian Wells (l. Halep) and R16 at Miami (l. eventual champion Swiatek)
  - Defeated in 1r at Dubai (l. Pegula) and then bounced back to reach QF at Doha (l. Sakkari)
  - Fell 1r at Australian Open (l. Q.Wang)
  - Made 2r in season opener at Adelaide (l. eventual champion Barty, having led by a set and a break) and then SF at Adelaide [250] (l. eventual champion Keys)
- Fell in 2r at Washington (l. Kalinskaya via ret. w/illness)
  - Advanced to SF at Birmingham (l. eventual champion Haddad Maia), Bad Homburg (withdrew w/neck injury prior to match against Andreescu) and Wimbledon (l. eventual champion Rybakina)
  - Reached QF at Madrid (l. Jabeur) and fell 2r at Rome (l. Collins) and Roland Garros (l. Q.Zheng)
  - Progressed to SF at Indian Wells (l. eventual champion Swiatek). Withdrew from Miami w/left thigh injury
  - Advanced to SF at Dubai (l. eventual champion Ostapenko) and fell 1r at Doha (l. Garcia)
  - Opened season by lifting 23rd WTA title of her career, at Melbourne Summer Set 1 (d. Kudermetova in F). Made R16 at Australian Open (l. Cornet)

## CAREER MILESTONES

- Highlight of 2021 campaign was completing singles-doubles title sweep at Parma; defeated Q.Wang in singles final and teamed up w/McNally to win doubles
- Elsewhere, last season also reached SF at Adelaide and Rome, while at the Slams made QF at Roland Garros and R16 at Wimbledon
- Finished R-Up in doubles at 2021 US Open (w/McNally, l. Stosur/Zhang)
- Ended 2020 season at No.48, just one shy of her career high which she reached on October 26, 2020
- First cracked the Top 50 earlier in the season on Feb. 24, 2020 at No.49 following a R16 appearance at Australian Open to tie her career best Grand Slam result - during performance, defeated V.Williams in 1r and her first Top 5 opponent in No.4 Osaka in 3r (l. eventual champion Kenin in 3s)
- Enjoyed breakout season in 2019, highlighted by maiden WTA singles title at Linz (as lucky loser, d. Ostapenko in F) - earned her first Top 10 win en route to title over No.8 Bertens in QF
- At 15y214d, her title run in Linz made her youngest to win a WTA tour-level title since Vaidisova (15y177d) won Tashkent in 2004
- Also claimed maiden WTA doubles titles at Washington, DC (w/McNally, d. Sanchez/Stollar in F) and Luxembourg (w/McNally, d. Christian/Guarachi in F)
- By winning the doubles title at Washington, DC at 15 yrs, 144 days, became the youngest player to win a doubles title since May 1995 (Martina Hingis won Hamburg at 14 yrs, 219 days)
- Reached R16 at 2019 Wimbledon on Grand Slam main draw debut defeating V.Williams in 1r (l. eventual champion Halep) - followed with 3r showing at US Open (as WC, l. Osaka)
- Made WTA main draw debut as a wildcard at 2019 Miami where she earned her first WTA main draw win over good friend McNally (l. Kasatkina in 2r)
- Made professional debut in May 2018 as a qualifier into the \$25K ITF/Osprey, FL-USA
- Member of US Billie Jean King Cup team in 2020
- Former Junior World No.1 (July 2018). Won 2018 Roland Garros girls' title (d. McNally in F) and 2018 US Open doubles title (w/McNally), while finished R-Up at 2017 US Open girls' event (l. Anisimova) becoming the youngest girls' singles finalist in US Open history at 13-years-old
- Finished 2021 season at No.20 and briefly dropped out of the Top 20 for the first time since 2013 on Nov.1, 2021
- Ended year on a high note, reaching QF at Moscow (l. Sakkari) and SF at Linz as well as reaching first and only final of the year at Cluj-Napoca (l. Kontaveit)
- Retired in opening match of Rome against Kerber after tearing a calf muscle that kept her out of Roland Garros and Wimbledon where she was the defending champion; made return to play at Montreal and reached R16 at US Open (l. Svitolina)
- Reached SF at Stuttgart (l. Sabalenka) and 3r at Madrid (l. Mertens)
- Posted a 17-match winning streak in 2020, featuring titles at Dubai, Prague and Rome - the longest streak (at any level) of her career
- Victory at 2020 Dubai saw her become the sixth active player to reach 20 career titles
- Lifted second Grand Slam title of her career at Wimbledon in 2019 (d. S.Williams in F)
- Ended 2018 season as World No.1 for the second time in her career, with season highlighted by maiden major title at Roland Garros (d. Stephens in F) - was the second Romanian woman to win a Grand Slam singles title, following in the footsteps of 1978 Roland Garros champion Virginia Ruzici
- Opened 2018 season by sweeping singles and doubles titles at Shenzhen - doubles titles w/Begu was the first of her career
- Finished 2017 as the year-end World No.1, having ascended to the No.1 spot for first time in career on October 9, 2017 - became the 25th woman to reach the top spot, and the 13th to hold year-end No.1
- Has spent 64 weeks as World No.1
- Made Top 10 debut on January 27, 2014 and has remained there ever since
- Breakthrough at Slam level came in 2014, when she made QF at Australian Open (l. Cibulkova), SF at Wimbledon (l. Bouchard) and finished R-Up at Roland Garros (l. Sharapova)
- Owns one win over a reigning World No.1: vs. S.Williams in RR at 2014 WTA Finals Singapore

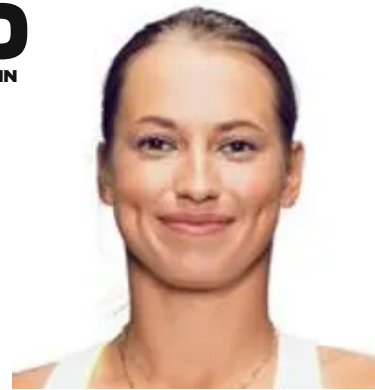

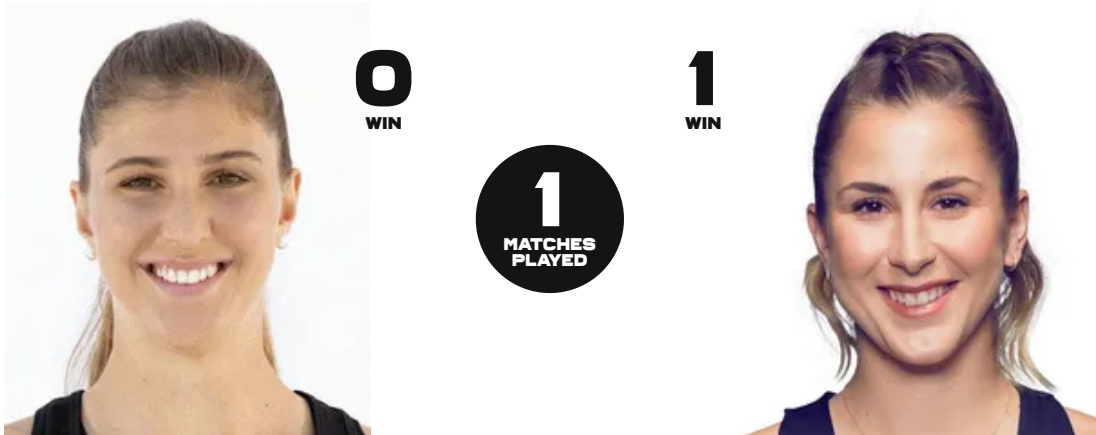

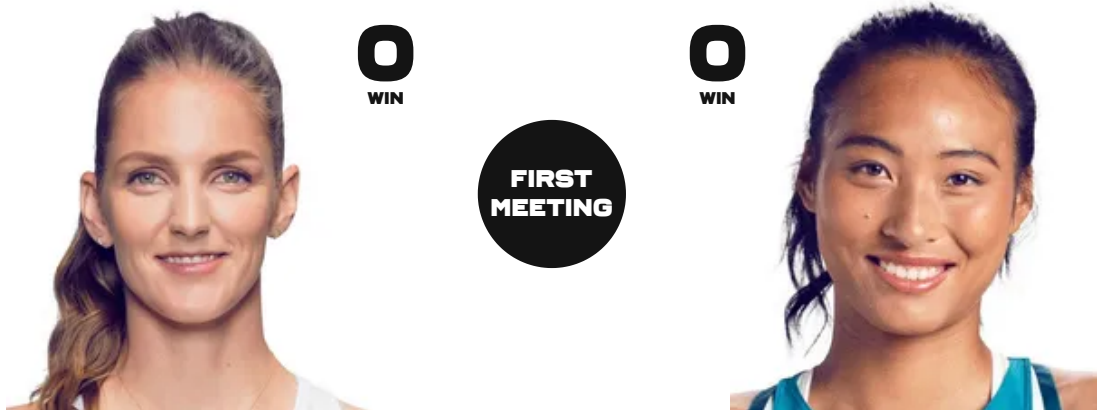

## CAREER MILESTONES

- Reached three finals across 2021, at Rome (l. Swiatek), her second Slam final at Wimbledon (l. Barty, having never previously gone beyond R16 at the All England Club) and Montreal (l. Giorgi). Has now reached at least one singles final Tour every year since 2013 (nine straight seasons)
- Ended 2021 season by qualifying for WTA Finals for the fifth consecutive year - only four active players have qualified more than her
- Made Olympic debut, reaching R16 at Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games (l. Giorgi)
- Reached two finals across 2020, at Brisbane (d. Keys) and Rome (l. Halep via ret.)
- Lifted a WTA-leading four titles across the 2019 season (tied with Barty) - triumphed at Brisbane, Rome, Eastbourne and Zhengzhou. Dropped 19 games across five matches during Eastbourne title win (d. Kerber in F) - most economic title run in 2019
- Also reached first Premier Mandatory final at Miami, losing to Barty in straight sets, and produced best Australian Open performance of career, reaching SF (l. eventual champion Osaka in 3s); saved four match points to beat S.Williams in QF
- Lost to twin sister Kr.Pliskova in 2r at Birmingham, in what was their first career main draw encounter
- Made fourth straight appearance at the WTA Finals in 2019, reaching SF for the third year in a row
- Won two titles in 2018 from three finals contested, triumphing at Stuttgart (d. Vandeweghe in F) and Tokyo [PPO] (d. Osaka in F). Posted R-Up finish in Tianjin (l. Garcia in F)
- Won Billie Jean King Cup for Czech Republic in 2015-16 and 2018
- Claimed No.1 ranking on July 17, 2017 despite making 2r exit at Wimbledon (l. Rybarikova). Was the first Czech woman to achieve the No.1 ranking since the computer rankings were introduced in 1975 (Martina Navratilova became No.1 on July 10, 1978 while representing USA)
- Won three titles in 2017, at Brisbane (d. Cornet in F), Doha (d. Wozniacki in F) and Eastbourne (d. Wozniacki in F)
- Is a Grand Slam finalist, reaching the title match at 2016 US Open (l. Kerber)
- Captured fifth WTA doubles title of career at 2016 Birmingham (w/Strycova). At 2013 Linz,
- Broke into Top 100 on January 31, 2022, following run through qualifying to 2r at Australian Open
- Ended 2021 at No.143, her first Top 150 finish
- Reached 2r on WTA main draw debut in 2021 at Palermo (as qualifier, l. Cristian)
- Made further main draw appearances at Moscow (as qualifier, l. Tsurenko in 1r) and Courmayeur (as qualifier, l. Vekic in 1r) last season
- Also last season contested qualifying in Strasbourg
- Made WTA qualifying debut in 2019, appearing at Miami then also at Tianjin and Wuhan that year
- Made ITF debut in Australia, at a \$25k event in Playford in 2018
- Has gone on to amass seven ITF singles titles, including three in 2021

with sister Kristyna, became first set of twins to ever win a tour-level doubles title

- Made Top 10 debut after 2015 Stanford R-Up finish; was first time in WTA history that three Czech women ranked inside Top 10 at the same time (also Kvitova and Safarova)
- Scored first Top 20 win of her career over No.16 Petrova in 1r at 2013 Wimbledon
- Won first career WTA title at 2013 Kuala Lumpur (d. Mattek-Sands) and followed it up with two more in 2014 Seoul (d. Lepchenko) and 2014 Linz (d. Giorgi)
- Reached first WTA QF as WC at 2008 Prague (l. Azarenka)
- Made professional debut on ITF Circuit in 2006
