TOURNAMENT TALKING POINTS

- Third edition, after being added to the calendar in 2019, when Dayana Yastremska claimed the title
- The tournament was on hiatus in 2021 and 2022 due to Covid-19 pandemic
- US Open 2019 finalist Bianca Andreescu was awarded a wildcard and is the top seed in the tournament. She meets Britain's Harriet Dart in the opening round
- Along with Andreescu, wildcards have been awarded to Bethanie Mattek-Sands and Lanlana Tararudee
- 2022 US Open Junior champion **Eala Alexandra**, as qualifier, advanced to main draw, facing No. 6 seed Maria in first round
- One to Watch Zhu Lin. Have accumulated wins against some big names start of this season. Most recently, made an impressive R16 run at the Australian Open, beating Rebecca Marino, Jil Teichmann, and Maria Sakkari on the way. Also made QF at Auckland overcoming Madison Brengle and Venus Williams in the opening rounds.
