[30] KAROLINA PLISKOVA (CZE #31)

Head-to-Head

MAGDA LINETTE (POL #45)

PLISKOVA: Won six of the first seven meetings from 2012-17; last year at the US Open required a final set tie-break to defeat Linette, who has won the most recent meeting... Appearing at this stage of the Australian Open for the fourth time... Struck a tournament-leading 28 aces in four matches; led the Tour in aces five times from 2015-21... Spent the least amount of time on court en route to QF... Will return to Top 20 by advancing to SF

LINETTE: Beat Pliskova during last year's Billie Jean King Cup Finals... Is ninth-oldest woman to make Grand Slam QF debut... Projected to break into Top 30 for the first time... Bidding to become third Polish woman to reach Australian Open SF in Open Era

SABALENKA: Contesting first QF at Melbourne Park; has reached the QF stage in four of last six Slam appearances... This fortnight has struck 125 winners and 76 unforced errors... Opened season with title run at Adelaide 1 and is now on an eight-match unbeaten streak... Has won all eight matches this season in straight sets...

<u>VEKIC</u>: Won their past two meetings in three sets at the Tokyo Olympics and at San Diego last October... Appearing in second major QF of her career... Has won 16 of her past 19 matches, including her last seven... Becomes third Croatian to reach the Australian Open QF stage joining Majoli (1996) and Lucic (2017)... Projected to return to Top 40 having slipped as low as No.112 last February... Owns more wins over Sabalenka than any other player (along with Bertens)

PLAYER NOTES

- Making seventh main-draw appearance at the Australian Open, where her previous best result was a 3r run in 2018 (l. Allertova)
- Overall this is her 30th main draw and first QF appearance at a Grand Slam; previously had reached the 3r six times
- On her way to the QF, has defeated Mayar Sherif, No.16 seed Anett Kontaveit, No.19 seed Ekaterina Alexandrova and No.4 seed Caroline Garcia, all Top 50 players
- Faces No.31 Karolina Pliskova in QF today; owns 36 wins in career over Top 50 players
- Has won seven of the last eight encounters against Top 50 players, only falling against Madison Keys (l. at United Cup)
- Owns 6-16 career record against players from Czech Republic; seven of those losses being against Ka. Pliskova
- Won last encounter against Ka.Pliskova at the United Cup; first win since triumohin on ITF Circuit in 2012, when both were ranked outside Top 100
- Owns two titles on hard courts Hua Hin in 2020 and Bronx in 2019
- Became the third female player from Poland to reach a Grand Slam QF in Open Era after A.Radwanska and Swiatek
- Best results by Polish players at Australian Open have been SF runs from Swiatek in 2022 and Radwanska in 2014 and 2016
- Is currently ranked No.45; this time last year was No.53

PLAYER NOTES

- Making her 10th appearance at Australian Open, having missed last year's tournament w/right hand injury
- Best result at Melbourne Park was a SF run in 2019 (l. eventual Champion Naomi Osaka); defeated Garbine Muguruza and Serena Williams en route
- Also made QF here in 2017-18
- Has won four of her previous 10 career GS QFs, and holds a 1-2 win record at Australian Open (d. S.Williams in 2019)
- Two-time Grand Slam finalist, finishing R-Up at 2016 US Open (l. Angelique Kerber) and 2021 Wimbledon (l. Ashleigh Barty)
- Has beaten Xiyu Wang, Yulia Putintseva, Varvara Gracheva and seed No. 23 Shuai Zhang so far this fortnight to reach her fourth QF at Australian Open
- Faces No.45 Magda Linette in QF today; owns 183 wins in career over Top 50 players
- Has won seven career matches against Linette; has only won more matches against Muguruza (nine), S.Zhang and Riske (eight)
- Aside the most recent two Top 50 wins at the Australian Open 2023, the last Top 50 win came in at US Open 2022 (d. Victoria Azarenka), since then has fallen on seven occassions including once against Magda Linette (at United Cup)
- Owns 6-8 career record against players from Poland
- Holds the record for the most aces so far at the Australian Open 2023 (28)
- Owns 10 titles on hard court, most recently lifting the title at Brisbane in 2020
- Is currently ranked No.31; this time last year was ranked No.5
- Best result by a Czech at Australian Open were Mandlikova's title runs in 1980 and 1987
