Caroline Dolehide (USA #111) vs. Sofia Kenin (USA #53)

Dolehide leads 2-1

All of the three previous meetings between Dolehide and Kenin were at ITF level, the pair are meeting for the first time at a WTA Tour level event... The winner will be the third unseeded finalist at a WTA 1000 tournament this year (also Karolina Muchova R-Up at Cincinnati and Barbora Krejcikova Won at Dubai)... This will only be the fith all-American SF at a WTA1000 event since the format introduction in 2009, **Kenin** also appeared in the last such SF match (I. Keys at Cincinnati in 2019)... Winner of this match will become third American to reach a WTA 1000 final in 2023 (along w/ Pegula in Montreal and Gauff at Cincinnati)... This will be the second time since 2009 three Americans have made a WTA 1000 final in a calendar year (2019 – S.Williams, Keys and Riske-Amritraj)... Having made the San Diego final, this is the first time **Kenin** has reached back-to-back SF since Toronto and Cincinnati in 2019... With a victory today, this would be the first time **Kenin** reaches back-to-back WTA finals and she would reach her first WTA 1000 final

Dolehide is aiming to become the second player ranked outside the Top 100 to reach a WTA 1000 final (also No.153 Kuznetsova, R-Up at 2019 Cincinnati)... With a win today, **Dolehide** would achieve five consecutive wins for the first time in her career at Tour-level evens... **Dolehide** hols a record of 8-4 wins at WTA level events in 2023, with two of those defeats coming in at 1r of Grand Slams (Wimbledon & US Open)

[3] Caroline Garcia (FRA #11) vs. [2] Maria Sakkari (GRE #9)

Garcia leads 3-1

Garcia leads the head-to-head against Sakkari by 3-1, with all matches being secured on hard court... This will be Sakkari's ninth career WTA 1000 SF and her third of 2023 (Indian Wells, Madrid), she has now equaled her highest tally as such in a calendar year having also reached three in 2022 (Doha, Indian Wells and Guadalajara)... This is the third time Sakkari has reached a WTA 1000 SF without dropping a set (Doha and Indian Wells in 2022)... With a victory against Garcia, Sakkari would reach her third WTA 1000 final (Indian Wells and Guadalajara in 2022), she is yet to lift a title of such level... Sakkari is projected to move to No.6 with a win today, the highest she can climb this week

Going into this match, **Garcia** holds a win-loss record of 88-74 at WTA 1000 events, the most match wins of any French player at such level since the format was introduced in 2009... **Garcia** holds a 0-2 win record against Top 10 opponents in 2023 (I. Sakkari and Kvitova)... With a win today, **Garcia** would reach her fourth WTA 1000 final (Wuhan, Beijing in 2017 and Cincinnati in 2022)... **Garcia** is the only player on the WTA Tour to have served over 300 aces in 2023 (325); and with 111 aces so far at WTA 1000 events, **Garcia** is only one of four players to have served over 100 aces (Rybakina 209, Sabalenka 145, Kvitova 102)... By reaching the SF, **Garcia** books her return to the Top 10 on Monday; she will move to No.6 by winning the title, otherwise will be No.10

- Is the 8th player ranked outside the Top 100 to reach the SF at a WTA 1000 and first to do so since 2019 Cincinnati (Svetlana Kuznetsova, R-Up)
- Best career result on hard court is quarterfinal which she has reached once: Monterrey in 2023
- Best result by United States of America at Guadalajara was champion achieved by Jessica Pegula in 2022
- At No.111 becomes the lowest ranked player to reach SF at Guadalajara, previously was (No.38) Marie Bouzkova in 2022
- Is currently ranked No.111; this time last year was ranked No.161; reached career high ranking of No.99 on May 22, 2023
- Projected to enter the Top 65 with SF loss, Top 50 as a R-Up and Top 30 with a title win
- Dolehide is also playing in the doubles semifinal today w/Muhammad
- Is currently on a 4-match winning streak, the longest of her career
- Has won 8 matches so far in 2023 with record on hard court standing at 6-2
- The winner today will face Garcia or Sakkari in the final

CAREER MILESTONES

- Last season at Tour level, made 2r twice, while fell 1r four times and in qualifying on seven occasions (including at all four Grand Slams). In doubles, won Nottingham (w/Niculescu) and reached SF at US Open (w/Sanders)
- At Tour level in 2021, made 2r twice, while fell 1r four times and in qualifying on seven occasions (including at all four Grand Slams)
- Won maiden WTA doubles title at 2021
 Monterrey (w/Muhammad, d. Watson/Zheng in
 F). Last year, also finished R-Up at Nottingham
 (w/Sanders) and Chicago [500] (w/Vandeweghe),
 and made SF at US Open (w/Sanders)
- Triumphed at W60 ITF Circuit events in 2019 at first Concord and then Charleston
- Reached doubles SF at 2019 US Open (w/King)
- Highlight of 2017 season was reaching first tourlevel QF at Québec City (as qualifier, l. eventual champion Van Uytvanck). Achieved then careerbest ranking of No.137 following the tournament (September 18, 2017)
- Also in 2017 reached 2r at Stanford (as qualifier, l. Keys) and won second and third ITF Circuit titles of career, at \$60k ITF/Winnipeg-CAN and \$25k ITF/Surprise, AZ-USA
- Fell in qualifying at US Open and WTA events in Indian Wells, Nottingham, Cincinnati, Linz and Luxembourg
- Highlight of 2016 season was coming through qualifying to win maiden ITF Circuit title at \$10k ITF/Buffalo, NY-USA on clay (d. Herring in F).
 Also won doubles at same tournament w/Neel
- Owns six singles and nine doubles titles on ITF Circuit
- Made professional debut at \$10k ITF/Hilton Head Island 2, SC-USA (lost in qualifying)

- Best results last season were QF at Adelaide (l. eventual champion Barty) and Cleveland (l. Pera). Missed clay and grass swings w/right ankle injury
- Missed second half of 2021 season due to ongoing foot injury and then testing positive for COVID-19
- In opening half of the 2021 campaign, standout results were QFs at Abu Dhabi and Yarra Valley Classic, and a R16 showing at Roland Garros
- Ended 2020 at career high of No.4 which she first hit on March 9, 2020 and came away with the 2020 WTA Player of the Year Award
- In last tournament of the season, finished R-Up at Roland Garros (l. Swiatek) for her first final appearance on clay
- Reached R16 at US Open and was one of only two players (also Kvitova) to reach second week of all three Slams in 2020
- Lifted fifth WTA singles title at Lyon (d. Friedsam in F) becoming the first player in 2020 to win a second title
- Won maiden major at 2020 Australian Open (d. Muguruza in F) to become the youngest champion (21y, 80d) in Melbourne since Sharapova (20y, 283d) in 2008. Defeated No.1 Barty and home favorite in SF for third career win over a reigning World No.1
- Australian Open run helped her break into the Top 10 for the first time at No.7 on February 3, 2020
- Won 2019 WTA Most Improved Player of the Year aware after winning three WTA titles at Hobart (d. Schmiedlova in F), Mallorca (d. Bencic in F) and Guangzhou (d. Stosur in F)
- Finished 2019 at No.14 as US No.2 (behind No.9 S.Williams) and leader in hard court wins (38tied w/Barty)
- Registered back-to-back SF runs at Toronto (l. eventual champion Andreescu) and Cincinnati (l. eventual champion Keys), subsequently leading to Top 20 debut at No.20 on August 19, 2019
- During this run, defeated No.1 Barty (Toronto) and No.1 Osaka (Cincinnati) to become first player since October 2001 to defeat World No.1s in consecutive weeks (Davenport); also became youngest American to defeat reigning No.1 in eight years (after McHale)
- Advanced to R16 at 2019 Roland Garros (d. S.Williams, l. eventual champion Barty) became first American to defeat Serena at the majors since Stephens at 2013 Australian Open QF

- Also won maiden doubles titles in 2019 at Auckland (w/Bouchard) and Beijing (w/Mattek-Sands)
- Broke into the Top 100 on March 19, 2018 and Top 50 on October 8, 2018
- Member of US Billie Jean King Cup team from 2018-20
- Made WTA main draw debut at 2015 US Open as a wildcard (l. Duque-Mariño in 1r)
- Owns four ITF singles titles and two doubles titles
- Played first matches of career on ITF Circuit in 2013, climbing to No.2 in ITF World Junior Rankings
- Represented the USA at the 2014 Youth Olympic Games and competed at the 2016 ITF Junior Masters, both held in China

- Comes from a family of tennis players older sister, Courtney, won a NCAA title with her team at UCLA and has coached women's tennis at the college ranks at University of Texas and is now coaching at Georgetown for men's and women's tennis; her younger sister Stephanie, who is committed to play tennis at West Point, won a state doubles title in 2015 as a sophomore at Hinsdale Central. Brother also won three state titles in golf at the same high school and is now playing golf for FAU

CAREER MILESTONES

- Return to form in second half of 2022, winning four tournaments, including a run through qualifying to Cincinnati title (d. Kvitova in F) and victory at WTA Finals in Fort Worth (d. Sabalenka in F)
- Only player to win titles on all three surfaces in 2022, having also triumphed on grass at Bad Homburg (d. Andreescu in F) and on clay at Warsaw (d. Bogdan in F). Summer form saw her return to Top 10 on September 12, following US Open SF

- Highlights in 2021 came on clay, with SF at Lausanne and QF at Parma
- Best results in 2020 were at Slams, reaching R16 at Roland-Garros (l. Svitolina) and 3r at US Open (l. Brady); defeated No.3 Ka.Pliskova in 2r at Flushing Meadows to record her first Top-10 win since late 2018
- Highlights of 2019 campaign include capturing her seventh career WTA singles title at Nottingham (d. Vekic in F) and finishing R-Up at Strasbourg (l. Yastremska)
- Member of French Billie Jean King Cup team that won the 2019 competition final vs.
 Australia, teaming up with Mladenovic to win the decisive doubles runner against Barty/Stosur. Also took part in the team that advanced to final vs. Czech Republic in 2016
- Fell out of the Top 20 on March 18, 2019 after holding her position there since August 14, 2017
- In 2018, won sixth career title at Tianjin; also made SF at Stuttgart and Madrid
- Broke into the Top 5 on August 13, 2018 and reached a career-high of No.4 on September 10, 2018
- Became first player to win Wuhan and Beijing back-to-back in 2017. As a result, qualified for WTA Finals. Was ranked No.30 on the Race to Singapore leaderboard in May 2017
- Made Top-10 debut on October 9, 2017, following completion of Wuhan-Beijing title double
- Won a career-best 48 main draw matches in 2017 (48-22 record, two titles), including reaching maiden major QF at Roland-Garros (l. Ka.Pliskova)
- Qualifying for WTA Finals in 2017, became the first Frenchwoman to compete at WTA Finals in singles since Mauresmo in 2006 (l. Henin in F)
