



- First edition of the tournament in Merida two previous editions were held in Guadalajara as Abierto Akron Zapopan.
- **Sloane Stephens** returns as the No.2 seed to defend her title after winning the event last year taking out Marie Bouzkova in the final.
- No.1 seed **Magda Linette** will look to carry her form from Australian Open where she made her first Grand Slam semi-final and achieved career-high ranking of No.21 last week.
- Along with Mexico's top ranked player, Fernanda Contreras Gomez, American Katie Volynets and Switzerland's Simona Waltert received main draw wildcards.
- Last year's doubles champions, **Kaitlyn Christian** and **Lidziya Marozava**, are back in the tournament with different partners. Christian has teamed up with **Sabrina Santamaria** and Marozava is with **Han Xinyun**.
- One to watch Elisabetta Cocciaretto. The Italian had a strong start to the season with a runner-up performance
 at Hobart that helped her break into Top 50 for the first time in her career. The 22-year-old won the WTA 125
 Tampico late last year beating current tournament seeds Magda Linette and Lin Zhu in the process. She is
 playing her first WTA tournament as a seed.
