Aliaksandra Sasnovich (#89) vs. [3] Caroline Garcia (FRA #11)

Garcia leads 5-0

Garcia is only player from France to reach 2r (Mladenovic lost 1r)... **Garcia** owns 30 match wins this season... **Garcia** is a five-time hard court champion, including 2022 WTA Finals.. **Sasnovich** bidding to win back to back main draw matches for the first time since SF at Den Bosch in June... **Sasnovich** owns 21 wins in career over Top 20 players, including over No.15 Bencic at San Diego last week... First time facing French opposition this season...

Dayana Yastremska (UKR #102) vs. [10] Victoria Azarenka (#23)

Tied 1-1

The two have met twice before with **Azarenka** winning their most recent match-up in 1r at Washington DC in 2022... **Azarenka's** second appearance at the tournament, reaching the semifinal in 2022 (I. Pegula)... Dropped only two games (6-1 6-1) in 1r match against Montgomery, **Azarenka's** most effective match since dropping only one game against lpek Oz in Doha... **Yastremska's** 1r win was her first main draw win since Palermo in July this year... With a win today, **Yastremska** would earn her first win against a seeded player this year...

[1] Ons Jabeur (TUN #7) vs. Alycia Parks (USA #45)

Jabeur leads 2-0

Jabeur is No.1 seed for her fifth Tour-level tournament and first at WTA 1000 level... **Jabeur's** best WTA 1000 result is winning Madrid in 2022 (d. Pegula in the final)... **Jabeur** won the previous two match-ups against **Parks**, once on grass at Berlin 2022 and once on clay at Charleston 2021... **Parks** owns two career wins over Top 10 players, most recently Caroline Garia in the final at Lyon 2023 leading to her best career hard court result...

Storm Hunter (AUS #157) vs. [2] Maria Sakkari (GRE #9)

First meeting

As No.2 seed, this is **Sakkari's** first time in the Top 3 seeds of a WTA 1000... Sakkari was Runner-up at Guadalajara in 2022 (I. Pegula in the final)... **Sakkari** holds a 60-41 record in WTA 1000 events, with record in 2023 standing at 10-7 (including reaching SF at Indian Wells and Madrid)... **Sakkari's** best career hard court result is Runner-Up which she has reached six times, most recently Washington DC this season... **Hunter** is making debut appearance in Guadalajara... A win today for **Hunter** would be her first career win over a Top 10 player... **Hunter** is No.1 seed in the doubles with partner Mertens

Keys won their only previous match-up in 1r at Charleston this season... As No.4 seed, the last time **Keys** was seeded in the Top 5 at a WTA 1000 tournament was at Toronto in 2013... **Keys** owns three hard court titles: Adelaide 250 in 2022, Cincinnati in 2019 and Standford in 2017... **Navarro** is making her tournament debut in Guadalajara... **Navarro** is one of ten players from United States of America in 2r... **Navarro's** first R32 appearance at a WTA 1000 tournament

- To start grass season, she reached SF at 's-Hertogenbosch (l. Alexandrova), fell in 2r at Berlin (l. Sakkari) and Bad Homburg (l. Masarova) and reached 2r at Wimbledon (l. Kvitova)
- On clay, lost 1r at Charleston (l. Kenin) before reaching 2r at both Madrid and Rome and lost opener at Roland Garros (l. Tauson)
- Made 2r at Indian Wells (l. Ostapenko) and Miami (l. Krejcikova)
- Reached 2r at Dubai (l. Gauff), while exited in qualifying at Abu Dhabi and Doha

- Reached QF at Stuttgart (l. Potapova) and 3r at both Madrid (l. Sherif) and Rome (l. Osorio)

CAREER MILESTONES

- Highlights last year were R-Up finishes at Melbourne Summer Set 2 (l. Anisimova) and Cleveland (l. Samsonova)
- Also made QF at St. Petersburg, Berlin and Hamburg, helping her post career-high ranking of No.29 on September 19, 2022
- Best results in 2021 were runs to QFs at Belgrade and Cleveland and R16 at Indian Wells
- Reached first WTA QF in 18 months at 2020
 Palermo (as qualifier, l. Martio); also advanced
 to this stage at Istanbul (l. Martincova) and Linz
 (l. Krejcikova)
- Made 3r at 2020 US Open-defeating No.19 Vondrousova in 2r was her first Top-20 win in over a year
- Recorded 20th Grand Slam main draw win after defeating Friedsam in the 1r at 2020 Roland Garros
- Made strong start to 2019 season by recording maiden Top-5 victory over No.4 Svitolina en route to a QF finish at Brisbane (l. Vekic) followed by an SF appearance at Sydney (as qualifier, l. eventual champion Kvitova) and 3r run at Australian Open (l. Pavlyuchenkova)
- Reached first Grand Slam SF in doubles at 2019 US Open (w/Kuzmova, l. Azarenka/Barty)
- In 2018, reached second career WTA final and first at a Premier tournament at Brisbane, as a qualifier - defeated No.11 Mladenovic and No.16 Sevastova en route to final (l. No.6 Svitolina)
- Also in 2018 made SF at Moscow [River Cup] and first Grand Slam R16 at Wimbledon
- First broke into Top 50 on January 29
- Played all three ties during Belarus' run to its first Fed Cup final in 2017 - posted 5-1 record, including win over No.13 Stephens in final
- Highlight of 2016 was run through qualifying to QF at Tokyo [PPO]; defeated No.6 Ka.Pliskova en route for maiden Top-10 win
- Reached maiden WTA final at 2015 Seoul (as qualifier, l. Begu)
- Made Top-100 debut on September 8, 2015 (after US Open; rose from No.120 to No.97)
- In 2014 season won 11th and most recent singles title on ITF Circuit. Also owns seven ITF Circuit doubles titles
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2013 Brussels; made WTA main draw debut at 2014 US Open
- Played first event of career at 2009 ITF/Minsk 2-BLR

- Return to form in second half of 2022, winning four tournaments, including a run through qualifying to Cincinnati title (d. Kvitova in F) and victory at WTA Finals in Fort Worth (d. Sabalenka in F)
- Only player to win titles on all three surfaces in 2022, having also triumphed on grass at Bad Homburg (d. Andreescu in F) and on clay at Warsaw (d. Bogdan in F). Summer form saw her return to Top 10 on September 12, following US Open SF
- Best win of her career came over No.1 Swiatek in QF at 2022 Warsaw
- At 2022 Roland-Garros, won first doubles title in almost six years (w/Mladenovic, d. Gauff/Pegula in F)
- Highlights in 2021 came on clay, with SF at Lausanne and OF at Parma
- Best results in 2020 were at Slams, reaching R16 at Roland-Garros (l. Svitolina) and 3r at US Open (l. Brady); defeated No.3 Ka.Pliskova in 2r at Flushing Meadows to record her first Top-10 win since late 2018
- Highlights of 2019 campaign include capturing her seventh career WTA singles title at Nottingham (d. Vekic in F) and finishing R-Up at Strasbourg (l. Yastremska)
- Member of French Billie Jean King Cup team that won the 2019 competition final vs. Australia, teaming up with Mladenovic to win the decisive doubles runner against Barty/Stosur. Also took part in the team that advanced to final vs. Czech Republic in 2016
- Fell out of the Top 20 on March 18, 2019 after holding her position there since August 14, 2017
- In 2018, won sixth career title at Tianjin; also made SF at Stuttgart and Madrid
- Broke into the Top 5 on August 13, 2018 and reached a career-high of No.4 on September 10, 2018
- Became first player to win Wuhan and Beijing back-to-back in 2017. As a result, qualified for WTA Finals. Was ranked No.30 on the Race to Singapore leaderboard in May 2017
- Made Top-10 debut on October 9, 2017, following completion of Wuhan-Beijing title double
- Won a career-best 48 main draw matches in 2017 (48-22 record, two titles), including reaching maiden major QF at Roland-Garros (l. Ka.Pliskova)
- Qualifying for WTA Finals in 2017, became the first Frenchwoman to compete at WTA Finals in singles since Mauresmo in 2006 (l. Henin in F)

- At 2016 Roland Garros w/Mladenovic, won first major doubles title. They were the first French pair to win in Paris since 1971, when Gail Chanfreau and Francoise Durr triumphed
- Represented France at 2016 Rio Olympics in singles and doubles
- Played 2015 WTA Finals Rising Stars Invitational in Singapore (l. Osaka in F)
- Made professional debut at 13 on ITF Circuit in France in 2007
- In juniors, singles runner-up at 2011 US Open (l. Min) and reached SF at the other three Slams

- Currently coached by Dzmitry Klimenko
- Mother is Natalia; younger sister is Polina
- Started playing at age 9; introduced to sport by father
- Favorite shot is backhand down the line; favorite surface is indoor hardcourt; favorite tournaments are US Open and Stuttgart
- Studying for a physical culture degree at university in Minsk
- Speaks English, Belarusian, Russian and a little bit of French
- · Dream is to win Wimbledon one day

- Currently coached by Bertrand Perret
- Worked with Juan Pablo Guzman and Emiliano Redondi. Was also previously coached by father Louis Paul Garcia
- Mother is Marylene
- Played many sports when she was younger and chose tennis because it was the one she enjoyed the most
- Enjoys reading and spending time with family, and a big sports fan
- Best tennis memories are winning Limoges, Strasbourg, and the 2016 Roland Garros doubles title

- At 2022 Adelaide, won first title in over two years (d. Riske in F), followed by SF run at Australian Open - best Slam showing since 2018
- Other highlights last year were SF at Cincinnati and two further QF runs, including at Indian Wells

- Enjoyed first Top-10 year-end finish in 2016 (at No.8), as youngest player in Top 20
- Broke into Top 10 on June 20, 2016, becoming 118th player to reach the elite bracket since computer rankings were introduced. Also first American to make Top-10 debut since S.Williams in 1999
- Made WTA Finals debut at Singapore in 2016, going 1-2 in round-robin play
- Represented USA at 2016 Rio Olympics, reaching SF (lost Bronze medal match against Kvitova)
- Qualified for WTA Elite Trophy Zhuhai in 2015, 2018-19; went 1-1 in round-robin stage on all three appearances, with best result SF run in 2018 (withdrew before match vs. Muguruza w/left knee injury)
- Advanced to maiden major SF at 2015 Australian Open (l. eventual champion S.Williams); broke into Top 20 following conclusion of tournament, on February 2
- Was second-youngest player to win a WTA title in 2014, at Eastbourne (after Vekic at Kuala Lumpur); also, youngest American to win a title since V.King in October 2006 (17y 254d at Bangkok)
