- Haddad Maia and Siegemund are appearing in their first final together in their debut as a doubles team
- The pair have defeated one seeded team en route to the finals (No.3 Kichenok/Ostapenko)
- The duo will face top seeds and Doubles World No.1 / World No.2 Katerina Siniakova and Barbora Krejckova in the final
- This is Siegemund's first doubles final at the 1000-level since winning Miami in 2022 with partner Vera Zvonareva, where they defeated the No.1 seeds Mertens/Kudermetova
- Overall, Siegemund appeared in four doubles finals in 2022, winning three: Lyon (w/Zvonareva), Miami (w/Zvonareva), and Cluj-Napoca (w/Flipkens); and losing one at Tallinn (w/Melichar-Martinez)
- Siegemund has won one doubles title in 2023, at Hobart with partner Kirsten Flipkens (d. Golubic/Udvardy)
- Siegemund is a two-time grand slam champion in doubles with Vera Zvonareva at US Open 2022 (d. Melichar/Yifan) and mixed doubles with Mate Pavic at US Open 2016 (d. Vandeweghe/Ram)
- Siegemund also competed in singles at Indian Wells 2023, reaching the main draw through qualifying before falling in the first round to Madison Brengle in straight sets
- Siegemund is attempting to win her 11th doubles title in 16 attempts
- At the 1000 level, Haddad Maia previously reached the 2022 Guadalajara doubles final with partner Danilina (l. Hunter/Stefani). The duo defeated Krejckova/Siniakova in three tight sets in the semifinal
- With Danilina, Haddad Maia qualified for the 2022 WTA Finals in Fort Worth. The pair also reached the 2022 Australian Open doubles final (l. Krejckova/Siniakova)

- Haddad Maia recently reached a career-high singles ranking of World No.12 earlier this year. She had a breakthrough singles season in 2022, winning two titles (Nottingham and Birmingham) and reaching an addition final (Toronto – I. Halep in final)
- This is Haddad Maia’s seventh doubles final – she won four (2015 Bogota, 2017 Bogota, 2022 Sydney, and 2022 Nottingham) and lost two (2022 Australian Open and 2022 Guadalajara)
- Haddad Maia fell in the third round in singles at 2023 Indian Wells to Emma Raducanu in three close sets. She defeated one of her opponents in today’s final, Katerina Siniakova, in the second round

W-L record: 175-51 (including Indian Wells 2023)

- Playing their 69th professional tournament together, after first teaming up back in 2013
- Won against Ena Shibahara / Shuko Aoyama in the semifinals. Set to face Laura Siegemund / Beatriz Haddad Maia in the final
- Only dropped one set in the tournament against Taylor Townsend / Leylah Fernandez in the second round
- Won this year's Australian Open (d. Shibahara / Aoyama) and currently enjoying a perfect 10-0 record in 2023
- Had an almost perfect Grand Slam campaign last year winning three of four Grand Slams; the duo missed out on a chance to defend their Roland Garros title after Krejciikova tested positive for Covid-19 before their first round match
- Missed four of eight WTA 1000 tournaments last year as a team, including Indian Wells, due to Krejciikova's arm injury. Best result was making semi-finals at Guadalajara (I. Haddad Maia / Danilina)
- By winning US Open in September last year, became seventh team in the Open Era to complete the career doubles Grand Slam and the second to complete the career doubles Golden Slam (also Serena and Venus Williams); only six women have achieved the latter (Pam Shriver and Gigi Fernandez both completed it with different partners)

- Have been regulars at the business end of the big events ever since winning back-to-back majors at 2018 Roland Garros and Wimbledon. In 2021, won Roland-Garros and won the gold medal at the Tokyo Olympics (d. Bencic/ Golubic in F)
- Siniakova has held the No.1 ranking since Nov 15, 2021 (68 weeks in total). Krejčíková has also occupied the top spot for 19 weeks in her career (12 of these concurrently with Siniakova)
- Although Siniakova enjoyed most of her success partnering with Krejčíková, she was also R-Up at 2017 US Open with Lucie Hradecká. Overall, she holds a 21-15 record in Tour-level finals, winning the past 12. Krejčíková's career record in doubles finals sits at 15-10
- Along with seven Grand Slam doubles titles, Krejčíková has one singles and three mixed doubles major titles to her name. She is one of the three active players to have won major title in singles, doubles and mixed
- In singles, Krejčíková enjoyed her best season to date in 2021, finishing R-Up at Dubai, lifting her maiden title at Strasbourg and capturing Roland Garros to break into Top 10. Siniakova is the owner of three WTA singles titles (2017 Shenzhen, 2017 Bastad and 2022 Portoroz), and has climbed as high as No.31 (October 22, 2018)
- Krejčíková also made it to R16 in singles of this tournament eventually losing to Aryna Sabalenka in a three-set match
- Siniakova's singles campaign at this year's Indian Wells ended in the second round where she lost to Haddad Maia
