**SWIATEK:** Dropped just four games when they met in Rome final in June... First top seed to reach US Open final since S.Williams won title in 2014... Recovered from 4-2 down in the deciding set to beat Sabalenka on Thursday evening... Has won her past nine finals in straight sets... Broken serve a tournament-leading 35 times this fortnight... Has won 50%+ returns points four times in first six matches at the US Open; throughout career, is 66-0 when winning 50%+ of return points... First woman to reach Roland Garros and US Open final in the same year since 2013 (S.Williams)... Bidding to be 10th youngest Flushing Meadows champion since 2000

### **FINAL QUICK-HITS**

- **Iga Swiatek** is contesting her third Grand Slam final, having previously lifted the title at Roland Garros in 2020 and 2022, while this year's Wimbledon runner-up **Ons Jabeur** is playing the second major final of her career
- **Jabeur** is the first woman to reach the final at both Wimbledon and the US Open in the same season since Serena Williams in 2019
- Should **Jabeur** triumph on Saturday, she will become the 58th different major winner in the Open Era and first from Africa
- **Jabeur** is one of four African woman in major history to reach a Grand Slam final and first in the Open Era. The other three were South Africans Irene Peacock (1927 Roland Garros), Renee Schuurman (1959 Australian Open) and Sandra Reynolds (1960 Wimbledon), with the trio all losing out in the final
- **Jabeur** is bidding to become the second African player male or female in the Open Era to win a major, following 1981 Australian Open champion Johan Kriek (also won the Australian Open 1982 but by that time was competing for the United States). Including doubles, most recent African Slam champion was Zimbabwe's Cara Black, who won the Wimbledon mixed doubles trophy alongside Leander Paes in 2010
- **Jabeur** is also attempting to become the first Arab Grand Slam champion in the Open Era. The only Arab player to win a singles major was Prague-born Jaroslav Drobny, who represented Egypt when he won Roland Garros in 1951-52 and Wimbledon in 1954
- **Swiatek** is the first woman from Poland in the Open Era to make it beyond the last 16 at the US Open. Before this year, the best results were fourth-round runs by Swiatek (in 2021) and Agnieszka Radwanska (in 2007-08, 2012-13, 2016)
- Jabeur has dropped one set against Shelby Rogers in the third round and 51 games en route to the final.
   Swiatek came from a set down in the fourth round and semifinals, although has conceded fewer games than her final opponent, losing 45 in her six matches
- **Swiatek** owns 14 Top-10 wins, winning the past nine, including over No.8 Jessica Pegula and No.6 Aryna Sabalenka in the past two rounds this fortnight. **Jabeur** has 10 Top-10 wins in her career, although only two at majors, upsetting No.7 Dominika Cibulkova at 2017 Roland Garros and No.9 Swiatek at 2021 Wimbledon
- **Swiatek** is the first No.1 seed to reach the US Open final since Serena Williams won the 2014 title. In the Open Era, the top seed has reached the final 29 times, lifting the trophy 20 times
- At the US Open in the Open Era, the No.1 seed won the title 16 times from 1968-1997 (30 years), while over the next 25 years, the No.1 seed has triumphed only four times: Serena Williams (2002, 2013, 2014) and Justine Henin (2007)

- Jabeur is the first No.5 seed to reach the final at Flushing Meadows since Arantxa Sánchez Vicario in 1992. In the
  Open Era, the only time the No.5 seed won the US Open title was in 1990, when Gabriela Sabatini upset World
  No.1 Steffi Graf in the final
- **Jabeur** has already claimed titles this season on clay at Madrid and on the grass of Berlin, while **Swiatek** has won a Tour-leading six tournaments, including three on hard courts. Should she triumph today, Swiatek will be the first player to win seven titles in a season since Serena Williams in 2014
- Since losing her first Tour-level final at 2019 Lugano, Swiatek has won nine in a row, all in straight sets. In 15 of those 18 sets, she conceded no more than three games
- Jabeur has struck 159 winners this fortnight, while Swiatek has hit 118
- Thirty-four of **Jabeur's** winners have been aces including 11 against Veronika Kudermetova in the fourth round.

  Her tally for the season is now 197 only five women have passed the 200-ace mark so far in 2022
- This ace count has helped **Jabeur** win 73% of her service games, marginally higher than her season average entering the tournament (72.3%)
- **Swiatek** is the only player on Tour this year to win over half her return games and this trend has continued in New York. Across the fortnight she has won 35 of 60 games when receiving serve (58%)
- **Jabeur** has played 21 three-set matches this year, the third-most on Tour behind only Sabalenka (23) and Bencic (22). Jabeur is also tied for the most three-set match wins this year:

- Since the start of 2021, **Jabeur** has won 92 matches and **Swiatek** 90 the most of any women on Tour
- Regardless of the result in the final, Swiatek and Jabeur will sit at No.1 and No.2, respectively, when the new

### **PLAYER NOTES**

- Making her 4th appearance at the US Open, where she is through to her third Grand Slam final
- On previous visits to New York advanced to R16 in 2021 (l. Bencic), 3r in 2020 (l. Azarenka) and 2r on debut in 2019 (l. Sevastova)
- Lifted two majors from her 15 main-draw appearances at this level, triumphing at Roland Garros in 2020 and 2022
- Entered 2022 US Open as the World No.1 and top seed - the last No.1 seed to win the US Open was S.Williams in 2014
- Defeated Paolini in 1r, Stephens in 2r, Davis in 3r, Niemeier in R16, Pegula in QF and Sablenka in SF; regstered tournament-leading 35 service breaks (followed by Jabeur on 31)
- Did not drop a game in final set of victory over Niemeier, her 19th 6-0 set of the season. Since 2000, only S.Williams in 2013 (25) has won more sets by that scoreline in a single campaign
- Recovered from 4-2 down in the final set against Sabalenka, winning 16 of the last 20 points
- Faces No.5 Jabeur in today's final; owns 14 wins in career over Top-10 players, winning the past nine
- Record in WTA finals stands at 9-1, winning the past nine in straight sets
- Is first Polish woman in Open Era to advance beyond R16 at US Open
- Has won 56 matches so far in 2022 (including two Billie Jean King Cup wins); the last player to post 56 wins or more wins in a single campaign was Barty (57) in 2019
- Has won six titles in 2022 (Doha, Indian Wells, Miami, Stuttgart, Rome, Roland Garros); looking to become the first player since S.Williams in 2014 to win seven or more titles in a single season

- Making 7th main-draw appearance at US Open (11th overall)
- Deepest previous runs were to 3r in 2019 (l. Ka. Pliskova), 2020 (l. Kenin) and 2021 (l. Mertens)
- This fortnight, beat Brengle in 1r, Mandlik in 2r, Rogers in 3r, Kudermetova in R16, Tomljanovic in QF and Garcia in SF; now owns 44 wins this season, the second-most on Tour behind Swiatek
- Struck 34 aces at 2022 US Open 11 coming against Kudermetova - the third-most in the draw, behing Q.Zheng (38) and Ka.Pliskova (36)
- Faces No.1 Swiatek in today's final; previous meetings over current No.1s ended in reitrement victory over Halep at 2018 Beijing (w/back injury) and defeat to Swiatek at 2022 Rome
- In terms of ranking, best career win in a completed match came over No.3 Ka.Pliskova at 2020 Doha
- Has 10 Top-10 wins, with two coming at the Slams: No.7 Cibulkova (2017 Roland Garros) and No.9 Swiatek (2021 Wimbledon)
- Record in WTA finals stands at 3-6; six of these nine finals have gone to three sets
- Only player from Tunisia in the draw. Other Tunisian in WTA rankings is No.761 Chiraz Bechri
- In the Open Era, is first African woman to make it beyond QF at US Open
- Is currently ranked No.5; reached her careerhigh ranking of No.2 earlier this season (June 27), having broken into Top 10 last October
- Is seeded for the ninth major in a row
- Has been involved in 21 three-set matches in 2022; only Bencic (22) and Sabalenka (23) have played more
- Best career results on hard have been R-Up finishes at 2019 Moscow [500] (indoor) and at 2021 Chicago [500] (outdoor)

### **SEASON 2022 HISTORY**

- Made 3r at Toronto (l. Haddad Maia) and Cincinnati (l. Keys)
- Upset in 3r at Wimbledon (l. Cornet) result ended 37-match winning streak - and QF at Warsaw (l. eventual champion Garcia)
- On clay claimed titles at Stuttgart (d. Sabalenka in F), Rome (d. Jabeur in F) and Roland Garros (d. Gauff in F)
- Won both rubbers during Poland's 4-0 Billie Jean King Cup victory over Romania (d. Buzarnescu and Prisacariu)
- Lifted Miami title without dropping a set (d. Osaka in F), becoming fourth woman to complete 'Sunshine Double' (also Graf, Clijsters and Azarenka)
- At Indian Wells, won fifth career title (d. Sakkari in F); is the first player to win five or more WTA titles before turning 21 since Wozniacki in 2009
- Fell 2r at Dubai (l. eventual champion Ostapenko) and then lifted title at Doha (d. Kontaveit in F) and

### **CAREER MILESTONES**

- Won two titles last season, at Adelaide and Rome. Other highlights included QF at Roland Garros and SF at Ostrava and qualifying for WTA Finals Guadalajara (fell in group stage)
- Also finished doubles R-Up at 2021 Roland Garros (w/Mattek-Sands, l. Krejcikova/Siniakova)
- Won her maiden Tour-level title at 2020 Roland Garros without dropping a set, becoming the first player from Poland - man or woman - to win a Grand Slam singles title and first from her country to reach a major final since Agnieszka Radwanska at 2012 Wimbledon
- Ranked No.54, she became the lowest-ranked woman to win the Roland Garros title in the Open Era and the lowest-ranked finalist since 1977 (No.56 Mihai). At 19y 132d, is the youngest champion in Paris since Monica Seles (18y 187d) in 1992
- Also became the first player to win her debut Tour-level title at a Grand Slam since Jelena Ostapenko at 2017 Roland Garros
- Won WTA Most Improved Player of the Year for 2020, as voted on by members of the media.
   Her coach, Piotr Sierzputowski, was voted by members of the WTA Coach Program as the WTA Coach of the Year for 2020
- Also won the 2020 WTA Fan Favorite Award, as voted on by fans
- Owns six career wins over Top 10 ranked players, having defeated No.16 Q.Wang (2019 Roland Garros), No.18 Wozniacki (2019 Toronto), No.20 Vekic (2020 Australian Open), No.19 Vondrousova (2020 Roland Garros), No.2 Halep (2020 Roland Garros) and No.6 Kenin (2020 Roland Garros)
- Ended 2019 season ranked No.61 after a campaign highlighted by R-Up finish at Lugano (l. Hercog) and R16 run at Roland Garros (l. Halep)
- Also in 2019, reached 3r at Toronto (l. Osaka) and made 2r five times (incl. Australian and US Open)
- Broke into Top 100 at No.88 after R-Up finish at 2019 Lugano
- Ended 2018 season ranked No.175 (up from No.690 in 2017), after posting 42-6 record in ITF Circuit
- Highlights of 2018 campaign were four titles on the ITF Circuit, including at the \$60k clay court events in Budapest-HUN and Montreux-SUI
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2019 Auckland
- Member of Poland's Fed Cup team, 2018-20

- Broke into Top 10 on October 18, 2021, following SF run at Indian Wells (l. eventual champion Badosa)
- At 2021 Birmingham, became first Arab woman to win a WTA title (d. Kasatkina in F). Followed this with QF at Wimbledon (l. Sabalenka)
- Last season also finished R-Up at Charleston [250] (l. Sharma) and Chicago [500] (l. Muguruza)
- Reached maiden Grand Slam QF at 2020
   Australian Open to become the first Arab woman to reach that stage at a major (l. eventual champion Kenin); made Top 50 debut at No.45 after breakthrough performance in Melbourne
- Made further QFs in 2020 at Doha (d. No.3 Ka.Pliskova, l. Kvitova), Lexington (l. Gauff), Western & Southern Open (l. eventual champion Azarenka) and Ostrava (l. Sakkari); posted career-high ranking of No.31 on August 31, 2020
- Season highlights in 2019 were matching best result at the Slams with 3r run at US Open (matching 2017 Roland Garros and now 2020 Australian Open) and SF appearances at Eastbourne (l. eventual R-Up Kerber) and Tianjin (l. eventual champion Peterson)
- In 2018, defeated No.3 seed Stephens, No.8 seed Kontaveit and No.5 seed Sevastova en route to her first WTA final at 2018 Moscow, where she fell in three sets to No.6 seed Kasatkina. - Member of Tunisian Olympic Team in 2012 and 2016
- Contested first two WTA main draws in 2012, at Doha (as WC) and Olympics
- On ITF Circuit, has 11 singles and one doubles title
- Played first event of career at 2008 ITF/El Menzah-TUN
- Became first North African woman to win a junior Slam at 2011 Roland Garros (d. Puig in F), having also reached the final in 2010 (l. Svitolina in F)

- On professional debut, came through qualifying to win title at \$10k ITF/Stockholm-SWE in 2016; owns seven singles titles at this level
- Enjoyed stellar junior career, including winning girls' singles at 2018 Wimbledon (d. Küng in F) and leading Poland to Junior Fed Cup in 2016
