



### **PLAYER NOTES**

- Making third appearance at Guangzhou, where she is into the QF for the first time; fell 1r in 2014 (as qualifier, l. Bacsinszky) and 2015 (l. Wickmayer)
- Has beaten Jodie Burrage, Daria Saville, Rebeka Masarova and Yulia Putintseva to reach her first since R-UP at Chennai 2022 (l. Fruhvirtova in F)
- Faces No.88 Xiyu Wang in F today
- Owns 10-12 career record against players from China, with record in 2023 standing at 0-1 (l. Zhu Lin at Birmingham)
- Record in WTA F matches stands at 2-3
- Has won two career titles on hard courts at 2019 Bronx and 2020 Hua Hin
- Four of her five WTA final appearances have come in Asia at 2015 Tokyo [250] (R-Up), 2019 Seoul (R-Up), 2020 Hua Hin (WON) and 2022 Chennai (R-Up)
- Is No. 1 seed this week; has been top seed at two other tournaments in career at 2023 Merida (QF, l. Peterson) and 2023 Strasbourg (2r, l.Pavlyuchenkova)
- Previous best result by Poland at Guangzhou was SF run by Urszula Radwanska in 2012
- First time a player from Poland reached final at Guangzhou
- Is currently ranked No.27; this time last year was ranked No.51
- Trying to become the third player to win a tournament as the top seed this year - Swiatek (Doha, Stuttgart, Roland Garros, Warsaw) and Gauff (Auckland)



### **PLAYER NOTES**

- Making third appearance at Guangzhou; fell 1r on both previous outings in 2018 (l. Ferro) and 2019 (as qualifier, l. Golubic)
- Has beaten Nadia Podoroska, Diana Shnaider, Viktoria Hruncakova and Greet Minnen so far this week to reach her first career final at Guangzhou 2023
- Faces No.27 Magda Linette in F today; owns 7 wins in career over Top 50 players, most recently No.27 Irina-camelia Begu at Rome 2023
- Owns 0-1 career record against players from Poland - defeated by today's opponent Lintte at 2020 Hua Hin
- Owns 9-24 career record against seeded players (4-9 in 2023)
- Making first career final, having previouly failed SF at 2020 Acapulco (l. Watson), 2022 Washington DC (l. Samsonova) and 2022 Cluj-Napoca (l. Paolini)
- Only player from China to reach F
- Best result by China at Guangzhou was title run by Qiang Wang in 2018; Shuai Zhang in 2013 and 2017; and Na Li in 2004
- Is currently ranked No.88; this time last year was ranked No.58
- Trying to become the third Chinese woman to win a singles title this year - also Zhu Lin (Hua Hin) and Qinwen Zheng (Palermo); the last time players from China won three titles in a season was 2006 - Zheng Jie (Estoril, Stockholm) and Sun Tiantian (Tashkent)


### **SEASON 2023 HISTORY**

- Fell in 1r at San Diego (l. Kostyuk) and reached 2r at US Open (l. Brady)
- Suffered 1r exits at Cincinnati (l. Li) and Montreal (l. Azarenka)
- Reached 3r at Wimbledon (l. Bencic)
- Reached 2r at Nottingham (l. Burrage) and Birmingham (l. Zhu Lin)
- Fell in opening round at Roland Garros (l. Fernandez)
- Reached 3r at both Madrid (l. Andreeva) and Rome (l. Haddad Maia), before 2r exit at Strasbourg (l. Pavlyuchenkova)
- Made 3r at Charleston (l. Keys), then lost both rubbers as Poland suffered 3-1 defeat to Kazakhstan in Billie Jean King Cup
- Defeated in 2r at Indian Wells (after 1r bye, l. Raducanu) and R16 at Miami (l. Pegula)
- Advanced to QF at Merida (l. Peterson)
- Fell 1r at Hobart (l. Van Uytvanck) before reaching maiden Grand Slam SF at Australian Open (l. eventual champion Sabalenka)
- Opened season at United Cup, going 3-1 in singles as Poland contested the City Final in Sydney

- Played 1r at Osaka (l. L. Zhu)
- Played 2r at US Open (l. Pera)
- Fell in 1r at Cincinnati as a qualifier (l. Sherif)
- Reached 2r at Prague (l. Schmiedlova)
- Fell 1r at Warsaw (l. Zhu Lin)
- Fell 1r at Wimbledon (l. Andreeva); reached 2r at Eastbourne (as qualifier, l. eventual champion Keys)
- Started grass court season at Nottingham where she fell in 1r (l. Sakkari); reached main draw at Birmingham as qualifier but fell 1r(l. Marino)
- At Roland Garros fell in 1r (l. Garcia)
- Fell 1r at Charleston (l. Baptiste), then reached 3r at Madrid (l. Krejcikova) and R16 at Rome (l. Zheng)
- Advanced to 2r at Indian Wells (l. Potapova in 3-sets) and Miami (l. B.Fruhvirtova)
- Lost in opening round at Monterrey (l. Parrizas
- Reached 2r at Merida (recorded first win of season defeating Riske-Amritraj; I. Birrell)
- Lost in opening round of first three tournaments of the season - Auckland (1r, ret. vs. Muchova), Australian Open (l. Ka.Pliskova) and Hua Hin (l. Lin)



### CAREER MILESTONES

- 2022 season highlight was R-Up finish at Chennai (l. Fruhvirtova). Also won two doubles titles, at Charleston (w/Klepac) and Eastbourne (w/Krunic)
- Posted seventh successive Top 100 season in 2021, finishing at No.57 after starting her season at Miami in March, due to a knee injury
- Reached two semifinals in 2021, at Strasbourg (l. Cirstea) and Cleveland (l. Begu)
- Matched previous best results at Grand Slams in 2021 with 3r runs at Roland Garros (d. World No.1 Barty via ret. in 2r; l. Jabeur) and Wimbledon (d. No.5 Svitolina in 2r for best win of career in a completed match, before falling to Badosa)
- Won second WTA singles title at Hua Hin in 2020 (d. Kung in F), rising to new career-high ranking of No.33 (on February 17)
- Posted best result at US Open by advancing to 3r (l. Kontaveit); now has reached this stage at all four Grand Slams
- Winner of 2020 WTA Shot of the Year; became the third Polish woman to win this award (after A.Radwanska and Swiatek)
- Her 2019 campaign was highlighted by lifting maiden WTA title at the Bronx and finished R-Up at Seoul (l. Muchova); broke into Top 50 on September 9, 2019
- Season highlights in 2018 included QF run at Washington DC (l. Vekic); win over No.17 Osaka in 2r was first Top 20 victory - previous careerbest win came over No.21 Gavrilova at 2017 Tokyo [PPO]
- Posted first career victories at 2018 Australian Open during 3r run (d. Brady in 1r and No.22 seed Kasatkina in 2r, l. Allertova)
- Highlight of 2017 campaign was SF at Kuala Lumpur (l. Hibino). Also made QF at Bogotá and reached 3r at major for first time at Roland Garros
- In 2016 enjoyed run to first Premier-level quarterfinal of career at Tokyo [PPO] (as qualifier, l. eventual champion Wozniacki); also advanced to QF at Katowice (l. Parmentier)
- Reached maiden WTA singles final at 2015 Tokyo [Japan Open] (l. Wickmayer)
- Broke into Top 100 on June 15, 2015
- Played first two WTA main draws in 2013: 2r at Strasbourg (l. Cornet) and SF at Baku (l. Peer)
- Made professional debut on ITF Circuit in Poland in 2007; owns 12 singles titles and eight doubles

- Recorded first Top 100 season finish in 2022, ending the year ranked No.50; season highlighted by reaching the semifinals at two WTA 250 tournaments - Cluj-Napoca and Washington DC; also reached the quarterfinals at Granby and Budapest
- In 2021, made 2r at Abu Dhabi (l. Rybakina) and Nottingham (l. Riske). Also finished R-Up at W25 ITF Circuit event in Florence, SC, USA
- Ended 2020 season at No.123, making steady progress from No.143 in 2019
- Enjoyed WTA breakthrough by reached her maiden tour-level SF on debut appearance at Acapulco as qualifier, where she defeated No.2 seed Y.Wang and two-time champion Errani before l. eventual champion Watson; following this week, posted new career-high ranking of No.106 on March 2
- Also reached her maiden WTA QF at Hua Hin earlier that month (l. eventual champion Linette), upsetting No.15 Martic in 1r for first victory over a Top 20 player
- Best result of 2019 at Tour-level was 2r showing at Miami (as WC, l. Bertens). Also fell 1r on Grand Slam main draw debut at 2019 US Open (as LL, l. Flipkens)
- Won third singles title on ITF Circuit at \$60k
  Internacional de Solgironès in 2019
- Season highlights in 2018 were maiden ITF Singles titles at \$25,000 Nonthaburi and \$25,000 Tsukuba
- Also won three doubles titles in 2018; at \$25k Barcelona (w/Ho), \$25k Madrid (w/Gonzalez), \$25k Nonthaburi (w/X.Wang)
- At tour-level in 2018 contested Wuhan; fell 2r to Kasatkina in what was her first match vs. Top 20 opponent
- Made WTA singles main draw debut at 2017 Tianjin Open as wildcard, defeating Kovinic in 1r; made WTA qualifying debut at 2018 Miami
- Made professional debut at 2016 \$10k ITF/Anning, CHN
- In Juniors, became first Chinese girl to win a Grand Slam Junior singles title at 2018 US Open; also teamed up with Wang Xinyu to claim Junior doubles title at 2018 Wimbledon
- As a junior, achieved career-high ranking of No.1 in both singles and doubles
- Took bronze in the girls' doubles (w/X.Wang) at 2018 Summer Youth Olympics in Buenos Aires

- Parents are Tomasz and Beata; sister is Dagmara
- Started playing at age 6, favorite shot is backhand; favorite surfaces are hard and grass, and favorite tournament is Roland Garros
- Tennis idol growing up was Monica Seles
- Previously worked with Mico Ratkovic; trains in Beijing
- Father is Frank Wang, owner of a fabric factory, while mother is Ma Xiaodan
   Favorite surface is hard, started playing tennis aged eight
