GAUFF: Defeated Anisimova during title run at 2021 Parma... Aiming to reach last 16 at Wimbledon for the third time in succession... Hit a 124mph serve against Buzarnescu in second round... Youngest of two teenagers left in the draw... Gauff has never beaten a seeded opponent at Wimbledon

ANISIMOVA: Fought back from dropping the opening set to beat fellow American Davis in previous round... Now owns a Tour-leading 12 three-set wins this season... Enjoying deepest run at Wimbledon... Has won past five matches against fellow Americans

[4] PAULA BADOSA (ESP #4)

[31] PETRA KVITOVA (CZE #26)

BADOSA: Six previous grass-court matches against seeded players ended in defeat... Progressed to fourth round here last year when ranked No.33... Bidding for 27th win of the campaign... Fell at opening hurdle to No.169 Burrage in only pre-Wimbledon grass-court tournament at Eastbourne

KVITOVA: Beat Badosa in two tight sets at 2020 Australian Open... One of two former champions remaining in the draw from five in starting field... Has played 46 matches at the All England Club, more than anyone remaining in the draw... Last week lifted fifth grass-court title of her career

SWIATEK: Battled past lucky loser Pattinama Kerkhove in previous round, dropping only third set in past 29 matches... Bidding to reach last 16 at All England Club for the second year in a row... Results in opening week have stretched winning streak to 37 matches... Owns 9-1 record in third-round matches at the majors

CORNET: Playing 62nd consecutive Grand Slam main draw, equaling Sugiyama's WTA record... Owns three victories over current WTA No.1s, including upset of S.Williams in third round at 2014 Wimbledon... One of four Frenchwomen to reach this stage, the most to do so since 2004

BOULTER: Upset Pliskova for second time in as many weeks to book third-round spot... One of two British women still in the draw... Has risen over 100 places in the rankings over the past year... Bidding to reach fourth round at a Grand Slam for the first time

TAN: Followed up epic victory over S.Williams by upsetting No.45 Sorribes Tormo... One of five debutantes to reach third round... Briefly broke into Top 100 earlier this year... Attempting to win three Tour-level matches in a row for the first time in her career

FRECH: Has never beaten a Top-20 player, suffering three defeats this season... Bidding to win three straight matches on grass for the first time at any level... Made Top 100 debut at the end of last year... Contesting just her sixth Grand Slam main draw

HALEP: Beat Frech earlier this year at Australian Open... Making milestone 10th appearance at All England Club and first since lifting title in 2019... Has posted 28 victories this campaign... Reached SF in both grass-court events leading into Wimbledon, at Birmingham and Bad Homburg

MARTIC: Triumphed in their most recent encounter, during SF run at 2021 Rome... Making milestone 10th main-draw appearance at Wimbledon... Owns five Top-10 wins in her career but none on grass... Dropped out of the Top 50 at the end of 2021

PEGULA: Has lost five times to players ranked outside Top 50 this season... Is one of three Americans remaining in the tournament... This time last year was ranked No.26... Playing first tournament since losing to Swiatek in QF at Roland Garros at start of June

TOMLJANOVIC: Twelve months ago reached maiden Slam QF here in SW19... Dropped serve just once in each match so far... Owns 1-7 career win-loss record against Top-20 players on grass... Rose to career-high ranking of No.38 earlier this year

KREJCIKOVA: Wins over Zanevska and Golubic are first since Doha in February... Advanced to last 16 here in 2021 and lifted doubles title alongside Siniakova in 2018... Career record in Grand Slam third-round matches is 5-0... One of six Grand Slam champions to reach this stage

ZHENG QINWEN (CHN #52)

ZHENG: Bidding to reach last 16 for second Slam in a row... Struck 15 aces across opening two matches... Prior to arriving in SW19, had lost her only two career matches played on grass... First Chinese woman to reach third round at Wimbledon before turning 20

RYBAKINA: Advanced to fourth round on Wimbledon main-draw debut in 2021... Struck 16 aces in opening two matches to take season total to a Tour-leading 184... Is seeded for the 10th successive Slam... Fell early at both grass-court events before Wimbledon

124 – Coco Gauff's 124mph serve against Mihaela Buzarnescu is the fastest of the fortnight

62 – Alizé Cornet is contesting her 62nd consecutive Slam, matching Ai Sugiyama's WTA record

38 – Iga Swiatek is bidding to stretch her winning streak to 38 matches, which would be the longest since Steffi Graf's unbeaten run of 66 in 1989-90

19 – Nineteen-year-old Zheng Qinwen is the first Chinese teenager to reach third round at Wimbledon

6 – Paula Badosa has lost all six career matches against seeded players on grass

1 – Amanda Anisimova's encounter with Coco Gauff is the only third-round match-up between players from the same country

- Hit 29 winners and won all nine service games during 1r triumph over Xinyu Wang
- Battled past compatriot Lauren Davis in 2r - has now won a Tour-leading 12 three-set matches this season (level with Haddad Maia)
- Faces No.12 Coco Gauff in 3r today; owns 12 wins in career over Top-20 players, most recently upsetting No.14 Belinda Bencic at 2022 Rome
- In terms of ranking, best grass-court win came over No.46 Van Uytvack at 2022 Bad Homburg
- Owns 13-8 career record against fellow Americans in main-draw matches, while is 6-1 this season
- Best career result on grass are QF runs at Bad Homburg (2021-22) and Mallorca (2019)
- One of four women from the United States to reach 3r (also Gauff, Pegula and Riske-Armitraj)
- In the Open Era, an American has won this title 29 times, most recently S.Williams in 2016
- Is currently ranked No.25; played last year's Wimbledon at No.81
- Last year on grass, reached QF at Bad Homburg, while fell 1r at Berlin and Wimbledon
- Has won 27 matches so far in 2022 - only Swiatek (44), Jabeur (33) and Halep (28) have more to their names

PLAYER NOTES

- Making third appearance at Wimbledon, having reached R16 in both 2019 (as qualifier, l. eventual champion Halep on Grand Slam main draw debut) and 2021 (l. Kerber)
- In 2019, aged 15y3m became the youngest player to reach the main draw at Wimbledon via qualifying in the Open Era
- This Wimbledon marks 12th main-draw appearance at a Slam, following her first major final at Roland Garros last month (l. Swiatek)
- In 1r, came within three points of defeat against Ruse, then saw off another Romanian, Buzarnescu, in 2r on Centre Court
- Faces No.25 Amanda Anisimova in 3r today; beat her compatriot en route to title at 2021 Parma
- Owns 13-5 career record against players from United States, while is 5-2 this season
- Has lost both previous meetings against a seeded opponents at Wimbledon: Halep in 2019 and Kerber in 2021
- At 18 is the youngest player in the draw and one of three teenagers to reach 3r (also Parry and Zheng)
- Is looking to become the youngest female player to reach Wimbledon R16 three times since Maria Sharapova in 2005, and youngest American since Jennifer Capriati in 1993
- Sitting at career-high rankings in both singles (No.12; this time last year was No.23) and doubles (No.5)
- At No.11, is enjoying her highest Slam seeding
- Playing mixed doubles here w/Sock (face British WC Edmund/Nicholls in 1r later today)
- Coming off her career-best performance on grass, reaching SF at Berlin (l. eventual champion Jabeur); posted second Top-10 win of season in SF, over No.7 Ka.Pliskova (also d. No.4 Badosa at Doha)
- During last year's grass swing, reached 2r at Eastbourne before R16 run here at Wimbledon
- Has won 25 matches so far in 2022 - joint ninth most on Tour

- Progressed to QF at Rome (l. Sabalenka) and R16 at Roland Garros (l. Fernandez)
- Advanced to SF at Charleston (l. Jabeur) and QF at Madrid (l. Alexandrova); upset Sabalenka at both tournaments - the second and third Top-5 wins of her career
- Made 2r at Indian Wells (l. Fernandez via ret. w/illness) and fell 1r at Miami (l. Rogers)
- Suffered qualifying exit at Dubai and reached 2r at Doha (l. Ostapenko)
- Made R16 at Australian Open (d. Osaka in 3r, l. eventual champion Barty)
- Lifted second career title at Melbourne Summer Set 2 (d. Sasnovich in F)

- Reached SF at Berlin (l. eventual champion Jabeur)
- Highlight of clay-court season came at Roland Garros, where she progressed to maiden major final (l. Swiatek). Also reached 3r at Madrid (l. Halep) and Rome (l. Sakkari), while fell 1r at Stuttgart (l. Kasatinka)
- Made 3r at Indian Wells (l. Halep) and R16 at Miami (l. eventual champion Swiatek)
- Defeated in 1r at Dubai (l. Pegula) and then bounced back to reach QF at Doha (l. Sakkari)
- Fell 1r at Australian Open (l. Q.Wang)
- Made 2r in season opener at Adelaide (l. eventual champion Barty, having led by a set and a break) and then SF at Adelaide [250] (l. eventual champion Keys)

CAREER MILESTONES

- Ended 2021 season with 3r run at Indian Wells to secure her fourth consecutive Top-100 finish
- Best results of 2021 were QF runs at Parma and Bad Homburg
- Opened 2020 with SF showing at Auckland, going on to reach 3r at US Open, Roland Garros and Doha
- During Doha run, earned third career Top 10 win over No.7 Svitolina (l. Kuznetsova in 3r due to walkover)
- Finished 2019 ranked No.24 - the youngest of three teenagers in the Top 50 (also Andreescu and Yastremska)
- Posted career best Grand Slam result with SF run at 2019 Roland Garros - first player (man or woman) born in 2000s to advance to this stage of a major. Scored maiden win over a Top 5 player during 2019 Roland Garros, upsetting No.3 and defending champion Halep in QF
- Result boosted her into Top 50 for first time at No.26 on June 10, 2019
- Won maiden title at 2019 Bogotá (d. Sharma in F); at 17y 222d was the youngest American to win a title since S.Williams at 1999 Indian Wells (17y 169d)
- Made Top 100 debut at No.95 on September 17, 2018, after reaching first WTA final at Hiroshima (as qualifier, l. Hsieh)
- Also in 2018, upset No.9 Kvitova to become the joint-youngest player to reach R16 at Indian Wells, along with Majoli, who made SF in 1994 (both aged 16 years, 199 days)
- Played only two ITF tournaments before making WTA main draw debut at 2017 Miami (l. Townsend in 3s), with Grand Slam bow coming at 2017 Roland Garros (l. Nara in 1r)
- Owns six Top 20 wins: No.9 Kvitova (2018 Indian Wells), No.11 Sabalenka (2019 Australian Open), No.11 Sabalenka (2019 Roland Garros), No.3 Halep (2019 Roland Garros), No.7 Svitolina (2020 Doha) and No.19 Riske (2020 Western & Southern Open)
- In juniors, won US Open girls' singles in 2017 (d. Gauff in F) and was R-Up at 2016 Roland Garros; reached No.2 in junior world rankings
- Owns one singles title on ITF Circuit
- Made professional debut at 2016 US Open qualifying (l. Hozumi in 2r)
- Highlight of 2021 campaign was completing singles-doubles title sweep at Parma; defeated Q.Wang in singles final and teamed up w/McNally to win doubles
- Elsewhere, last season also reached SF at Adelaide and Rome, while at the Slams made QF at Roland Garros and R16 at Wimbledon
- Finished R-Up in doubles at 2021 US Open (w/McNally, l. Stosur/Zhang)
- Ended 2020 season at No.48, just one shy of her career high which she reached on October 26, 2020
- First cracked the Top 50 earlier in the season on Feb. 24, 2020 at No.49 following a R16 appearance at Australian Open to tie her career best Grand Slam result - during performance, defeated V.Williams in 1r and her first Top 5 opponent in No.4 Osaka in 3r (l. eventual champion Kenin in 3s)
- Enjoyed breakout season in 2019, highlighted by maiden WTA singles title at Linz (as lucky loser, d. Ostapenko in F) - earned her first Top 10 win en route to title over No.8 Bertens in QF
- At 15y214d, her title run in Linz made her youngest to win a WTA tour-level title since Vaidisova (15y177d) won Tashkent in 2004
- Also claimed maiden WTA doubles titles at Washington, DC (w/McNally, d. Sanchez/Stollar in F) and Luxembourg (w/McNally, d. Christian/Guarachi in F)
- By winning the doubles title at Washington, DC at 15 yrs, 144 days, became the youngest player to win a doubles title since May 1995 (Martina Hingis won Hamburg at 14 yrs, 219 days)
- Reached R16 at 2019 Wimbledon on Grand Slam main draw debut defeating V.Williams in 1r (l. eventual champion Halep) - followed with 3r showing at US Open (as WC, l. Osaka)
- Made WTA main draw debut as a wildcard at 2019 Miami where she earned her first WTA main draw win over good friend McNally (l. Kasatkina in 2r)
- Made professional debut in May 2018 as a qualifier into the \$25K ITF/Osprey, FL-USA
- Member of US Billie Jean King Cup team in 2020

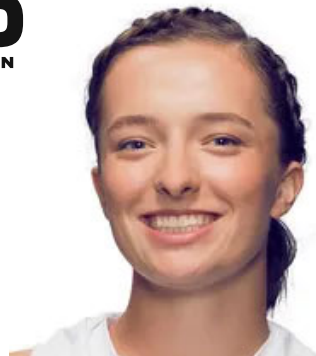

- Best results in 2020 were QF at Auckland (l. Pegula) and R16 run at US Open (d. No.14 Keys, l. Pironkova)
- Also in 2020, made 3r at Western & Southern Open (l. eventual champion Azarenka). Defeated No.4 Kenin in 2r - first Top 5 win since No.4 Kerber at 2018 Montréal
- Highlight of 2019 was reaching Lausanne final (l. Ferro as the defending champion) - has reached at least one WTA final in six of last seven seasons
- Part of victorious Fed Cup squad for France who defeated Australia in Perth 3-2 to be crowned 2019 champions (did not play)
- In 2018, won sixth career title at Gstaad (d. Minella in F), and reached two further QFs at Brisbane and Charleston
- Former World No.11 (achieved in February 16, 2009) who broke back into Top 20 at end of 2014 for first time since May 2009; dropped out of Top 20 again after 2015 Dubai
- Owns five wins over Top 3 ranked opponents: No.1 S. Williams (2014 Dubai, 2014 Wimbledon and 2014 Wuhan via ret.), No.3 A.Radwanska (2014 Katowice) and No.2 Halep (2015 Madrid); wins over S.Williams made her the first player to defeat the American in three straight meetings since Henin in 2007
- Qualified for 2013 and 2014 Tournament of Champions in Sofia, Bulgaria
- Grand Slam breakthrough came with with R16 run at Australian Open in 2009 (l. Safina)
- Excelled on clay in 2008, winning her maiden WTA title at Budapest (d. Klepac in F), reaching maiden final at Acapulco (l. Pennetta) and finishing R-Up at Rome (d. No.5 Kuznetsova and No.8 Chakvetadze, l. Jankovic)
- In 2007, rose over 120 places in the rankings, reaching first two WTA QFs, at first Acapulco
- Won two titles last season, at Adelaide and Rome. Other highlights included QF at Roland Garros and SF at Ostrava and qualifying for WTA Finals Guadalajara (fell in group stage)
- Also finished doubles R-Up at 2021 Roland Garros (w/Mattek-Sands, l. Krejčíková/Siniakova)
- Won her maiden Tour-level title at 2020 Roland Garros without dropping a set, becoming the first player from Poland - man or woman - to win a Grand Slam singles title and first from her country to reach a major final since Agnieszka Radwanska at 2012 Wimbledon
- Ranked No.54, she became the lowest-ranked woman to win the Roland Garros title in the Open Era and the lowest-ranked finalist since 1977 (No.56 Mihai). At 19y 132d, is the youngest champion in Paris since Monica Seles (18y 187d) in 1992
- Also became the first player to win her debut Tour-level title at a Grand Slam since Jelena Ostapenko at 2017 Roland Garros
- Won WTA Most Improved Player of the Year for 2020, as voted on by members of the media. Her coach, Piotr Sierzputowski, was voted by members of the WTA Coach Program as the WTA Coach of the Year for 2020
- Also won the 2020 WTA Fan Favorite Award, as voted on by fans
- Owns six career wins over Top 10 ranked players, having defeated No.16 Q.Wang (2019 Roland Garros), No.18 Wozniacki (2019 Toronto), No.20 Vekic (2020 Australian Open), No.19 Vondrousova (2020 Roland Garros), No.2 Halep (2020 Roland Garros) and No.6 Kenin (2020 Roland Garros)
- Ended 2019 season ranked No.61 after a campaign highlighted by R-Up finish at Lugano (l. Hercog) and R16 run at Roland Garros (l. Halep)
- Also in 2019, reached 3r at Toronto (l. Osaka) and made 2r five times (incl. Australian and US Open)
- Broke into Top 100 at No.88 after R-Up finish at 2019 Lugano
- Ended 2018 season ranked No.175 (up from No.690 in 2017), after posting 42-6 record in ITF Circuit
- Highlights of 2018 campaign were four titles on the ITF Circuit, including at the \$60k clay court events in Budapest-HUN and Montreux-SUI
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2019 Auckland

- Won 2007 Roland Garros junior title (d. Duque-Mariño in F)

- Member of Poland's Fed Cup team, 2018-20
- On professional debut, came through qualifying to win title at \$10k ITF/Stockholm-SWE in 2016; owns seven singles titles at this level
- Enjoyed stellar junior career, including winning girls' singles at 2018 Wimbledon (d. Küng in F) and leading Poland to Junior Fed Cup in 2016

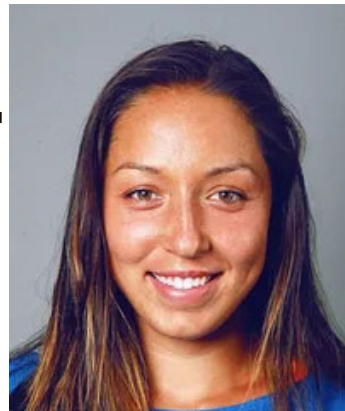

CAREER MILESTONES

- Best result of 2021 SFs at Eastbourne, Olympics and Chicago [500], and QFs at Abu Dhabi, Roland Garros, San Jose and Ostrava
- Opened 2020 season by reaching the championship match at four of her first five tournaments, including a title run at Hobart (d. Zhang in F)
- Made first final appearance at a Premier-level tournament with R-Up finish at St. Petersburg (l. Bertens); was rewarded with Top 20 debut at No.19 following run in Russia (February 17, 2020)
- First win over a Top-5 ranked opponent came over No.3 Ka.Pliskova during R-Up finish at 2020 Dubai
