2022 ROLAND GARROS

The first national French Championships for women were held in 1897, with foreign competitors eligible to take part from 1925. As such, this year's Roland Garros represents the 115th staging of the event overall, and the 92nd edition since international players were admitted (the tournament was not held during WWI and WWII). This year also marks the 55th staging of the Open Era (which began in 1968). Of the 128 players in the singles main draw, 104 gain direct entry based on WTA Singles Rankings (for week of April 11, 2022). In addition, there are 16 qualifiers who play three rounds of qualifying matches, as well as eight wildcards.

WORLD NO.1

Currently on a 28-match winning streak, Iga Swiatek will spend her eighth and ninth weeks at the top of the WTA rankings during the Roland Garros fortnight. Swiatek, who claimed the No.1 spot on April 4 this year, is the first man or woman from Poland to reach the top ranking in singles.

ANNIVERSARY QUEENS

Among other notable anniversaries, the 2022 edition of Roland Garros marks 10 years since **Maria Sharapova** captured her first French title to complete her Career Grand Slam, and 50 years since **Billie Jean King** won her sole title in Paris, which also meant a Career Slam for the American great.

King and Sharapova are two of just 10 women (all-time) who have achieved a Career Grand Slam.

YEAR	CHAMPION
5 years ago – 2017	Two days after turning 20, unseeded Jelena Ostapenko shocked Simona Halep in the Roland Garros final. Ostapenko's hard-hitting run through the draw led to her first singles title.
10 years ago – 2012	No.2 seed Maria Sharapova won her first Roland Garros title against Sara Errani to complete her Career Grand Slam. Sharapova lifted the Coupe Suzanne Lenglen again in 2014.
15 years ago – 2007	Justine Henin won her third consecutive French Open title, and fourth overall, this time defeating future champion Ana Ivanovic in the final. For the second year in a row, the Belgian did not drop a set en route to the winner's dias.
20 years ago – 2002	Serena Williams defeated her sister Venus to win the first of her three Roland Garros singles titles. The victory also kicked off the first of Williams' two "Serena Slams," when she held all four majors simultaneously.
25 years ago – 1997	Ninth-seeded Iva Majoli stunned World No.1 Martina Hingis in the final to win her lone Grand Slam title. It would be the only loss Hingis took all year at the majors and marked the end of a 37-match win streak.
30 years ago – 1992	Monica Seles completed a hat-trick by winning her third straight Roland Garros title. Seles defeated Stefanie Graf in a dramatic 2-hour and 43-minute final, ultimately prevailing 10-8 in the third set.
35 years ago – 1987	Heralding a changing of the guard, Stefanie Graf won the first of her 22 Grand Slam singles titles, defeating No.1 seed Martina Navratilova in the Paris final, 6-4, 4-6, 8-6.
40 years ago – 1982	Martina Navratilova won the first of her two Roland Garros singles titles, beating the defending champion Hana Mandlikova in the semifinals and teenager Andrea Jaeger in the final.
45 years ago – 1977	Top-seeded Mima Jausovec , representing Yugoslavia, defeated Florenta Mihai to win her sole Grand Slam title. The Slovenian player went on to reach two further finals at Roland Garros, losing to Virginia Ruzici and Chris Evert.
50 years ago – 1972	No.3 seed Billie Jean King won her sole Roland Garros singles title, defeating top seed Evonne Goolagong in the final to complete her Career Grand Slam. King won her total of 12 singles majors across the amateur and Open eras.

STRONG OFF THE BLOCKS – FIRST-ROUND SUCCESS

Of those players with 10 or more Grand Slam appearances in this year's Roland Garros draw, here are the players with the best strike rate in the opening round at a Grand Slam:

- **Madison Keys (31-5 in 1r):** Has suffered a couple of 1r exits over the past few years, at 2021 US Open (l. Stephens) and 2020 Roland Garros (l. S.Zhang). Other three losses at this stage came in her teenage years, at 2012 Australian Open (l. J.Zheng), 2013 US Open (l. Jankovic) and 2014 Roland Garros (l. Errani)
- **Garbiñe Muguruza (30-6 in 1r):** Muguruza fell 1r most recently at last year's Roland Garros (l. Kostyuk). Her other five defeats at this stage came on her Grand Slam debut at 2012 US Open (l. J. Errani), 2014 Wimbledon (l. Vandeweghe), 2014 US Open (l. Lucic-Baroni), 2019 Wimbledon (l. Haddad Maia) and 2019 US Open (l. Riske)
- **Naomi Osaka (19-2 in 1r):** Osaka lost her opening match at 2017 Roland Garros (l. Van Uytvanck) and more recently at 2019 Wimbledon (l. Putintseva)
- **Elise Mertens (17-3 in 1r):** Mertens fell at the first hurdle three times in her first four Grand Slam main-draw appearances, however, since then has won 16 straight matches at this stage
- **Iga Swiatek (11-1 in 1r):** Swiatek has been defeated in 1r only once in 12 Grand Slam main-draw appearances, at 2019 Wimbledon (l. Golubic)

QUALIFIERS AT GRAND SLAMS & ROLAND GARROS

Sixteen players earned their main draw place by winning through the qualifying rounds this year, along with three lucky losers. Last year at US Open, Emma Raducanu became the first qualifier, male or female, to win a major title in the Open Era. Before that, the deepest run by a qualifier at any Grand Slam was to the semifinals – achieved by Nadia Podoroska at 2020 Roland Garros, Alexandra Stevenson at 1999 Wimbledon and Christine Dorey at the 1978 Australian Open.

A qualifier has reached the quarterfinal stage at Roland Garros 11 times, most recently **Nadia Podoroska** and **Martina Trevisan** in 2020:

ROLAND GARROS MISCELLANY

- The 115th staging of the women's singles at French Championships (having first been played in 1897)
- Only five times, in 1933 (**Margaret Scriven**), 2010 (**Francesca Schiavone**), 2017 (**Jelena Ostapenko**), 2020 (**Iga Swiatek**) and 2021 (**Barbora Krejčíková**) has the singles title at Roland Garros not been won by a Top 10 seed
- The players who have won the most Roland Garros singles titles (in the tournament's entire history) are **Chris Evert** (7); **Stefanie Graf** (6); **Margaret Smith Court** (5); **Justine Henin** and **Helen Wills-Moody** (4); and **Hilde Sperling**, **Monica Seles**, **Arantxa Sánchez-Vicario** and **Serena Williams** (3)
- USA has won the most titles at Roland Garros (29) ahead of Germany (10), then Australia (9) and Great Britain (8)
- The players who own the most doubles titles are **Martina Navratilova** (7), **Simonne Mathieu**, **Natasha Zvereva** and **Gigi Fernandez** (6 apiece)
- Last season, **Barbora Krejčíková** became the first player since **Mary Pierce** in 2000 to sweep the singles and doubles titles at Roland Garros. **Lucie Safarova** also contested both the singles and doubles finals in 2015 (finished runner-up in singles, champion in doubles)
- There are seven former or current No.1s in the 2022 main draw: **Victoria Azarenka**, **Angelique Kerber**, **Karolina Pliskova**, **Garbiñe Muguruza**, **Simona Halep**, **Naomi Osaka** and **Iga Swiatek**
- Longest match (time): 4 hours, 7 minutes – V.Buisson (FRA) d. N. Van Lottum (FRA) 67 75 62, 1r, 1995
- Longest match (games): 56 games – K Melville (AUS) d. P.Teeguarden (USA) 97 46 1614, 1r, 1972. Since the introduction of the tiebreak in 1973, the record is 46 games, which has happened twice
- A left-handed player has won the singles title 10 times (most recently, **Monica Seles** in 1992)
- The singles title has been won without dropping a set 21 times (most recently, **Iga Swiatek** in 2020)
- Five players have won the title after saving match point: **Osborne DuPont** (1946); **Smith-Court** (1962); **Myskina** (2004); **Henin** (2005) and **Barbora Krejčíková** (2021)
- Only six players have won the Roland Garros women's singles title after winning the Roland Garros girls' singles title (**Halep**, **Durr**, **Jausovec**, **Mandlikova**, **Capriati** and **Henin**)
- Previous girls' singles winners in this year's main draw are: **Kanepi** (2001), **Cornet** (2007), **Halep** (2008), **Mladenovic** (2009), **Jabeur** (2011), **Bencic** (2013), **Kasatkina** (2014), **Badosa** (2015), **Gauff** (2018), **Fernandez** (2019), **Jacquemot** (2020), **Noskova** (2021)

- Last year, **Barbora Krejčíková** won her first Grand Slam in singles on her fifth main draw appearance at the majors, and she became the first woman since 2000 to sweep the singles and doubles titles at Roland Garros. Having saved a match point en route, she also became the first Czech woman to win Roland Garros since Hana Mandlíková in 1981
- Two years ago, **Iga Swiatek** won her first Grand Slam and became the first Polish Player to win a Grand Slam Singles title. She also became the lowest-ranked player to win Roland Garros since rankings were introduced in 1975 and the youngest woman to lift the trophy here since Monica Seles in 1992
- Five years ago, **Jelena Ostapenko** became the first unseeded player in the Open Era to win Roland Garros
- Ten years ago, Maria Sharapova won her first Roland Garros title against Sara Errani to complete her Career Grand Slam
- In 2011, **Li Na** won the title at Roland Garros as the No.6 seed, the first Asian to win a Grand Slam singles title
- Twenty years ago, **Serena Williams** defeated her sister Venus to win the first of her three Roland Garros titles. The victory also kicked off the first of her two “Serena Slams”
- In the Open Era, the Top 2 seeds have played in the final 12 times, with the No.2 seed winning seven times (most recently 1995)
- Thirty-one of the Roland Garros women’s titles have been won by one of the Top 2 seeds; the top seed has won the title 19 times, and the No.2 seed has won the title 12 times
- The Roland Garros final has been decided in three sets on 22 occasions, most recently in 2021
