CAREER MILESTONES

- Best result last season was QF run at Eastbourne (as LL, l. Giorgi). Also finished R-Up at WTA 125 in Budapest and at W80 ITF Circuit tournament in Oeiras
- Broke into Top 100 for first time on August 8, 2022, following SF run at W80 ITF Circuit event in Grodzisk Mazowiecki, Poland
- Advanced to maiden WTA SFs during 2021 season, first at Bogota (l. Zidansek) and then at Belgrade (as LL, l. eventual champion Badosa)
- On Tour's return in 2020, fell 1r at US Open and Istanbul before reaching SF at \$80k ITF/Cagnes sur Mer-FRA
- In final event before the tour's hiatus, made 2r at Lyon (l. Van Uytvanck)
- Started 2020 with a productive spell on ITF Circuit in Great Britain, finishing R-Up at \$25K Glasgow before winning 16th title at this level at \$25K Sunderland (d. Raducanu in F)
- Made four Tour-level appearances in 2019, highlighted by 2r showing at Osaka (as qualifier, d. Cornet, l. Osaka), while won title at \$80K ITF/Biarritz-FRA (d. Kovinic in F)
- Highlights of 2018 were Grand Slam main-draw debut at Australian Open (l. Gibbs in 1r) and first ever Grand Slam main-draw victory at Wimbledon (as qualifier, d. Smitkova, l. S.Williams). Also made 2r at Istanbul and Hong Kong
- In 2017, reached 2r at Bastad (as qualifier, l. Krunic) and Linz (as qualifier, l. Golubic). Also fell 1r at Gstaad - making her WTA main draw debut - and in qualifying on 12 occasions (including all four majors)
- Maiden Top-50 upset came over No.40 Goerges in 1r at 2017 Bastad (via ret.)
- Made successful comeback from injury in 2016, winning 64 matches and four titles, rising over 300 places in the rankings. Since return has stopped playing doubles to protect injury
- In 2015, missed five months with a leg muscle strain - ended season at No.474
- Member of Bulgarian Billie Jean King Cup Team, 2014-15, 2017-19, 2021-22
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2010 Miami
- On ITF Circuit owns 16 singles titles and 12 doubles titles
- Played first events of career on ITF Circuit in Bulgaria in 2009
- Best results last year were QF at Parma (l. eventual champion Sherif) and 3r runs at Miami (as qualifier, l. Kvitova) and US Open (l. eventual champion Swiatek)
- Highlights of the 2021 season included QF at Guadalajara (l. Cocciaretto) and SF at Nottingham (l. Zhang)
- Best result of disrupted 2020 campaign was QF run at Hobart (l. Zhang)
- Tied career best Grand Slam result by reaching 3r at 2019 Wimbledon (as lucky loser, l. Suarez Navarro); in 2r upset Kerber to become the first LL to beat the defending women's champion at Wimbledon and the first to win two matches at the tournament
- Win over No.5 Kerber at 2019 Wimbledon was first Top-10 win since 2017 Eastbourne (d. No.10 A.Radwanska)
- Ended 2018 ranked No.252 - her first year-end finish outside Top 100 since 2011
- Only Tour-level victories in 2018 came during 3r run at Australian Open (l. Halep)
- Reached career-high ranking of No.26 on May 2017 after QF at Rabat (l. Pavlyuchenkova), Doha (as qualifier, l. Wozniacki) and Dubai (l. eventual champion Svitolina) as well as advancing to R16 at Indian Wells (l. Mladenovic)
- Broke into the Top 50 at No.46 for the first time on January 9, 2017 after first career WTA title at Auckland (d. Konjuh in F)
- Appeared in first singles finals of career in 2016, at Washington DC (l. Wickmayer) and Québec City (as qualifier, l. Dodin)
- Earned first Top-20 win en route to R16 at 2014 Indian Wells over No.4 Azarenka (l. Dellacqua by walkover)
- Reached 3r at 2014 Australian Open for career best Slam result (l. Bouchard)
- Notched first WTA main draw win over No.55 Martic at 2012 Indian Wells (l. Petrova in 2r)
- Played first Tour-level main draw match at 2011 Australian Open as a wild card (l. Stosur in 1r)
- On ITF Circuit has won seven singles titles
- Member of US Billie Jean King Cup Team in 2014-15, 2017
- Won USTA Girls' 18 & Under national title in 2011, earning a US Open main draw wildcard
- In December 2010, registered 18-match win streak on ITF Junior Circuit, capturing three tournaments, culminating in Orange Bowl. Finished 2010 year ranked No.3 in world junior rankings
