Linette is 2-16 against Top-10 opponents, posting wins over No.1 Barty at 2021 Roland Garros and No.5 Svitolina at 2021 Wimbledon... Jabeur leads the Tour in clay-court match wins this season with 17

For the third consecutive Slam, **Marino** has reached the main draw via qualifying... **Gauff** lost to eventual champion Krejčíková in last year's QF here... **Marino** has two career Top-20 wins, over No.14 Bartoli at 2010 Québec City and No.15 Pavlyuchenkova at 2011 Luxembourg... **Gauff** was upset by No.110 Q.Wang in opening round of January's Australian Open

- Making 8th appearance at Roland Garros, where her best previous results have been 3r runs in 2021 (l. today's opponent Jabeur) and 2017 (l. Svitolina)
- During last year's 3r run, beat defending champion and World No.1 Barty in 2r via ret. (w/hip injury)
- Faces No.6 Jabeur in 1r today; in addition to win over Barty her last year, only other Top-10 upset came against No.5 Svitolina at 2021 Wimbledon
- Her one win over Jabeur in four meetings came via retirement (ankle injury) during run through qualifying to maiden WTA SF at 2013 Baku
- Record in Grand Slam 1r matches is 10-16
- One of three players from Poland in main draw (also Swiatek and Frech) - most since 2015 (Kania, Linette and A.Radwanska)
- Best result by a Polish player at Roland Garros was title run by Swiatek in 2020
- Best career result on clay was SF run at Strasbourg 2021 (l. Cirstea)
- Deepest Grand Slam runs have been to 3r at Australian Open 2018; Roland Garros 2017, 2021; Wimbledon 2019, 2021 and US Open in 2020
- During last year's European clay swing reached SF at Strasbourg, 3r at Roland Garros, and fell 1r at Rome and Madrid

PLAYER NOTES

- Making her 5th appearance at Roland Garros, where her previous best results have been R16 runs in 2020 (ll Collins) and 2021 (l. Gauff)
- Also made 3r in 2017 (as qualifier, l. Bacsinszky) - was the first Arab woman to reach this stage at a major
- Won girls' singles title here in 2011 (d. Puig in F). Is one of 12 former champions in the women's singles this year - only six women have won both junior and senior titles here
- Faces No.56 Linette in 1r today; struck 26 winners and won 11 games in a row during comeback win over the Pole in 3r here last year
- Record in Grand Slam 1r matches is 11-8, winning the last eight
- Is currently ranked at a career-high No.6 (first posted on May 16, 2022); this time last year was No.26
- Has won 25 matches so far in 2022; she is ranked No.2 on tour for match wins, behind Iga Swiatek (37)
- Leads the Tour with 17 clay-court wins this season; by contrast, won 13 in 2021 and three in 2020
- Is ranked No.3 on Tour, behind Ka.Pliskova and Alexandrova (both 66), for most aces on clay court this season (65)
- Leads the Tour in several other categories this season, including overall winners (852), forehand winners (486), backhand winners (260) successful net approaches (196) and successful dropshots (103) - stats do not include Grand Slam matches
- Owns one title on clay, at 2022 Madrid. Has also finished R-Up at Charleston [250] in 2021, and Rome and Charleston [500] in 2022
- Sole player from Tunisia in the main draw. Only other Tunisian woman in WTA rankings in No.741 Chiraz Bechri
- Involved in 13 three-set matches in 2022, only Anisimova (9-4) has played this many
- Has won all 21 matches this season when she has taken the first set
- Best Grand Slam results are two QF runs, at 2020 Australian Open and 2021 Wimbledon

CAREER MILESTONES

- Posted seventh successive Top 100 season in 2021, finishing at No.57 after starting her season at Miami in March, due to a knee injury
- Reached two semifinals in 2021, at Strasbourg (l. Cirstea) and Cleveland (l. Begu)
- Matched previous best results at Grand Slams in 2021 with 3r runs at Roland Garros (d. World No.1 Barty via ret. in 2r; l. Jabeur) and Wimbledon (d. No.5 Svitolina in 2r for best win of career in a completed match, before falling to Badosa)
- Won second WTA singles title at Hua Hin in 2020 (d. Kung in F), rising to new career-high ranking of No.33 (on February 17)
- Posted best result at US Open by advancing to 3r (l. Kontaveit); now has reached this stage at all four Grand Slams
- Winner of 2020 WTA Shot of the Year; became the third Polish woman to win this award (after A.Radwanska and Swiatek)
- Her 2019 campaign was highlighted by lifting maiden WTA title at the Bronx and finished R-Up at Seoul (l. Muchova); broke into Top 50 on September 9, 2019
- Season highlights in 2018 included QF run at Washington DC (l. Vekic); win over No.17 Osaka in 2r was first Top 20 victory - previous career-best win came over No.21 Gavrilova at 2017 Tokyo [PPO]
- Posted first career victories at 2018 Australian Open during 3r run (d. Brady in 1r and No.22 seed Kasatkina in 2r, l. Allertova)
- Highlight of 2017 campaign was SF at Kuala Lumpur (l. Hibino). Also made QF at Bogotá and reached 3r at major for first time at Roland Garros
- In 2016 enjoyed run to first Premier-level quarterfinal of career at Tokyo [PPO] (as qualifier, l. eventual champion Wozniacki); also advanced to QF at Katowice (l. Parmentier)
- Reached maiden WTA singles final at 2015 Tokyo [Japan Open] (l. Wickmayer)
- Broke into Top 100 on June 15, 2015
- Played first two WTA main draws in 2013: 2r at Strasbourg (l. Cornet) and SF at Baku (l. Peer)
- Made professional debut on ITF Circuit in Poland in 2007; owns 12 singles titles and eight doubles titles on ITF Circuit
- Broke into Top 10 on October 18, 2021, following SF run at Indian Wells (l. eventual champion Badosa)
- At 2021 Birmingham, became first Arab woman to win a WTA title (d. Kasatkina in F). Followed this with QF at Wimbledon (l. Sabalenka)
- Last season also finished R-Up at Charleston [250] (l. Sharma) and Chicago [500] (l. Muguruza)
- Reached maiden Grand Slam QF at 2020 Australian Open to become the first Arab woman to reach that stage at a major (l. eventual champion Kenin); made Top 50 debut at No.45 after breakthrough performance in Melbourne
