Hailey Baptiste (USA #174) vs. [3] Caroline Garcia (FRA #11)

Baptiste leads 1-0

Baptiste defeated Garcia in their only previous match-up in 1r at Australian Open in 2022... In her Guadalajara debut, **Baptiste** becomes the lowest ranked player to reach the 3r after No.73 Kalinskaya in 2022... **Baptiste** owns 1-2 record against seeded players in 2023, most recently defeating No.16 Ka. Pliskova in 2r at current tournament... **Garcia** is only player from France to reach 3r (Mladenovic lost 1r)... **Garcia** won four out of the last 10 encounters against lower ranked players (31-23 record in 2023)... **Garcia** is a five-time hard court champion, including 2022 WTA Finals...

Sofia Kenin (USA #53) vs. [6] Jelena Ostapenko (LAT #16)

Ostapenko leads 2-1

Ostapenko won the most recent match against **Kenin** in 1r at Dubai dropping only three games (6-1 6-2)... **Ostapenko** has only lost one of her last seven meetings against lower ranked players (I. No.43 Collins at San Diego)... Four out of five of **Kenin's** titles came on hard court: Lyon and Australian Open in 2020, Guangzhou and Hobart in 2019... **Kenin** is one of five players from United States of America to reach 3r (along with Baptiste, Dolehide, Navarro and Townsend)... **Kenin** owns 4-5 record against Top 20 players this season with highest win against No.2 Sabalenka in Rome...

Camila Giorgi (ITA #56) vs. [2] Maria Sakkari (GRE #9)

Sakkari leads 3-0

Sakkari has lost to opponents Giorgi's rank or lower at last two events, falling to No.61 Navarro at San Diego and No.71 Masarova at US Open... **Sakkari** has reached six hard court finals, including at Guadalajara last year, but yet to lift a title... **Sakkari's** opening match win against Hunter was 30th victory of the season... **Giorgi** has won back to back main draw matches for first time since Eastbourne in June... First meeting between the pair came in qualifying at 2016 New Haven... **Giorgi** bidding to be first Italian woman to progress beyond R16 at Guadalajara...

[7] Veronika Kudermetova (#19) vs. [10] Victoria Azarenka (#23)

Kudermetova leads 2-0

Kudermetova's best hard court result in 2023 is semifinal achieved at Adelaide 1 (I. eventual champion Bencic) and Doha (I. Swiatek)... With a win today **Kudermetova** will reach her third WTA 1000 QF of 2023 after Rome and Madrid... **Azarenka's** second appearance at the tournament, reaching the semifinal in 2022 (I. Pegula)... Following her 2r win, **Azarenka** has won 190 WTA 1000 matches, the most of any player since the format was introduced in 2009... With a win today **Azarenka** will reach her 25th WTA 1000 QF on hard court...

Jabeur leads 1-0

Jabeur is No.1 seed for her fifth Tour-level tournament and first at WTA 1000 level... **Jabeur's** best WTA 1000 result is winning Madrid in 2022 (d. Pegula in the final)... **Jabeur** has not lost to an opponent ranked outside the Top 50 since the beginning of this hard court swing in Cincinnati... **Trevisan's** best career result on hard court is semifinal (Miami 2023)... One of two Italian players to reach 3r along with Giorgi... **Trevisan** holds best previous result by an Italian player at Guadalajara with R16 in 2022...

CAREER MILESTONES

- Last season, reached 2r at Australian Open (as qualifier, l. Inglis), Guadalajara [250] (as qualifier, l. Osorio) and Charleston (l. Cornet)
- Came through qualifying to reach 2r at 2021 Roland Garros (l. Kenin)
- Last year, also made 2r at Chicago [500] (as WC, l. Azarenka) and Charleston [500] (as WC, l. Jabeur). Fell 1r on three occasions (including US Open)
- Won doubles title at Charleston [250] w/McNally (d. Perez/Sanders in F)
- Earned best year-end ranking of career by concluding 2020 at No.231
- Fell 1r on Grand Slam main draw debut as WC at US Open (l. Mladenovic)
- Also contested qualifying at Australian Open and reached one SF on ITF Circuit at \$25k event in Rancho Santa Fe
- Ended 2019 season at No.285 (up from No.457 in 2018) after posting 29-13 record (all levels)
- Highlight of 2019 was 2r showing on WTA main draw debut at Washington DC (as WC, d. No.17 Keys, l. Mladenovic)
- Also contested qualifying at US Open and on ITF Circuit won \$25k titles at Tucon, Sumter and Plantation
- In 2018, posted 31-9 record, including one SF and four OFs on ITF Circuit
- Made debut on ITF Circuit in Florida in 2017
- As a junior reached career-high ranking of No.38 in 2018

- Return to form in second half of 2022, winning four tournaments, including a run through qualifying to Cincinnati title (d. Kvitova in F) and victory at WTA Finals in Fort Worth (d. Sabalenka in F)
- Only player to win titles on all three surfaces in 2022, having also triumphed on grass at Bad Homburg (d. Andreescu in F) and on clay at Warsaw (d. Bogdan in F). Summer form saw her return to Top 10 on September 12, following US Open SF
- Best win of her career came over No.1 Swiatek in QF at 2022 Warsaw
- At 2022 Roland-Garros, won first doubles title in almost six years (w/Mladenovic, d. Gauff/Pegula in F)
- Highlights in 2021 came on clay, with SF at Lausanne and OF at Parma
- Best results in 2020 were at Slams, reaching R16 at Roland-Garros (l. Svitolina) and 3r at US Open (l. Brady); defeated No.3 Ka.Pliskova in 2r at Flushing Meadows to record her first Top-10 win since late 2018
- Highlights of 2019 campaign include capturing her seventh career WTA singles title at Nottingham (d. Vekic in F) and finishing R-Up at Strasbourg (l. Yastremska)
- Member of French Billie Jean King Cup team that won the 2019 competition final vs. Australia, teaming up with Mladenovic to win the decisive doubles runner against Barty/Stosur. Also took part in the team that advanced to final vs. Czech Republic in 2016
- Fell out of the Top 20 on March 18, 2019 after holding her position there since August 14, 2017
- In 2018, won sixth career title at Tianjin; also made SF at Stuttgart and Madrid
- Broke into the Top 5 on August 13, 2018 and reached a career-high of No.4 on September 10, 2018
- Became first player to win Wuhan and Beijing back-to-back in 2017. As a result, qualified for WTA Finals. Was ranked No.30 on the Race to Singapore leaderboard in May 2017
- Made Top-10 debut on October 9, 2017, following completion of Wuhan-Beijing title double
- Won a career-best 48 main draw matches in 2017 (48-22 record, two titles), including reaching maiden major QF at Roland-Garros (l. Ka.Pliskova)
- Qualifying for WTA Finals in 2017, became the first Frenchwoman to compete at WTA Finals in singles since Mauresmo in 2006 (l. Henin in F)

- At 2016 Roland Garros w/Mladenovic, won first major doubles title. They were the first French pair to win in Paris since 1971, when Gail Chanfreau and Francoise Durr triumphed
- Represented France at 2016 Rio Olympics in singles and doubles
- Played 2015 WTA Finals Rising Stars Invitational in Singapore (l. Osaka in F)
- Made professional debut at 13 on ITF Circuit in France in 2007
- In juniors, singles runner-up at 2011 US Open (l. Min) and reached SF at the other three Slams

- Formerly coached by Peter Lucassen at the USTA National Campus in Orlando
- Met Williams sisters as a kid when they were playing World Team Tennis and managed to hit with both
- Pet dog, a half-Shar Pei, half-Pug named Tsonga
- Currently coached by Bertrand Perret
- Worked with Juan Pablo Guzman and Emiliano Redondi. Was also previously coached by father Louis Paul Garcia
- Mother is Marylene
- Played many sports when she was younger and chose tennis because it was the one she enjoyed the most
- Enjoys reading and spending time with family, and a big sports fan
- Best tennis memories are winning Limoges, Strasbourg, and the 2016 Roland Garros doubles title
