TOURNAMENT TALKING POINTS

- The 21st edition of the tournament features seven of the Top 10, including World No.1 and defending champion Iga Swiatek
- Last year. Swiatek swept through the draw at the Khalifa International Tennis & Squash Complex for the loss of just one set, beating three Top-10 rivals along the way. The event also marked the start of a 37match winning streak, ushering in a spell of Tour domination that would bring five further titles and the WTA World No.1 ranking
- Jessica Pegula and Caroline Garcia are the No.2 and No.3 seeds, respectively, while Coco Gauff ٠ occupies the No.4 spot. All four receive first-round byes and will begin their title challenges on Wednesday
- Two of 2022's losing semifinalists are also in the draw, Jelena Ostapenko and Maria Sakkari. Ostapenko takes on fellow big-hitter Madison Keys in her opener, while Sakkari, who is fresh from a run to the final four in Linz, was paired with the ever-improving Zheng Qinwen in Saturday's draw
- In addition to Swiatek, there are a couple more former champions in the main draw, Victoria Azarenka (2012-13) and Petra Kvitova (2018, 2021), and an additional two in qualifying, Karolina Pliskova (2017) and Elise Mertens (2019)
- Azarenka is one of four wildcards in the field, joined by Sakkari, Sofia Kenin and Ipek Oz
- One to Watch Zheng Qinwen. Since the start of 2022, Zheng has risen over 100 places in the WTA rankings to her current career-high position of No.24. In this time, the 20-year-old has won 47 matches across all levels, including nine over Top-20 opponents, and arrives in Qatar fresh from a semifinal showing last week in Abu Dhabi. She faces No.5 seed Sakkari in the first round, with Garcia potentially awaiting in the quarterfinals
