TOURNAMENT TALKING POINTS

- The fourth edition of the tournament features five of the Top 50, including local favorite and World No.5 Caroline Garcia
- Last year, Garcia was a semifinalist at her home-town event and opens her challenge this time against **Tereza Martincova**
- Garcia's semifinal conqueror in 2022 was eventual champion **Zhang Shuai**, who returns as No.2 seed, opening her title defense against **Madison Brengle**
- Like Garcia, No.3 seed **Alizé Cornet** has been an ever-present in Lyon since its addition to the WTA calendar in 2020. She has won only once in her three previous visits and has a tricky assignment in the first round this year against **Camila Osorio**
- The wildcards feature two more Frenchwomen, **Clara Burel** and **Kristina Mladenovic**, as well as two-time major champion **Garbiñe Muguruza**, with the latter involved in arguably the pick of the first-round matches against teenage qualifier **Linda Noskova**, who was a recent finalist in Adelaide
- One to Watch Anna Blinkova. Last October, Blinkova came through qualifying to lift her maiden WTA title at Cluj-Napoca and help secure a first year-end Top 100 finish since 2020. The 24-year-old has continued where she left off at the start of 2023, reaching the semifinals at Hobart as a qualifier before a tight three-set defeat to No.10 seed Madison Keys at the Australian Open
