WTA FINALS – A BRIEF HISTORY

- This is the 52nd staging of the event (which began in 1972). This year marks the first time that the WTA Finals are hosted in Cancun and second time being hosted in Mexico as the event was staged in Guadalajara in 2021. Cancun is the 13th different city to host the year-end event.
- The singles event features eight players and begins as a round robin event, with four players in each group. Over the first six days of competition, each player meets the other three players in her group, with the top two in each pool moving on to the semifinals. Each of the group winners meets the runner-up in the other group in the semifinals. The winners of each semifinal meet in the championship match.
- The current round robin format was re-introduced in 2003 for the first time since 1982.
- Twelve players have advanced to the final on their WTA Finals debut; only Serena Williams (2001), Maria Sharapova (2004), Petra Kvitova (2011), Dominika Cibulkova (2016) and Ashleigh Barty (2019) won the title on their debut. Those other players who reached the final on their debut are Tracy Austin (1979 R-Up), Andrea Jaeger (1981 R-Up), Lindsay Davenport (1994 R-Up), Martina Hingis (1996 R-Up), Simona Halep (2014 R-Up), Sloane Stephens (2018 R-Up) and Anett Kontaveit (2021 R-Up)
- The longest Finals win streak was compiled by Navratilova, who won 21 straight matches in winning five titles between 1983 and 1986 and reaching the quarterfinals in 1987. The next longest win streak in tournament history is S.Williams, who won 16 in a row (2009, 2012, 2013 and 2014)
- Between 1984 and 1998, a best-of-five sets final was used to decide the Finals final; three finals went the distance: 1990 - Seles vs. Gabriela Sabatini (the first woman's match in 89 years to extend to five sets since the 1901 Philadelphia Finals); 1995 – Steffi Graf vs. Anke Huber; 1996 - Graf vs. Hingis. Six finals went to four sets (1986 - March, 1987, 1989, 1991, 1993 and 1998)
- Nine times has a Finals winner has not dropped a set en route to the title; Evert achieved the feat three times (1972-73, 1975) and Navratilova (1984-85) and S.Williams (2001, 2012) did it twice; Sabatini did not drop a set in 1988, while Clijsters did the same in 2002
- There have been 25 different winners in 51 stagings; of those 24 winners, 18 have reached No.1 in the WTA Rankings with the only exceptions were Sylvia Hanika (1982), Gabriela Sabatini (1988, 1994), Jana Novotna (1997), Petra Kvitova (2011), Agnieszka Radwanska (2015), Dominika Cibulkova (2016), Elina Svitolina (2018) and Caroline Garcia (2022)
- The top seed has won the title 23 times, most recently Ashleigh Barty in 2019

DOUBLES QUALIFIERS

The doubles event at the WTA Finals features eight teams in a round robin format. The qualifiers below will be split into two groups, with the winners and runners-up advancing to the semifinals:

Coco Gauff & Jessica Pegula – The all-American duo are making their second appearance at the WTA Finals courtesy of reaching four finals this season, winning titles at Miami and Qatar and finishing as runners-up at Madrid and Rome. Also this year they became the first co-ranked WTA Doubles World No.1s since 2019, both hitting the top spot in the rankings in September and returning to the top just prior to the WTA Finals on October 23.

Storm Hunter & Elise Mertens – While this is their debut as a team, Mertens returns as defending champion having lifted the WTA Finals crown last season with Veronika Kudermetova. The Australian-Belgian duo picked up two titles this season, at Rome and Guadalajara, and also enjoyed a successful spell on grass by making the finals at Wimbledon.

Barbora Krejčíková & Katerina Siniakova – The experienced Czech pairing are making their fifth straight appearance at the WTA Finals and went unbeaten in 2021 to win the event when it was last held in Mexico in Guadalajara. The former No.1s have won three tournaments in 2023, at Indian Wells, San Diego and the Australian Open, which marked their seventh Grand Slam title together.

Demi Schuurs & Desirae Krawczyk – Having reached the semifinals of the WTA Finals last year, Schuurs and Krawczyk will be aiming to go one further in 2023. They reached three finals across this season, triumphing at Stuttgart and Eastbourne and contested the title match at Montreal. As a team they reached the semifinal stage at six of their 18 tournaments.

Shuko Aoyama & Ena Shibahara – Aoyama and Shibahara made history this year by becoming the first all-Japanese team to qualify for the WTA Finals more than once and secured their place courtesy of winning Montreal and 's-Hertogenbosch while also posting their best Grand Slam result by reaching the final at the Australian Open and also finishing as runner-up in Zhengzhou.

Gabriela Dabrowski & Erin Routliffe – History-maker Routliffe is New Zealand's first-ever WTA Finals qualifier, while Dabrowski on her fifth outing in 2023 will be looking to become Canada's maiden WTA Finals champion. Both players lifted their debut Grand Slam title at the US Open in August, enjoyed further success by winning Zhengzhou in September, and have already enjoyed a solid run on Mexican soil recently too by reaching the final at Guadalajara. In eight tournaments as a team this year, they reached the semifinal stage four times.

Nicole Melichar-Martinez & Ellen Perez – The pairing are making their debut as a team at the WTA Finals and secured their place in Cancun thanks to reaching four finals in 2023, finishing runners-up at Cincinnati, Eastbourne, Austin and Cleveland. Perez is bidding to be the first Australian WTA Finals doubles champion since 2006, while Melichar-Martinez would be the first woman from the USA to triumph since Lisa Raymond and Liezel Huber in 2011. The duo teamed up to compete in 24 tournaments together this year.

Laura Siegemund & Vera Zvonareva – Zvonareva first played the WTA Finals back in 2004, contesting the singles format five times overall and earned her first doubles qualification in 2005. The team sealed their position in Cancun at the last possible moment by winning Nanchang, their third title this season after Ningbo and Washington DC. Zvonareva, who gave birth to her daughter Evelina in 2016, is bidding to be the first mother to triumph at the WTA Finals since Cara Black in 2014, while Siegemund would be the first ever German WTA Finals champion in doubles.

ABOUT THE ROUND ROBIN FORMAT

- In 2003 the current round robin format feeding into a four-player single-elimination draw returned to the WTA Finals for the first time since 1982
- The Top 2 finishers in each group will advance to the semifinals where the top player in each group, will play against the other group's runner-up
- There have been 22 instances where a player has posted a perfect 3-0 record in round robin play, most recently 2019 finalist Elina Svitolina
- Only eight times though has a player posted a 3-0 record and gone on to win the title, most recently in 2018 (Svitolina).
- Meanwhile eight times has a player posted a 3-0 round robin record and failed to reach the final, most recently 2022

ROUND ROBIN TIE-BREAKING METHODS

Since 2003, a semifinalist has been decided by the round-robin tie-break method nine times (2003, 2004, 2009, 2011, 2013, twice in 2015, 2016 and 2021). The final standings of each group shall be determined by the following:

- 1) Greatest number of wins
- 2) Greatest number of matches played; or
- 3) Head-to-head results if only two (2) players are tied, or if three (3) players are tied then:
 - a. If three (3) players each have the same number of wins, a player having played less than all three (3) matches is automatically eliminated and the player advancing to the single elimination competition is the winner of the match-up of the two remaining tied players; or
 - b. Highest percentage of sets won; or
 - c. Highest percentage of games won

If the above tie-breaking methods produce one (1) superior player (1st place) or one inferior player (3rd place), and the two (2) remaining players are tied, the tie between those two (2) players shall be broken by head-to-head record.

The WTA year-end World No.1 Rankings for singles and doubles are on the line this week at the WTA Finals. The singles year-end No.1 ranking will be determined between **Aryna Sabalenka** and **Iga Swiatek**.

Sabalenka is in control of her own No.1 fate. She can secure the year-end No.1 by reaching the final with a 2-1 record in group play, regardless of Swiatek's results.

If Swiatek loses a round-robin match, Sabalenka can secure No.1 by going undefeated in round-robin play or reaching the final.

If Swiatek loses two round-robin matches, Sabalenka can secure No.1 with a 2-1 round-robin record.

Assuming Sabalenka plays all three of her group matches, Swiatek must make the final to have a chance to finish at No.1.

- If Sabalenka goes 0-3 in group play, then Swiatek would need to win the title or reach the final with a 3-0 group record.
- If Sabalenka goes 1-2 in group play, then Swiatek would need to win the title.
- If Sabalenka goes 2-1 in group play, then Swiatek would need to win the title with at least two round-robin wins.
- If Sabalenka goes 3-0 in group play, then Swiatek would need to run the table, winning the title with a 3-0 group record.

A champion at the Australian Open, Madrid and Adelaide this season, Sabalenka became the 29th World No.1 after her run to the US Open final in September. The 25-year-old's ascension ended Swiatek's 75-week reign as a first-time No.1, a position she had held since April of 2022.

Swiatek finished the WTA regular season strong, capturing her tour-leading fifth title of the year, at the China Open in Beijing. Along with titles in Doha, Stuttgart, Roland Garros and Warsaw, Swiatek goes into the WTA Finals leading the tour in match-wins with 63.

In doubles, **Jessica Pegula & Coco Gauff** (as co-No.1), **Storm Hunter**, **Gabriela Dabrowski** and **Katerina Siniakova** have a chance to finish the year at No.1.
