This season **Kichenok** and **Ostapenko** won 10-straight matches on grass and also claimed a WTA 1000 title at Cincinnati, beating **Kudermetova** and **Mertens** en route





#### **CURRENT TOURNAMENT**

#### **PLAYER NOTES**

- Making 2nd appearance at the WTA Finals, where her previous outing ended in the roundrobin stage in Guadalajara last year
- Faces No.8 Daria Kasatkina in opening roundrobin match; has beaten her four times this season and today bids to become first woman to win five or more matches against the same opponent in a single season since 2014 (Kvitova vs. Safarova)
- Owns 17 wins in career over Top-10 players, including a Tour-leading 12-1 record this season (one loss came against No.1 Barty at Adelaide)
- Best result by a Polish player at WTA Finals was A.Radwanska's title run in 2015
- Is currently ranked No.1, with a 5780 point lead, while this time last year was No.11
- Is the first player to finish the regular season with more than 10,000 ranking points (currently 10,335) since S.Williams in 2013
- Bidding to be sixth No.1 seed to win this title since round-robin format was reintroduced in 2003; last year, top seed Sabalenka fell in the group stage
- Has won a Tour-leading 64 matches so far in 2022 (including Billie Jean King Cup matches); this is the most wins in a single season since 2013, when S.Williams notched up 78
- Won 37 consecutive matches over the span of 135 days earlier in the year, the joint-longest win streak on the Hologic WTA Tour since 1990
- Claimed eight titles from this year Doha, Indian Wells, Miami, Stuttgart, Rome, Roland-Garros, US Open and San Diego; is the first player to win two Slams in a single season since 2016

#### **PLAYER NOTES**

- Making her 1st appearance at the WTA Finals
- Also made a trip to the WTA Finals in Singapore in 2018 where she was a non-playing alternate
- Faces No.1 Iga Swiatek in first round-robin match today; owns 2-2 career record against World No.1s, beating Kerber (2017 Sydney) and Wozniacki (2018 St. Petersburg), while losing to S.Williams (2016 Australian Open) and Swiatek (2022 Roland-Garros)
- Overall has 18 wins in career over Top-10 players, most recently No.6 Sabalenka and No.4 Badosa during title run at San Jose in August
- Has scored 40 wins this year fourth on Tour behind Swiatek, Jabeur and Pegula - with 24 coming on hard courts; has never won 25 hardcourt matches in a season
- In 2022, has contested 144 rallies lasting 15 shots or more - only Sorribes Tormo has played more with 233 (not including Grand Slam matches)
- For the second year straight, has won multiple WTA titles, both on hard at San Jose and Granby; also made SF on hard at Melbourne [250] and Sydney
- Currently ranked No.8, having returned to the Top 10 for the first time since 2019 following San Jose title in August; this time last year was No.28




### **SEASON 2022 HISTORY**

- Finished R-Up at Ostrava (l. Krejcikova) and won title at San Diego (d. Vekic in F)
- Made 3r at Toronto (I. Haddad Maia) and Cincinnati (I. Keys) before lifting second major of season at US Open (d. Jabeur in F)
- Upset in 3r at Wimbledon (l. Cornet) result ended 37-match winning streak - and QF at Warsaw (l. eventual champion Garcia)
- On clay claimed titles at Stuttgart (d. Sabalenka in F), Rome (d. Jabeur in F) and Roland-Garros (d. Gauff in F)
- Won both rubbers during Poland's 4-0 Billie Jean King Cup victory over Romania (d. Buzarnescu and Prisacariu)
- Lifted Miami title without dropping a set (d. Osaka in F), becoming fourth woman to complete 'Sunshine Double' (also Graf, Clijsters and Azarenka)
- At Indian Wells, won fifth career title (d. Sakkari in F); is the first player to win five or more WTA titles before turning 21 since Wozniacki in 2009
- Fell 2r at Dubai (l. eventual champion Ostapenko) and then lifted title at Doha (d. Kontaveit in F) and
- Reached SF during defense of Adelaide title (l. eventual champion Barty) and also at Australian Open (l. Collins)

- Defeated in 2r at Ostrava (l. Alexandrova) and San Diego (l. Keys), while made 3r at Guadalajara (l. Kalinskaya)
- After 1r exits at at Toronto (l. Andreescu) and Cincinnati (l. Anisimova), enjoyed title run at Granby (d. Saville in F) before 1r exit at US Open (l. Dart)
- Won title at San Jose (d. Rogers in F) to secure return to Top 10; upset No.6 Sabalenka and No.4 Badosa en route
- Reached QF at Berlin (l. Sakkari) and Bad Homburg (l. Andreescu)
- Advanced to SF at Rome (l. Jabeur) and Roland Garros (l. eventual champion Swiatek)
- Made 2r at Stuttgart (l. Jabeur) and 3r at Madrid (d. No.5 Sakkari in 2r, l. Sorribes Tormo)
- Fell 3r at Indian Wells (l. Kerber) and 2r at Miami (after 1r bye, l. Sasnovich)
- Defeated in 1r at Dubai and 3r at Doha (l. Swiatek at both tournaments)
- Withdrew from St. Petersburg title defense after testing positive for COVID-19 on arrival
- Advanced to SF at Melbourne Summer Series 2 (l. eventual champion Anisimova) and Sydney (d. No.3 Muguruza in QF, l. Badosa). Reached 3r at Australian Open (l. Swiatek)





### **CAREER MILESTONES**

- In 2022, lifted second and third Grand Slam titles, at Roland-Garros (d. Gauff in F) and US Open (d. Jabeur in F)
- Triumph in Paris was the last of six straight titles during 37-match winning streak - jointlongest unbeaten run on Tour since 1990
- Won two titles in 2021, at Adelaide and Rome.
   Other highlights included QF at Roland-Garros and SF at Ostrava and qualifying for WTA Finals Guadalajara (fell in group stage)
- Also finished doubles R-Up at 2021 Roland-Garros (w/Mattek-Sands, l. Krejcikova/Siniakova)
- Won her maiden Tour-level title at 2020 Roland-Garros without dropping a set, becoming the first player from Poland man or woman to win a Grand Slam singles title and first from her country to reach a major final since
   A.Radwanska at 2012 Wimbledon
- Ranked No.54, she became the lowest-ranked woman to win the Roland-Garros title in the Open Era and the lowest-ranked finalist since 1977 (No.56 Mihai). At 19y 132d, is the youngest champion in Paris since Monica Seles (18y 187d) in 1992
- Also became the first player to win her debut Tour-level title at a Grand Slam since Jelena Ostapenko at 2017 Roland-Garros
- Won WTA Most Improved Player of the Year for 2020, as voted on by members of the media.
   Also won the 2020 WTA Fan Favorite Award
- Ended 2019 season ranked No.61 after a campaign highlighted by R-Up finish at Lugano (l. Hercog) and R16 run at Roland-Garros (l. Halep). That year also reached 3r at Toronto (l. Osaka) and made 2r five times (incl. Australian and US Open)
- Broke into Top 100 at No.88 after R-Up finish at 2019 Lugano
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2019 Auckland
- Ended 2018 season ranked No.175 (up from No.690 in 2017), after posting 42-6 record and winning four titles on ITF Circuit
- Member of Poland's Billie Jean King Cup team, 2018-20, 2021-22
- On professional debut, came through qualifying to win title at \$10k ITF/Stockholm-SWE in 2016; owns seven singles titles at this level
- Enjoyed stellar junior career, including winning girls' singles at 2018 Wimbledon (d. Küng in F) and leading Poland to Junior Fed Cup in 2016

- In 2022, reached maiden Grand Slam SF at Roland-Garros (l. eventual champion Swiatek) and won titles at San Jose (d. Rogers in F) and Granby (d. Saville in F); returned to Top 10 on August 8, after San Jose run
- Broke back into Top 50 in early 2021, after lifting first titles since 2018, at the Phillip Island Trophy in Melbourne (d. Bouzkova in F) and then St. Petersburg (d. Gasparyan in F)
- Reached two additional finals in 2021, at Birmingham (l. Jabeur) and San Jose (l. Collins)
- Helped Russia win their fifth Billie Jean King Cup and first since 2008 with her singles win over Teichmann in the 2021 final against Switzerland
- Highlight of truncated 2020 season was SF showing at Lyon (l. Friedsam) - her first run to the last four at a WTA event since lifting title at 2018 Moscow [500]
- Won consecutive matches only twice in difficult 2019 campaign, with best result a QF run at Beijing (l. Wozniacki)
- Ended 2018 season by lifting her second WTA singles title at Moscow [500], recovering from a set and 6-2 4-1 down to defeat Jabeur in final; broke into Top 10 following the tournament, on October 22, 2018
- Knocked out No.2 seed Wozniacki en route to her first Grand Slam QF, at 2018 Roland-Garros
- Reached biggest final of career at 2018 Indian Wells (I. Osaka), having upset No.2 Wozniacki, No.10 Kerber and No.8 V.Williams en route
- Made Top-20 debut on February 26, 2018, following R-Up finish at Dubai (d. No.3 Muguruza, l. Svitolina)
- Captured maiden WTA singles title in debut final at 2017 Charleston, defeating fellow teenager Ostapenko in F - the first all-teenage final on tour since 2009 Linz (Wickmayer d. Kvitova)
- Ended 2016 as the highest-ranked teenager on tour, at No.27, after a campaign in which she reached a second career WTA SF, at St.
   Petersburg and made QF stage at Indian Wells, Charleston, Montréal, Rio Olympics and Moscow.
   Made Top 50 debut on February 15, 2016, following St. Petersburg run
- Upset No.7 V.Williams in opening match of 2016 season at Auckland to register the first Top-10 win of her career
- Made Billie Jean King Cup debut in World Group quarter-final defeat to Netherlands in 2016. Has also represented Russia in the competition in 2017, 2019 and 2021, and at 2016 Olympics

- Reached first WTA SF at 2015 Moscow (as qualifier, l. Pavlyuchenkova, having recorded first Top-20 win over No.14 Suárez Navarro in QF); following the tournament made Top-100 debut at No.73 (October 26, 2015)
- Reached 3r at 2015 US Open (as LL, l. Mladenovic) on Grand Slam debut (main draw and qualifying). Earlier in summer of 2015, won back-to-back matches for first time at a WTA tournament during QF run at Bad Gastein (as qualifier, l. Errani)
- Also in 2015, won maiden WTA doubles title at 2015 Moscow (w/Vesnina), lifted five singles titles on ITF Circuit and was nominated for WTA Newcomer of the Year in 2015
- Fell 1r on WTA main draw debut at 2014 Moscow (as WC, l. Riske)
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2013 Moscow


### OTHER INFORMATION

- Coached by Tomasz Wiktorowski. previously worked with Piotr Sierzputowski
- Father is former Olympic rower Tomasz Swiatek, who competed in the men's quadruple sculls event at the 1988 Summer Olympics in Seoul
- This summer organised 'Iga Swiatek and friends for Ukraine' event in Krakow, which featured a mixed doubles match between Agnieszka Radwanska, Sergiy Stakhovsky, Polish junior Martyn Pawelski and herself, and was attended by Poland's First Lady, Agata Kornhauser-Duda, Elina Svitolina and Andriy Shevchenko. The occasion was watched by almost 15,000 people live and a further one million on television, raising more than half a million Euros for Ukrainian children and teenagers affected by the war
- Started playing tennis because her older sister was playing and wanted to beat her
- Enjoys rock music, including AC/DC and Pink Floyd
- Includes PZU, ASICS, Tecnifibre, Rolex and Xiaomi in her endorsement portfolio

- Currently coached by Carlos Martinez, formerly with Philippe Dehaes
- Parents are Sergey and Tatiana; brother is Alexsandr, who also serves as her fitness trainer; introduced to tennis by brother at age 6
- Baseliner whose favorite surface is clay; favorite shot is forehand
- Loves soccer (favorite team is FC Barcelona)
- Best tennis memory is winning Roland Garros juniors and 2015 US Open run
