THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 21 – QUARTERFINALS

Leylah Fernandez (CAN #74) vs. Sofia Kenin (USA #53)

Kenin leads 1-0

Kenin won their only previous match in 2r at 2020 US Open... **Fernandez** and **Kenin** play in the second WTA 1000 quarterfinal of 2023 as two unseeded opponents after Muchova and Bouzkova at Cincinnati... Four out of five of **Kenin's** titles came on hard court: Lyon and Australian Open in 2020, Guangzhou and Hobart in 2019... With a win today **Kenin** would reach her third WTA 1000 semifinal after Toronto and Cincinnati in 2019... **Kenin** enters Guadalajara off the back of WTA 500 San Diego final (I. Krejčíková)... **Fernandez** quarterfinal appearance is her best WTA 1000 result... With a win today **Fernandez** would become the third Canadian to reach WTA 1000 semifinal after Bouchard and Andreescu...

[10] Victoria Azarenka (#23) vs. [3] Caroline Garcia (FRA #11)

Garcia leads 3-1

Azarenka defeated Garcia in their most recent meeting in 2r at Cincinnati in 2020... With a win **Azarenka** would become the fourth player to reach a WTA 1000 SF at 34+ years old, already achieved by Svetlana Kuznetsova, Serena Williams and Venus Williams... This is **Azarenka's** 35th QF appearance at a WTA 1000; only Agnieszka Radwanska (42), Simona Halep (39), Caroline Wozniacki (36) and Petra Kvitová (36) have made more QF appearances at WTA 1000s... Following her 2r win, **Azarenka** has won 191 WTA 1000 matches, the most of any player since the format was introduced in 2009... With a win today **Garcia** would reach her fifth WTA 1000 semifinal with only Marion Bartoli holding more (six) among the French players... **Garcia** is a five-time hard court champion, including 2022 WTA Finals... With a win today, **Garcia** will return to the Top 10 overtaking Barbora Krejčíková...

Martina Trevisan (ITA #54) vs. Caroline Dolehide (USA #111)

Dolehide leads 1-0

Dolehide won their only previous meeting in qualifying at Acapulco in 2020... **Trevisan** defeated No.1 seed Jabeur to reach her eighth quarterfinal and fourth in 2023... Trevisan's best career result on hard court is semifinal (Miami 2023)... **Trevisan** holds best previous result by an Italian player at Guadalajara with R16 in 2022... With a win today **Trevisan** would become the first Italian player to reach WTA 1000 semifinal since Giorgi at Montreal in 2021... With a win today **Dolehide** would reach her first career semifinal, previously reaching quarterfinal at Quebec City in 2027 and Monterrey in 2023... **Dolehide** could become the first American player to make the semifinal ranked outside the Top 100 since Sloane Stephens in 2017 (Toronto and Cincinnati)...

Emiliana Arango (#180) vs. [2] Maria Sakkari (GRE #9)

First meeting

Sakkari has 11 losses against opponents ranked outside Top 50, including her last two tournaments, falling to No.61 Navarro at San Diego and No.71 Masarova at US Open... **Sakkari** has reached six hard court finals, including at Guadalajara last year, but yet to lift a title... With a win today **Sakkari** will reach her ninth WTA 1000 semifinal and third of 2023 (Indian Wells and Madrid)... **Arango** is the first Colombian woman to reach the QF at a WTA 1000... With a win today, **Arango** would become the first player to reach a WTA 1000 in their debut appearance since Bouzkova at Toronto in 2019... At No.188, **Arango** becomes the lowest ranked player to reach quarterfinal at Guadalajara, previously No.73 Anna Kalinskaya in 2022...

CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2022 won her second title at Monterrey (d. Osorio in F; saved 5MP), and reached the QF at Roland Garros (l. Trevisan); missed grass-court season due to grade three stress fracture in her right foot suffered during match vs. Trevisan in Paris
- Enjoyed a memorable 2021 campaign, lifting first career title in Monterrey and advancing to maiden Grand Slam final, at US Open (l. Raducanu)
- En route to the final at Flushing Meadows in 2021, upset defending champion and No. 3 Osaka in 3r, 2016 winner Kerber in R16, No.5 Svitolina in QF and No. 2 Sabalenka in SF, becoming the youngest woman to beat multiple Top-5 opponents at the same major since S. Williams at 1999 US Open
- Breakout year in 2020 saw her crack Top 100 for the first time on September 14 and finish campaign by reaching 3r at Roland Garros
- Earned first career Grand Slam win at 2020 US Open (d. Zvonareva, l. Kenin in 2r) and made Grand Slam debut at 2020 Australian Open as qualifier (l. Davis in 1r)
- Reached first career WTA final and notched first tour-level back-to-back wins at 2020 Acapulco as qualifier (l. Watson in F); at 17y, 177d, she was the youngest Canadian to reach a WTA singles final in 34 years (since Helen Kelesi at 1986 Tokyo [Japan Open] won at 16y, 338d)
- Also in 2020, earned first Top-100 win over No.5 Bencic in Billie Jean King Cup
- Owns one singles title and two doubles titles on ITF Circuit
- Won 2019 Roland Garros junior's title (d. Navarro) becoming first Canadian to win a junior Grand Slam since Bouchard in 2012
- Played first WTA main draw and earned first main draw win of career at 2018 Quebec City defeating countrywoman Dabrowski in 1r (l. Watson in 2r)
- Member of Canadian Billie Jean King Cup Team 2019, 2021-22
- Made professional debut on ITF Circuit in USA in 2016
- Best results last season were QF at Adelaide (l. eventual champion Barty) and Cleveland (l. Pera). Missed clay and grass swings w/right ankle injury
- Missed second half of 2021 season due to ongoing foot injury and then testing positive for COVID-19
- In opening half of the 2021 campaign, standout results were QFs at Abu Dhabi and Yarra Valley Classic, and a R16 showing at Roland Garros
- Ended 2020 at career high of No.4 which she first hit on March 9, 2020 and came away with the 2020 WTA Player of the Year Award
- In last tournament of the season, finished R-Up at Roland Garros (l. Swiatek) for her first final appearance on clay
- Reached R16 at US Open and was one of only two players (also Kvitova) to reach second week of all three Slams in 2020
- Lifted fifth WTA singles title at Lyon (d. Friedsam in F) becoming the first player in 2020 to win a second title
- Won maiden major at 2020 Australian Open (d. Muguruza in F) to become the youngest champion (21y, 80d) in Melbourne since Sharapova (20y, 283d) in 2008. Defeated No.1 Barty and home favorite in SF for third career win over a reigning World No.1
- Australian Open run helped her break into the Top 10 for the first time at No.7 on February 3, 2020
- Won 2019 WTA Most Improved Player of the Year award after winning three WTA titles at Hobart (d. Schmiedlova in F), Mallorca (d. Bencic in F) and Guangzhou (d. Stosur in F)
- Finished 2019 at No.14 as US No.2 (behind No.9 S.Williams) and leader in hard court wins (38-tied w/Barty)
- Registered back-to-back SF runs at Toronto (l. eventual champion Andreescu) and Cincinnati (l. eventual champion Keys), subsequently leading to Top 20 debut at No.20 on August 19, 2019
- During this run, defeated No.1 Barty (Toronto) and No.1 Osaka (Cincinnati) to become first player since October 2001 to defeat World No.1s in consecutive weeks (Davenport); also became youngest American to defeat reigning No.1 in eight years (after McHale)
- Advanced to R16 at 2019 Roland Garros (d. S.Williams, l. eventual champion Barty) - became first American to defeat Serena at the majors since Stephens at 2013 Australian Open QF

- Also won maiden doubles titles in 2019 at Auckland (w/Bouchard) and Beijing (w/Mattek-Sands)
- Broke into the Top 100 on March 19, 2018 and Top 50 on October 8, 2018
- Member of US Billie Jean King Cup team from 2018-20
- Made WTA main draw debut at 2015 US Open as a wildcard (l. Duque-Mariño in 1r)
- Owns four ITF singles titles and two doubles titles
- Played first matches of career on ITF Circuit in 2013, climbing to No.2 in ITF World Junior Rankings
- Represented the USA at the 2014 Youth Olympic Games and competed at the 2016 ITF Junior Masters, both held in China

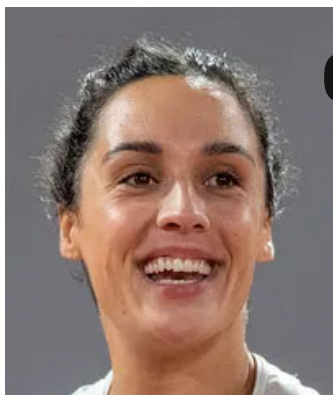

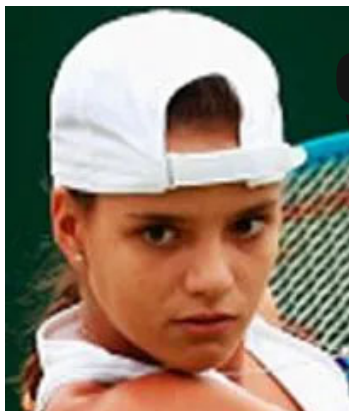
