- The Miami Open presented by Itaú, a combined WTA 1000 and ATP Masters 1000 even, is celebrating its 37th year
- Defending champion **Ashleigh Barty**, who triumphed on the past two stagings of the tournament in 2019 and 2021, is not present this year, leaving **Aryna Sabalenka** as top seed
- Two former champions are in the draw: **Victoria Azarenka** (2009, 2011, 2016) and **Sloane Stephens** (2018), as well a couple of previous runners-up, **Jelena Ostapenko** (2018) and **Karolina Pliskova** (2019)
- After missing the opening few months of the season with a hand injury, **Pliskova** is set to play her second tournament of the year, having lost early at Indian Wells. The Czech will meet either reigning US Open girls' singles champion **Robin Montgomery** or a qualifier in the second round
- While Barty and last year's beaten finalist Bianca Andreescu are not in the draw this fortnight, 2021's other two semifinalists, **Maria Sakkari** and **Elina Svitolina**, are present and are seeded No.4 and No.15, respectively

- **Naomi Osaka**, who reached the quarterfinals at Miami last year, is unseeded and faces **Astra Sharma** in the first round. The winner will meet three-time major winner and former World No.1 **Angelique Kerber**
- Arguably the pick of the first-round matches is the all-American clash between **Amanda Anisimova** and **Shelby Rogers**
- *One To Watch* – **Daria Saville**. Seven years ago, Saville made her Miami debut as a wildcard, upsetting Maria Sharapova en route to the fourth round. Now on the comeback trail after several campaigns in the injury wilderness, the Australian is showing signs of a return to the form of old. In her past two tournaments, Saville has made the quarterfinals at Guadalajara and come through qualifying at Indian Wells, where her run was finally ended by a thigh injury against Maria Sakkari in the fourth round

WILDCARDS

In 2010, Justine Henin became the first wildcard to reach the semifinals at Miami. A wildcard has reached R16 or better 13 times, most recently Ana Konjuh in 2021:

SEEDS

Aryna Sabalenka is the No.1 seed at this year’s Miami Open. The top seed has won the title here 14 times, including last year when Ashleigh Barty defended her title (d. Andreescu in F). The earliest the top seed has lost is third round, in 1995 (Sánchez Vicario, I. Werdel Witmeyer), 2018 (Halep, I. A.Radwanska) and 2019 (Osaka, I. Hsieh).

- Sixteen different women have won the singles title at Miami. Aside from **Serena Williams** who has won a record eight singles titles, other multiple winners are **Stefanie Graf** (5), **Venus Williams** (3), **Victoria Azarenka** (3), **Monica Seles** (2), **Arantxa Sánchez Vicario** (2), **Martina Hingis** (2), **Kim Clijsters** (2) and **Ashleigh Barty** (2)
- The title has been won 11 times by the current WTA No.1 ranked player and 30 times by a player who held the No.1 ranking at some point during their career. Of the former champions at Miami, only five have not held the No.1 ranking: **Gabriela Sabatini** (1989), **Svetlana Kuznetsova** (2006), **Agnieszka Radwanska** (2012), **Johanna Konta** (2017) and **Sloane Stephens** (2018)
- The final has featured the Top 2 seeds seven times (1985, 1986, 1988, 1989, 1993, 2001, 2014) with the top seed winning six of those finals; the No.1 seed has won the final 14 times overall
