WORLD NO.1 SCENARIO

Ashleigh Barty became the 14th WTA player to achieve the year-end No.1 singles ranking in 2019, and she repeated the feat in 2020 and 2021. She will kick off her 104th consecutive week at No. 1 entering Australian Open, a mark that stands as the fifth longest streak in WTA history.

Barty first claimed the No.1 ranking on June 24, 2019, after winning back-to-back titles at Roland Garros and Birmingham, and will spend her 111th and 112th non-consecutive weeks atop the WTA Rankings during the coming fortnight.

Aryna Sabalenka and **Barbora Krejčíková** can both challenge Barty for the No.1 spot in Melbourne.

Sabalenka would need to reach at least the final if she is to overtake Barty at the summit.

-If Barty reaches the QF, then Sabalenka would need to win the title

-If Barty reaches the final, Sabalenka cannot move to No.1

Krejčíková, who is through to the Sydney final, will also need to reach the final at the Australian Open in order to keep her hopes of overtaking Barty alive, with specific scenarios depending on the result of this weekend's championship match:

If Krejčíková wins Sydney...

Krejčíková will need to reach the final to have a chance of moving to No.1

-If Barty reaches the R16 or Sabalenka reaches the final, then Krejčíková would move to No.1 only by winning the title

-If Barty reaches the final, Krejčíková cannot move to No.1

If Krejčíková finishes runner-up in Sydney...

Krejčíková will need to reach the final to have a chance of moving to No.1

-If Barty reaches the 3r or Sabalenka reaches the final, then Krejčíková would move to No.1 only by winning the title

-If Barty reaches the SF, Krejčíková cannot move to No.1

ACTIVE GRAND SLAM CHAMPIONS

Two first-time Grand Slam champions were crowned in 2021 – **Barbora Krejčíková** at Roland Garros and **Emma Raducanu** at US Open – there are now 19 active Grand Slam champions, six of whom have lifted the trophy at the Australian Open: **Victoria Azarenka** (2012-13), **Angelique Kerber** (2016), **Serena Williams** (2003, 2005, 2007, 2009-10, 2015, 2017), **Kim Clijsters** (2011), **Naomi Osaka** (2019) and **Sofia Kenin** (2020).

CORNET CONTINUES GRAND SLAM STREAK

Alizé Cornet holds the title of having the longest active consecutive Grand Slam main draw appearance streak with 60-straight appearances. She holds the third longest streak of consecutive slams in the Open Era behind only **Ai Sugiyama** (62) and **Francesca Schiavone** (61). **Schiavone** had amassed 61 successive Grand Slam appearances dating back to 2000 US Open, however the Italian veteran fell in the second round of qualifying at the 2016 Australian Open (l. Razzano). As such, **Sugiyama** retains the longest streak in the Open Era for women – 62 appearances in a row. Feliciano Lopez holds the men’s record with 79 consecutive appearances (including 2021 Australian Open).

DEFENDING THE TITLE, A TOUGH TASK

There have been 24 title defenses at Wimbledon, 22 at the US Open, **21 at the Australian Open** and 11 at Roland Garros (post-1945):

- 22 different women have successfully defended a Grand Slam singles title at least once in their careers
- 10 different women have successfully defended two or more different Grand Slams
- Only five women – Maureen Connolly, Margaret Court, Stefanie Graf, Monica Seles and Serena Williams – have defended three or more different majors
- Graf is the only woman to have defended at all four of the majors more than once; in fact she achieved the amazing feat at least twice at each Grand Slam
- Six defending champions have lost in the opening round of their title defense: Graf (1994 Wimbledon), Capriati (2003 Australian Open), Myskina (2005 Roland Garros), Kuznetsova (2005 US Open), Kerber (2017 US Open) and Ostapenko (2018 Roland Garros)
- **Victoria Azarenka (2012-13) was the last player to defend her title at the Australian Open**

DIFFERENT GRAND SLAM CHAMPIONS

In 2021, for the fifth year in a row, the majors were all won by different Grand Slam champions in a calendar year – Naomi Osaka, Barbora Krejčíková, Ashleigh Barty and Emma Raducanu.

In the Open Era, the majors have produced all different champions in 16 different years, and it has happened 29 times since 1926. See table below for details (prefix denotes seeding):
