CAREER MILESTONES

- Advanced to maiden WTA SF at 2023 Austin (l. Gracheva)
- Performed well on clay in 2022, lifting a title at W100 event in Palm Harbor, Florida and compiling 11-3 win-loss record at a series of ITF Circuit events before making 2r at Roland Garros (l. Rybakina)
- Won first ITF Circuit title in 2021, at W100 Bonita Springs, FL, USA
- Fell 1r on Grand Slam debut at 2019 US Open (l. eventual champion Andreescu)
- Ended 2018 ranked No.743 after posting 21-5 record from five tour outings
- Best results in 2018 came in October and November when she came through qualifying to reach SFs at \$25k ITF/Florence-SC, USA and \$25k ITF/Norman-OK, USA
- Achieved career-high ranking of No.387 on July 29, 2019
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2019 San Jose
- As a junior, contested three of the four majors and reached No.21 in the rankings

- Last season finished R-Up at San Jose (l. Kasatkina). Also reached the SF at 's-Hertogenbosch (l. Sabalenka) and QF at Adelaide 1 (l. Rybakina)
- Enjoyed most consistent campaign of her career in 2021, reaching QFs at Yarra Valley Classic, Adelaide, Charleston [250] and Indian Wells. Also made R16 at Australian Open and US Open
- Broke into Top 50 for the first time on March 1, 2021, following QF showing at Adelaide
- Produced career best year-end finish in 2020 at No.58, on the heels of SF appearance at Lexington (d. S.Williams in 2r, l. Teichmann) and QF at US Open (d. Kvitova, l. eventual champion Osaka) - marked second career Slam QF appearance (also 2016 Roland Garros)
- In 2019, made return from injury at Charleston where she reached 2r (l. Ostapenko). Also posted 2r showings at Roland Garros and Mallorca and fell 1r six occasions and reached one ITF Circuit final
- Fell 1r in only two tournaments played in 2018 at Australian Open and Indian Wells - injured left knee in loss to Dolehide at Indian Wells, requiring surgery in the summer
- In 2017, posted third Top 100 season and yearend finish of No.59. Year highlighted by reaching QFs at Charleston, Hobart and Strasbourg. Achieved career-high ranking of No.48 on January 30, 2017
- Also, played all three ties to help USA win its first Fed Cup in 17 years, winning decisive doubles rubber (w/Vandeweghe) in final against Belarus
- In 2017 US Open 2r, d. No.25 seed Gavrilova 7-6(6), 4-6, 7-6(5), in a match that took 3 hours, 33 minutes, setting a record for the longest women's match in US Open history
- Appeared in two WTA singles finals, at 2016 Rio de Janeiro (l. Schiavone) and at 2014 Bad Gastein (d. No.16 Suárez Navarro and No.14 Errani en route, l.Petkovic)
- One-time doubles runner-up, at 2015 Bogotá (w/Falconi)
- Participated in 2014 WTA Finals Rising Stars Invitational in Singapore (along with Diyas, Puig and Zheng)
- Made Top 100 for first time on August 11, 2014
- Won first WTA level match at 2013 Strasbourg (d. Domachowska)
- Winner of five singles titles and two doubles titles on ITF Circuit, where she made

CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2022, made 2r at US Open (l. Jabeur) and San Jose (as qualifier, l. Badosa)
- Started US summer hard-court swing in fine form, lifting W25 ITF Circuit title in Wichita, KC and advancing to SF at W60 tournament in Evansville, IN
- Last season, enjoyed early success on ITF Circuit, posting 13-match winning streak to win back-to-back W25 titles in Florianopolis, Brazil
- In 2021, won third and fourth ITF Circuit titles of her career, both at W15 ITF Circuit events in Monastir, Tunisia
- Contested qualifying at 2021 US Open
- Fell at final hurdle on WTA qualifying debut at 2019 Bronx
- Owns seven titles in singles and three in doubles on ITF Circuit
- Made professional debut on ITF Circuit in 2016

- Last season finished R-Up at both Adelaide 2 (l. Keys) and Nottingham (l. Haddad Maia). She returned to the Top 50, finishing the season at No.41
- Foot injury kept her out most of the first part of the 2021 season; made return at Madrid and would eventually reach two finals in 2021 at Portoroz (l. Paolini) and winning her third career title at Linz (d. Cristian in F)
- Also represented the United States at the Tokyo Olympics for the first time in career (l. Buzarnescu in 1r)
- Best results of 2020 came in the opening month with a QF showing at Brisbane (QF) and R16 run at Australian Open
- Ended 2019 at career-high ranking of No.18, posted on November 4, 2019 - up from No.63 in 2018
- In a breakout 2019 campaign, achieved best Slam result by advancing to QF at Wimbledon, ousting World No.1 Barty to notch biggest win of her career before being halted by eventual R-Up S.Williams
- Additionally, lifted second career WTA singles title at 's-Hertogenbosch (d. Bertens in F after saving 5mp) and finished runner-up at Shenzhen (l. Sabalenka) and Wuhan (l. Sabalenka)
- Highlights in 2018 include reaching 3r at 2018
 Miami, her best result at a Premier Mandatory
 tournament (l. Y.Wang on third set tiebreak), and
 advancing to QF at Hobart (l. Buzarnescu), 's Hertogenbosch (l. Vandeweghe), Mallorca (l.
 Stosur) and Tokyo [PPO] (l. Ka.Pliskova). Also
 won eighth ITF Circuit singles title at Surbiton
 (d. Perrin in F)
- In 2017, finished R-Up at Shenzhen (d. No.3 A.Radwanska, l. Siniakova). Also part of Fed Cup winning USA team and reached QF at Nürnberg and 3r at Australian Open and Wimbledon
- Won maiden WTA singles title at 2014 Tianjin without dropping a set (d. Bencic in F)
- Made Top 100 debut on July 22, 2013 (No.96)
- Reached first WTA SF at 2010 Birmingham (as qualifier, l. Sharapova)
- Made WTA main draw debut at 2010 Charleston
- Winner of nine singles and one doubles title on ITF Women's Circuit

- Coached by Emilio Sebastian Eguez Paz
- Mother is four-time Grand Slam winner Hana Mandlikova
- Goes by the name of 'Elli'
- Started playing tennis aged seven and favorite surface is hard
