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2022 WIMBLEDON

This is the 135th Wimbledon Championships. The event was first held in 1877, with the first women's singles championship being staged in 1884. This is the 128th staging of the Wimbledon women's singles championship and the 54th of the Open Era, which began in 1968 and saw the introduction of prize money. Due to the pandemic, the tournament was not held in 2020.

Currently on a 35-match winning streak, Iga Swiatek will spend her 13th and 14th weeks at the top of the WTA rankings during the Wimbledon fortnight. Swiatek, who claimed the No.1 spot on April 4 this year, is the first man or woman from Poland to reach the top ranking in singles.

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STRONG OFF THE BLOCKS – FIRST-ROUND SUCCESS

Of those players with 10 or more Grand Slam appearances in this year's Wimbledon draw, here are the players with the best strike rate in the opening round at a Grand Slam:

- **Serena Williams (77-2 in 1r):** Serena's two opening round losses at a Grand Slam came at 2012 Roland Garros (I. Razzano) and 2021 Wimbledon (I. Sasnovich via ret. w/ankle injury)
- **Madison Keys (32-5 in 1r):** Has suffered a couple of 1r exits over the past few years, at 2021 US Open (I. Stephens) and 2020 Roland Garros (I. S.Zhang). Other three losses at this stage came in her teenage years, at 2012 Australian Open (I. J.Zheng), 2013 US Open (I. Jankovic) and 2014 Roland Garros (I. Errani)
- **Garbiñe Muguruza (30-7 in 1r):** Muguruza fell 1r most recently at this year's Roland Garros (I. Kanepi). Her other six defeats at this stage came on her Grand Slam debut at 2012 US Open (I. J. Errani), 2014 Wimbledon (I. Vandeweghe), 2014 US Open (I. Lucic-Baroni), 2019 Wimbledon (I. Haddad Maia), 2019 US Open (I. Riske) and 2021 Roland Garros (I. Kostyuk)
- **Elise Mertens (18-3 in 1r):** Mertens fell at the first hurdle three times in her first four Grand Slam main-draw appearances, however, since then has won 16 straight matches at this stage
- **Iga Swiatek (12-1 in 1r):** Swiatek has been defeated in 1r only once in 13 Grand Slam main-draw appearances, at 2019 Wimbledon (I. Golubic)

The All England Club has awarded seven singles wildcards this year: **Katie Boulter** (GBR), **Jodie Burrage** (GBR), **Sonay Kartal** (GBR), **Yuriko Miyazaki** (GBR), **Katie Swan** (GBR), **Daria Saville** (AUS), and **Serena Williams** (USA). The best result by a wildcard at a Grand Slam was achieved by Kim Clijsters, who won the 2009 US Open title.

QUALIFIERS AT GRAND SLAMS & WIMBLEDON

In 2010, Estonian Kaia Kanepi became the sixth qualifier in the Open Era to reach Wimbledon QF. The best result by a qualifier at Wimbledon came in 1999 when Alexandra Stevenson advanced to SF.

Last year at US Open, Emma Raducanu became the first qualifier, male or female, to win a major title in the Open Era. Before that, the deepest run by a qualifier at any Grand Slam was to the semifinals – achieved by Nadia Podoroska at 2020 Roland Garros, Alexandra Stevenson at 1999 Wimbledon and Christine Dorey at the 1978 Australian Open.

WIMBLEDON MISCELLANY

- Five players have won the singles title after **saving match point**: Blanche Hillyard (1889), Suzanne Lenglen (1919), Helen Wills-Moody (1935), Venus Williams (2005) and Serena Williams (2009)
- Only 11 **nations** are represented on the Wimbledon women's singles roll of honor. British and American women have won 91 of the 122 championships to date. The other nations are Australia, Brazil, Czech Republic, France, Germany, Russia, Spain, Switzerland and Romania
- In 2013, France's Marion Bartoli became the 29th woman to win the singles title **without dropping a set** (10th in Open Era)
- In 2004, Maria Sharapova became the **first woman not seeded in the Top 8** to win the Wimbledon singles title since seeding began in 1927. She has since been joined by Venus Williams (2005—No.14 and 2007—No.23), Marion Bartoli (2013—No.15), Garbiñe Muguruza (2017—No.14) and Angelique Kerber (2018 – No.11)
- Just five players have won the Wimbledon women's singles title **after winning the Wimbledon girls' singles title** (Haydon-Jones, Susman, Hingis, Mauresmo and Barty). Former girls' singles winners in the 2022 Wimbledon field are: Kristen Flipkens (2003), Belinda Bencic (2013), Jelena Ostapenko (2014), Claire Liu (2017) and Iga Swiatek (2018)
- The player with the **most women's doubles titles** is Elizabeth Ryan, who won 12 between 1914 and 1934
- Serena Williams was the last player to **win both the singles and doubles titles** in the same year, in 2016
- Ann Jones (1969), Martina Navratilova (nine times), Petra Kvitova (twice) and Angelique Kerber (2018) are the only four **left-handers** to win the Wimbledon women's singles title in the Open Era
