Split their first two meetings with **Kasatkina** winning in 3-sets at 2021 San Jose and **Garcia** winning at 2019 Wuhan... **Garcia** is the only player this year to lift titles on all three surfaces... **Garcia** owns the Tour-lead for most aces this year... **Kasatkina** currently sits at her career-high ranking... **Kasatkina** is 28-0 in 2022 when winning the opening set... **Garcia** could become the fifth player to reach the semifinals at the WTA Finals at her first two appearance in the tournament's current format

Head-to-Head[4] COCO GAUFF (USA #4)

By winning her first two round robin matches, **Swiatek** has secured a spot in the semifinals... With the two wins, **Swiatek** has pushed her ranking point total to 10,835; only Victoria Azarenka and Serena Williams have reached a higher total... **Gauff** cannot advance but can add 250 ranking points with a win today (or 125 with a loss)... **Swiatek** has won the first four meetings in straight sets... **Swiatek** has a Tour-leading 14 wins vs. Top-10 opponents this year (14-1 record); she is the first player to win 14-straight vs. Top 10 since Justine Henin (2007)... **Swiatek** is 40-5 since moving to no.



#### PLAYER NOTES

- Making 2nd appearance at WTA Finals; advanced to SF on debut in Singapore in 2017
- The five-year gap between first an second appearances at the tournament is the fourth biggest in history; only Amy Frazer (eight), Barbara Paulus and Judith Wiesner (both six) took longer to return
- Has beaten Coco Gauff in the opening match and fell against Iga Swiatek so far this week, now faces No.8 Daria Kasatkina in her thrid match of the week
- Has won the first meeting against Kasatkina in Wuhan 2019, however lost the following in San Jose 2021
- Could become the fith player to reach SF at the WTA Finals at her first two appearances in the tournament since Robin Round format was reintroduced in 2003 (Sakkari, Stosur, Wozniacki and Sharapova)
- Could become the third French woman to reach the SF at her first two WTA Final appearances after Durr (1972 & 1973) and Pierce (1993 & 1994)
- Owns 22 wins in career over Top 10 players, including five this season: No.1 Swiatek at Warsaw, No.3 Sakkari, No.8 Pegula and No.4 Gauff this week
- Only second to Swiatek for title wins his season; also the only player to win titles on all three surfaces
- Has won 33 WTA matches since June 2022, at least 10 more than any other player in this run
- First French player to qualify for WTA Finals since her own run to SF in 2017; only Frenchwoman to win this title was Mauresmo in 2005 (d. Pierce in F)
- Posted 33 Tour-level wins since June, at least nine more than any other player in this timespan
- Is now the player with the most aces in 2022, 373, having surpased the tour leader Rybakina (370)
- Has made 427 successful net approaches in the Hologic WTA Tour this season, at least 64 more than any other player in 2022
- Owns four titles on hard courts; 2022 Cincinnati, 2018 Tianjin, 2917 Beijing and 2017 Wuhan

#### **PLAYER NOTES**

- Making 1st appearance at WTA FINALS
- Also made a trip to WTA Finals in Singapore in 2018 when she was a non-playing alternate
- Lost to No.1 Swiatek in first roun-robin match; now 2-3 in career against World No.1s
- Won in straight sets for the third time in her career agianst Gauff, who she met in her second encounter of the robin round; with this win she ensured to keep her chances to enter the SF round at the WTA Finals 2022
- Faces No.6 Caroline Garcia in today; owns 20 wins in career over Top 10 players, most recently beating No.6 Sabalenka and No.4 Badosa during title run at San Jose, as well as No.4 Gauff
- Owns 7-4 career record against players from France, with record in 2022 standing at 1-0 (d. Perry in Granby)
- Has won 5-2 matches against Top 5 players in 2022, having only lost to Swiatek (Roland Garros and WTA Finals)
- Has now secured 25 hard court wins in 2022, her highest tally in a single year
- Continues to be undefeated in 2022 when she wins the opening set (29/29)
- Is second on tour, behind Sakkari (282), for saving the most break points in 2022 - with 279 break points saved
- Only Sabalenka, Swiatek and Kanepi (10 each) have made more comeback wins than Kasatkina in 2022 (nine)
- Is currently ranked No.8; this time last year was ranked No.28
- Ranks third on Tour for both hames (47.3%) and points (48.5%) won on return; only Swiatek (49.7% and 49.7%) and Halep (48% and 49.8%) are above her
- Entering the tournament, had contested 144 rallies lasting 15 shots or more this season only Sorribes Tormo has player more with 233 (not including Slam matches)
- Currently ranked No.8, having returned to the Top 10 for the first time since 2019 following San Jose title in August; thist ime last year was No.28

- Suffered exits in 2r at Indian Wells (l. Raducanu) and 1r at Miami (l. Bondar)
- Advanced to SF at Lyon (l. eventual champion Zhang)
- Defeated in 1r at Dubai (as WC, l. Krejcikova) and 2r at Doha (l. Gauff)
- Upset in 1r at Australian Open (l. Baptiste, having led 6-4 5-3)
- Fell 1r at Melbourne Summer Set 2 (l. Sevastova) and made QF at Sydney (l. Krejcikova)

- Defeated in 2r at Ostrava (l. Alexandrova) and San Diego (l. Keys), while made 3r at Guadalajara (l. Kalinskaya)

## **CAREER MILESTONES**

- Return to form in second half of 2022, winning three tournaments, including a run through qualifying to Cincinnati title (d. Kvitova in F), and career-best Slam showing with SF run at US Open (l. Jabeur)
- Only player to win titles on all three surfaces in 2022, having also triumphed on grass at Bad Homburg (d. Andreescu in F) and on clay at Warsaw (d. Bogdan in F). Summer form saw her return to Top 10 on September 12, following US Open SF
- Best win of her career came over No.1 Swiatek in QF at 2022 Warsaw
- At 2022 Roland-Garros, won first doubles title in almost six years (w/Mladenovic, d. Gauff/Pegula in F)
- Highlights in 2021 came on clay, with SF at Lausanne and QF at Parma
- Best results in 2020 were at Slams, reaching R16 at Roland-Garros (l. Svitolina) and 3r at US Open (l. Brady); defeated No.3 Ka.Pliskova in 2r at Flushing Meadows to record her first Top-10 win since late 2018
- Highlights of 2019 campaign include capturing her seventh career WTA singles title at Nottingham (d. Vekic in F) and finishing R-Up at Strasbourg (l. Yastremska)
- Member of French Billie Jean King Cup team that won the 2019 competition final vs. Australia, teaming up with Mladenovic to win the decisive doubles runner against Barty/Stosur. Also took part in the team that advanced to final vs. Czech Republic
- Fell out of the Top 20 on March 18, 2019 after holding her position there since August 14, 2017
- In 2018, won sixth career title at Tianjin; also made SF at Stuttgart and Madrid
- Broke into the Top 5 on August 13, 2018 and reached a career-high of No.4 on September 10, 2018
- Became first player to win Wuhan and Beijing back-to-back in 2017. As a result, qualified for WTA Finals. Was ranked No.30 on the Race to Singapore leaderboard in May 2017
- Made Top-10 debut on October 9, 2017, following completion of Wuhan-Beijing title double
- Won a career-best 48 main draw matches in 2017 (48-22 record, two titles), including reaching maiden major QF at Roland-Garros (l. Ka.Pliskova)
- Qualifying for WTA Finals in 2017, became the first Frenchwoman to compete at WTA Finals in singles since Mauresmo in 2006 (l. Henin in F)

- In 2022, reached maiden Grand Slam SF at Roland-Garros (l. eventual champion Swiatek) and won titles at San Jose (d. Rogers in F) and Granby (d. Saville in F); returned to Top 10 on August 8, after San Jose run Broke back into Top 50 in early 2021, after lifting first titles since 2018, at the Phillip Island Trophy in Melbourne (d. Bouzkova in F) and then St. Petersburg (d. Gasparyan in F)
- Reached two additional finals in 2021, at Birmingham (l. Jabeur) and San Jose (l. Collins)
- Helped Russia win their fifth Billie Jean King Cup and first since 2008 with her singles win over Teichmann in the 2021 final against Switzerland
- Highlight of truncated 2020 season was SF showing at Lyon (l. Friedsam) - her first run to the last four at a WTA event since lifting title at 2018 Moscow [500]





- She also appeared in three other WTA finals 2021 Indian Wells (w/Rybakina), 2019 Charleston (w/Khromacheva) and 2019 Lugano (w/Voskoboeva)
- In singles, lifted maiden WTA title at Charleston in April 2021. This year, she has finished R-Up at Melbourne Summer Set 1, Dubai and Istanbul, reaching career-high singles ranking of No.9 on October 24; she is first alternate in singles at WTA Finals this week
